Elusive customs hampers efforts to import rifle

Trying to contact the right person in a government office can be frustrating at any time. But Grant Marcotte was recently forced to the limits — and to the edge of the country — seeking help in an emergency.

Marcotte had bought a German rifle while in Europe this spring and intended to bring it home with him. However, KLM Royal Dutch Airlines would not let him carry the rifle through Amsterdam. Accordingly, he sent it home, and it was intervened by Canada Customs' international mail office in Mississauga, Ontario.

Marcotte arrived home April 6. On April 23 he received a letter from the Mississauga Canada Customs office directing him to

send his original firearms acquisition certificate within 21 days of their letter or his rifle would be disposed of. The letter was dated April 4.

As Marcotte wrote to MP Jack Frazer: "First I felt rage, second I panicked, thirdly I thought of what I could do to stop the disposal of the rifle."

It was Saturday evening when he read the letter. His rifle could be history after Monday.

Marcotte tried the obvious. He searched the letterhead and envelope for a phone number he could call that would connect him to a person able to prevent the imminent loss of his rifle. However, no phone or fax number was there.

So he phoned the Sidney Canada Customs office, where he was given two other numbers to try.

The toll-free number could not be reached from Salt Spring and the other one produced a recording.

A second call to the Sidney office armed him with another set of Ontario phone numbers, which produced no results. He even tried U.S. Customs.

"Some of them would ring, some would ring busy or say all lines were busy," Marcotte told the Driftwood.

Then he said he asked himself "What would be the last place in the world you would think of phoning?" He decided to try Newfoundland Customs. Pursuing that instinct proved to be his rifle's salvation.

Telephone information offered him an "emergency" number in St. John's, which he dialled after getting yet another answering

machine from the first number. To his amazement, a customs agent answered. The man had been asleep in bed due to the time difference, but promised to help Marcotte when he got to his office in the morning.

At 6:30 a.m. Sunday morning (April 24), the man phoned and woke Marcotte, and supplied numbers for the international mail office in Mississauga where the rifle was waiting. He also sent a fax to that office alerting them to the situation.

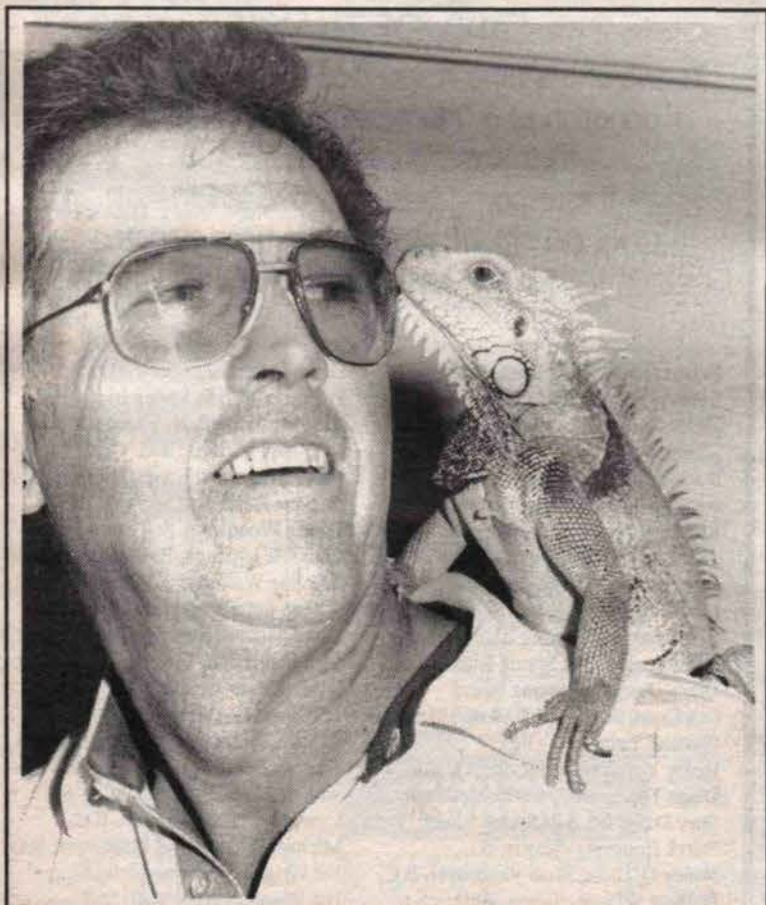
While the problem could have been averted if a phone or fax number was on the Canada Customs letterhead, Marcotte was also obviously upset about a letter taking 19 days to reach him from Ontario in the first place.

Although the incident was

resolved after Marcotte reached the right office and was instructed to go to Canada Customs at the Sidney Airport and send a copy of the firearms acquisition certificate by fax, he was upset to be so unnecessarily tortured by a defective communications system. He estimates his phone costs could be as high as \$60.

Acting manager of the international mail district office in Mississauga is Rod Hart. He told the Driftwood there was no contact number on Marcotte's letter because the office moved in February and new numbers had not yet been put on their letterhead.

An apology letter has been written to Marcotte, added Hart, and details of his telephone expenses are being requested for possible reimbursement.

Just 'cricket' to raise exotic pets

A thousand crickets are on the grocery list every two weeks for Bob Wanless.

Wanless doesn't eat the insects himself nor is he planning his own personal plague of mini-locusts. The crickets are food for some of his stock — a collection of exotic pets guaranteed to become conversation pieces. At Ganges Village Pets there are iguanas, claw-footed and scaly, which resemble miniature wingless dragons. There is an equally reptilian basilisk, a furry-legged tarantula, an albino tree frog and Wanless' specialty, tank after tank of rainbow-hued tropical fish.

Once a catcher of fish, Wanless is now a creator of fish. He is selling his fishing boat and devoting his energy to his newly-opened pet shop at 128 Hereford Avenue.

Tropical fish were a boyhood hobby for Wanless. "I had about 14 tanks about 42 years ago in Toronto," he says. "I've always been involved in fishing in some form or another." A year ago he returned to the hobby, buying a breeding pair of Angel fish and starting to breed the flowing-finned beauties.

Angel fish breed four times a year and produce up to 200 young at a time, he notes. Once the young have hatched, usually two days after the eggs are laid, the adults care for the young fish for two to three months. Wanless' fish are accustomed to human contact. All of the Angel fish in his shop tanks are his own breeding and swim eagerly to the surface of the tank when he approaches.

He also has a highly prized breeding pair of sapphire-streaked Blue Discus, which retail for \$600 a pair, and a breeding pair of Brown Discus but is still working towards his first successful breeding. It takes very little for a breeding to fail, he notes.

Water quality, temperature and conditions must be perfect for the young to survive. In fact, water temperature is so critical that he keeps the blinds on his shop window closed, so sun through the window won't heat up nearby fish tanks. The closed blinds keep the inside of the shop dim. Inside, the shop resembles a treasure cave, lined with glass aquariums bearing jewel-like drops of flickering fish amid emerald greenery.

In the next few weeks he will add more colour — cockatiels, budgies and canaries — plus supplies for birds and other pets. He already carries supplies for fish and reptile owners. He notes aquarium equipment has made huge advancements in the decades since he started raising tropical fish. Systems can precisely control water temperature, cleanliness and balance.

Segregated tanks contain iridescent Siamese fighting fish. "You can't keep any two males together. They'll kill each other," Wanless says. Goldfish glitter in a series of tanks — large red cap orandas, velvety black Moors and comical, Bubble-eyed goldfish with wobbling, rounded sacs — like water-filled balloons — under each eye.

Wanless notes all of his stock, from lizards to fish to birds, is domestically bred for the pet market. The pet store is open from 1 to 6 p.m. Tuesday to Saturday. Humans are welcome, especially those with crickets.

Extra: Murder mars train trip

It was a dark and stormy night — and if it wasn't it should have been — when the Disoriented Expresso embarked from Waterside Bistro in Ganges last Saturday, enroute to murder.

Aboard were the usual collection of suspects, most of whom were acting suspicious even before a body staggered out of the kitchen and died writhing on the floor of the dining car.

"Everyone here is under suspicion," the cops announced when they returned — McTavish now properly resplendent in plaid from his kilt-wrapped hips to the toes of his high-topped plaid sneakers.

Interrogating the passengers, they turned the spotlight on Charles Formby Smythe and Jennifer Farrington Hunt, who steadfastly refused to answer any questions about their relationship.

Vaudeville enlivens Nightmare

A relaxed and intimate pre-theatre atmosphere that is not very common on Salt Spring Island was included in the price of admission to Christopher Durang's *The Actor's Nightmare*, playing at Beaver Point Hall on the weekend.

Music by Ted Rhodes and Reid Collins, catered coffee and sweets, and tables adorned with candles, flowers and table cloths heightened the experience. For movie buffs or culture vultures, the Reid Collins and Caroline Andress produced play is quite the piece. There are lines and characters from writers as diverse as Shakespeare and Noel Coward and everyone in-between.

I had a sense this particular play might be better suited to television with its ability to zoom into facial expressions or cut from one character to another instantly. The play has little action to draw the audience into the quirky story and make them feel as disjointed as the script is. The play was at its best when characters were able to come up with little action-vehicles to enhance the quirky movement of the text.

One character, Sara, played by Tonya Cooper, flourished her arms, rolled her eyes and moved her body in time with her speech in a way that reminded me of a cross between heroines from the silent screen and film-noir. She kept the pace of the play going at a good clip and made the lines come alive.

Laurie Clarke, who played, among others, a character from Beckett's *Waiting For Godot*, was also very good at creating drama from an ostensibly still character. Sitting on top of a garbage can, like a lizard in the desert sun she hardly moved, pronouncing stage directions and monosyllabic words in the required deadpan. But she produced action and livened the theatre with the few chances she was given: wiggling her nose and touching the end of her nose with

her tongue. Great!

Some of the other characters were less sure of themselves and their roles. George/ Stanley, played by Seth von Handorf, had a hard time playing the straight accountant who has to be mostly astonished or confused. Both those emotions are hard to dramatize on stage and there has to be more than facial expression to carry it off.

Perhaps some more vaudevillian techniques were needed to overcome that accountant's woodenness.

He has some very funny lines

— especially when he tries to go through all the speeches he could remember, including parts of Hamlet's soliloquies, parts of Polonius' soliloquies, nursery rhymes, Dickens and even Tennessee Williams.

The stage manager, played by Kim Hoban, and Horatio, played by Steve Kuric, were also good. Horatio got a well deserved laugh when he acted out his line "He walked thrice ..." by walking across the stage three times as he said it.

A valiant show for a first production of acting students.

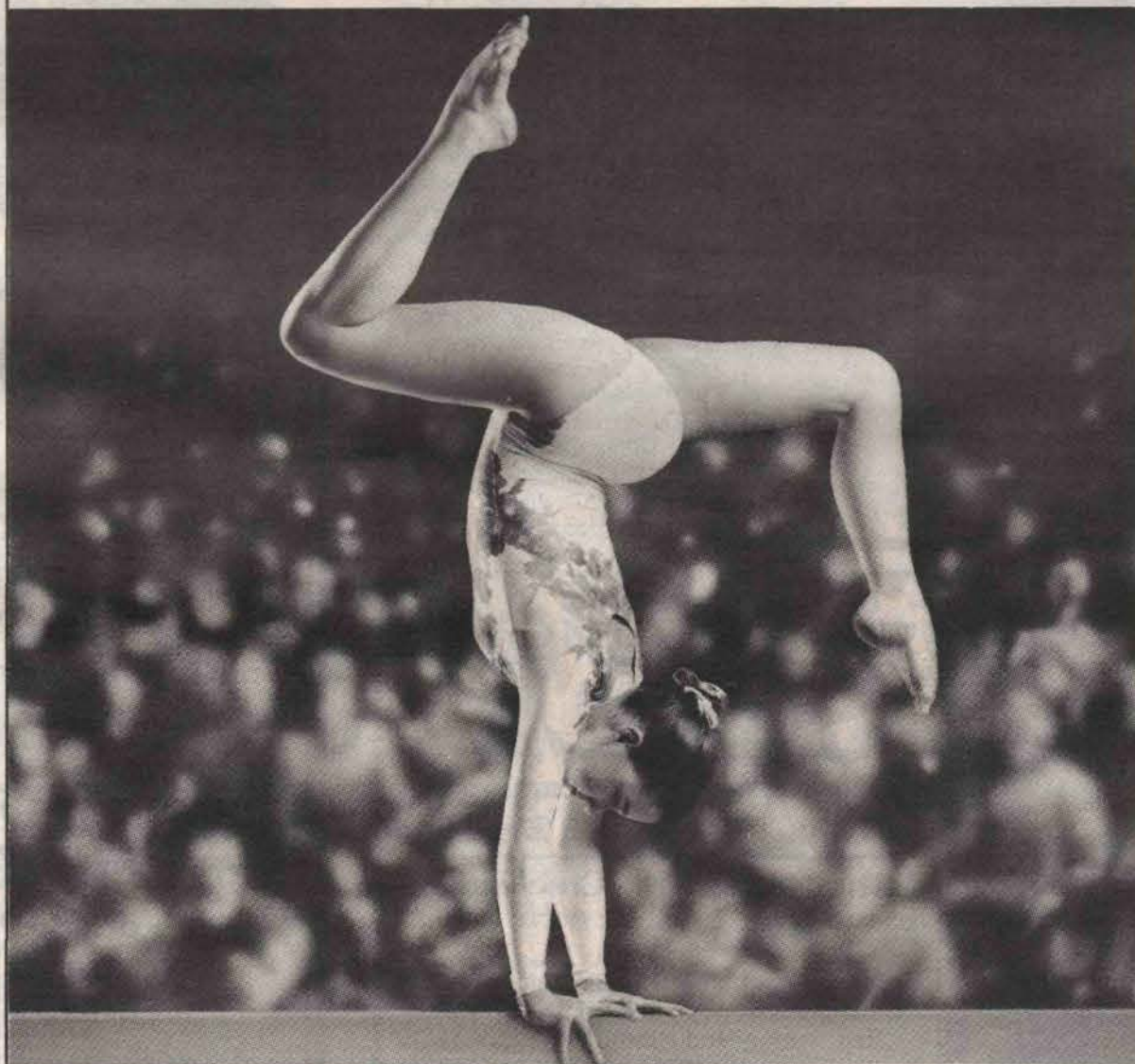
"She finds the universal threads that tie us all together as women loving women," wrote Rusty Gordon in *The Community Voice* of West Palm Beach Florida.

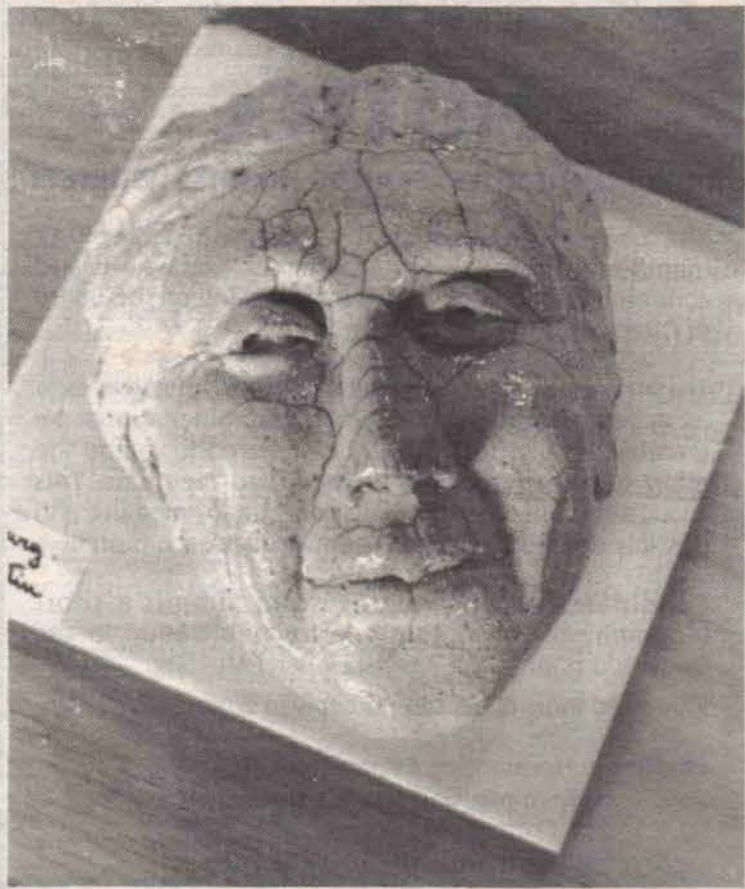

Writer finds fixes in common acts

Fay Wray, Goober and neighbours called Bill or Bob or Phil are a few of the characters readers might find familiar in a new short story collection from Salt Spring's Gary Whitehead.

"I Can Fix Anything" was recently published by Arsenal Pulp Press, and is available in local bookstores.

Whitehead's stories wreak havoc on the seemingly mundane, transforming simple acts like commuting on the bus or eating french fries into a Kafka-esque nightmare.

As characters do their rounds in a disturbing "automatic pilot" state, we become intimate witness to their subtle failings. In "Supply and Demand", for example, one man spends his lottery earnings on boxloads of Paveway pocket calculators, becoming Paveway's star salesman and achieving questionable fame on "60 Minutes."

"The influence of popular culture and how people cope with it" is one of Whitehead's fields of exploration. Several of his stories contain film and television references, or literally get right into them.

The protagonist in "A Situation Comedy, Now" finds himself cheerfully enticed into Mayberry, but discovers a town not quite as down-homey as he first thought. Whitehead has also done an elaborate form of literary remake on the mythic "King Kong" film. "I am amazed by how much my life has been formed by movies," he said last week. "If you are aware of that happening, it can be informative and fun."

Whitehead also cites attraction to "the suburban theme," influenced in part by growing up in the Surrey area. In his "I Love Raisins" story, a man moves to the suburbs imagining he will have instantly-reward-

ing relationships with folksy neighbours, but he can't even remember their names properly.

Seeking explanations for simple situations he witnesses brings Whitehead many story ideas. "I ask how could that happen? What would have to take place for that thing to happen? It becomes a puzzle I have to solve."

He was a co-founder of the Kootenay School of Writing in the mid-1980s, which transplanted a particular Kootenays' vitality to Vancouver through its writing services and workshops. He spent the early 80s at David Thompson University Centre in Nelson.

Although Whitehead enjoyed the writing school experience in Vancouver, he decided to acquire a masters' degree for "career" purposes. He chose Louisiana State University and packed up for Baton

Rouge in the spring of 1989, in search of a contrasting environment without having to leave the continent.

"I chose that place because I wanted something different culturally but I didn't want to learn a new language," he said.

Whitehead's choice did not prove disappointing.

"Louisiana is so much more different than our experience of the United States, living so close to the border," he said.

He and a friend ventured into Slim Waikiki's — the birthplace of zydeco music — despite warnings that it would be "dangerous" for them as white people. Instead, they found themselves openly welcomed with an inherent friendliness he found everywhere in Louisiana's black community.

People in that state talk about "things not being the same since the war" — meaning the Civil War. And surely fodder for a future story is the time he turned a corner on his bicycle to witness giant basketball star Shaquille O'Neil breaking up with his girlfriend — dialogue and all.

He returned to Vancouver with : Masters of Fine Arts majoring in creative writing, but after his partner moved to Salt Spring, he joined her in December of 1991.

While a part-time teaching job would be welcome at any time, Whitehead has found the island generous to the muse.

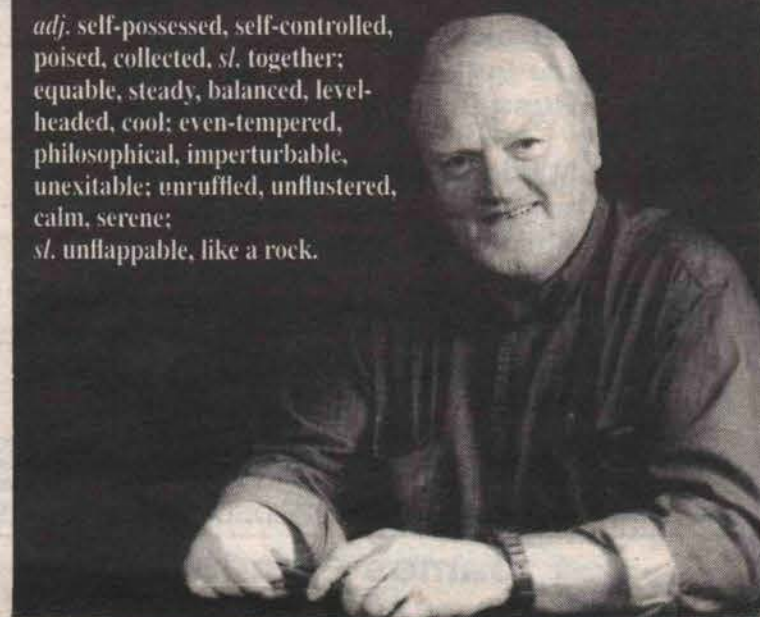
Current projects include a screenplay making the rounds for possible sale, more short stories and a novel in progress.

"I've gotten more writing done in the past two-and-a-half years than I've ever done in my life," he said.

Although island bowlers may already know Whitehead, everyone is welcome to meet him at a June 3 reading at Waterside Bistro.

That order supplied nurses for the hospital for a number of years. Miss. A. Calhoun was the first matron and had to do all the nursing. Sergeant Newens was cook, janitor and orderly.

• The Victoria Day weekend tennis tournament was set to begin, with competitors from Nanaimo, Victoria and Vancouver vying for trophies on the courts in front of the Harbour House Hotel. Desmond Crofton and George McMinn were in charge of the tournament.

Twenty-five years ago

May 22, 1969
 • A page of island transportation history was turned when the Island Princess, once Galiano's answer to ferry shortages, was ac-

quired by the provincial government to augment its ferry commitments. O.H. New, who operated the island service for a number of years, sold all his ferry operations to the government and then was concerned solely with coastal freighters. The Island Princess linked Vancouver Island and the mainland via the Gulf Islands.

Twenty years ago

May 23, 1974
 • Islanders wanted no part of an international park. With the close of a voluntary poll, islanders voted 794 to 2 against including the Gulf Islands and the San Juan Islands in an international park with headquarters in Point Roberts. The poll was launched by the Gulf Islands Driftwood. • A middle school was being planned for Mayne Island to serve

grades seven, eight, nine and 10. Gulf Islands School District trustees chose Mayne over Pender for the school at their regular monthly meeting.

Fifteen years ago

May 16, 1979
 • An extension to Lady Minto Hospital was opened by the same woman who had opened the new hospital in 1958, Barbara Hastings. Renovations to the building cost \$450,000 and were paid for by the provincial and federal governments. Donald Wagg was the architect and Liddell Construction in Central Saanich the construction company.

• Hugh Curtis was returned as MLA for the Gulf Islands, but with a reduced majority. Provincially, the Social credit party retained its hold of government.

Ten years ago

May 16, 1984
 • Either Crofton or Harmac was suspected of being responsible for a combination of fly ash and soot found floating in Stuart Channel.

A federal environment spokesperson said it was neither coal dust nor an oil spill. The black sooty substance covered an area of about two square miles.

• A three-year study from the ministry of the environment came up with a plan to rid the water of St. Mary Lake of unpleasant odours and bad taste. The ministry had devised a system of aeration. By pumping air into the island lake, high phosphorous levels would be reduced. A similar system had recently been introduced at Langford Lake.

Five years ago

May 17, 1989
 • A small creek which flowed through property belonging to Conhor and Isabel Hunt was named in honour of early settlers Kumanosaki and Riyo Okano who first came to the Sharp Road farm in 1919. The previously unnamed creek flowed into Booth Inlet and was the subject of restoration work by the Island Stream and Salmon Enhancement Society earlier in the year.
