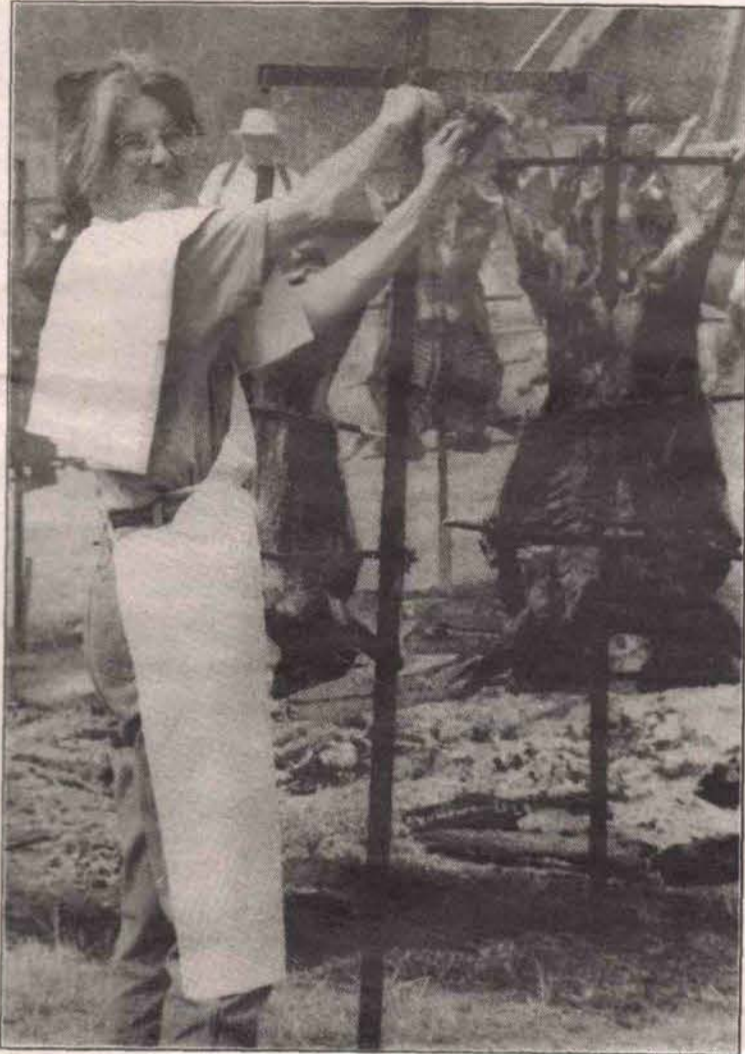

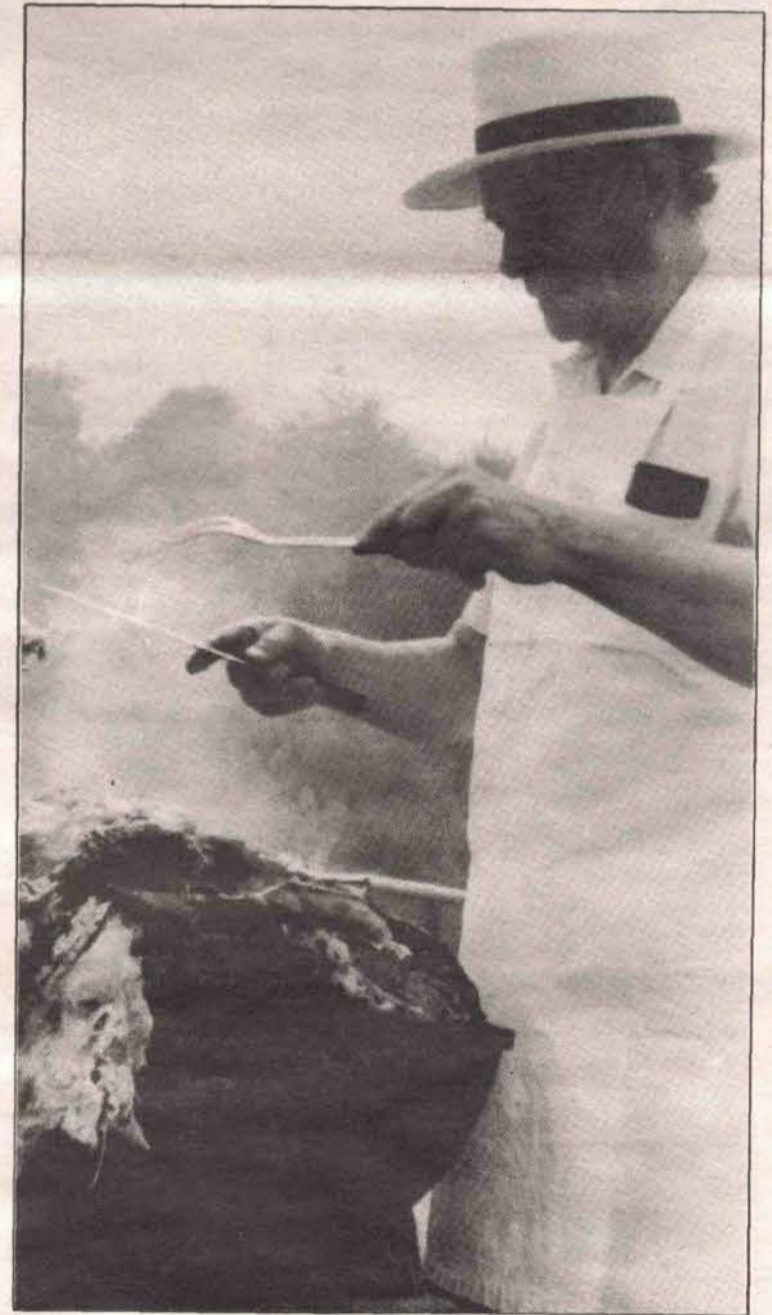

And that's Father's Day.

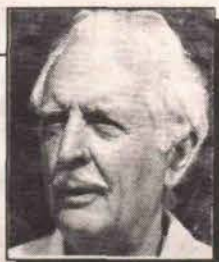
What time did you say?

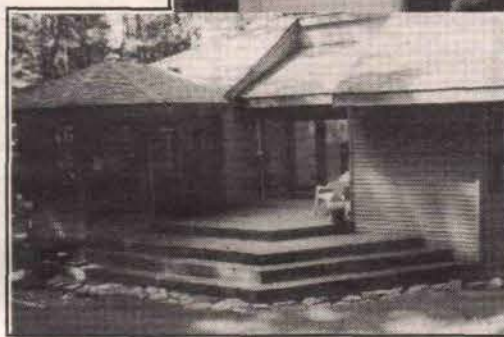

Posters, ad mark birthday as ex-victim gets own back

It was payback time. That's what drove Salt Spring's Jeff Outerbridge to devote time, effort and money — \$150 was his estimate — to "get" Jim Buckley last week.

And by all accounts, he got him. When Buckley drove to work last Wednesday morning from his Quebec Drive home, it didn't take him long to notice the newly-erected posters along the roadside. He couldn't help but notice because the poster contained his photograph and in large type above it the word, "Gotcha!"

The photo itself showed Buckley pulling a face during a party at the Ganges fire hall. Both Buckley and Outerbridge are volunteer firemen.

Buckley, who works for Victoria Highways Maintenance Corp., said this week that he "wasn't too annoyed" when he saw the posters but admitted that he ran one down with his truck.

Outerbridge, a sales representative with the *Driftwood*, said he had 36 posters made in both black and white and colour, using a colour photocopier for the latter. By Wednesday morning, they were plastered all over Ganges.

In addition, the poster was reproduced in an advertisement in last week's paper.

So what prompted the stunt? Last year, Buckley did the same thing to Outerbridge. Posters appeared around town with a photo of Outerbridge with a head full of curly locks.

It too appeared as an advertise-

ment.

This year, Outerbridge turned the tables on Buckley, whom he called "a chronic prankster."

Chronic may be the key word here. Buckley would not elaborate

but there was no doubt that Outerbridge has not had the last word. Reminded that he had a year to wait — Outerbridge's birthday was last week too — Buckley said: "It doesn't have to be his birthday."

Shared agriculture is farmers' meet topic

Salt Spring Farmers' Institute is hosting a visit by Brewster and Cathleen Kneen tomorrow night (Thursday) to talk about community shared agriculture.

This is a relatively new and growing concept among non-commercial farmers which seeks to bring community members who are not farmers closer to the farming process. People buy shares of a crop at the beginning of a season and share the risk and responsibility of bringing that crop to harvest.

"Those who buy shares in the farm crop are not 'supporting' agriculture," Brewster Kneen wrote in February's *Ram's Horn*, a newsletter of food systems analysis, "they are engaged in it, in a way very similar to the ways 'family' members participated in the multi-generational farms of the pre-industrial age."

"It seems to be clear to everyone involved in this growing movement that the food tastes better not just because of its proximity but because it has a real social context — it is a community enterprise from seed time to harvest."

The Kneens have spent many years studying the theories of food production and distribution. They spent 15 years on a farm in Nova Scotia learning the practicalities of running a small farm before returning to Toronto in 1986. Kneen is the author of several books on agriculture, including *From Land to Mouth* and *Rape of Canola*.

The Kneens will be at the Farmers' Institute building, Rainbow Road, Thursday at 8 p.m.

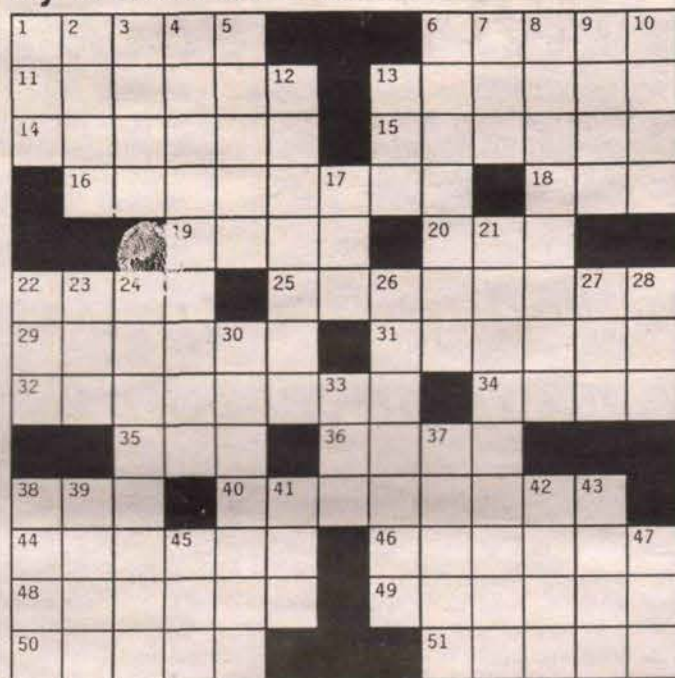

Mission resident born here in 1893

A woman born on Salt Spring Island celebrated her 100th birthday last month.

Catherine Mann was born June 15, 1893, the seventh child of Nelson and Esther Rogers, proprietors of the Fulford Inn. She celebrated her birthday with a gathering of family and friends at the extended care unit of Mission Memorial Hospital.

Mann spent many years living with her husband Harry in a floating logging camp in Kingcome Inlet, where they raised five children. Though she never learned how to swim, she made sure everyone else did.

Later, Mann took over the only government-run, floating school in the British empire. She boarded children from other camps to help keep Simoom Sound school going until her own children completed their education. She moved to Powell River after being widowed in 1953, and remained there until 1977 when she moved to Mission.

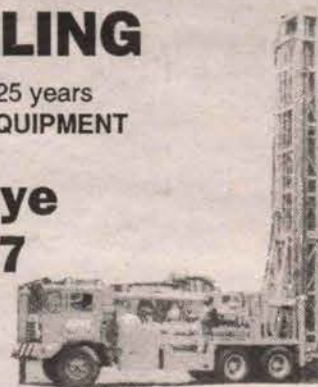
Mann has lost three sons, two granddaughters and two grandsons. She has 13 grandchildren, 30 great grandchildren and four great-great grandchildren.

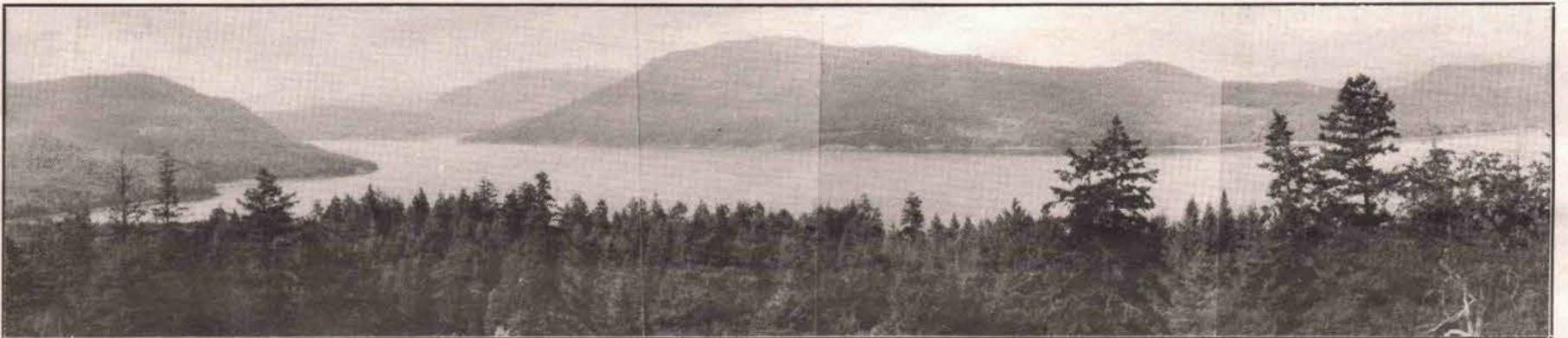

Islanders 'speak up for themselves' at conference

More than 500 physically and mentally disabled people from all over British Columbia converged on the Okanagan city of Penticton June 3, 4 and 5 to listen to seminars, meet one another and have some fun together.

Eddie Waddell and Terry Swing were there as Salt Spring Island delegates, to tell other self-advocates from around the province about the new self-advocacy group set up on Salt Spring earlier this year.

The whole experience was new and exciting for all, community worker Morgan Traquair said. The island delegates rode the new super-ferry, *Spirit of British Columbia*, and then travelled through the Coast Mountains to Penticton.

"It was good," Waddell said. "You could see the scenery. You could see for miles."

They arrived a day early — June 2 — and while Traquair went off to meetings, Swing and Waddell went off to explore the town on their own.

"We walked together," Swing said. "We helped each other. I would help Eddie in his speech. He would watch me for my seizures."

The next day the conference started. There were 10 rooms where seminars, lectures and presentations were made, as well as designated areas for coffee breaks, meals and meeting. It was easy to get lost, and many of the self-advocates did get lost, time and again. But with map in hand, Swing and Waddell navigated their way from session to session.

"I feel good," Waddell said of the workshops. "It got me thinking."

"Some of the meetings were just to tell people what was going on in different places," Swing said. "We found out how small we are on Salt Spring. There was a lot more going on in other places."

"We found out how exhausted we were by the end of the day. We'd have a meeting with the two

of us to talk about what went on during the day."

"Being in a small workshop, discussing something that was of importance to them was a huge confidence-booster," Traquair said.

"Two years ago we went to (Camosun) College and just listened," Swing added. "Now we were speaking up for ourselves."

The workshops ranged from topics like conflict resolution to communication to income assistance issues and guardianship. One of the seminars, titled *Victims No More!*, addressed the need to learn how to say no to strangers. How close should one allow a stranger to come? How close a friend?

"People who have only lived in institutions never learned about

personal space or privacy," Traquair said. "It has to be learned as a conscious effort."

At another round-table discussion, Swing said he and Waddell told other self-advocates about their new group on Salt Spring Island. "People in big cities have more opportunities, more access," Traquair said. "In smaller communities we have to create the op-

portunities or go to the big cities."

But as well as all the serious topics and the business issues for the province-wide community living association, there was also some fun. On one day a casino was set up in one of the convention centre ballrooms with a riverboat theme and dixieland music.

Swing discovered he has a special talent for blackjack.

Quick dip more than sobering experience

Boaters who believe a quick dip in the salt chuck will sober them up rather than put them at risk should think again.

That's the message from the Canadian Red Cross, which has statistics showing that 75 per cent of recreational fishermen who drowned while fishing from small boats were "significantly intoxicated."

In all drownings from small power boats, 53 per cent of the victims were intoxicated.

"People who drink and boat fail to realize how quickly they can be in danger when out on the water," says Red Cross spokesman Rick Graham. "A minor incident that normally would not be a problem can become disastrous if you lack normal coordination and reaction time due to drunkenness."

"... It's a myth to think that being suddenly dumped into cold water will sober you up. Unfortunately, you'll drown very quickly because your reactions will be slower due to the alcohol and your ability to save yourself will be greatly impaired."

Don't overlook the children in family's time of grief

This was a sad funeral indeed. Roger was a 42-year-old father of three; Andrew, 4, Mary, 8, and Jacob, 10. He died instantly of a brain haemorrhage while taking the dog for a walk early on a spring evening a few months ago. He and his wife Joss were happily married and well-settled in a small prairie city.

The prairie culture is predictable and helpful in such emergencies. Neighbours responded with support immediately and it was assumed that Roger's body would be embalmed and lodged in the local funeral home for three days until the funeral service. The family would receive guests on successive evenings and the funeral would be from the family home, to the church for the service and then to the interment of the body in the local community cemetery.

Though a daunting challenge, meeting friends and those who "come to pay respects" eases the shock of sudden loss for many families, and starts the process of grief-sharing. These evening receptions are often marked by many tears, much laughter, warm memories acknowledged or just a simple wordless embrace.

This is fine for adults, but what about the children?

My friend Colin, the minister in this situation, happens to be a very competent pastor with profound sensitivity to people's needs and longings in the midst of suffering



and loss. When he asked Joss about the children the morning after Roger's death, as they were struggling with her desperate grief and the need to make funeral plans, she replied that they would be picked up in an hour by an old and close school friend with whom they would stay until after the funeral.

She added that they were "too young to have to face this and it would seriously disturb them to be around all this grief and upset."

That's when Colin, who knew Joss reasonably well, presented her with an alternative.

The long and short of what he advised, and she hesitantly agreed to, was that her friend would come to take a major responsibility for the children but everybody would stay together at home. Colin told Joss that children usually handle the death of a parent with equal capability to an adult and they really accept the full range of emotions from delight to dismay. They need to mourn and to be with their family as they are mourning.

What children have a hard time with is evasion; when, for instance, a parent feels he or she must not let a child see tears because it would be a sign of weakness that would cause the child to feel unprotected. What children need at the time of such trauma is a sense of security

born of the awareness that even though there has been a tragic occurrence, they themselves are cherished enough to be included in most aspects of that difficult time.

And so the children were in the most direct care of their favourite honorary "aunt" for the next few days along with grandparents who arrived a day later. They were with their mother at the funeral home for an hour or so on one evening. The two oldest were at the funeral and all three were at the reception after the service.

Most importantly of all, Mary and Jacob were in on things from the outset. The minister met with them and their mother to describe to them in detail what a memorial service was for and what form it would take. Then he gave them the choice of whether they wished to be there or not.

I suspect these children will be stronger, more sensitive and compassionate as they grow older because of the respect shown them at the time of their father's death.
