1992 Terry Fox Run raises \$7,000

More than \$7,000 was raised by 130 participants in the Terry Fox run last weekend, organizer Marilyn Marshall said Monday.

"The community as a whole was so supportive of the event," she said, "It was very successful."

The pledges were up from last year's total of \$6,400 though the participants were down from 155. The top two pledge collectors were Joanna Barrett (\$1,022) and Phyllis Waltho (\$640). They were the top two pledge collectors last year as well, with donations of \$500 and \$550 respectively.

The route was different this year. Beginning at Fernwood

school, the route followed North End and North Beach roads to return up Fernwood Road to the school.

"Everyone enjoyed the new route," Marshall said, "especially the walkers. They really enjoyed the walk back along the waterfront."

The event started with a warm-up given by Salty Sweat's Roberta Bantel before the 10 a.m. start. Ganges Village Market donated 300 boxes of juice for participants at the start and finish and the four island bakeries donated energy-filled cookies.

"There were a lot of children on the run," Marshall said.

Kids ran, walked, biked and even rode in a Mansell Farm horse-drawn buggy.

Some knees were skinned, Marshall said, and one wheelchair participant had a problem with some new racing tires on the damp tarmac, but there were no major injuries.

Ambulance staff, police, highways staff and a registered nurse were on hand throughout the day.

Within the grand total so far of \$7,000, the golf tournament on Friday raised \$570, the horseshoe tournament at Vesuvius Inn raised \$100 and sales of T-shirts, books and pins raised \$400.

"You can still walk or run the route," Marshall said, "and pledges and donations can be deposited at both banks."

Issues on agenda next week

Saturday market mediation is set to begin talking about issues next week, now that the mediator, the members of the table and their numbers have been decided.

At a meeting September 17, Victoria lawyer Peter Walton was chosen to act as mediator in the dispute which has been on-going for more than a year.

"He'll do the job quite nicely," was the verdict of Friends of the Market spokesperson Mark Meredith. "We made quite a bit of progress in terms of our own understanding of what we need to do in this process."

The mediator will meet with each group separately before the next meeting set for October 1.

At the September 8 meeting, there was still discussion as to who would sit at the table during negotiations. Friends of the Market members were asked to join the table as a separate group.

A statement issued by Friends of the Market said it is a group of old-time market vendors and home-based producers. Members have become increasingly distressed by current market conditions and are

Trust fund established for Steven

Friends and relatives of 22-year-old Jason Steven are opening a fund to help smooth his transition from hospital to the community, spokesperson Mary Koroscil said Monday.

Steven's spine was severed in two places in a vehicle accident on Salt Spring August 15. He has been recovering in Shaughnessy Hospital and will soon move to G.F. Strong Hospital to begin rehabilitation.

"He's going to need an awful lot when he comes out of hospital," Koroscil said. He will get a small income from the government, she said and there will eventually be a settlement from ICBC but that might take several years.

In the meantime, Steven will need money to outfit an apartment, she said.

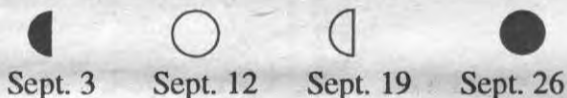

adamantly opposed to the "open market" concept.

"This is the time when we need people who believe in our vision of the market to come out of the woodwork," Meredith said.

Wolfgang Kranz was expected to participate on behalf of the Gasoline Alley merchants, but he declined.

"There is no good will from the (market) vendors at all," Kranz said. "I will not sit at the table."

He insisted the CRD enforce an agreement with the market vendors that they leave Centennial Park by 2 p.m. Kranz then issued a warning that he would give up his lease in Gasoline Alley if the bylaws were ignored again.

As of September 17, Kranz had not yet approached Gasoline Alley owners about vacating his premises. No other representatives from Gasoline Alley have come forward.

On September 15, the numbers of representatives from each group allowed at the table was left to each group to decide. There had been some discussion about setting a limit of two but the Market Vendor's Association said three was the smallest number they would have.

Friends of the Market, the Chamber of Commerce and the Parks and Recreation Commission had no objections. The Retail Merchants' Association did not wish to be the "fly in the ointment."

Local radio operators monitor disaster-stricken Kauai area

Salt Spring Island Radio Amateurs have been closely monitoring radio transmissions this week from a ham radio operator on the Island of Oahu who is still in direct contact with a radio amateur on Kauai, the island which was so heavily damaged in the recent hurricane Iniki.

Radio reports coming out of that island confirm the destruction done to houses and property with an estimated loss of over one billion dollars. Winds up to 165 miles per hour badly damaged 11,000 of the 22,000 houses, destroyed roads, cut off power and telephone services and flattened the island's plantations. It is unlikely power will be restored until the new year.

Fortunately the loss of life was minimal with two reported fatalities and about 100 hospital admissions, mostly from falling debris.

There are restrictions on those wishing to travel to Kauai. Priority is given to those returning to their homes or rendering assistance.

There is little accommodation for others.

They suggest that those tourists who plan to holiday in Hawaii this year should book accommodation on the other islands, and in particular, on Maui. Here there are, reportedly, several large hotels with vacancies.

Communication to and from Kauai is still largely by radio. Most frequencies have been left open for messages from Hawaii. One radio net has been allocated to "life and death" traffic. Hundreds of messages from Kauai residents have been handled by island radio operators in the last few days.

The airport at Princeville is now open and flights are landing at least every hour. A shuttle bus service from all parts of the island was put in place Friday. It will bring residents into the large towns enabling them to obtain food supplies.

One radio amateur on Kauai provided the list of supplies needed by island residents:

Powdered milk, canned goods, and juices (but not in bottles which might break and damage other foodstuffs), manual can openers, rice, baby formulas and baby foods,

coffee, tea, sugar, laundry and bar soap, camp stoves, toilet articles such as tooth paste, razors and blades, soap, shampoo, feminine hygiene needs, garbage bags, diapers and last but not least, dog and cat food. Animals at this time provide youngsters with a great amount of comfort.

No information is available on how or where to send the above items. Salt Spring radio amateurs will continue to monitor transmissions coming from Oahu. Hopefully directions will be given out soon so that these needed supplies can reach residents of Kauai in the next few days.

However, the following addresses were listed for those wishing to donate money:

- The Honolulu Advertiser, Kokua-Kauai Fund, Post Office Box 3110, 161 South King Street, Honolulu 96802.

- The American Red Cross Iniki Fund, 161 South King Street, Honolulu.

Some phonecalls have been made but in general, the phone service has only been restored within each community.

The disaster highlights once again the importance of amateur radio in an emergency, especially when power and telephone service has been cut off. Problems experienced in Kauai should provide us with some useful lessons in preparation for the "big earthquake." We could do well to stock up on some of the items being asked for by those on Kauai.

Region agrees to pay for island recyclables

At a Capital Regional District meeting September 9, it was agreed the Salt Spring Island Community Society — which runs the recycling depot here — should be paid a fee per tonne for certain marketable goods in addition to a per household rate.

"Up until now we were paid by the tonne for glass, cans, newspapers and aluminum," recycling centre coordinator Rick Laing said. "Now we will be paid the same as what IPI and Laidlaw are getting paid."

The CRD will pay \$110 per tonne for cardboard, magazines, office paper and plastics. Scrap metals and large appliances will collect \$22.60 per tonne. In August the depot collected, processed and shipped 19.6 and 3 tonnes of these two categories of recyclables respectively.

"We have been negotiating for a long time," Laing said, "We felt we should be paid for taking the additional items out of the waste stream."

All those who ran, walked or cycled the route, tossed horseshoes, swam or golfed and all those who pledged money are to be commended.

No community fund-raising event is successful without countless hours of volunteer organizational work. Marilyn Marshall tackled the position of overall coordinator with great tenacity; others at the Shelby Pool, Vesuvius Inn and golf club helped organize sideline events which also contributed to the total number of dollars raised.

More than \$9 million has been earmarked for innovative cancer research work across Canada this year, with \$1,150,285 going to projects in British Columbia.

Canadian travellers' guide printed in the United States

The Canadian federal government has endorsed a publication promoting tourism in Canada, but it was printed in the United States.

The *Official Travellers Guide to Canada* was printed in the U.S. to save costs, according to its publisher, Diane Landry. The publication was sponsored jointly by the Tourism Industry Association of Canada and Tourism Canada, part of the federal ministry of small business and tourism.

"Because this project had to be self-funding and it was private sector, we obviously had to go where we could get the best price," said Landry.

The 92-page, full colour magazine — which is targeted to American travellers — has the words "Printed in the U.S.A." below a picture of tourism minister Tom Hockin, who recently helped to unveil a new "Printed in Canada" logo in support of the Canadian printing industry.

Questioned on the matter in the House of Commons, Hockin defended the publication as being an "American publication for the American market."

However, Willy Cooper, president of the Canadian Printing Industries Association (CPIA), sent a letter to the industry minister Michael Wilson criticizing what amounts to a direct contravention of the "Canada, Buy Into It" campaign launched last May.

When he announced the campaign, Wilson said that when it comes to the question of cross-border shopping, "Certainly, one should compare price and quality, then we should also take a minute to think about Canada."

The U.S. publication was "paid for in part by Canadian tax dollars," said CPIA's director of public affairs, Ray Coutu, but, "The government just spent \$4-million telling us to buy Canadian."

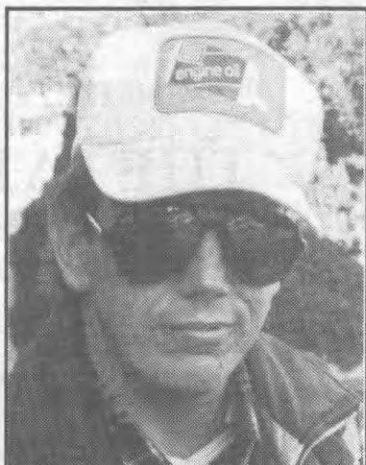

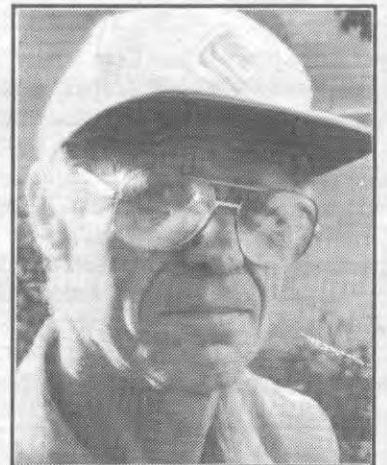

police protection. The purpose of this letter is to sing praises well earned, to the island RCMP force.

In the early hours of last Saturday morning, about 2 a.m., I was awakened from a sound sleep by considerable shouting and swearing, and the sound of footsteps on my deck. Three strangers could be made out in the moonlight. They lingered on our property for about 15 to 20 minutes, and then passed on.

We found this to be quite unsettling, but nonetheless went back to sleep.

Approximately two hours later, just before 4 a.m., I awoke to a crash against the house. Again stomping footsteps resounded on my deck. That was enough! I quickly dialed 911.

A calm voice immediately answered the phone and recorded important details. She assured me the police were on the way, and proceeded to give me well-thought-out advice. All this time she was in communication with the police officers en route.

She insisted I remain on the line so she knew we are all right. I informed her that the intruders were trying the door handles. We passed information back and forth. She then informed me that the police were now driving up my driveway.

Sure enough, I heard two cars pulling up by the house. I had only been on the phone for four minutes! She then informed me that the police had apprehended an individual on my deck, and that an officer would be coming to the door to talk to us.

This story had a benign ending. As it turned out, the individuals involved were severely intoxicated and consequently had lost their way to a party at the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club. No harm had come to my family, nor to the drunken off-islanders, nor to the three police officers who bravely and professionally handled what at the time was a terrifying experience for me and my family.

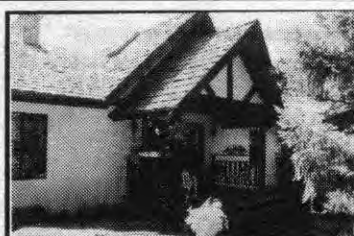
These officers put their own safety at risk for the benefit of Salt Spring islanders. They must often meet this

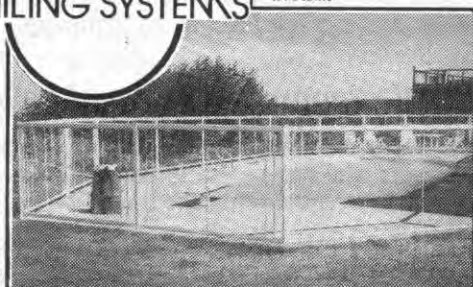

VICTORIA — To all of you who told me in letters and on the phone that my stand on gender equality in the proposed new Senate is ill-informed at best and outright undemocratic at worst, I'd like to say: read the report by the Law Society of British Columbia on gender bias in B.C.'s court system.

Read it and then tell me again we don't need some kind of affirmative action, some mechanism, some gesture to make women equal.

The report, written by a three-woman, three-man committee, headed by the province's respected Conflict of Interest Commissioner Ted Hughes, is nothing short of an indictment, not only of our justice system but of society at large.

At the very least, the report is a shocking window on how the justice system in British Columbia and undoubtedly elsewhere, treats women.

Women, the report states, are sexually harassed, humiliated, belittled and treated unfairly in B.C.'s justice system.

"Judges have been trying to improve the situation in the courts, but it was reported to us that there are instances of insensitivity and cases where judges belittle experiences of violence that cause women to doubt the impartiality of the court," Hughes said.

Filled with accounts of gender bias

Peter Leask, treasurer of the Law Society, said the panel knew the system wasn't perfect, but added that "I was shocked at how far we still have to go."

The 600-page report is filled with accounts about gender bias from more than 1,000 people who came out to public hearings. Here is but one of them:

In a chambers meeting, a woman lawyer asked the opposing male lawyer what his position would be concerning the case at hand. In front of the woman's client, and the other lawyers, he said: "I prefer the missionary position."

The woman lawyer said she was rattled, embarrassed and angry, but her learned colleague just looked blankly at her and turned away. The judge didn't see fit to call him on the carpet.

But sexual harassment and innuendo by male lawyers towards their female colleagues is just one aspect of "how far we still have to go." Far more insidious is the unfair way in which the courts treat women victims.

Do not always receive fair treatment in court

"We believe the family law system in our province fails to provide women and children with adequate means of economic support upon marriage breakdown," the report states in the introductory chapter.

"We believe women do not always receive fair and equitable treatment in the courtroom as a result of direct and systemic biases based upon gender," it adds.

And here's one for the chauvinists. Throughout the report, the committee used the term "feminist." But to dispel the myths and misunderstandings about the word, the committee decided it was important to define it.

"Feminism is not about hating men. A feminist believes the world should be a comfortable place for women, men and children, free of stereotypes and myths which restrict the roles each may assume."

The report makes more than 300 recommendations, which is rather shocking in itself. Our justice system is our most important and often the last bulwark against our own follies, and as long as it remains so patently flawed, we are far from having reached our goal of being a fair and compassionate society.

Some of the problems the report says should be remedied include the lack of women judges, sexual harassment in law offices, and tasteless jokes in the courtroom.

All supposed to be equal before the courts

Other recommendations require education for judges and lawyers who can't seem to understand that all people are supposed to be equal before the courts.

As an example, the report mentions a job interviewer at the department of justice who asked a Native woman law student if she would be able to prosecute a case involving an Indian who was accused of trafficking in drugs. What an asinine question, but endemic of the gender bias that continues to permeate not only the justice system, but society as a whole.

We may be on our way towards a fairer society, devoid of discrimination against women, but we're not there yet. Not by a long shot. Affirmative action is clearly required, and I say it again, securing that women will have three seats on the new

Fernwood area residents
taking sides on light issue

Fernwood wharf lights are still up and still on.

An article in the September 2 issue of *Driftwood* about elimination of new lights on the wharf galvanized a number of local residents into action to keep the lights there.

A total of 59 residents have signed a petition to leave the lights in place. Coast Guard area manager for the mainland Ron Martin said "We're waiting to see what they have to say" before deciding the fate of the lights.

"It may come down to a public meeting. Right now the yeas outweigh the nays."

Fernwood Seaside Market has agreed to put up petitions either for or against the lights. So far there is only a petition in support of the lights.

"The no side can have a petition here too," store owner Lani Archambault said. "We're a community store and we made that offer."

Local resident Marilyn Marshall wants the lights to stay.

"People who live here know that the lights are necessary," she said.

"It's safer for school kids now."

The lights went up on Fernwood wharf in response to a request more than one year ago by a parent whose children used the wharf. The wharf was considered dangerous in

the dark winter months. Last month the lights were installed, connected and turned on, upsetting some members of the community enough to write to the Coast Guard, which paid for the lights.

CRD briefs

• Drader Environmental Ltd. was awarded the contract for drainage, irrigation and hydroseeding of Portlock Park.

On September 9, the Capital Regional District Board ratified an earlier recommendation by Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission to award the contract.

Seven firms tendered bids. Drader was the second lowest bid at \$66,200. The budgeted figure for the work was \$60,000 so after some discussion, the contract was amended for a final bid price of \$62,000.

• CRD Health Committee recommended creating two new positions within the health department to further develop its community health information capability.

The two new positions are manager of health information and health systems analyst.

"The improvement of Health Information Systems capability is instrumental in achieving at least four of the nine guidelines identified in the Royal Commission," the committee reported.

Another reason cited for the two new positions was "the anticipated shift of services and resources out of institutions into homes and home communities."

• At a meeting September 9, the CRD Board approved giving management and control of three Magic Lake sites to the Pender Island Parks and Recreation Commission.

In May 1989, Magic Lake Estates Water and Sewer Committee identified three sites on its land that were surplus to the needs of the utility. These are the Disk Park, used for frisbee golf and hiking, the Prior Site, used for hiking access to Prior Provincial Park and the Dam site, used as a swimming area.

Responsibility for running the sites as public spaces will be transferred to the Pender PRC but ownership remains with the CRD.

trust briefs

The following matters were discussed at Islands Trust Council's quarterly business meeting held in Victoria September 12.

First quarter finances

Operations manager Doug Levell reported that 19.51 per cent of the Trust's 1992-93 budget had been expended in the first quarter of the fiscal year.

Trust Council expenses had eaten the largest percentage of its annual apportionment, at \$29,622.24 of a \$96,534,000 budget. However, noted Levell, \$15,459 of the spent sum paid the elected officials liability insurance annual fee.

Local Trust committees had spent 14.76 per cent of their \$158,834 budget so far, while executive committee expenses totalled 28.09 per cent of its \$46,400 budget.

Only 3.7 per cent of funds allotted for all departments' legal services had been dispersed as of June 30.

Trust scoops showerheads

About 3,500 Islands Trust residents will have access to free B.C. Hydro water saving showerheads thanks to trustee Phil Clark plugging into some North Pender Island connections.

B.C. Hydro's Power Smart water saver program is now defunct, said Clark, but he has arranged for the Trust to receive the program's remaining showerheads.

Non-profit groups may be able to handle distribution of each island's bundle based on its population. Individuals will simply exchange their old showerhead for the new one, said Clark.

Changing legislation

Trustees agreed to pursue a formalized process of reviewing the *Islands Trust Act* at some point in the future with Minister of Municipal Affairs, Housing and Recreation Robin Blencoe.

A report prepared by Trust executive director Gordon McIntosh outlined the need for a review. He said the current act did not provide "sufficient authority and/or tools to more adequately implement its *preserve and protect* mandate" and is "silent on many routine aspects of the Trust in its capacity to serve as a local government."

McIntosh also cited the policy statement process, the failed Bowen Island incorporation attempt and Salt Spring Local Government Options study as inducements for change.

Artificial reefs

Islands Trust Council will ask B.C. environment minister John Cashore to set up a task force looking at creation of artificial reefs for recreational diving purposes in the Georgia Basin.

Gabriola trustees Jack Sickavish and Joan Best urged Trust action in light of recent applications for sinking of old ships near their island.

"We have information there is up to four more supposedly proposed, with 12 to 14 more behind that," said Best.

Private land forestry

Trustees agreed to try urging the municipal affairs and forestry ministries to set up an inter-agency task force looking at regulation of private land forestry, tax incentives and a related public education program.

Lasqueti trustee Janice McMillan initially wanted to communicate directly with premier

Policy forum input to be released

Input gathered at the Islands Trust policy forums during the summer will soon be released in report form for public consumption.

Islands Trust Council agreed Saturday to give 10 copies of the report to each island's Trust committee, for distribution to interested parties.

A further 120 copies will be sent

to government officials at various levels.

Additional copies of the report will be made available to the public for \$3 each.

Long range planning and policy manager Cynthia Hawksworth said the distribution plan would minimize costs while making the report available to as many people as possible.

Reports include brainstormed comments from the forums, island-by-island meeting summaries and the consulting firm's conclusions.

Forums called *Framing Our Common Future* were held on all Trust Area islands and in Victoria and Vancouver throughout the summer, led by Dovetail Consulting Inc. of Vancouver.

More than 1,200 people attended the workshops.

Public participation is aiding in development of the Trust policy statement, slated for completion in 1993, which will form the basis for future Trust legislation and Official Community Plans.

Further input will be requested after a first draft of the policy statement is released early next year.

English, Marshall elected

Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital Society elected four new members of its board and adopted a new set of bylaws at its annual general meeting September 16.

Current board chairperson Gordon English and Bank of Montreal Manager Dodie Marshall were elected for three-year terms. Dr. Stephen Thorsen was elected for a

two-year term and Bill Garrick was elected for a one-year term. Vice chairman Ron McQuiggan said the staggered terms would allow the board to be revitalized every year for the next three years.

Joseph Donahue, who was not present, was declared winner by acclamation for the two-year seat for North and South Pender.

After the elections, a new set of bylaws was adopted unanimously. The bylaws change society membership and allow employees of the hospital to become society members.

In years past, annual members owned property, zone members did not. Now there is one category of membership and the only requirements are that the applicant is at least 19-years-old and applies 15 days in advance of any meeting she/he wants to vote at.

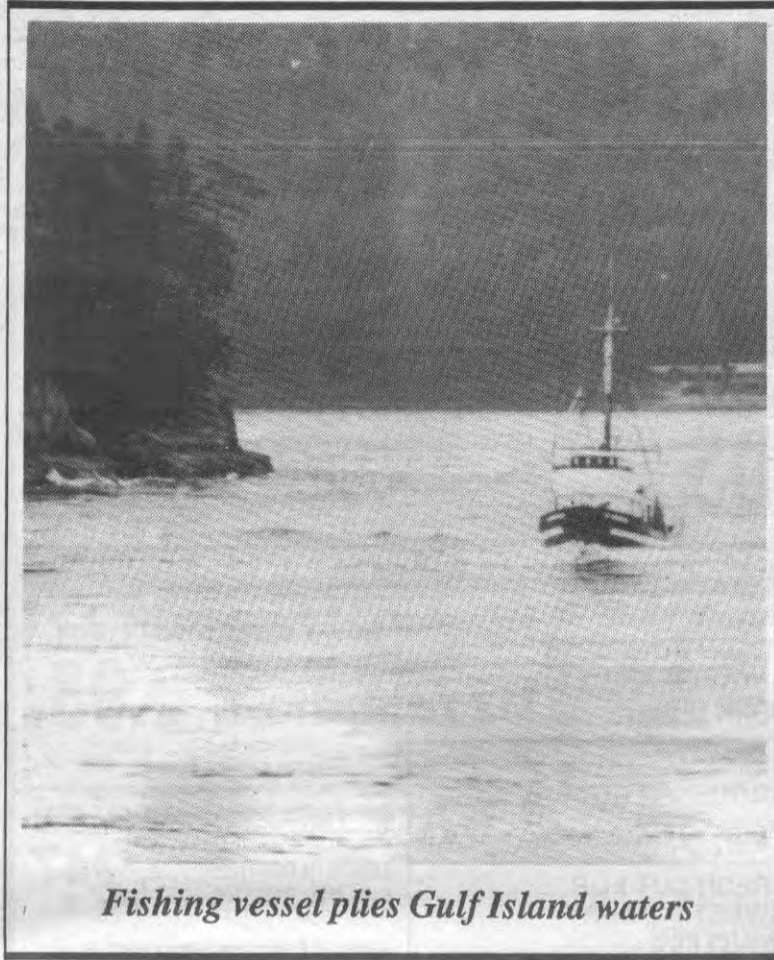
English said that since regulations require meetings to be advertised in advance of 15 days, it is possible to learn of a meeting and still apply for membership before that meeting.

This was not possible according to the last bylaws.

Hospital employees are now allowed to apply for society membership. At the 1991 annual general meeting a motion was passed instructing the board to petition the Minister of Health to allow this change. Elizabeth Cull, minister of health, agreed with the motion and the bylaw was changed accordingly.

New bylaws also require directors to adhere to a code of ethics adopted by the board and limit the term of office of the chairman, vice-chairman and secretary treasurer to three consecutive years.

In other business, the society unanimously passed a motion to eliminate society membership fees, which had been \$1 for zone members.

Ministry to fix accident hot spot

Recent surveying done by highways ministry workers brings Salt Spring drivers closer to losing one of the island's accident hot spots.

Ministry of Transportation and Highways area manager Mark Stevens said surveying work at the intersection of Upper and Lower Ganges roads records extra right-of-way space needed from Harbour House Hotel property to change the intersection "under one design scenario."


Negotiations between property owners and highways ministry staff to establish a new right-of-way are currently underway.

Stevens said major changes proposed are relocation of Upper Ganges Road northward and creation of a left-hand turn lane on Lower Ganges Road. The new lane will allow a continuous flow of southbound traffic on Lower Ganges Road while providing a safer way to make a left-hand turn onto Upper Ganges Road.

Also in the plans is "reducing the grade of the hill that comes up to the intersection so you're not having to start and stop on a steep hill."

He said he hoped negotiations would proceed quickly but no time frame for construction could yet be determined.

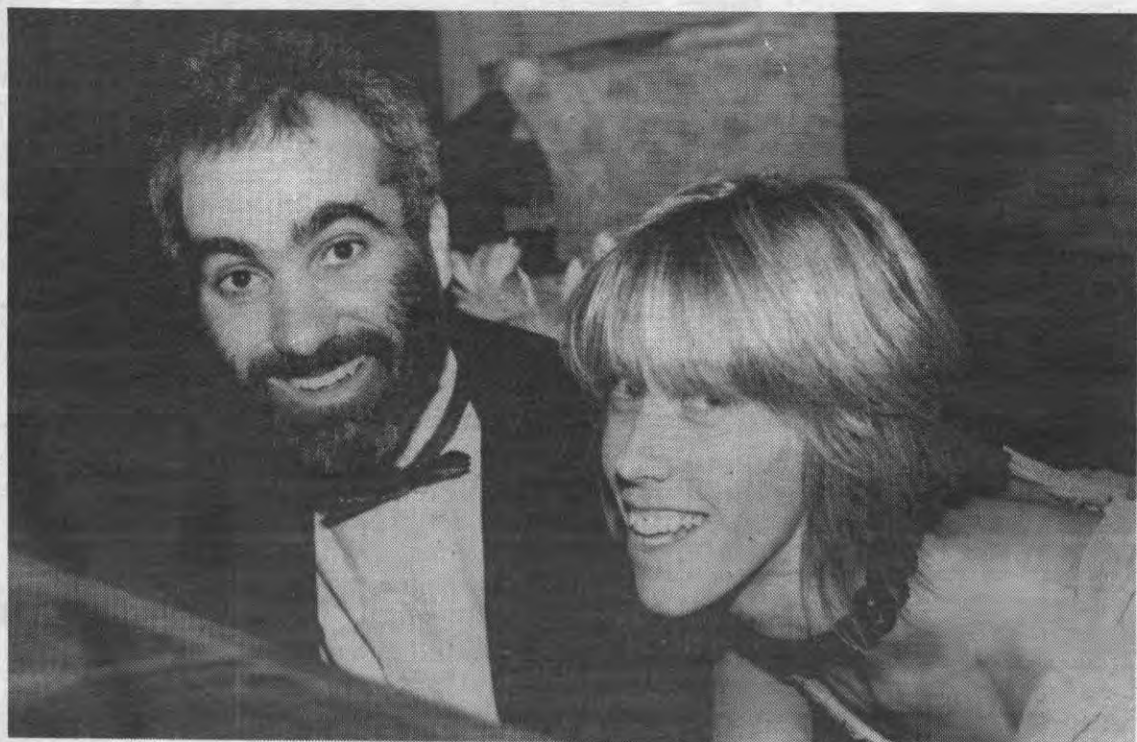

From Eggs to Apples will begin touring this month

Dance tours Fringe Festival Scott's From Eggs to Apples leaves this month

From Eggs to Apples, a multimedia dance production conceived and directed by Salt Spring Island choreographer Robbyn Scott, will be travelling to perform in the Victoria Fringe Festival this month.

The production premiered on Salt Spring Island in January of this year followed by a well-received performance in the *Women in View Festival* in Vancouver.

From Eggs to Apples performed by women and children from the community will also be touring to the Duncan Fringe, Galiano Island and Mayne Island in October.

A group of high school students will assist in the tour as part of a Careers Program through GISS. Funding for this "mini-tour" has come in part from the Gulf Islands Community Arts Council and a Recommender Grant from Vancouver's Dance Centre.

Ticket sales will hopefully cover the remaining costs of the production's remount and tour.

From Eggs to Apples is a show exploring the rites of passage of older women, celebrating the wisdom and empowerment gained from these experiences. It takes an introspective look at women's lives as they mature and achieve greater control and understanding of themselves and the world around them.

"The frankness of the women's exchanges — both in word and movement — reveal those familiar feelings of joy, fear, desire and vulnerability," said Lynda Jensen in a *Driftwood* review earlier this year.

Scott is happy to be bringing the show and its message out to audiences who otherwise wouldn't see the performance. Trish Nobile is helping with the tour as a part of a pilot project being designed to bring more performances to the outer islands.

Day unveils new series at Vortex

Margaret Day unveils a new series of drawings in her current exhibition at Vortex Gallery.

Titled *Same Boat*, the show is a continuation of last year's *In Search of Heroes*.

Same Boat opened September 12 and runs until October 1.

Day uses small Dipylon figures as the primary focus of work in the exhibit and graphite as the primary material.

"I love graphite," says Day. "It is wonderful stuff, capable of energy and elegance, graininess, smoothness, directness and subtlety."

She is also fascinated by the Dipylon figures which she describes as the small geometric images on Athenian Dipylon vases (750 B.C.) — "detached and universal in their simplicity."

Day originally intended to use the figures "to consider the myth of the dead hero and its relevance to our society at the end of the 20th century. Dipylon figures, I decided, were the start of a terrible tendency of our civilization to honour the dead and ignore the deaths. However, as I continued to use and research the figures, I realized that the theories, including my own, were more relevant to the times in which they were written than to the times of which they wrote," she says.

"The figures are evocative of the human condition. They serve as a focus. The connections, intellectual and intuitive, which I have made, are part of their continuing life as symbols, as such their meaning is altered by each new

"They are reflections on and, I hope, of our times."

Day splits her time between Fulford Harbour and Edmonton and is a member of both the artist-run Vortex Gallery and Latitude 53 in

Edmonton.

She has had numerous solo and group shows in Edmonton since 1981 and taught art at Fort Park Elementary in Fort Saskatchewan, Alberta for several years.
