## This island family has taste for pioneer, primitive past

Buckskin robes, flintlock rifles and powder horns may seem like museum pieces to most people. But for some they are much more than that.

All across North America, people gather by the hundreds at weekend rendezvous to re-enact pioneer life from the early 1800s. Salt Spring's own Frank and Sylvia Tarodi have had the urge "to go primitive" for more than 20 years now.

"I've always been interested in guns," Frank told the *Driftwood*. "I used to see these guys in the May Day parade (in Victoria) fire these guns off the float in the early 1970s. I said to myself, 'I'm going to join this club.'"

And he did. He helped start the Malahat Marauders.

Mountain men; pioneers; powder competitors. There are many names for people who try to follow as exactly as possible or as exactly as convenient the ways of North American frontier life of more than 150 years ago.

"All a mountain man had was his rifle and his equipment," Frank said. "He had to live off the land."

Rifles before 1830 or so were called flintlocks. A flint hammer struck down on a steel, igniting a trail of gunpowder which led into the barrel of the gun. More powder and a cloth patch inside ignited and propelled a lead ball in the general direction of the next meal — say a deer or moose.

Frank has a flintlock and has hunted with it often. He has even shot a huge grizzly bear with one. When asked what would have happened if he had missed on the first shot, Frank says only, "A lot of people didn't have time to reload."

About 1830, the percussion rifle was invented, which was fired not by a flint but by a hammer hitting a small gunpowder cap on a nipple, which ignited the powder inside through a hole.

"Percussion guns could fire much faster, about as fast as a modern gun," Frank said, "but if you run out of caps you may as well not have a gun."

"With a flintlock, if you broke the flint, you could pick up a rock, put it in its place and it would still

work."

As well as the all-important rifle, men and women on the frontiers of North America in 1830 would have to have had powder horns, all kinds of knives, tomahawks and of course, clothes. Everything, or virtually everything was made by the men and women themselves.

The Tarodis have learned, or been forced to take on the challenges, of making all these things themselves.

"I didn't know I was capable of doing these things," Frank said of all the equipment he has made over the years.

"Take these knives. I looked all over the country. I even wrote to Sheffield in England (where British

steel comes from). I ended up making them myself and now I make them to order for others."

He makes all sorts of knives of different sizes and with different names: the Arkansas toothpick, for example.

Handles are made from moose, elk or deer horn.

He has several powder horns, some of them beautifully patterned. Milking-cow horns make the best ones, apparently.

The buckskin clothes Frank and Sylvia make themselves — with the aid of a sewing machine. They keep the wind out, Frank said, but on a hot day they're really hot.

He spends a lot of time in the winter making equipment, like the pioneers did before there was television or even electric light. Last winter he made 7,000 lead shot balls for this season's competitions.

And competitions run all through the summer, all across North America. Whole valleys are taken over by spanking new teepees, lean-to's and other shelters.

Everyone wears buckskin, coonskin caps and moccasins.

Cooking is done over an open fire on cast iron, though the food is not all beans and coffee.

"You just step back a couple of hundred years," Frank said. "Everything has to be primitive. It's taken us a long time to be primitive."

That means period clothing, buffalo robes instead of sleeping bags, wooden boxes instead of Coleman coolers, any kind of container except plastic.

"Some places are really strict," Frank said. "You have to get rid of your vehicle so it's out of sight — no plastic or anything modern allowed at all."

These weekend events have all kinds of entertainment and food. There are trail rides for the kids and a chance to relax with friends and enjoy a pace of life that is anything but fast. "There are buffalo burgers — our favourite," Sylvia said, "and workshops. Every day they teach you something different, like making arrowheads. And there is a 'trade row.' You can trade whatever you have."

But the main events are shooting-oriented. "You shoot at paper targets, steel gongs of different shapes and sizes, silhouettes," Sylvia said. "Everything at different distances."

"You shoot cards sideways, you 'shoot the feather' — aim to break the feather in half."

There are even cannon-shoots which are loaded — depending on their size — with frozen oranges and grapefruit, or popcorn or tennis balls filled with cement.

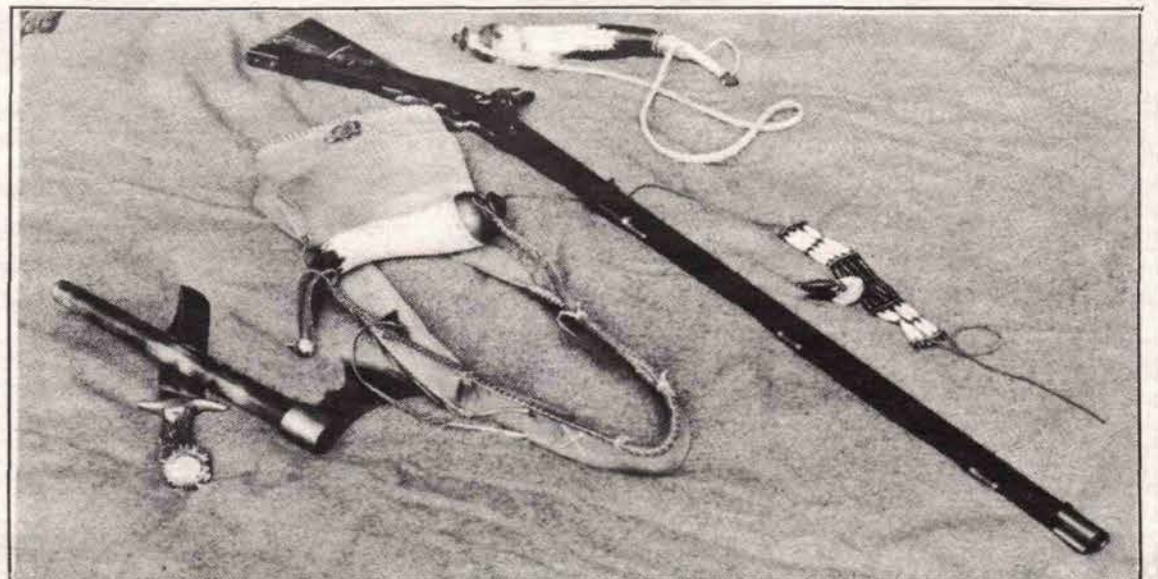
Another common event is the trail walk which involves 25 to 30 targets along a trail at which competitors shoot or throw knives and tomahawks.

Sylvia emphasizes that the rendezvous are family-oriented occasions. They always took their children and now their children are bringing theirs.

"You get so laid back," she said. "There are no phones ringing. The saddest part is coming home."

But there is always another. The next, local rendezvous is on the Malahat the weekend of July 30 to August 2.

The Tarodis will be there, but for them it will be a different time, and a different place.

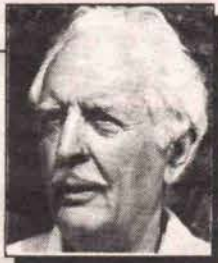

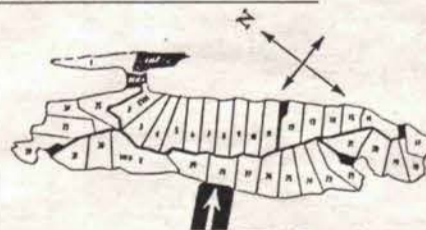

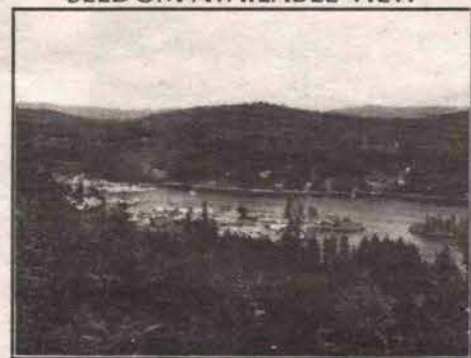

water will become scarce when we have witnessed so much rainfall but my experience always brings me to think carefully about my usage of water and how best my garden will benefit from irrigating.

If you hoe weeds during the day it makes little sense to water straight after and indeed less sense to irrigate before hoeing.

I believe that during hot summers, the most benefit to the plants is received when watering is done in the late evening or at night. The reasons for this are:

1. There is very little evaporation during the night.
2. The roots of the plants are under less stress at night and therefore take up water gradually, giving the plant an all-round better chance for good health.
3. Stomata are holes (pores) in

the leaves that release water during the day in order to survive. This is called transpiration. They release less water at night when the temperature is colder and therefore need less water to grow well.

The soil structure also benefits from night watering as it is less likely to shrink and expand and so breaks down much more slowly. This has the overall effect of permitting much better water retention.

Lawns in particular will benefit from night watering and you will notice that they will stay green during arid conditions for longer periods of time.

The reason for this is that water on a lawn tends to stay on the surface longer. It has less chance of evaporating at night and will seep slowly into the ground.

It follows that citizens should cultivate a generous and loyal spirit of patriotism, but without narrow-mindedness, so that they will always keep in mind the welfare of the whole human family which is formed into one by various kinds of links between races, peoples and nations.

## Favourable verdict offered by local opinion on jamboree

While our new prime minister was making personal appearances at celebrations in Saint John, Ottawa, and Vancouver (no small feat in one working day), those of us here on Galiano were celebrating July 1 too. It was our 13th annual Canada Day Jamboree, and it was a good one according to local opinion.

The weather being what it has been of late, the organizers did not expect too much, but were hopeful. They were alarmed by an early morning sprinkle of rain, but not surprised by the sullen skies. The clouds remained until early afternoon but didn't keep islanders away. At the height of the day's celebrations cars were lined up on Porlier Pass Road both north and south of the hall for a distance of about a mile.

Nancy Davidson, community association vice-president, did most of the organizing for the jamboree. Davidson's "pioneer and western" theme gave lots of scope for costuming, ideas for games and activities, and a focus for the hall's "museum" display.

The celebration began with a parade led off this year by our scarlet-coated RCMP officer, Tom Norton, astride a horse. A trailer of hay followed, alive with flag-waving youngsters, then came Bev Schuh with North Galiano's well known lamb (formerly "Lamb Chop", but now called "Pork Chop" — we can't imagine the reason).

Following Bev were two young pilgrims, then Walter Roots driving North Galiano's fire truck. "Desperado" Myron Sebelius came next in a pick-up decked out as a saloon, complete with gamblers, drinks and bar girls (this was pioneer Galiano?) Steve Oscko's horses and riders brought up the rear of the parade. Phyllis Harris and John Sibbald, dressed in square dance costumes, judged the entries from the judge's stand midway on the parade route.

A trio of singers led the singing of the national anthem at the opening ceremonies with Constable Norton taking the salute. Master of ceremonies Nick Francis then introduced Gill and Ken Allen of Madrona Lodge who, for 13 years, have faithfully driven the jamboree's special guests to the

grounds in one of their vintage cars. Gill Allen was a director of the North Galiano Community Association during the early 80s, and is still always on hand to help when needed.

The Allens were given one of Aini Haksi's floral tributes to wear. In addition, Mr. Allen was presented with the "First Citizen, Chain of Office", "The Miss Mew Award" — a decorative chain of office made from lids of cat food tins.

Around the grounds were the usual games for the youngsters — the wheel of fortune, the clown toss and balloon and darts. In addition there was a covered wagon grab-bag, a hay stack treasure hunt and a rubber duckie pond race. A craft shop, a tee-shirt sales booth and a hat shop were to be found nearby.

Janet Sutherland's men's cake decorating table, face painting, and a free horse and hat making centre, operated by Kiyo and Anne Okuda, were popular attractions. The last mentioned activity led to a parade of hats and horses later in the afternoon. Harold Wike organized the nail driving contest for the ladies and children.

The Galiano lock-up was a popular addition to the day's events. For those able to identify well known citizens from the "wanted posters" set out around the grounds, the pleasure of seeing that person behind bars was a possibility. A more direct incarceration could be arranged by simply paying a loonie for your prisoner to be put away for a three-minute sentence.

A number of island notables had the pleasure of cooling off in the dirt-floored cell. They had room service of a sort — dry bread served on a tin plate and a mug of water.

A large tent was set up at the back of the hall for the "Homesteaders' Cafe" where baked beans, beef on a bun and corn meal muffins were served along with the now traditional hot dogs and pie and ice cream. Notable among them was Wally Schuh with his carving knife and his mammoth

roasts of beef.

One highlight of the afternoon's stage program was a short demonstration of Texas line dancing led by Paulina Barnes. On the stage earlier Stephanie King and Tahirih Rockafella, piano students of Barbara Landmark, performed, as did professional violinist Cam Trowsdale with Landmark as his accompanist. This pair's country tunes and traditional jugs and reels had all toes a-tapping.

For many visitors what was inside the hall was the best feature of the jamboree, the pioneer museum: a collection of things both domestic and industrial, which might have been used in the early days of the

island. The objects were arranged in groupings according to use, and where possible, ticketed with explanatory notes. Notable were many quilts, some up to 150 years old, some more recent, some new. Also on display was a sampler completed on 1820 by a girl of 13.

A showcase contained fine old china, lace and Victorian steel-beaded ladies' purses. Laser printed copies of photos from the family album of Bea Robson (her grandfather, Edward McCoskrie settled at Retreat Cove in 1894) showed life on Galiano in the second decade of this century.

Edwardian hats decorated by members of the ladies' "Wednesday" needlework group were on display, as were garden tools, and household items from the parlour, the kitchen and the sun porch. Centred in the hall on bales of hay were stuffed animals — cows, horses, chickens, sheep — cuddly toys made by Dorothy Ross, Margaret Bonser and Elsie Mussell.

The jamboree raffle featured many prizes donated by the island's commercial outlets. With tickets sold out, the drawings were made early in the afternoon and the winners announced.

### A permanent display

The museum show at the North Galiano Jamboree was set up only for the duration of that four-hour event. A lot of time and effort went into setting it up, but it was an interesting experience for the curator. A permanent showing was suggested by many visitors. Has the time now come when Galiano should be looking for a permanent site for the display of its heritage, its art and artifacts?

The material is there, stored away in cupboards and attics, and people are willing to loan it for show. But this may not always be so. As time goes on, the owners of these treasures may well move away and take their "heritage" with them.

Our sister islands, Mayne and Salt Spring, have museums, and North and South Pender are moving in that direction. Perhaps it is time for Galiano to do so as well.
