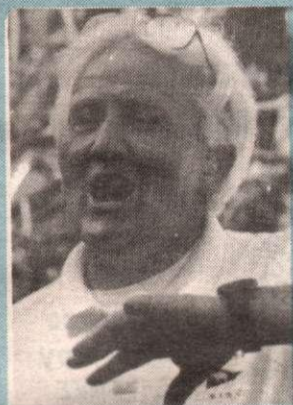

## Erskine plan scuttled

A hoped-for community purchase of Mt. Erskine property owned by Martin Williams has been deemed officially null and void.

Williams did not reverse his decision to withdraw an offer to sell 57 acres to the community via the Islands Trust Fund Board, members learned at a September 12 meeting.

After offering last September to sell the property at half market value, Williams withdrew that offer in July of this year, citing a long delay to effect the transfer and "inadequate protective covenants" against possible future development on the land.

The Trust Fund Board members asked Williams to reconsider while board and Salt Spring community members along with Islands Trust legal counsel attempted to clarify and address his concerns.

This was followed by a final discussion between Williams and Islands Trustee Bob Andrew speaking not as a Trust representative but as "a private, concerned citizen," said Andrew.

He said their meeting indicated "it was clear there was no opening" for a reconsideration by Williams.

Acting Trust general manager Cynthia Hawksworth said in a prepared release Monday "the (Trust Fund) board regrets Mr. Williams' decision but has concluded that further discussions with Mr. Williams are unlikely to change his mind."

Accordingly, she said, the board has "written to Glen Moores, who played a central role in co-ordination of fund-raising last year, requesting that those involved in planning for the acquisition of the property consider the various options available at this time."

Hawksworth added that while the board agreed it would "be pleased to assist the fundraisers with whatever option they believe most advantageous to the community," it did not believe it should direct the fate of funds currently held in trust.

She also said Trust Fund Board chairman Diane Cragg thanked "Moores, the Salt Spring Trail and Nature Club, the Salt Spring Island Foundation and a number of other Salt Spring residents" for their efforts in raising funds and working hard to acquire the property.

## Employee bylaw change defeated

A motion that employees be allowed to become members of the Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital Society was defeated at the society's annual general meeting, although more members voted for the motion than against it.

A show of hands at the September 11 gathering indicated 35 were in favour of the motion, and 30 were against it. To have a bylaw changed

cause the majority in favour was not large enough.

Society Chairman Gordon English spoke against the motion, and said employees could be in a conflict of interest if they were members of the society.

"Hospital societies typically have small memberships. If all the employees were admitted they could dominate the meetings and we

If employees became society members "it is possible for employees to overwhelm the society, and it has happened," he said. "They could elect their own board of directors."

"It is undemocratic and obscene to exclude employees," responded Colin Nicholson who put forth the motion.

at the board. "I'm hoping to get this organization into the 20th century in labour relations," he said.

Society member Bill Curtin said employees should have the opportunity to become involved and fear of employees overwhelming the society "shouldn't preclude them in acting in the best interests of the community."

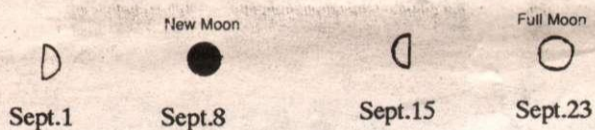

cipal. "If the board is concerned with rank and file union members, therapists, and nurses to exercise that right responsibly, why aren't they concerned with doctors," he said.

English pointed out the Ministry of Health would reject a proposal to allow employees in the society even if the motion was passed.

In the Ministry of Health model bylaws for hospital societies bylaw 13(a) reads "no employee of the society shall be eligible for membership in the society."

The explanation for this bylaw says "in effect, the society employs the persons who work in the facility and therefore an employee should not be permitted to become a member because as such he might attempt to influence a decision of the society or the board on a matter which affects the facility's employees.

"This provision is required by Ministry of Health policy."

Ministry communications manager Graydon Gibson said it is required by the ministry for all hospital societies in B.C. to have bylaw 13(a) as part of their own bylaws.

Nicholson called the bylaw "reprehensible."

After the bylaw change was rejected, Curtin moved that the hospital society make representation to the Ministry of Health regarding employee eligibility for becoming society members, which was carried.

Curtin said his intention was to ask the ministry to reconsider its employee exclusion bylaw policy.

The Commission is now requesting community input into the Master Planning process through interest group interviews.

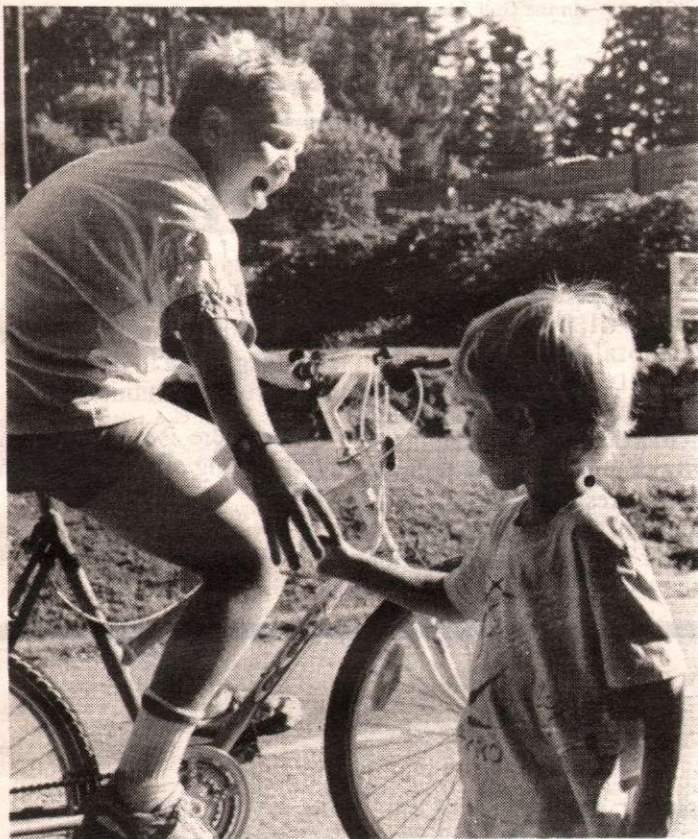

More than \$6,300 dollars was raised by Salt Spring participants in the Terry Fox Run Sunday, organizer Sharlene Betts said Monday.

Not only was more money raised this year, but the number of participants was up from less than 90 last year to about 155 this year.

The tractor was pulled out and a fence was erected around the hole. After it was fully dug out, Price went down into the hole "to see what he could see," Brownsword said.

Price used ladders and ropes to get down. When he was standing at the bottom, his head was a metre below the playing field surface. It was a bit wet at the bottom and tunnels travelled off from the main hole at 90 degree angles.

Brownsword said the hole is not only a mystery, but it is scary as well. "There could have been a class of kids gathered right there and they could have fallen in."

Children play in that area and lawn mowers have cut the grass where the hole is, but there has been no evidence of a large hole before, he said.

The school property was formerly owned by a family named Bowden, and according to long-time Fernwood resident Vic Sampson, the hole is located where the house was situated, said Brownsword.

Brownsword said he is interested in gathering more information about the property to help solve the mystery. However, "we may find other things we don't want to find," he said.

# Politicians MB petition proceeds to meet

Regular joint monthly meetings between Islands Trust and Capital Regional District representatives will commence next week.

CRD director Julia Atkins along with Salt Spring Island Trust Committee members Diane Cragg, John Stepaniuk and Bob Andrew will meet on the last Monday of every month in the board room of the Government Building.

The first of these meetings will occur on Monday, September 23, starting at 1 p.m.

An Islands Trust press release says the purpose of the meetings is to address issues of joint CRD/Trust interest.

The public is welcome to attend and observe proceedings. There will also be an opportunity to ask questions during the final 20 minutes of the meeting.

An agenda will be posted at the Government Agent and Islands Trust offices in Ganges.

A Galiano Island Trust Committee attempt to have MacMillan Bloedel Ltd.'s petition against controversial bylaws dismissed was unsuccessful in B.C. Supreme Court last week.

The forestry company filed a petition against the committee on June 27, 1991, asking that a series of bylaws regarding Galiano's forest lands be declared void. MB said it believed the bylaws were discriminatory because they affected only the company's lands which it was in the process of selling when the bylaws were introduced.

The GITC subsequently filed a counter-petition asking that MB's application be entirely dismissed. That submission was heard in Vancouver Tuesday by Justice Hogarth.

Acting Trust general manager Cynthia Hawksworth said Trust counsel advised her that Hogarth did not rule in the committee's favour "because he felt it was an important public issue that should be fully heard in public."

She added that Hogarth said "he was not judging the correctness of MB's petition" by not granting its dismissal.

Hawksworth also said a hearing date for MB's petition had not yet been set.

## Year 2000 decision lacks consultation

Shocked may be one of those words in the overused and abused category of our English language these days but it aptly describes the current mood of School District 64 officials.

They have just been informed that the much-touted Year 2000 program which was to change our provincial education system for the better has been delayed. Problems with education policies already caused the resignation of former education minister Tony Brummet.

Gulf Islands school board trustees and staff have spent many, many hours discussing the new focus for learning; trying to conform to guidelines with a time period they said from the beginning was too short.

After going through three major examinations of education in B.C. during the 1980s — The Apple Report in 1980, Let's Talk About Schools in 1985 and the Sullivan Royal Commission on Education in 1988 — educators and parents may have thought the subject had been looked at thoroughly.

Now the government is defending its delaying action by saying it wants to ensure that the whole community has an opportunity to join in the review process. "More time can only result in better programs for our young people and that is why we're giving communities more time to get ready for Year 2000," education minister Stan Hagen has said.

While stating it is committed to an extensive consultative and collaborative process, the government, and more specifically Hagen, has infuriated educators who have been caught by surprise with the delay announcement.

Another cause for alarm is that the tenor of *Education Reform in British Columbia: Building a Sustainable School System* — the document containing announcement of the delay — is very different from the Year 2000 literature we have read. That in itself is probably contributing to the shock and

annoyance of educators.

If the government is that concerned about the input and timing of Year 2000, why was that not decided earlier. Some portions of the program are in place in this school district — the primary section began this month when school re-opened for the 1991-92 year.

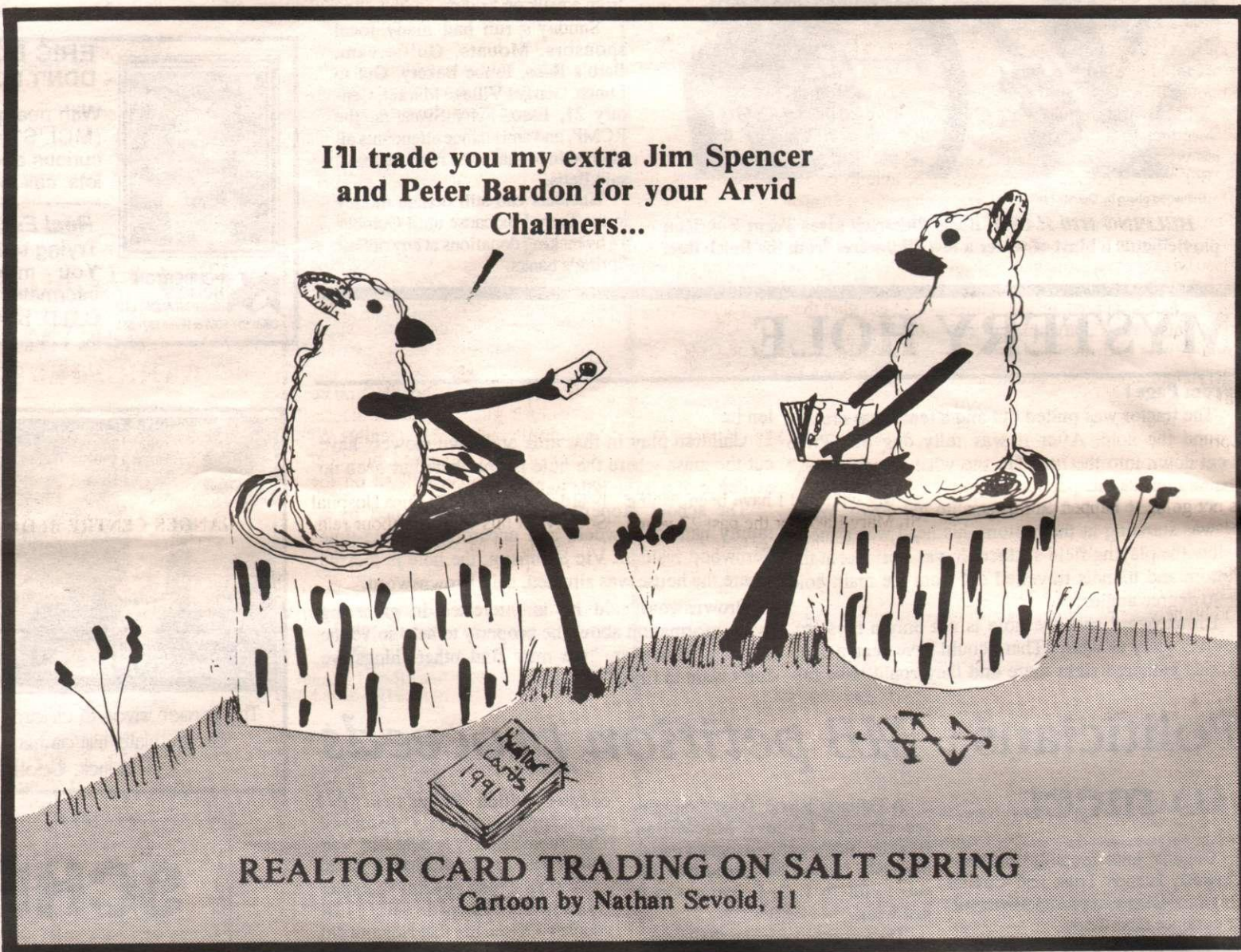
Disruption caused by the delay will be damaging to educators' morale and subsequently to students. It is similar to an oil tanker being sent to a destination and quickly being changed to another direction. It takes time to turn.

Lack of consultation on such a major aspect of our education

system, something which vitally changes the focus and direction, is unforgivable in these times of improved communication.

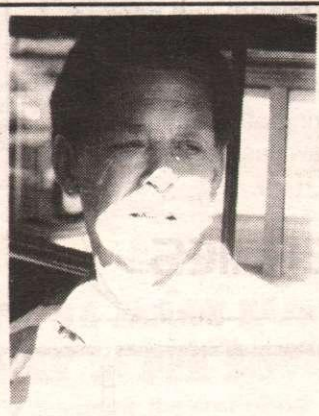
Just where is our education system going and who is at the helm?

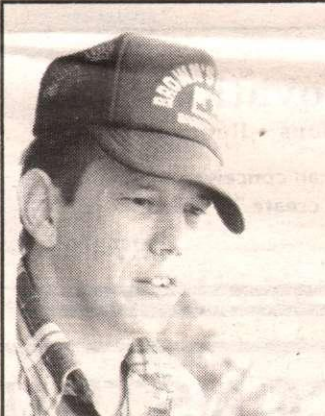

He made it clear that he didn't like the idea, either: first by trying to rule the motion "out of order" - on the basis that the ministry would veto the change; and secondly by suggesting that the employees, if allowed membership, could "pack" a meeting and ride rough-shod over the board.


This last, ludicrous suggestion infuriated a lady who belongs to the HEU (Hospital Employees Union) - she's an "employee," but of Greenwood's.

I predict that within a year, it will be possible for employees to be members of the society. No judge would allow Mr. English or his board to deny membership to any class, race, sex or religious group. Similarly, the clerks who govern us are also subject to the laws of this Dominion. They will all learn - even if they do honestly think that hospital employees are inferior.


Latvia is free! So should we all be - and soon it is to be hoped that at least one employee, a RN (registered nurse) or LPN (licensed practical nurse) for example, will sit on the board as in the Juan de Fuca Hospital Society. In this way the labour relations of Lady Minto can be moved into the 20th Century.

It is puzzling that 32 honest men and women were induced to vote against my motion on the by-law change which would admit hospital employees to membership.



Capital Comment

VICTORIA — Shortly after Attorney General Russ Fraser announced at a press conference that Bill Vander Zalm had been charged with breach of trust, the former premier emerged from the Social Credit caucus room in the Parliament Buildings.

And for the first time, he looked like a beaten man. He had served the public faithfully for 25 years, he said, and he had never breached the public's trust.

Breach of trust is a serious charge. Upon conviction, it carries a maximum jail term of five years. No other premier in Canada's history has been charged with this offence.

The last B.C. politician charged with breach of trust was former Surrey mayor Ed McKitka. He was sentenced to three years in jail. That's bad enough, but it's a sad day when a former premier faces criminal charges.

What's even sadder is that Vander Zalm has no idea, not even now, why he has been charged. He has never understood the necessity to keep his private and business interests separate from his duties as an elected official.

One of my readers, who calls occasionally to take issue with what I write, called me while I was working on this column. He wanted to know whether I was satisfied now.

Like Vander Zalm very much

No, sir, I am not. I had no desire to see Vander Zalm dragged into court. I have never spoken ill of the man. In fact, I liked him very much and still do.

For me, the Vander Zalm issue was done with the day he resigned as premier. His shortcomings had made it essential that he be removed from office.

Vander Zalm once said that he had his doubts about the justice system, and from his point of view, I suppose, those doubts are quite well founded.

First consider that he doesn't understand to this day what was wrong with accepting \$20,000 from Tan Yu. The way he sees it, he was selling "the family home and the family business."

Then consider that the decision whether or not to charge him has rested with one man — Peter Freeman, the special prosecutor. In making his decision, Freeman had to take into account whether there is substantial likelihood of conviction.

How difficult it is, I wonder, to keep personal bias out of such a decision? Canadians have, in the past few months, suspected that even judges cannot keep some of their personal bias out of rulings.

Likelihood of conviction

I also have to wonder about the likelihood of conviction. Compared with other Criminal Code charges, the precedents aren't that bountiful.

So, what's wrong with going ahead anyway, and if the charges don't stick, why then the man's name is cleared. Is it really?

The public doesn't care much for the finer points of the law and, in keeping with the old saying, where there's smoke — there's fire, assumes guilt. And no judge or jury, finding the accused not guilty, is going to change their minds.

I'm not saying Vander Zalm shouldn't have been charged, but that doesn't mean I have to like the fact that he was charged. In the contrary, I don't like it one bit.

Fraser told reporters that he won't intervene in this case, a right he has under the Crown Counsel Act, which states that the attorney general can intervene where it is in the public interest.

Of course, he won't intervene, although with due respect to the attorney general, sparing British Columbians the spectacle of having a former premier humiliated in court and perhaps even convicted, might be considered in the public interest.

All in all, it's a very sad end to what was otherwise a brilliant political career. If only he had been able to comprehend the strictures of high office.

Once during the great abortion controversy, Vander Zalm said that, of course, he had the right as premier to impose his moral standards on the public. If not, the office might as well go to the mafia.

That statement said it all. He never understood that the premier could not rule by decree, that he must scrupulously follow the standards laid down by our system of parliamentary democracy. And no amount of explaining could convince him otherwise.

Ignorance is no excuse

He just didn't know any better. But if it be true that ignorance is no excuse before the law, then at least let it be a mitigating circumstance. Surely, a man who finds himself in trouble because he had no idea what he was doing wrong, cannot be judged as severely as someone who deliberately runs afoul of the law.

One of my colleagues suggested jokingly that I might make a good character witness for Vander Zalm, and perhaps, that's not as funny as it sounds. If I can help, I'm available.

Moratorium

The following is an open letter to Claude Richmond, Minister of forests, filed with this newspaper for publication.

We are writing on Behalf of the Board of the Island Watch Society, an organization formed in 1987 to support the "preserve and protect" mandate of the Islands Trust.

As you know, forestry management and practices are deeply troubling issues in the Gulf Islands. Therefore, although the Island Watch Society is a Salt Spring organization, the board feels compelled to comment on recent events in the Walbran Valley.

We ask that you impose an immediate moratorium on logging in the Walbran Valley until the significance of the old growth in the valley can be reconsidered from a broader social perspective. We recognize that such a decision may require some form of negotiated compensation for the license holder or affected employees.

We remind you that there is broad public support, and a growing body of expert opinion calling for a fundamental rethinking of forestry policy in the province, culminating in the Forest Resources Commission Report.

With respect to the Walbran specifically, at least two government appointed task forces have recognized that the social, economic and environmental value of preserving the valley may outweigh the costs. The Old Growth Strategy Committee recommended a moratorium on logging in the area to permit further study, and a recent Tourism Task Force has pointed out the valley's significance in relieving pressure on the West Coast Trail.

To permit logging of such a unique resource in spite of this opinion, and when forestry policy generally is at a crossroads, would be tragic, and a sad environmental legacy for which your government would be long remembered.

We thank you for your consideration in this matter and look forward to your reply.

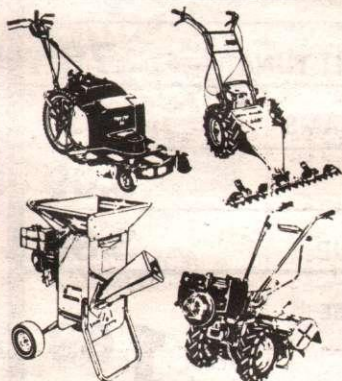

COURT Docket

Charges of boat theft were dropped against a German citizen arrested in Ganges last July when Judge R.E. Hudson ruled the accused had an "honest belief" of his right to take it.

Marcus Muth, 22, in Canada on a visitor's visa in early October last year, told provincial court he went to Desolation Sound to hike and camp with his German friend Tim and Axel Burgheim, who had a cabin there.

"I thought we just have a kind of holiday," Muth said.

While there, Burgheim asked Tim and Muth to help build an extension to his cabin, Muth testified. The extension project took two months to complete, and although no wage had been agreed upon at the beginning of the job, "I thought about getting paid for it because it had been an immense amount of work."

Burgheim said he could not pay, so Muth suggested Axel sell his boat and use the proceeds for payment. Burgheim refused.

In June, 1991, Muth took two friends, Paul Eaton and Richard Bahry, to Desolation Sound to get the boat.

Muth was going to use as a "bargaining tool" with Burgheim, said witness Paul Eaton.

"I thought this is my right to do it," said Muth.

By this time Burgheim, also from Germany, had returned home, Muth said.

Muth and his friends towed Burgheim's boat to Salt Spring Island, and arrived in Ganges Harbour at 2 a.m. July 2, said witness Richard Bahry of Salt Spring.

David Rayment of Ganges said he recognized the boat as one he had designed for the Jericho Sailing Club. He then called the sailing club, and was told the boat had been stolen last year.

He informed the Ganges RCMP,

and Muth and Eaton were arrested July 3.

Michael Parsons, an insurance adjuster, said the boat had been stolen from Jericho on November 8 or 9, 1990. He described it as a 16 foot aluminum boat with a 70 horsepower motor. Laurentian Pacific paid a claim of \$11,500 for the boat and motor and \$3000 for the trailer.

Judge Hudson said the accused did not know the boat was stolen. He said Muth had an "honest mistaken belief" in his right to the boat and dismissed the charge.

Her sister Lena gave a report to Driftwood Monday from the Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria.

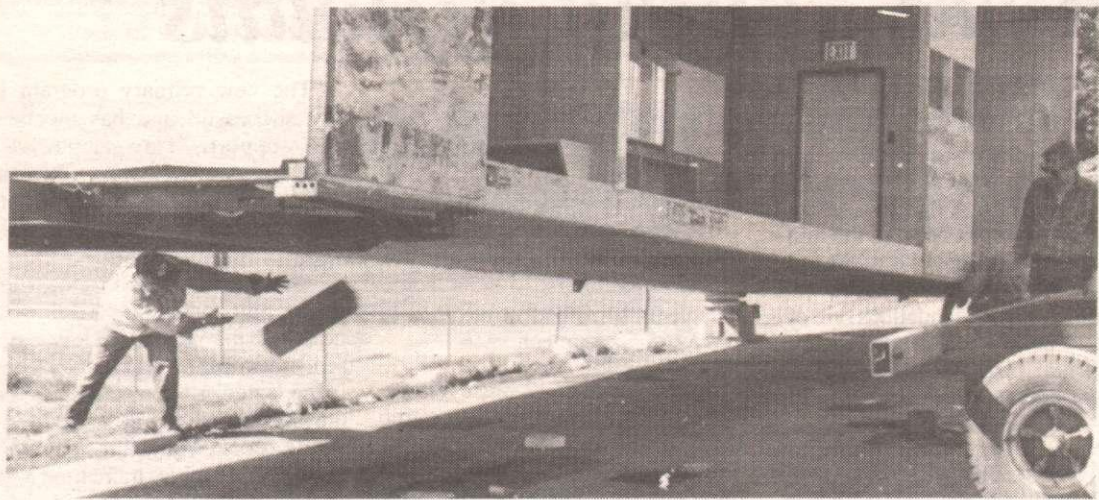

Seventeen-year-old Jessica initially was taken to Vancouver General Hospital suffering from serious head injuries after a truck she was driving went off Fulford-Ganges Road and struck a power pole last July 29.

## Crowded conditions seen in many district schools

Predicted enrolment increases and crowded schools have become a reality in School District 64.

Initial enrolment figures in Gulf Islands schools indicate an across-the-board 4.2 per cent population increase. Staff positions were also increased by 3.2 per cent from 1990-91 levels.

Fulford Elementary experienced the highest growth at 10.8 per cent with 206 students compared to 186 in 1990/91. First year primary (formerly kindergarten) has 22 pupils.

Pender Island School's population also grew over 10 per cent to 97 students from 88. Galiano has 86 pupils (79 in 1990), Mayne has 78 — including 27 in junior secondary — down by four from last year. Saturna has 19 students, two fewer students than last September's enrolment.

Gulf Islands Secondary School figures show 490 students on the hill, up from 466 in 1990-91.

Fernwood Elementary has 302 pupils, including 46 in first year, an

increase of 12 from last year when the school housed 290 kids.

Salt Spring Elementary has 348 students this year, one less than in 1990/91, including 42 attending half-time in the first year primary program.

The overall district pupil/staff ratio increased to 14.5 from 14.

And while portable classrooms made their way to Fernwood Elementary School to alleviate crowding there, Salt Spring Elementary School parents voiced concerns about their crowded school.

Rosemary Trump told the September 11 school board meeting that "everybody realizes it has to do with funding and is not something that can be easily solved."

However, she said, parents of SSE students wanted assurance there would not be disruptions to classes because of high classroom or facilities demand.

"They really did feel their con-

cerns should be on record," she said.

The impression parents had, Trump added, was that "decisions are not being made so much because of children but because of a money crunch."

Schools superintendent Mike Marshall acknowledged that all Salt Spring schools are crowded. However the concerns are being addressed, he added.

When evaluating the situation last spring, he said, Fernwood was deemed to have the most "severe" problem.

"What we have indeed is a crowded school at Salt Spring Elementary," said Marshall. "We have been working to balance that out as fairly as we could."

Two new portable classrooms — one for GISS and another for Fernwood — arrived on the island last Friday. Fernwood also received an older portable from GISS to relieve crowding there.

## Two new hospital trustees elected at annual meeting

Two new trustees were elected to the Board of Directors of the Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital Society last Wednesday night, with a third seat going unfilled.

Salt Spring resident Eileen Hunter defeated the absent Gil Newall and was elected to a three-year term on the board. I

Andrew J. Loveridge won the Galiano seat by acclamation, and will also serve a three-year term. Loveridge is a 12-year resident of Galiano active in the Bodega Ridge preservation campaign and as a historian for the Galiano Club.

"My main qualification is that I've been in the hospital so much because of arthritis," he said.

Pender Island's seat remains vacant because no one was nominated.

Lady Minto's new administrator and chief executive officer Vicki Curtis was introduced at the meeting. Her previous position was executive director of the Peace Arch Hospital in White Rock.

She has also worked in nursing management roles at hospitals in B.C., Saskatchewan and Ontario.

# Year 2000 delay shocks school officials

Shocking and offensive were words used to describe school trustees feelings about education minister Stan Hagen's handling of Year 2000 postponement.

His recent education reform announcement was discussed at last Wednesday's school board meeting.

Gulf Islands school trustees and administrators expressed amazement about the postponement of Year 2000 changes implementation for one year. The delay and establishment of a new education reform committee are two major parts of an education ministry document released September 6.

A result of a provincial cabinet review of the Year 2000 program, contents of *Education Reform in British Columbia: Building a Sustainable School System* came as a surprise to school trustees and education staff.

At the September 11 meeting in Ganges, local trustees and schools superintendent Mike Marshall were blunt in criticizing the document and absence of consultation before its release.

"It seems to make a mockery of the consultative process we have been talking about in education in the past year," said trustee Charles Hingston.

Hingston moved the board support the B.C. School Trustees' Association response to Hagen, "even though it won't make the slightest bit of difference."

BCSTA directors agreed to "communicate to the minister strong concern regarding the process used in making his announcement regarding the cabinet review of Year 2000 education reforms; a process that changed the implementation process and schedule through a press conference."

In a September 9 letter to Hagen, BCSTA president Donna Jones said "We are shocked and offended that you would unilaterally intervene in the Year 2000 implementation process without prior consultation with the education partners ..."

Trustee David Eyles said "I particularly like Donna's words *shock* and *offend*. I think that describes my reaction."

Eyles thought trustees should give the *Education Reform* document more analysis and communicate specific concerns to Hagen.

Allisen Lambert was surprised Hagen had proposed a new Special External Advisory Committee on Education Reform to be chaired by businessman Edward F. Kaiser Jr. Hagen said other representatives will be from "the post-secondary education and business communities, parents, students and the general public."

She also voiced concern about the absence of consultation, noting that the process of communication between education partners was "at risk."

"I can't grasp it. It seems to be incredible," she said.

Gulf Islands Teachers' Association president Jack Braak told *Driftwood* that while he had not yet had a chance to read the *Education Reform* document, he had initial concerns about a few points, based on what he had heard to date.

In addition to the ministry taking unilateral action and putting the Year 2000 on hold, Braak said teachers would be concerned about proposed changes to methods of pupil assessment.

*Education Reform* also refers to developing "provincial indicators" involving "a wide range of testing and assessments, including evaluations from graduating students, employers and post-secondary institutions."

Braak noted "the Year 2000 document talks about more than just

like the direction the ministry wants to go back to is just a test, and we are concerned about that too."

He said teachers are also wondering about the choice of Kaiser as committee chairman when "he has little or no education background."

Schools superintendent Mike Marshall spoke out strongly about the *Education Reform* document.

"It is filled with inaccuracies," he said, "and I am being kind when I say

*inaccuracies.*"

As an example, he said, the ministry states it adopted 78 of 83 Sullivan Royal Commission on Education recommendations. He offered to bet his son's motorcycle if "even half have been approached" and for anyone to check that in his copy of the Sullivan report.

Marshall said "so many good things have been started and could be

happening" from that report.

He said "it is shocking and absolutely without ethics" for the education ministry to print some statements contained in the *Education Reform* document.

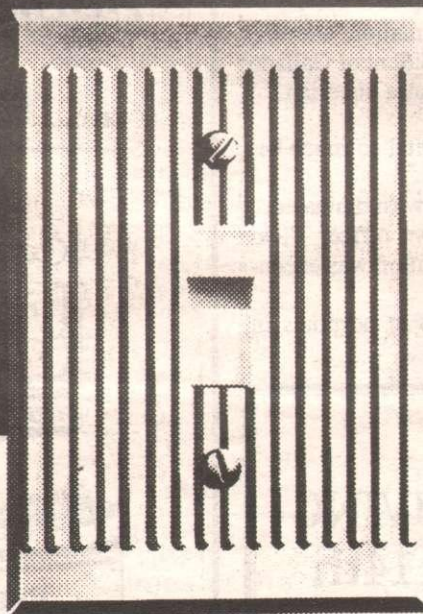
In a September 12 press release, Hagen defended proposed education changes and delay of implementing Year 2000 intermediate and graduate programs.

"The new primary program is very successful and has received wide support. Many people have asked for more time and wider consultation for the new Intermediate and Graduation programs," said Hagen.

"We want to ensure that the whole community, including parents, business and the post-secondary representatives have an opportunity to join in the review process. More time can only result in better programs for our young people and that is why we're giving communities more time to get ready for Year 2000," he said.

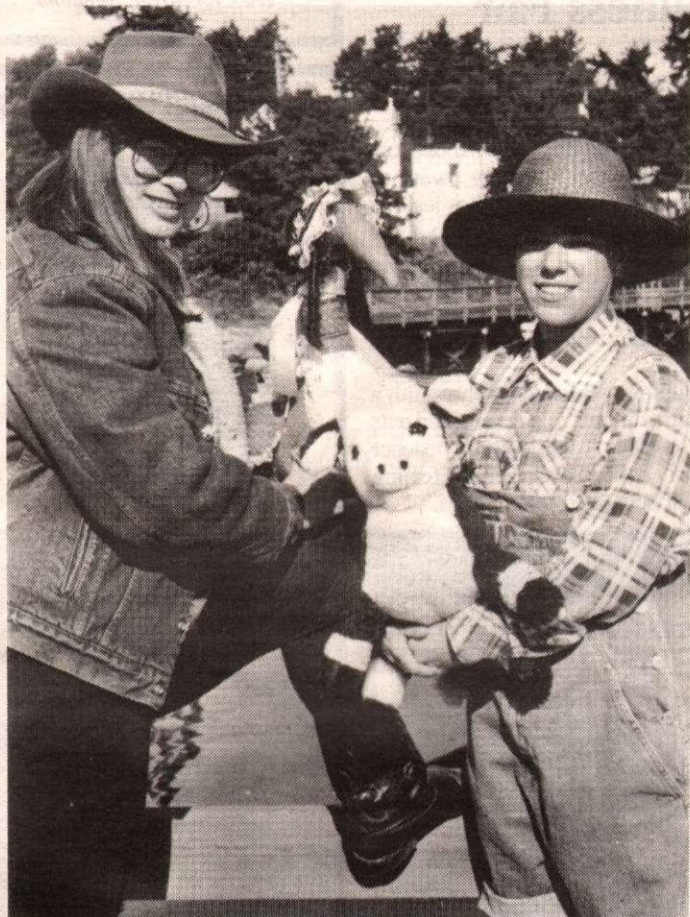

## Fair festivities offer fun, frolic

One of Salt Spring's most popular outdoor events sets up this weekend on the Farmers' Institute Rainbow Road grounds.

Fall Fair fun starts at 7:30 a.m. for early risers Saturday morning and continues all day until 6 p.m. Fairgoers are reminded, however, that "island time" may apply to scheduled event times.

Indoor exhibits covering areas like produce, flowers, photography, arts and crafts are open to the public all day Saturday and Sunday. Midway rides will be on the grounds both days starting at 10 a.m.

A horse show starts at 9 a.m., and people can watch island livestock being judged by experts in the field. Classic cars parade to the site at 10 a.m. for display until 1 p.m. Loggers sports begin at 11:30 a.m. Petting zoo, official ceremonies and pony rides start at 11 a.m., with sheep dog demonstrations scheduled for 12:30 and 2 p.m.

Food and beverage is available from noon, with a lamb barbecue and local food concessionaires providing a varied menu. A 4-H show and pony rides starts at 1 p.m. Trophy presentations take place at 4 p.m.

Kicking off Sunday's events at 10 a.m. is a pet contest, and hay baling starts at 10:30. A Ganges dog obedience demonstration is also scheduled for 10:30. A magician is set to perform at 11 a.m. and 1:15 p.m. Sheep dog demonstrations will be repeated at 2 p.m. on Sunday.

The refreshment garden and barbecue opens at noon on Sunday, and winners of the Rotary Club's "Muffin Madness" draw will be determined by local cows in an entertaining contest at approximately 1 p.m.

Gates close at 5 p.m. Sunday.

Exhibitors are reminded that indoor section entries must be placed by 8:30 p.m. on Friday, September 20, and all livestock must be penned by 8:30 a.m. on Saturday.

## Student marks above average

Last June's class of Gulf Islands Secondary School graduates fared better than most in provincial exams and teacher grading.

At last week's school board meeting, superintendent of schools Mike Marshall outlined 1991 exam and teacher evaluation results which gave GISS grads a consistent edge in both categories.

GISS students averaged almost three per cent higher in the Grade 12 provincial exams than their B.C.-wide counterparts. Students wrote the mandatory exams in 11 different subjects. Their scores were higher in all classes except Mathematics, Chemistry and French Immersion.

Marshall said lower scores in the French Immersion test were not surprising since GISS' program was not an "elitist" one as it often is in larger schools.

GISS students scored most dramatically higher than the provincial average in English Literature (75.4 versus 66 per cent) and Physics (78 versus 66.6 per cent).

Last year's GISS Physics students received an average 85 per cent grade from their teacher, while the provincial average was 72.8 per cent.

GISS teachers gave an average 3.6 per cent higher assessment of students in the same 11 subjects.

In addition, two GISS graduates received provincial government scholarships from writing a series of exams in academic subjects. Shandra Platts and Nick Hock exceeded the 1,700 points required to receive the \$1,000 scholarship.

Marshall pointed out that the overall higher scores were particularly significant because students at a smaller school like GISS have fewer class choices. Consequently, more students will be enrolled in classes they are not truly keen on taking.

He noted that of the 20 top provincial scholarship winners, "literally not one was from a small school."

Marshall and trustees commended GISS staff and graduates for their work last year.

## Historical pictures need identification

Salt Spring Island Historical Society members are hoping islanders will be able to identify residents and visitors in photographs taken as far back as 99 years ago.

Society members will display prints, which are now part of their archives collection, at the Fall Fair. Pictures of people, buildings, farm animals and wedding parties were taken by former island resident Henry Bullock.

"It's like a history of Salt Spring at that period of time, but there are so few of them we can identify," volunteer archivist Mary Davidson told *Driftwood* last week.

"If island residents were children then, they might remember Mr. Bullock coming along and taking their picture."

Tom Holtby, an amateur photographer who printed the photographs

for the archives, said Bullock wrote names and dates for only two of the 222 photos in the collection.

"Having your picture taken was a very serious affair. You weren't supposed to grin or anything," said Holtby, and the expressions of many subjects seem to support that theory.

Holtby added that Bullock lived in Steve's Boarding House near the location of St. Mark's Church, and he rented two rooms there; one for his bedroom and one for his darkroom.

Glass plates, from which the photographs were printed, were donated to the historical society by Ivan Mouat.

A photo booth will be set up in front of the Bittancourt House Museum. Even if islanders are unable to identify anyone, the prints will provide an informative glimpse into Salt Spring's past.

## Healing art shown

### Hands on at Wellness Fair

Actually, a Reiki practitioner does not even have to touch the recipient as healing can release body energy through blankets, clothing, and casts, said Petrie.

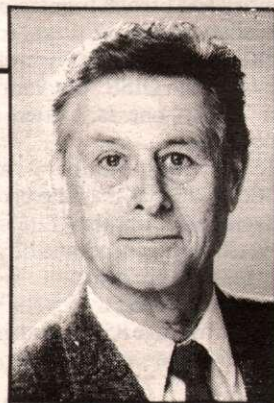
"We can't see radio and TV waves. There're lots of other energy we can't see. We have an aura we can't see," she said. "Once you get on to it, it is there — plain and simply there."

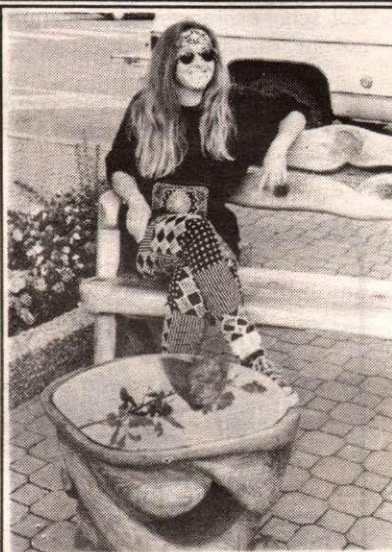

They were joined by Islands Trustee John Stepaniuk and Peggy Mika from MP Lynn Hunter's office.

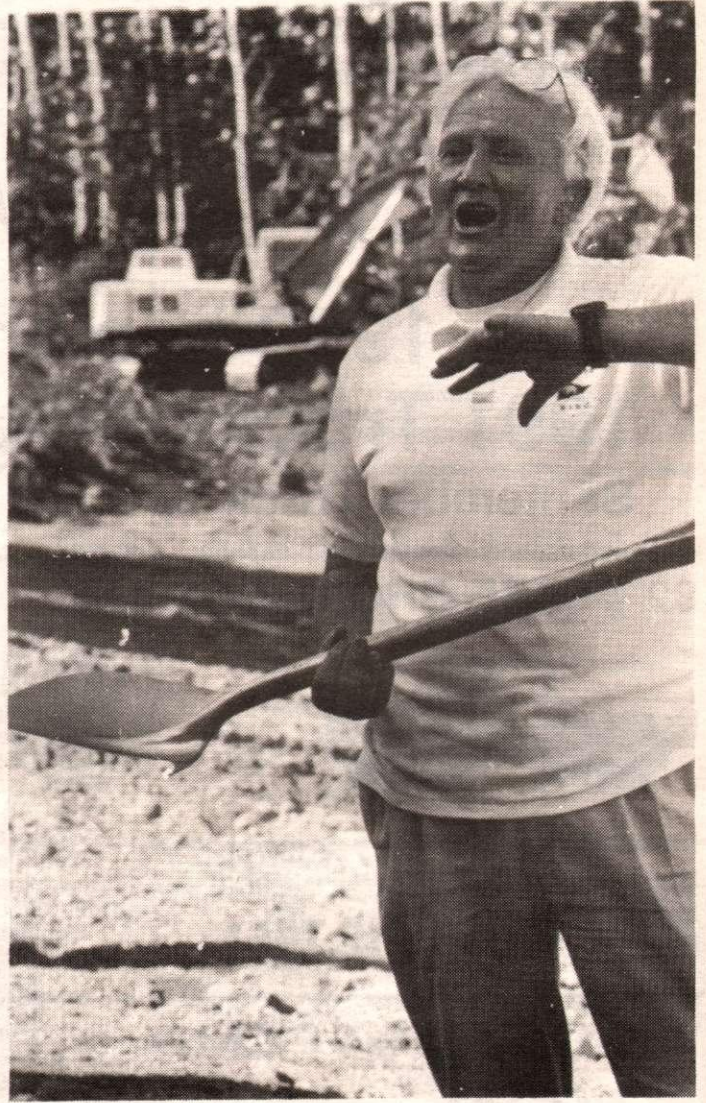
Mika announced a \$185,000 Communications

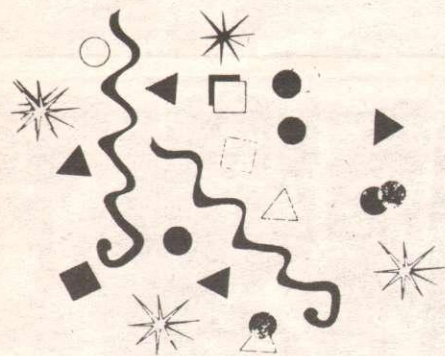

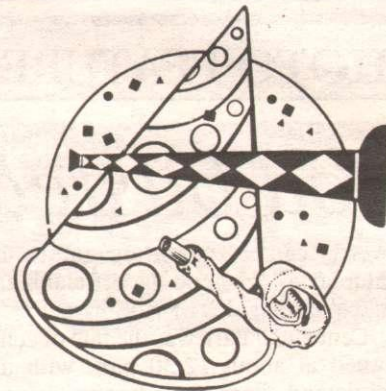

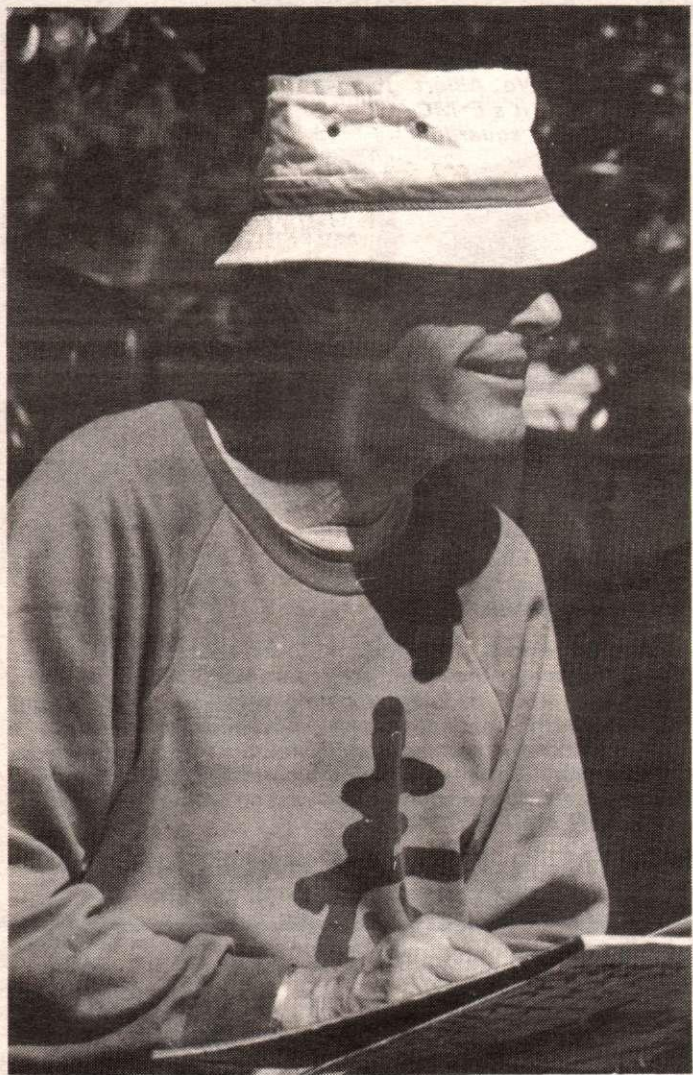

A concert will be held at St. George's Anglican Church this Sunday, September 22 at 3 p.m.

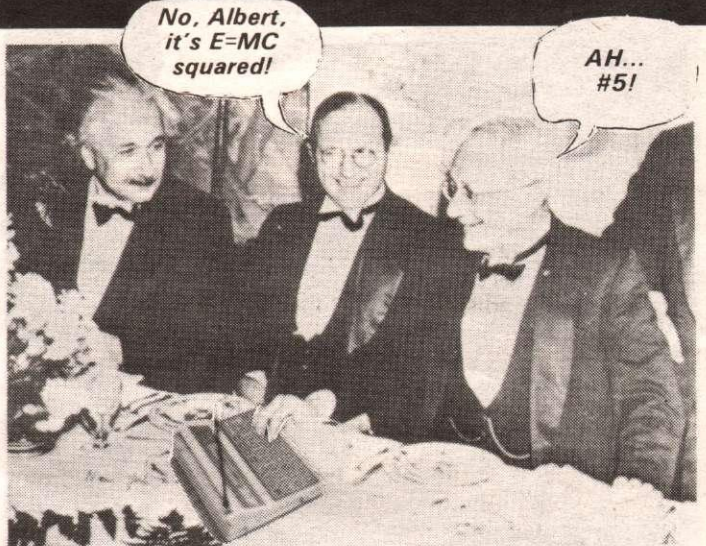
This will be the first vocal concert, excluding choirs, that the Community Arts Council has scheduled since taking over the concert series from the Concert Society.

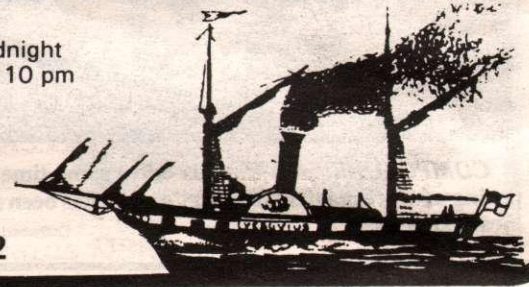

# Nature art featured at show

*Island artists participate at Goldstream park*

Salt Spring artists are well represented at a nature art show focusing on bio-diversity at the Goldstream Park Visitors Centre.

The disproportionate number of artists from Salt Spring is "not surprising" organizer Dave Fraser said from the visitors centre Wednesday.

"You find a lot of people doing natural artwork on Salt Spring," said Fraser, a Salt Spring artist himself.

Robert Bateman, Allan Crane, Michael Hames, Brien Foerster, Peggy Frank, Dave Fraser, Jan

Sharkey Thomas, Dave Rayment, and Diana Thompson are all represented at the show. Salt Spring artists have contributed watercolours, wood carvings, stone sculpture, pastels, and oil paintings.

Fraser said the diversity of the artists on Salt Spring fit the show's needs, "and quite frankly, some of the stuff is really nice."

Bio-diversity is the concept of looking at a wide range of species, and preserving the diversity of species now in existence. "The show is to raise public awareness of

managing a whole range of species rather than just one species," he said.

Each artist wrote an essay on the theme of art, parks, and diversity, he said. "That has been interpreted in as many ways as you can imagine."

The essays are placed beside the artist's work and ballots are cast by spectators attending the show for their favourite essays and art work. The "people's choice" awards will be handed out Friday, September 20, Fraser said.

Money is being raised for a scholarship to be given to a University of Victoria student interested in natural history. Fraser said that when he won the scholarship, it paid for his tuition, but now "it is good for about four books."

"We're trying to get the scholarship amount up so it does more than just be a token amount of money."

Money is also being raised for a viewing blind "so people can watch wildlife in Goldstream without disturbing it," Fraser said.

Some of the displayed art will be sold. Customers interested write down their bids in a book, and if the bid is accepted, they are the new owners. Bidding closes at 6 p.m. September 22.

The show is sponsored jointly by B.C. Parks and the Natural History Society, and runs until September 22. It is located about a five minute walk from the park's picnic ground at the foot of the Malahat on the Victoria side, said Fraser.

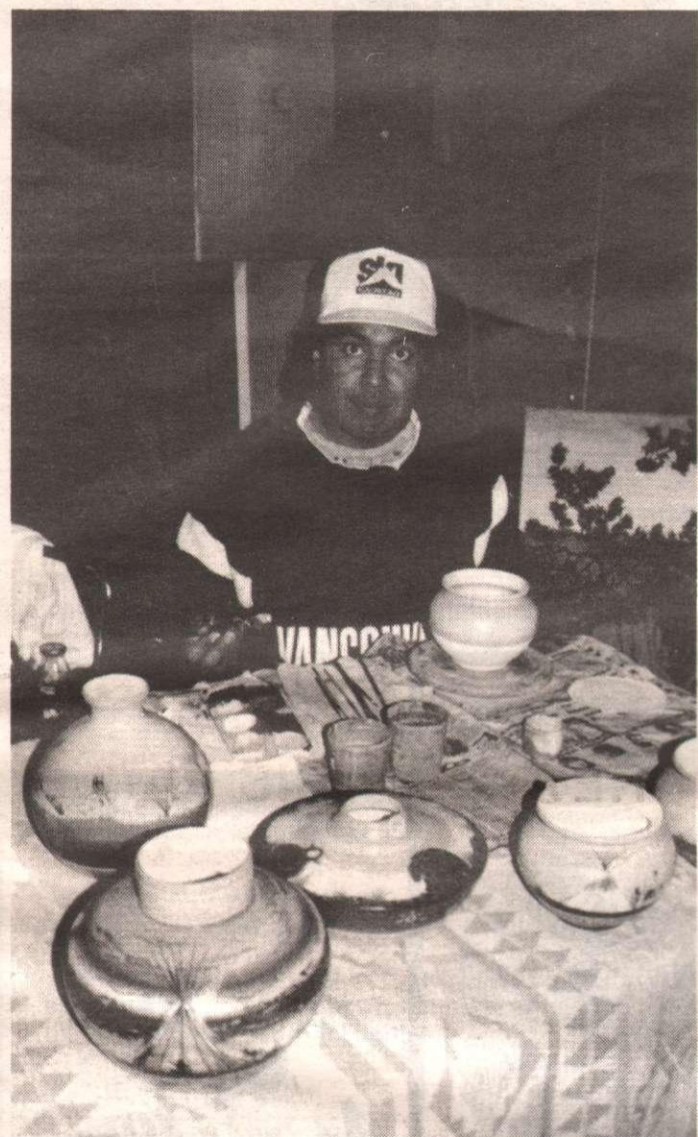

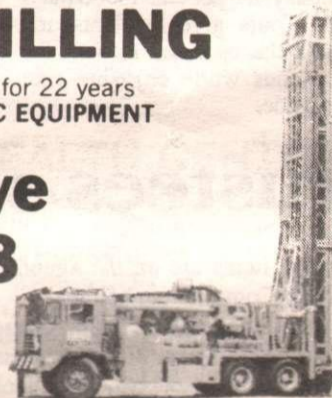

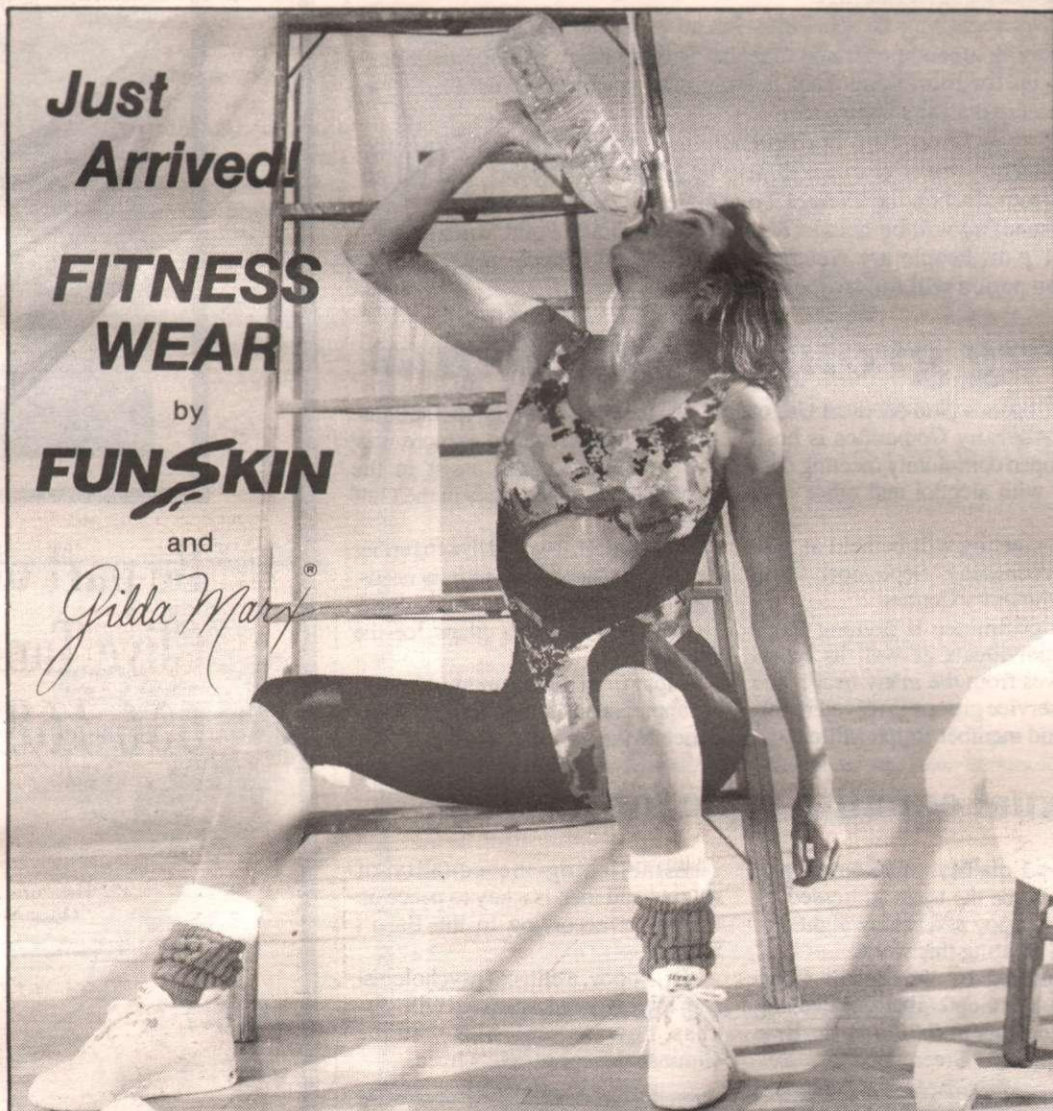

Committee members Diane Cragg, Bob Andrew and John Stepaniuk will consider a Baker Road rezoning application to effect a boundary adjustment and a Gulf Islands school board request to rezone a Channel Ridge property to allow school use.

Bylaw enforcement related to the former south end YMCA camp and the Whist dock application will be discussed.

A bylaw amending the definition of "adequate water supply" is set for second and third reading.

Bylaws regarding the Hawkins Island oyster lease, minor Bullman Road zoning amendments and Channel Ridge village development permit are up for fourth and final reading after receiving Trust executive and municipal affairs approval.

Input from the community would be appreciated in the form of attendance at the meeting.

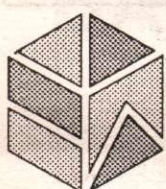
