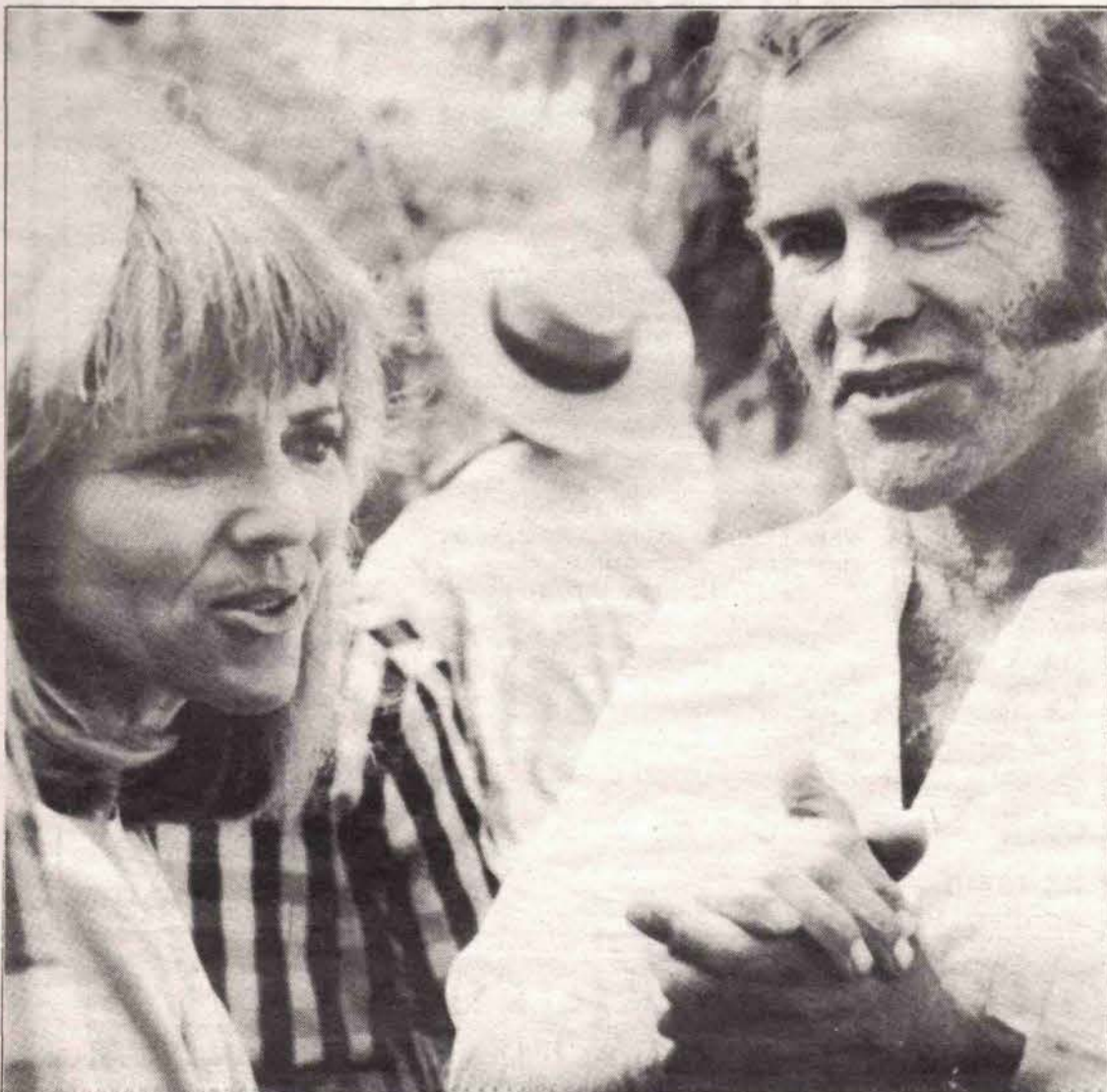

Local programming coming but no extension of service

Community programming and more television channels are in the cards for Salt Spring cable subscribers, but service to new districts is not, say Geoff and Linda Phillips of Salt Spring Cablevision.

Some of the impetus for change may have come from the 59 interventions sent to the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) in response to Salt Spring Cablevision's licence renewal application.

All letters sent to the CRTC have been answered by the Phillips,

including one from Donald Chace which included a petition signed by 190 island residents.

"We didn't think we had enough coverage on the island," Chace said. "There are many people who don't have television. We've been trying to get it for a long time. Six years ago I asked them.

"I have nothing against Salt Spring Cablevision. But I think we could be served. We've come from areas where we're used to television.

"It may be too expensive but I'd like to find out."

He also wanted to see more channels available and faster ser-

vice and repair when there are problems.

The latter two of Chace's concerns will be addressed, Salt Spring cablevision owner Geoff Phillips said.

"(Community programming) has always been in the works, as soon as we were getting to 1,700 or 1,800 (subscribers).

"We're looking at hiring somebody at the end of July or the beginning of August. The position has been really well received. Some of the people are well qualified...."

The part-time community programmer will tape meetings, public celebrations like Sea Capers or other community events.

"We've got a lot of equipment already," Phillips said. "We should be able to start right away (when someone is hired)."

In addition, Salt Spring Cablevision is investigating expanded channel service for the island. Phillips said there may be as many as six new channels by January, but they would be available as part of a package with a different rate structure than the current 19 channels offered.

People could still choose to have fewer channels and pay less, he said.

The CRTC is expected to make a decision about the licence renewal application by the end of August.

Trust faces protest to policy statement

Some Pender Island residents have only recently discovered the Islands Trust policy statement and they do not like what they have found. Monday night, about 60 of them gathered at the Pender Island library to form the Pender Island Taxpayers' Association.

Several task forces were formed to deal with issues the members felt were pressing, including the publication of a newsletter, examination of the policy statement and consideration of legislative changes to the Islands Trust Act.

"Perhaps the most important (task force) is to deal with what we consider to be the inefficient distribution of the policy statement," general secretary Clifford Hunt said.

"This Trust policy statement must be read.

"No one here has a copy. In the judgment of many, (Pender Island trustees) are sitting on it."

Hunt said Pender residents have had difficulty getting copies of the latest draft of the statement. Unlike Salt Spring, which has a Trust office, Pender residents must go to Victoria to get a copy if they cannot get one from local trustees.

A task force will closely ex-

amine the latest draft of the policy statement and forward criticisms to various government agencies, Hunt said.

The preserve and protect mandate needs clarification too, Hunt said, to give direction to the Trust and trustees about policies.

"The mandate, especially the word preserve — it cannot be done. We can't freeze things," Hunt said. "There has to be a mandate to reflect that.

"Preserve is to preserve the physical loveliness of these islands without unduly restricting the rights of citizens. Why should we be second-class citizens because we live here?"

"In the view of many we should look to preserve, recognizing the fact that people already live here.

"I totally support the intent of the mandate. I'm not anti-Trust, just anti-bureaucracy."

He said his idea of preserving and protecting the Gulf Islands would mean there would be no rezoning.

That means no up-zoning (increasing density) but also no down-zoning (decreasing density) without compensation for land owners.

500 cyclists expected on island Saturday

More than 500 cyclists will converge upon Salt Spring Saturday as part of a "Big Island Tour".

Riders from many points in Canada and the western United States will tour Salt Spring and Vancouver islands for five days with Imagine Tours, a California-based company.

The cyclists will travel to Salt Spring from Swartz Bay on an extra

sailing as well as the regular sailings, Sidney tour coordinator Brenda Harfield said.

The tour will take the cyclists from Fulford to Vesuvius, where they will board the ferry to Crofton.

Imagine Tours organized a similar bicycle tour last July which saw an estimated 480 cyclists on the island.

Art for children at park Saturdays

The "in" place to be this summer is going to be Ganges linear creek park, across from ArtSpring. Starting Saturday, kids and parents are invited to come to "ArtSpringin' for kids" — a morning of dancing, singing, acting and all sorts of arts activities.

"It's like a little taste of what will be coming out of ArtSpring for kids and adults," April Curtis said. "It's a gift to the kids from island artists and helps bring attention back to ArtSpring."

Each week for the next two months different artists will give their time and talent to work with groups of children in the park.

This Saturday, Sue Bowler and Rory Cliche will be conducting kids in drumming and dancing sessions — and whatever else comes

along.

July 24, Shauna Grylls and others will conduct a session on miming, clowning, face-painting and costumes. July 31, April Curtis will conduct a session on acting and storytelling.

The children will be divided into groups and given a project in which everyone participates. Towards the end of each session the groups will come together to share what they have done and what they have learned.

"We're here to have fun," Curtis said. "We're here to indicate our desire to have a place, a home, for the arts . . . We are so close. We can taste it."

This is what dance is all about

It's 5 a.m. Saturday. I want to write about *Trespassing* — the performance by They Said Dance which we saw last night. What an evening — a first-class evolution of a humane process. There was truly something behind all this — months of work, anguish, self doubt, passion enthusiasm and, with this final performance, ecstasy for the audience. That's art! Take a little and make a lot out of it.

Those who came most assuredly felt a great interconnectedness. I ask myself, how so? Where did this value come from? I was overwhelmed by a special effect, the effect of a special gift generated by a group of people.

This was the result of a group effort — crafting, building, changing, anguishing, pushing themselves and taking us with them.

Ahhh! This is what dance is about. This is what theatre is about. This is what all art is about this is why it has value. One doesn't see too much of it — but we experienced it last night.

Coming into the theatre space we passed through a cavern of black plastic sheet — then more of the stuff bubbling on the floor. What is this? There is something that's alive. What is it?

Suddenly this whole mass is transformed into a whirling phantasmagoria of material. Dancers break through and the performance develops — The Sea-egg-Searchers, Desperation Duet, Exiles, Is That All There Is?, Motherless Child, Secrets, Divine Mother — wonderful images portrayed with the effervescence of dance. Not just dumped out as a bunch of esoteric concepts, but thoroughly transposed through the articulation

of dance.

One is made to experience a reality — not something just told about, but something created in the watchers by the dancers who make us all dance. Intermission, everyone is asked to leave.

Act II: we are back again to our plastic bubbling world. Once again the rushing of a spirit that motivates everything — Sea-eggs (again), Creature, Infants and Protectors, and the Final Ritual — building up to a tremendous and climactic experience.

It is not possible to describe all this. It is enough to say this experience generates in me a "gift of the heart." Materials used were the cast-offs in our world (plastic, scaffolding, humans) of No Commercial Value. Through a great exertion of spirit all is transformed into a surging and great wind of (dare I say) love!

Diverse pieces by Turnagain

The Turnagain Dance Collective offered an entertaining and thought-provoking show recently when they presented *Take Back the Body* at the Festival of the Arts. The two-hour performance of a dozen pieces by different members of the company offered a nice mixture of material, a mixture that probably served to entertain a diverse audience.

Having taken lessons in dance of a more conventional nature — foxtrot, jive and others — from both Lottie Devendisch and Sue Bowler, this writer was prepared to see some talented presentations.

The more enjoyable were the more conventional, such as the synchronized dance steps of the chorus in *Reclaiming Evora*, a piece choreographed by Yarrow Sheehan, or Robbyn Scott's *Rooting Out-and-About Time*. The key in both was the music and the rhythm.

There was some humour to many of the pieces, an attribute that can go a long way towards strengthening a serious message, such as disarmament, the topic of a piece by Sue Bowler.

A highlight that many in the audience will not soon forget was Lillian Horsdal's entry on the stage. Rather than take back the body, a

scantily-clad Horsdal gave into societal pressures and proceeded to doll herself up. It was very effective, and not without humour.

A particularly spell-binding piece was *The Meridian Figure Project* by Denise Bertrand, in which she wore strings of lights, each supposed to be located upon an acupuncture point of the body. In a darkened hall, the effect was powerful and mesmerizing.

If anyone went looking for flaws, they may have found some as a result of the absence of one dancer. A minor accident days before the show left Mike Krayenhoff unable to perform, and others had to take her place.

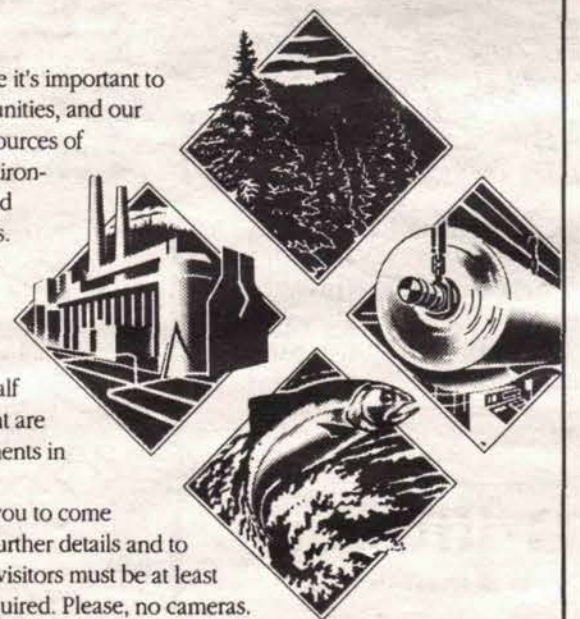

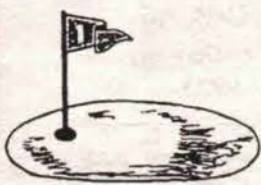

Family emotions are explored by show

Flesh hangs limp, grey, cold. Bodies cower, defensive and protective. Eyes only steal sideways glances, reaching out, looking for answers before questions can be voiced. This is *Exposed Flesh*, an exhibition of work by Edmonton artist Kim Harris.

The paintings in Salt Spring's artist-run Vortex Gallery expose the complexities of emotions within families — whether family means blood relatives or a self-chosen family.

"Everybody has a family. Everybody has a history," Harris said. "One of the things I've tried to do is strip away all the superficial things. That's why the paintings are so sparse."

Life-size figures stare out from starkly coloured canvases. Relationships are defined by distance and by body language: bodies defensive and turned away, eyes apprehensive and imploring understanding and acceptance.

A multi-media performance

Saturday night by Harris' sister Pamela brought together brother, sister and mother and magnified the impact of the paintings. But the theatrical piece — with sound by island resident Lynne Quinn — also proved that the tension inherent in relationships which are steeped in the "intricacies of silence" can be worked out and form the basis of new, stronger relationships.

"When I was working with the paintings I kept coming up with this duality: expressing emotion and the fear of getting hurt," Pamela Harris said. "There were always at least two things going on: angst, turmoil, reaching out, heaviness and softness."

"How do you play with both these ideas? There is a constant movement, which is fantastic — which is what relationships are. This is what life is."

"In my prairie family," Kim Harris said, "you don't talk about anything emotional or difficult."

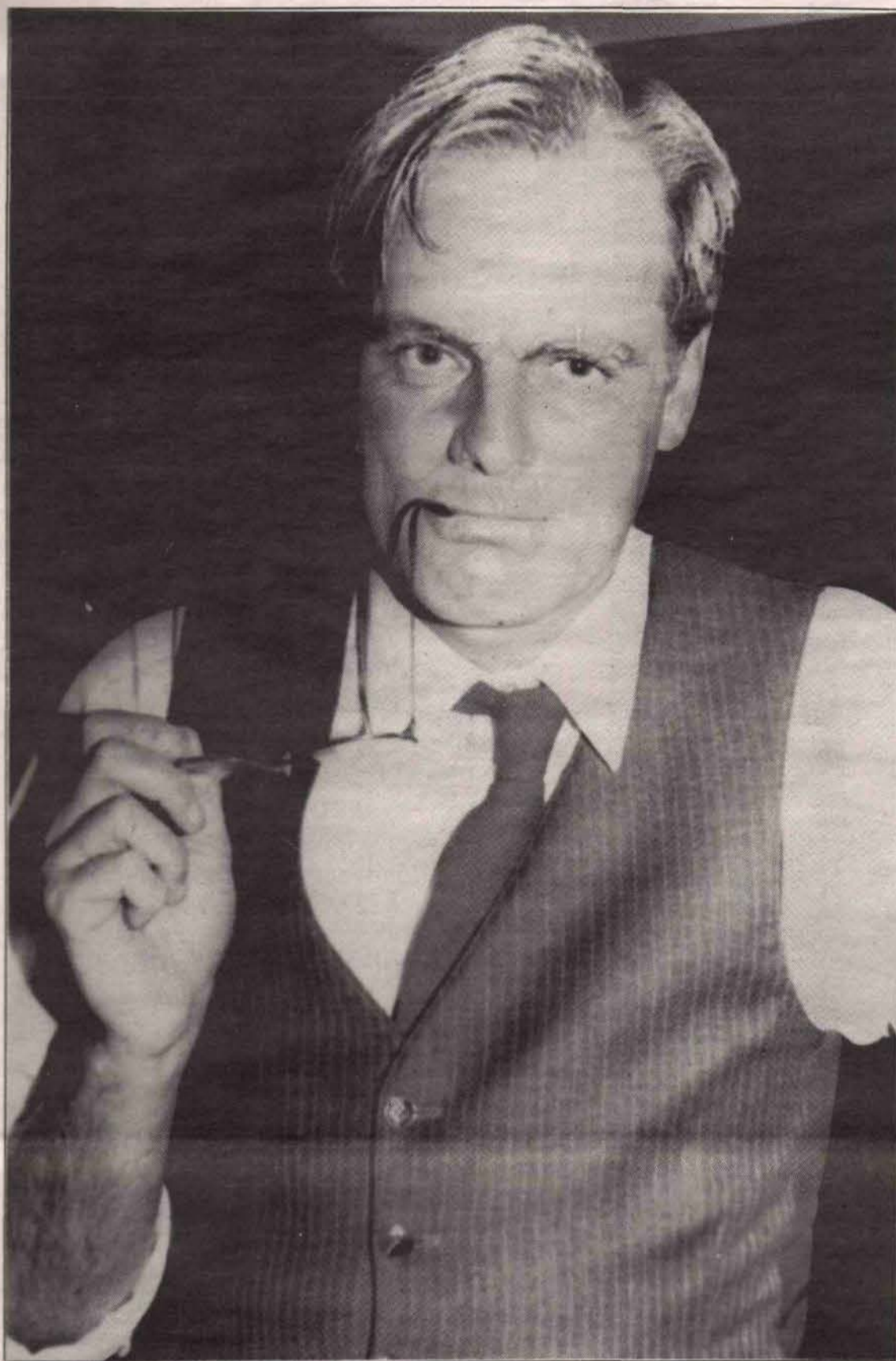

Play has mark of good theatre

Theatre Alive!'s newest production, *Clarence Darrow* by David Rintels, is the kind of play that will get people talking, reading and thinking. And that is the mark of good theatre.

The show is a sketch of the life and times of the American criminal lawyer Clarence Seward Darrow, whose career spanned the decades from about 1875 to 1930. He became the most famous lawyer of his time and spent his whole career fighting on behalf of the "poor, the weak and the weary."

Starring Jeremy Davis, *Clarence Darrow* is an illuminating and colourful history lesson, social commentary and glimpse of a man and his world. Yvonne Adalian's stage direction fills the courtroom, witness box and judge's bench with make-believe characters which makes the cast seem much larger than its one-person complement.

Davis moves between voices as easily as he moves from armchair to jury box and his voices — from avuncular storyteller to persuasive advocate to cajoling elder — keeps the audience enthralled with events as Darrow remembers them.

Darrow's criminal career really

begins when he moves to Chicago from rural Ohio in 1885. His cases read like a catalogue of labour and social struggles in America which, contrary to modern portrayals, was anything but the land of opportunity.

Darrow's character comes alive in the tiny theatre space set up at Waterside Bistro. Suspenders, glasses and waistcoat are used to great effect to plant that seed of reasonable doubt in 12 good men and true. But as well as battling against the injustices of the so-called captains of industry and on behalf of the forgotten promises contained in the Declaration of Independence, the play has humour and personality.

Darrow tells us how he hates spinach and shredded wheat. He tells how everyone in the town where he grew up thought a particular old man had written the Declaration of Independence because, as long as anyone could remember, he read it every fourth of July. He proudly describes the height of his popularity when he saved the town's reputation in a baseball game. With two men on and two men out, he hit the ball "over the grocery store."

And for courtroom drama on Salt Spring this summer, I can tell

you there is nothing better than *Clarence Darrow*.

Band has blues roots

A band drawing its sound from the roots of the blues will be entertaining on Salt Spring this weekend.

Elmore's Bar and Grill has a sound derived from blues artists such as Robert Johnson and Muddy Waters and ranging to contemporary artists like Paul Butterfield and the Fabulous Thunderbirds.

Johnny Shuffles and S.P. Wadsworth formed the band in 1985 and since then it has worked the lower Vancouver Island bar scene.

With Shuffles on guitar and vocals, Wadsworth on bass and vocals, Ken Preston on drums, and Bill Johnson on guitar, the group produces electric music for the mind and body.

Atwood, Gibson will read for arts festival

An evening of readings by Canadian authors Margaret Atwood and Graeme Gibson will take place this week as part of the Salt Spring Festival of the Arts.

Atwood has been publishing her works — which include poetry, fiction, non-fiction and children's stories — since the 1960s.

The award-winning writer is well known for many books, such as *Surfacing*, *Lady Oracle*, *The Edible Woman*, *The Handmaid's Tale*, *Cat's Eye*, and most recently, *Good Bones*.

Atwood has twice received the governor-general's award, in addition to many others.

She lives in Toronto with her husband, writer Graeme Gibson, and their two-year-old daughter Jess.

Gibson has a new book out, entitled *Gentleman Death*.

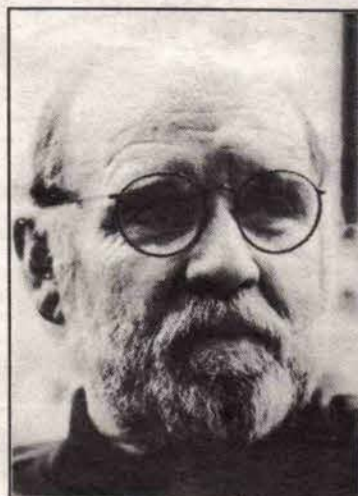
He wrote his first novel, *Five Legs*, in 1969. It was acclaimed by *Saturday Night* as "the most sophisticated writing ever done in Canada."

He has written five books over the years including *Communion*, *Eleven Canadian Novelists*, and *Perpetual Motion*, and many of his works have been published throughout the world.

Gibson has read from his work in half a dozen European countries, in Latin America, India, Australia, as well as in many centres across Canada and the United States.

Gibson has also written for film, TV, and radio. Active in cultural politics since the 1970s, he was the initial organizer and founding member of the Writers' Union of Canada.

Atwood and Gibson will appear at the Activity Centre Friday. Donations to ArtSpring will be accepted at the door in lieu of an admission charge.

Musical reveals gut humour, violence of township life

An examination of the catastrophe that is black education and the collision of generations and cultures in South Africa is highlighted this week with a performance at Ganges by an international group called the Sibikwa Players.

D.E.T. Boys High tells the story of a rural youth named Thoko who has recently undergone circumcision at a traditional initiation.

He is ridiculed for it by his teacher so he sets out to defend his honour and culture and to seek revenge.

Thoko solicits the assistance of Mingus, the school drug pusher, Bozol, an aspiring gangster, and T. Man, the scholar.

The old school janitor, who cynically observes the boys and tries to provide the voice of reason, also gets drawn in.

The performance — a musical — has been described as "a wonderfully rollicky, remorseless

revelation of all the artistic violence and gut humour of township life."

The Sibikwa Community Theatre Project was established in 1988 to develop the talents and skills of the black community on the East Rand in the Transvaal.

It is particularly concerned with school dropouts and offers classes in theatre skills to equip youth with the means to become financially self-sufficient.

An employment program for talented adults is also being run by the project, which assists adults in developing shows whereby they may earn income.

The Sibikwa Players are prepared to do a bonus, cabaret-style show after the theatre production if there is a large enough turnout to warrant it.

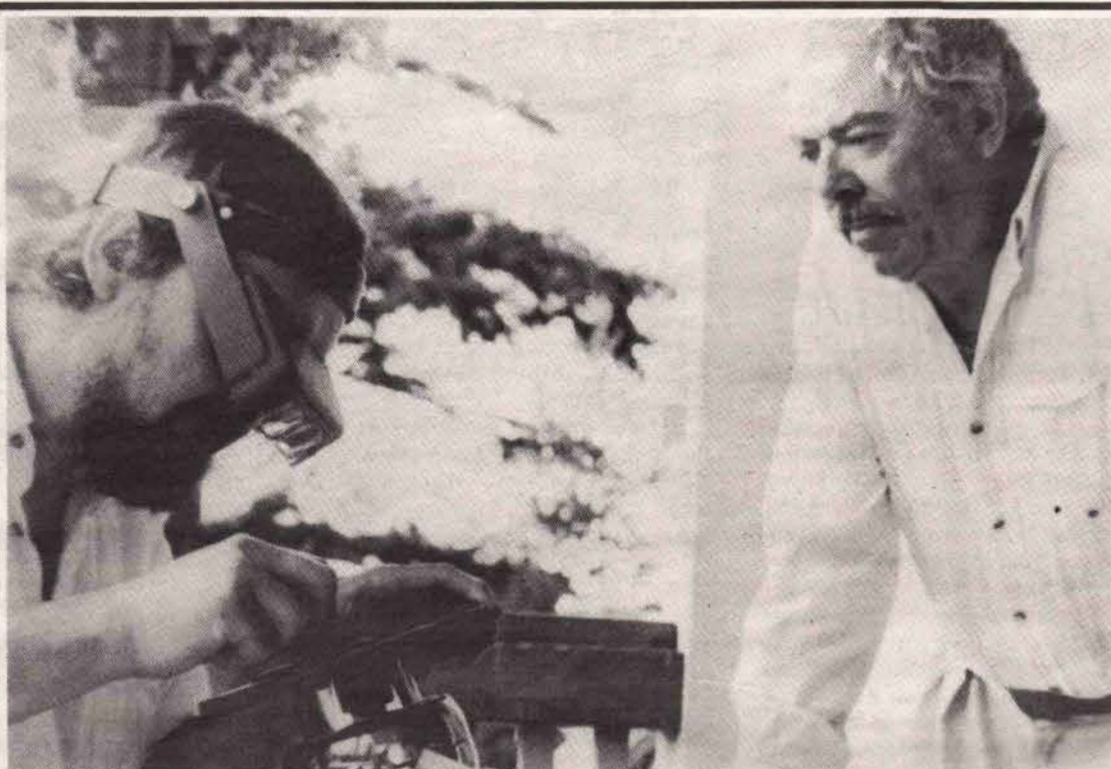

Good things are easy to talk about. They are right up front: "How are you? I'm fine."

But more difficult, emotional questions — including the acceptance of gay and lesbian relationships — are left unsaid, unaddressed and unanswered. Silence defines the family and hinders the search for acceptance, support and understanding.

One painting — "Intruder" — shows how exposed relationships are to the scrutiny and judgment of others. Another work, "Siblings,"

got a strong reaction from Pamela. "Yuck. What are you doing to me? How dare you do that," she said. "But then I started to look at the expressions, what is behind it all.

"What I'm trying to do in the show is get the other side, leaving the hurting, the pain . . . behind somehow, to find your way out of that and find something lighter, more embracing to bring other people into your life."

Kim echoed that sentiment. "There are glimmers of hope,"

he said. "They may not be so up front, but they are there."

His paintings, for all that they are based on his own family experiences in rural Saskatchewan, are provokingly universal.

For good or bad, we are all recovering family members. We must confront relationships with others, and gird our own exposed flesh with honesty and openness. Therein lies understanding and happiness.

Exposed Flesh continues at the Vortex Gallery until July 15.
