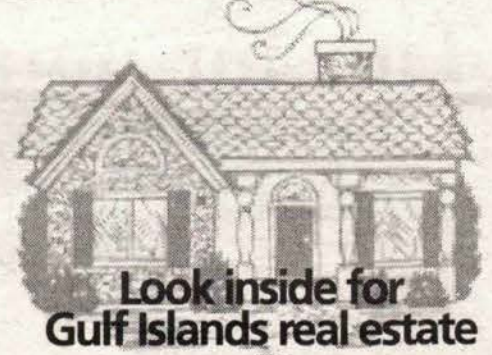

## Kathy Reimer

*Fish and creek enhancement gives positive focus to her life*

Fish have always figured in Kathy Reimer's life.

She recalls spending countless hours during childhood watching fish in the streams near her home. Now president of the Salt Spring Salmon Enhancement Society, Reimer spends countless hours as an adult examining the streams on her home island.

Repeatedly recognized for her volunteer efforts to bring salmon stocks back to the island, she has received an Environmental Watch Award and, most recently, an award from the Federation of B.C. Naturalists.

But she says her favourite "awards" come from the school children who tour the society's island hatchery and respond with crayoned thank-you cards. These children, she says, are "our hope for the future."

She also sees hope in the young offenders who have been assigned over the years to undertake community service work for the salmon enhancement society. Some have completed community service work and then become volunteers for the society, she notes. She sees others in the community who have grown past their one brush with the law. "They're beautiful, healthy young adults."

Reimer's work with children and her interest in their future has a special poignancy. Her first child, daughter Laura Jane, died from cystic fibrosis when she was five years old. Reimer's son, 10-year-old Jamie, also has cystic fibrosis.

Reimer notes treatment for the disease has improved significantly in recent years. Her daughter, born in 1977, was not diagnosed until she was 18 months old. Jamie was diagnosed at birth and has responded well to treatment.

Becoming involved with salmon enhancement and encouraging life in Salt Spring's streams was, in part, a reaction to dealing

with cystic fibrosis. As well as being part of her life, preserving the salmon stocks is a tribute to life.

"For almost 10 years my life was taken up with the disease," Reimer recalls. Then she realized she had a choice: she could let her

life revolve around fighting a potentially futile battle against a terrible disease or she could find a project to give her life a positive focus.

She recalls asking herself: "Can you still do something good with your life?"

In 1984, shortly after Jamie was born, she went to the founding meeting of the Salt Spring salmon enhancement society. Over the next few years, she threw herself into the society's work. Carrying Jamie, she tramped along miles of Salt Spring's creeks, examining their condition and taking temperature readings.

Sometimes, amid the stillness of the wood and the chuckling of the creek, she recalls feeling almost like she had stepped back 200 years and was travelling through an as-yet new world.

"There were some parts of Cusheon Creek where I felt like an Indian mother, carrying her baby along."

Within the creeks and the trees

were echoes of her own childhood. She grew up in a rural area south of Revelstoke. "We had a 40-acre hillbilly farm." There was no electricity or running water.

Reimer recalls her mother teaching her to read and then playing hooky from the one-room country school, so she could go rafting around a nearby beaver swamp. Always a tomboy, she tried fishing in a nearby creek. "I caught a few, just for the excitement, but that quickly wore thin."

In the mid-1950s, the Columbia River had not yet been dammed. Fish swam thickly in the streams leading into the Columbia and into the Arrow Lakes. Reimer recalls one year when the water level dropped dramatically and she organized friends with buckets to carry fish from the drying pools of the creek into deeper water. "I used to worry that I missed fish," she said. "By then I was spending every free moment now by the creek."

Her interest in fish almost resulted in tragedy. Reimer vividly recalls one hot sunny day down by the creek when she was about 12 years old. She was lying on top of the railway trestle tracks, watching the courting, fighting and spawning of the trout in the waters below.

"Squirming around there, I got my knee down between the ties." She was so engrossed in the fish, she didn't notice at first that her trapped knee was swelling. When she tried to pull her leg free, she found her knee was wedged tightly between the ties and all her efforts only increased the swelling.

"I thought that was it. The train was going to come and I would be killed."

The trestle was a good distance from the nearest home but Reimer began yelling for help. Finally, she was spotted by another child, who ran for help, returning with Reimer's mother, sister and the operator of the local ferry.

At first, Reimer's mother tried to free her daughter's leg with a crowbar, accompanied by the constant swearing of the ferry operator. The train was due at any time but the schedule was irregular and no one knew exactly when the train would come rumbling down the track.

Finally, Reimer's mother seized the trapped leg and yanked, scraping off the skin on both sides of Reimer's knee. "I always have had problems with that knee," Reimer remarked.

After graduating from Revelstoke Secondary — she had stopped playing hooky and was among the top students in the school — she attended the University of Victoria and earned a degree in zoology.

For the next 10 years she continued to work at the university as a research assistant in marine biology and as a lab instructor. While there, she met Allan Reimer, who was working as physics lab instructor.

Wages for lab instructors were poor, so Reimer switched to fishing. In 1978, a year after the birth of their first child, the couple moved to Salt Spring. For Reimer, it was like completing a cycle.

"This community, Salt Spring Island, is a lot like the community

I grew up in." Their Salt Spring hobby farm even had a creek, although it was usually dry in the summer. "Part of Duck Creek goes through the farm," Reimer observed.

Volunteering for the salmon enhancement society also felt like the next loop in a cycle, echoing her childhood fascination with fish. "I just knew that

it is what I wanted to do. It felt so good and it was so exciting."

During a drought in 1987, Reimer recalls organizing volunteers to transfer fish from the drying Mansell Creek to irrigation ponds, saving that year's run of cutthroat trout. The project was an echo of her childhood and the bucket brigade she organized to save fish in the creek near her home.

But this time, Reimer has the ability to tabulate the result. "We've got thousands of fish in that creek."

She has drawn others into her efforts. Through her husband, Reimer has contacts with commercial fishermen, who are involved in the salmon enhancement program. Teacher Debbie Nostdal, who is also a fisherman's wife, helped develop an education pro-

Work by Kathy Reimer to protect water habitats on Salt Spring was honored by the Federation of B.C. Naturalists with an award presented October 1 during the federation's conference on Salt Spring.

The federation cited a long list of activities which led to Reimer being chosen for the award.

These included sitting on solid waste committees of the Capital Regional District and the Islands Trust; walking lands with developers to allow for footpaths and covenants on water courses; re-routing Ganges Creek and landscaping the creek's linear park in Ganges; developing a program with Salt Spring Elementary students to seed viable streams and charting watersheds, collecting flow and quality data which is

used by the water management department.

Reimer was nominated by the Salt Spring Trail and Nature Club for the award, which is presented annually by the federation to an individual outside the organization. Nominations are received from clubs throughout the province.

"Her dedication to the protection of water habitats on this island is expressed by her enthusiasm as she attends the Saturday market to raise funds; spends time in the classroom educating the young, and as she tramps through the bush with her son and her dog to release trapped fry," observed Sylvia Bristol, who wrote the nomination on behalf of the Salt Spring club.

## Donations of wool accepted

Knitting is a thread of normalcy for women surviving in the refugee camps of the former Yugoslavia. So the women are knitting, creating warm sweaters for themselves and their children. It is an echo of better times.

But wool is scarce and sometimes the women are so desperate to maintain the clicking of their needles that they pick apart what they've knit during the day so as to have yarn available to knit the next day.

That is the scenario described by Susan Berlin, a member of the Salt Spring Weavers and Spinners Guild. The guild is organizing a donation of wool and knitting needles to the Women's Commission for Refugee Women and Children.

The weight per pound is cheaper for larger quantities, so the guild is appealing to island residents to donate unused yarn or knitting needles to increase the size of the donation.

"Most of us have yarn stashed away somewhere, intended originally for some project or other that never got made," Berlin said. "If your stash includes full skeins, balls or cones of worsted weight yarn, at least 50 per cent wool for warmth, and if you have any spare straight or circular knitting needles in sizes nine and six (U.S. sizes four and seven or 3.75 mm and 5 mm) they can be sent."

Yarn and/or knitting needles can be left in a collection box at the Fulford post office or, in Ganges, at Crossroads, 131 McPhillips Avenue. Anyone contributing yarn is also asked to drop a few coins into the envelope attached to the box in order to help cover the mailing costs, estimated at 90 cents per pound.

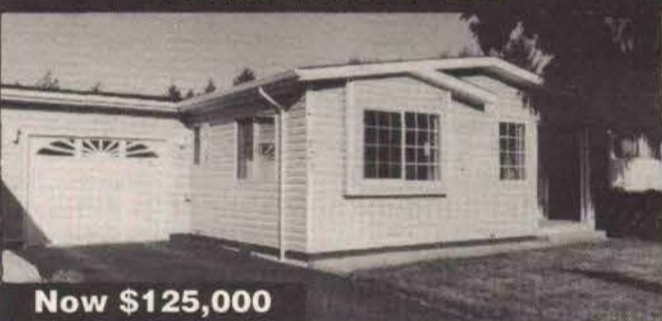
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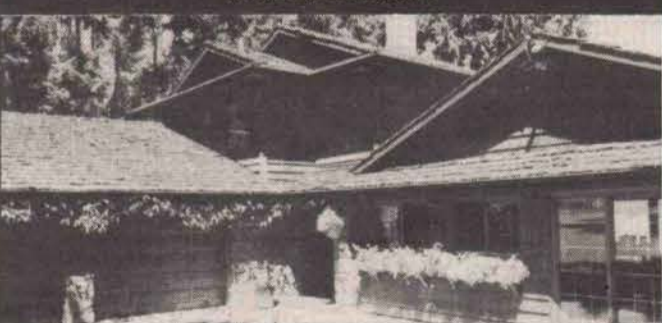
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### Plain bad driving!

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# B.C. Naturalists gather on island

Beautiful weather and the beckoning views and trails of Salt Spring made the Federation of B.C. Naturalists' fall conference a delight for the 80-plus registrants who met at Cedar Beach Resort from September 29 to October 2.

"This is as good as they come," said conference coordinator Glen Moores of the Salt Spring Island Trail and Nature Club. "From a naturalist's point of view, there's still a number of good things here."

The conference was hosted by the local club, which has approximately 125 members.

A comprehensive schedule ensured conference participants saw many of Salt Spring's attractions. On September 30, optional outings included a boat trip from Fulford Harbour to Portland Island, exploration of the Bullock Lake wetlands, a bird watching walk and a tour of Bob and Judy Weeden's organic orchard and vegetable garden.

On October 1 there was a bird watching walk near St. Mary Lake and on Sunday conference participants could choose between a tour and history of Ruckle Park, presented by Gwen Ruckle and Briony Penn, or a geological tour and history of the island, presented by Tom Wright.

Moores said a number of other

island residents contributed to the conference. Kathy Reimer of the Salt Spring Salmon Enhancement Society presented the program on Bullock Lake, describing how Ducks Unlimited and her organization are working together to claim the lake.

Trustee Bob Andrew presented a program September 30 on the community plan. He spoke about methods to preserve land in its natural state, either completely or partially, which could be done as part of a community plan.

Moores said the preservation of land was an important topic during the conference. Parks, nature reserves, private stewardship and covenants placed on land were among the ideas discussed.

On Saturday, reports were received from naturalist clubs throughout the province. A banquet Saturday evening featured photographer Bristol Foster, who spoke on his trip around the world with Robert Bateman 30 years ago.

A recognition award from the Federation of British Columbia Naturalists was presented to Kathy Reimer for her work in preserving the province's natural environment.

"It all worked out well," Moores concluded. "The weather cooperated and we had good attendance."

# Service pays tribute to emergency groups

## Self-examination clinic recommended as breast cancer is "almost epidemic"

This workshop is described as a geography lesson.

Salt Spring women are being encouraged to attend a breast self-examination clinic next week as a means to provide early detection of breast cancer.

The clinic will introduce women to breast self-examination and offer individual instruction on how it is done. Wellness coordinator Rhema Cossever says the clinic is simply an informational and instructional session. "We're not looking for disease."

Eight Salt Spring nurses have been trained to teach breast self-examination, a procedure that consists chiefly of learning to recognize a change in the feel or appearance of the breasts. It's a matter of being familiar with the geography of the body, Cossever said.

Nurse Sue Yardley said statistics indicate that breast cancer is "almost epidemic." She said there were twice as many deaths from breast cancer as there were from AIDS in North America in 1990. About 14,400 Canadian women

develop breast cancer every year, while 5,000 die from it every year. But it is treatable if detected early. While breast cancer affects women of all ages, the majority of cases occur after menopause.

Eighty per cent of all breast cancers diagnosed clinically were found by the woman herself, either by practising breast self-examination or accidentally, according to the Canadian Cancer Society.

The clinic takes place Saturday, October 22 between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. at the Capital Region health office behind Lady Minto Hospital. The clinic is free and takes approximately one hour.

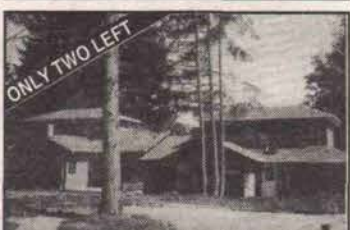

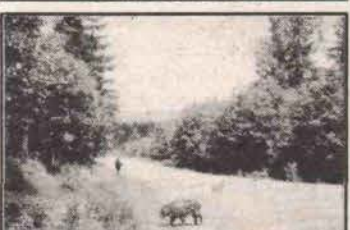

gram for local schools.

"Debbie's school program is a main component of the salmon enhancement," Reimer remarked.

She has worked with young offenders doing community work service — "it really seems to suit them, working in the creeks" — and organized job training and employment training projects based in environmental enhancement of Salt Spring's streams.

She puts in more than 40 volunteer hours a week, visiting the hatchery every day, checking water condition and local ponds and, on Saturdays, often attending a local market to sell fundraising raffle tickets and distribute information on salmon enhancement.

But the rewards are swimming in. For the past five years, coho have returned to Cusheon Creek. Last year, steelhead and cutthroat returned to Duck Creek and coho returned to Okano Creek. The water quality in Ganges Creek has been improved by building a new channel through Mouat Park and Reimer hopes to see fish in that creek as well.

It is fitting that some of the benefits have flowed on to Reimer's hobby farm. Since 1992, the once

dry creek has chuckled through the summer months.

Her current goals are to see the aerators fixed in St. Mary Lake and to revive the Bullock Lake watershed.

Her son, she says, is proud of the achievements of the salmon enhancement society and interested in the group's projects.

For Reimer, bringing life to the creeks is an accomplishment which balances tragedy.

"Now I have something that I feel really good about," she says. "I feel I will be able to look back and see good things as well as sorrow."

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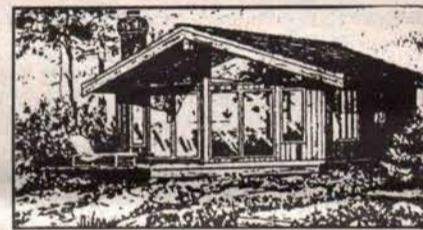
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Salt Spring seniors have their own hang-out, the Seniors for Seniors Centre at 379 Lower Ganges Road, across the street from Ganges Village Market.

A games afternoon is held once a week and there is a stamp club, a strollers club, a seniors' choir and a chess club meeting at the centre.

The centre also hosts a monthly blood pressure clinic and an arthritis wellness program.

Volunteers operate the centre, taking on jobs like office reception, publicity and programs, fundraising and specific activities. Toynbee estimates one third of the centre's members are also volunteers.

All of the program leaders will be present during the open house and refreshments will be available. Everyone is welcome.

# Cougar continues to roam island

Thirty years ago

October 1, 1964

There was still a cougar roaming Salt Spring despite a kill two weeks earlier, island cougar hunter Bob Akerman reported after a sheep carcass was found on Mount Tuam beside cougar tracks. Other hunting parties were also reporting cougar tracks in the area.

The official government cougar hunter was due on Salt Spring that week. Anyone with information on the cougar was urged to contact Bob Akerman immediately.

Winners in the Fall flower show, held in Fulford Hall, included Mrs. E.E. Groff, who received the Freeborn Trophy for the special club chrysanthemum class; Joseph Wallis, who earned grand aggregate points in the chrysanthemum class; and Dr. R.W. Bradley, who received the Scott and Peden trophy for the best chrysanthemum bloom. Runner-up was Mrs. E. Worthington.

October 2, 1969

An inquest into the death of Salt Spring Island motorcyclist Steven Reeves September 17 found the death was accidental. Reeves died after hitting the rear of a stopped school bus. A witness, Lyle Ebert of Sidney, testified that he was passed by the motorcycle just before he noticed the flashing lights of a school bus further ahead on the road. Ebert said he drove through a dip in the road, losing sight of the school bus and motorcycle. When he came to the top of the dip, the accident had already occurred.

Cpl. V.G. Meyer said the accident occurred during a rainstorm which reduced visibility. He estimated the bus was visible from 130 to 160 yards and the motorcycle was traveling at 40 miles per hour. Reeves was not wearing goggles or any eye protection.

The coroner's jury recommended some form of eye protection be mandatory for motorcyclists riding in poor weather. The jury also recommended work be done to reduce the hazard on the road.

Outer islanders were delighted with new hunting restrictions on their islands, according to reports at a meeting of the Gulf Islands Joint Council. John Rainsford of Mayne and Vernon Roddick of South Pender both praised the regulations banning rifles from their island. However Salt Spring spokesman Mr. Reynolds said one result of the restrictions was an increase in the number of wounded deer. He noted few of the hunting accidents over the previous two years could be attributed to the use of rifles.

## DOWN THE YEARS

Twenty years ago

October 2, 1974

Election of two local trustees for each of the islands included in the newly created Islands Trust was to take place November 16, the same day as the election of school board trustees. The elections were to be conducted by the regional districts covering the islands involved. Elections would be held on Salt Spring, North Pender, South Pender, Saturna, Mayne, Galiano, Bowen, Denman, Gabriola, Gambier, Hornby, Lasqueti and Thetis. The remaining smaller islanders were to be served by three general trustees: Hilary Brown of Hornby, Marc Holmes of Salt Spring and David Brousson of Bowen Island.

Fifteen years ago

October 3, 1979

If Salt Spring's parks and recreation commission wants to use Mouat Park for a recreation centre, the commission should be willing to take over operation of the entire park. That was the message of B.C. Parks to a suggestion that Mouat Park be used for a recreation centre.

Taking over the park would also include taking over operation of the campsites within the park.

Chairman Glenn Woodley told a commission meeting that a complete breakdown of the cost of operating the campsites has been requested from B.C. Parks. Commission members agreed not to proceed further until that information was received.

Ten years ago

October 3, 1984

Classes officially began at the new Fulford School on the south end of Salt Spring. The six classroom school opened with an enrolment of 115 students. Principal was Bob Brownsword.

Five years ago

October 4, 1989

A motion asking the provincial government to designate the Gulf Islands as a special forest management area was passed by the Islands Trust Council at its September meeting. If the designation was approved, any forestry company operating in the Gulf Islands would have to submit a plan outlining how an area was to be logged and where access roads would be constructed. Upon approval of the logging plan, the company would receive permission to log. Salt Spring trustee John Stepaniuk said the approval process would have to be followed by any commercial logging operator who wished to cut more than five truck loads.

helping the young at heart stay fit

If challenged to guess Tony Maidstone's age, "81" is not the number that would leap to mind.

Maidstone is a three-year regular at Pump Primers, a Salt Spring fitness group tailored for people with, or showing signs of developing, cardiovascular disease.

His angina pectoris condition has now stabilized, and he looks as if he could join a young men's soccer team.

When he told his Victoria cardiologist he had joined the fitness program, the specialist told him if he continued, he wouldn't be returning to his office.

"It seems to keep me going," said Maidstone, smiling.

Pump Primers was initiated by John and Ann Page almost six years ago, and the group has steadily grown since then. It meets Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 8 to 9 a.m. at Central Hall.

Although not all in the current group have cardiovascular health concerns, they will probably not develop one.

Instructor Catherine Bennett begins the class with a slow warm-up of walking, stretching and talking. (The class also provides vital social exercise, she notes.) The aerobic portion of the class is between 20 and 25 minutes in length, and participants work to achieve their "target heart rate" by the end of that period. A four-minute walk around the hall is what Bennett calls the "warm down" session, before the group does stretching and exercises that strengthen various muscle groups.

She splashes wry humour throughout her classes.

"Put your arm up in a position where you know you could keep it for an hour or more," she joked.

She also urges the class to relax before heading off for the rest of the day. "No bemoaning what you didn't do, no planning what you have to do."

Safety is always stressed in the class, with participants taught to recognize the symptoms of over-exertion and find the right level of

working out suitable for them.

"I try to pitch it somewhere in the middle," said Bennett. Some work less vigorously than she does, others know they can exert themselves more.

Elizabeth Grant and Judith Humphrys are a mother-daughter team at Pump Primers. Grant said the class has dramatically improved her life, especially in reducing the agony of "terrible backaches."

"It has just gotten better and better," she said.

Humphrys said that as an aesthetician she knows the importance of good blood circulation for healthy skin and body, a definite benefit of regular exercise.

Ruth Grunau has been going to Pump

Primers for more than three years. She said it has enhanced her fitness level, made her as supple as possible and able to walk farther than she did in the past. "I have gone on different holidays (in the past few years), and realize I can do more things than I used to," she observed.

Maintaining class attendance is important, said Bennett, and that is why it does not stop during summer months like some fitness programs.

Going to Pump Primers in the morning becomes something most members do with military regularity, like brushing teeth or eating breakfast. A core group has stuck with it for the past five-and-a-half years, said John Page.

The group is also extremely supportive, he said, and meets for occasional social events.

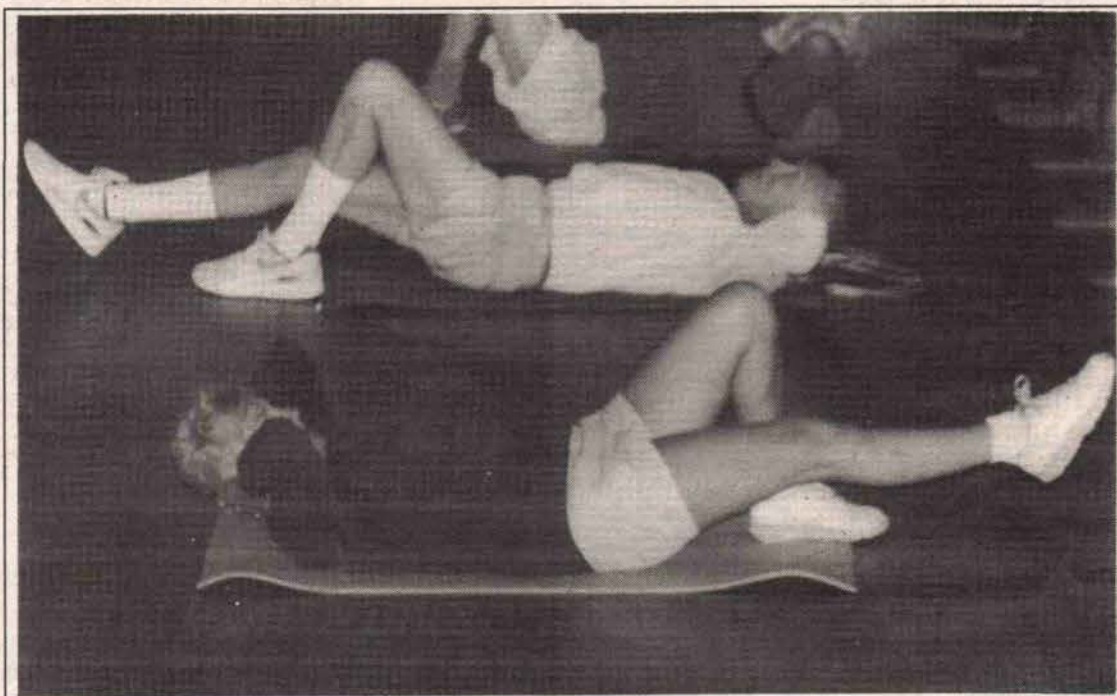
"It's a supportive group for me, too," said Bennett, adding they have become an "adoptive family."

While the Pump Primers class is actually full, Page stressed they will never turn away anyone who is sent there by a doctor. If this kind of cardiac rehabilitation fitness program is critical for well-being, the club will find a way to accommodate.

Physician approval is required for participation.

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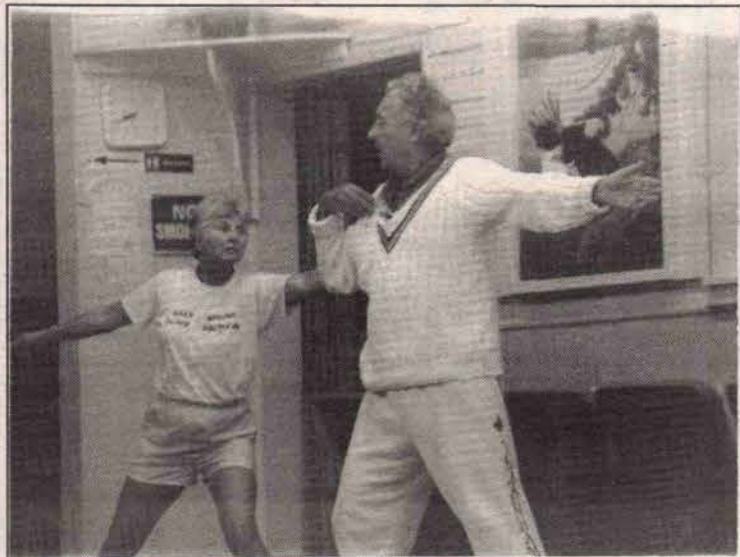

# Tribunal hands down judgment in local soccer refereeing dispute

All three men involved in a dispute on a Salt Spring soccer field were reprimanded by a youth soccer league tribunal last week.

Salt Spring referee Ken Marr, Gorge Canadians under 19 boys team manager Jim Travers and player Alan Travers appeared before a Lower Island Youth Soccer League three-person tribunal last Wednesday evening.

The hearing resulted from a September 11 incident at Portlock Park. The Travers reacted angrily when Marr issued a yellow card against Alan Travers for blocking a

goal kick.

One aspect of the hearing dealt with Marr's complaint that he was pushed by Alan Travers later in the game when he approached Jim Travers to demand individual names.

LIYSL director Les Cleghorn told the Driftwood there was doubt as to the exact circumstances and whether the assault was deliberate or simply "incidental contact" resulting from Alan Travers being the "third man in" trying to keep his father and Marr apart.

He said the committee did

believe Alan Travers used foul and abusive language against Marr and for that he received a one game suspension and a disciplinary letter. He had already served an "automatic" one game suspension.

Jim Travers had "a strip torn off him" for his part in the dispute, and particularly for coming onto the field after Marr issued the yellow card. Cleghorn said he and his club will receive a disciplinary letter about his part in the incident.

Marr was also admonished for some of his behaviour that day. The confrontation was incited to some degree, said Cleghorn, by Marr telling the manager to "shut up and get off the field."

Marr should have "stayed away from the manager, called the coach onto the field and got the (player's and manager's) names that way," he said.

## Scoring eludes local men

Working to improve midfield play is paying off for Salt Spring FC, but it did not translate into a victory against Castaways on Sunday.

"We played a really good game in the midfield," said team manager and goaltender Ken Marr. "From the 18-yard box to the 18-yard box, we played really well."

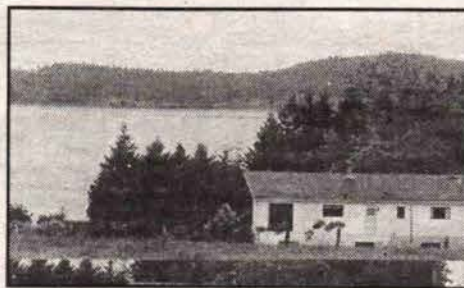
Unfortunately, no one could finish a play with goals needed to win the men's soccer game. Castaways scored its first goal on a breakaway within the first five minutes of the game. The team did not panic, said Marr, and felt "it was just a matter of time" before it would score.

Castaways' second goal came with 20 minutes remaining in the game. FC was "deflated" for about 10 minutes, said Marr, but created more scoring opportunities before the match was over. The score remained 2-0, however.

Having solved its early-season midfield problems, the team will now concentrate on how to propel the ball over that magic line.

Salt Spring FC meets Gorge FC at Portlock Park this Sunday beginning at 2:15 p.m.

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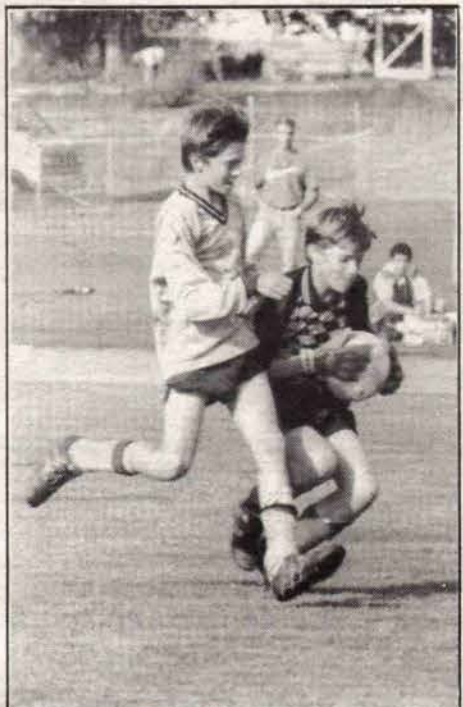

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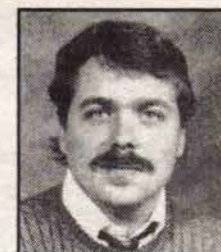

After several games on the road, the under-19 boys team returns to Salt Spring for its next two Sunday matches.

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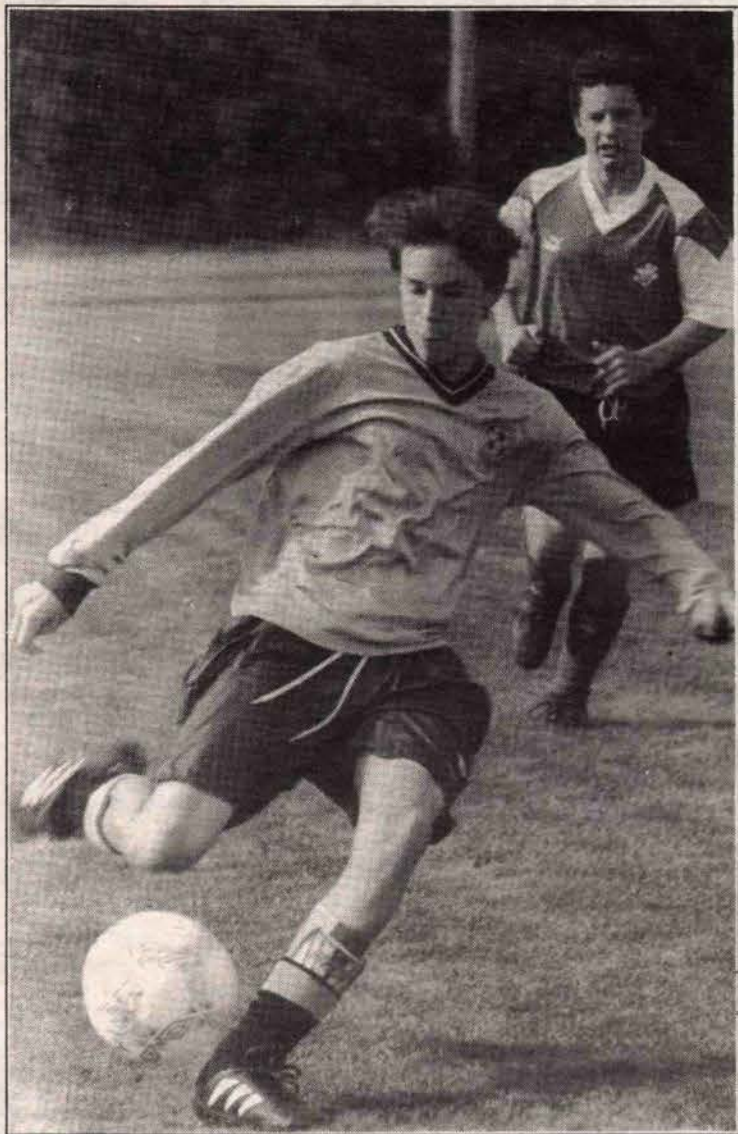

Booth said players are pleased to be using the new gymnasium and are the current envy of off-island school teams.

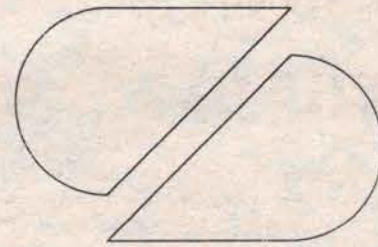

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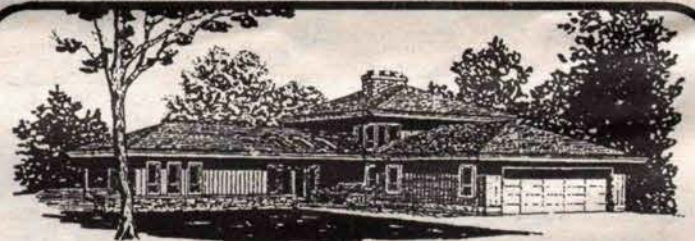
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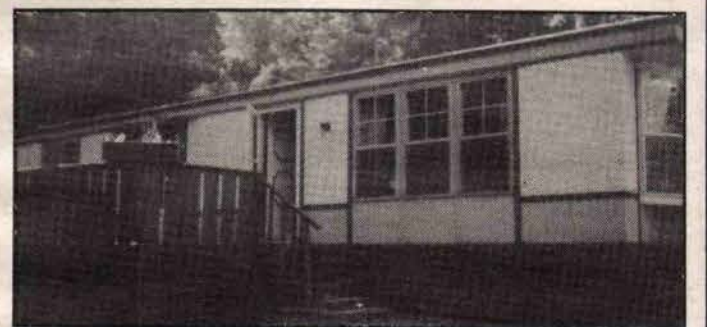
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# Aerobics classes keeping 'em fit

With an explosion in demand for ways to "work out," islanders are all over the map pursuing their chosen exercises.

But for those who don't fancy getting fit on a treadmill or other machines, Parks and Recreation Commission-sponsored aerobics classes offer the widest choice possible. Salty Sweat's uses the enticed health-conscious islanders and kept them coming back for the past 14 years.

With twice-weekly morning and after-work aerobics, step aerobic classes, plus classes aimed at "more mature" participants, Salty Sweat's meets everyone's fitness needs. Summer aquafit classes in Shelby Pool have also proven extremely popular.

After a two-year absence from Mahon Hall, most classes have returned there this fall since Gulf Islands Secondary School no longer needs the space. The exception is step classes held at All Saints-by-the-Sea church hall.

Along with a surge in aqua-fit classes and the return to Mahon Hall, long-time Salty Sweat's instructor Rosemary Trump has observed a few other changes. Lowering the impact of classes is now stressed more, she said, so that people are encouraged to stay closer to the ground.

More men are coming out to classes, she said, as awareness of the importance of fitness continues to grow. Another part of that awareness sees people diversifying their forms of exercise, supplementing aerobics with biking, swimming or walking.

And while "working out at the gym" has caught on in recent years, Trump notes that for some people, nothing matches a group aerobic workout done to upbeat music.

Kelly Hayes is one of those people. She goes to as many Salty Sweat's classes as she can, and has done so religiously for the past four years. Four-year-old Cameron Hayes and three-and-a-half-month-old Alex are "fitness children" whose mom took them to aerobics all through pregnancy and soon after their births. Alex currently

joins mom at class in his backpack. "It's a really good program," said Hayes, noting she especially appreciates the choice of morning and afternoon classes.

Hayes did aerobics in Vancouver before moving to Salt Spring and was glad to find Salty Sweat's here.

Even if some parents don't have Hayes' tenacity, having small children is no reason to be deprived of fitness. Salty Sweat's uses the childcare services of Carol Young to entertain children during its Monday through Thursday morning classes.

"Afternoon Energizer" sessions are set at a higher level than morning "High-Low Energizer" classes, said Trump, but members are always encouraged to work at a pace comfortable for themselves.

A Friday morning "Prime Time" class led by Ila-Mae Dickson finds 19 women beginning their day by limbering every possible muscle and ligament before getting into a thorough exercising of cardiovascular systems.

The group watches Dickson intently as she leads them through each step of the warmup, but by the time they are doing "step kicks" and "heel jacks" and swinging their arms, there are relaxed smiles on almost everyone's face.

Formerly called the "Easy Does It" class, Dickson's class is designed for people over 55 years of age, although some members simply want the lowest impact class offered.

What Trump observes is that "these are remarkably fit ladies." Most lead active lives that include at least one other regular physical exercise, and a fitness class is a vital part of ensuring they can continue hiking, playing tennis or swimming.

"A lot of them are there to maintain their ability to do all those other things," said Trump.

Strength, coordination, flexibility and balance are all improved by regular participation in the Prime Time class.

Some members do crafts which cause tension in the neck and shoulder area, so Dickson includes exercises to relax and strengthen

those muscles.

The class has basically been tailored for the women who go there, said Trump. Familiarity with each member's needs and physical condition is a "luxury" island instructors have over their counterparts in larger communities. They know who has had hip problems in the past and who should take it easy on their knees, for example.

Fortunately, "Prime Timers" also know their own limits and "are marvellous at pacing themselves," said Trump.

Going to fitness classes is not only beneficial for the body and mind, but becomes a vital part of a person's social life. Joining a program provides a natural entry into the island scene for new residents.

Salty Sweat's certified instructors are Trump, Dickson, Brenda Akerman, Janet Severn, Roberta Bantel and Betty-Lou Lake.

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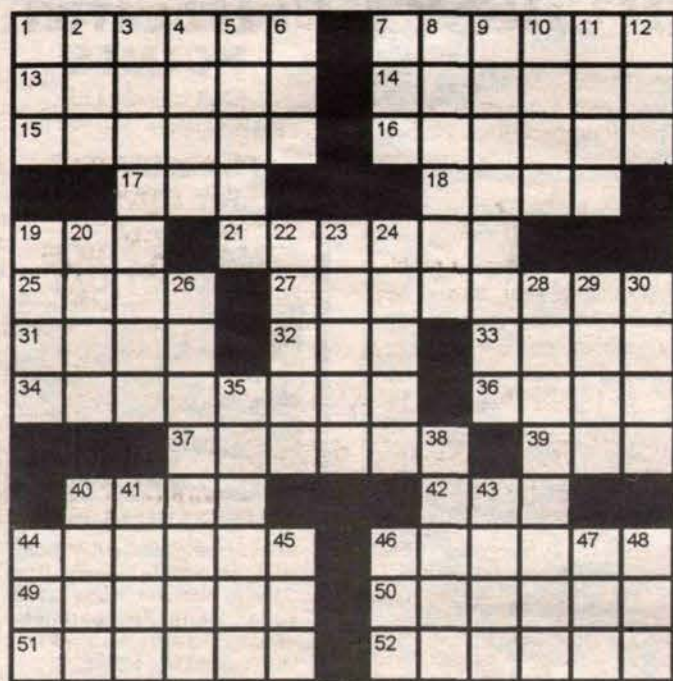

# Community service experience offered by candidate Jamieson

Almost two decades of community service on Pender Island is part of the experience offered by Gail Jamieson, a candidate in next Saturday's by-election for a North Pender island trustee.

Jamieson and husband Dave moved to Pender Island more than 18 years ago. Their three children, 17-year-old Michael, 11-year-old Matthew and nine-year-old Andrew, were born and raised in the community.

"As a family, we all have a genuine interest in the well-being of our community," Jamieson observed. Since arriving on the island, she has tried to contribute to the community by participating in many local organizations.

She has been secretary of the arts club and president of the Pender Island Playschool and Parent Advisory Committee. She has served as a member of the hall association, the health care society and the group committee for cubs and scouts.

She is now on the editorial board of the Pender Post Society.

She feels a trustee must address many issues in a fair and capable manner. Among the challenges facing the Local Trust Committee are residential and commercial growth, water, transportation and land use. No easy solutions exist for these issues, she noted.

Since trustees operate with a great deal of freedom and authority, Jamieson feels it is important to "trust" the elected person.

"In the past, there has been a great deal of dissatisfaction with the Trust," Jamieson observed. "It has been seen by some as unfair, high-handed and prejudicial." But Jamieson feels the organization

should not be faulted for the failings of some representatives.

She believes her lack of previous experience as a trustee is an asset. "I do not have any preconceived ideas or biases from ancient Trust Committee battles. I will look at everything with a clear mind, uncluttered with old commitments and prejudices." Instead of just keeping islanders aware of Trust actions, she hopes to work with the community to find solutions to local issues. Describing herself as honest,

enthusiastic and a strong believer in the democratic process, Jamieson predicted her election to the Trust could bring a change to how the Local Trust Committee serves the community.

"I am asking everyone who shares my vision for our island to please come out and vote because it is really in your hands," she concluded.

Also seeking election is former North Pender trustee Peter Campbell. The by-election was called following the death of trustee Bob Allison on July 15.

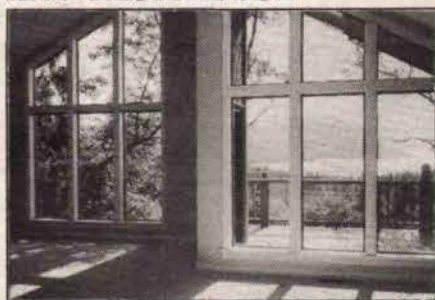

# Association considers property purchase for firehall

The responsibilities of North Galiano's Community Association are many and varied. And most recently it has initiated discussion on the purchasing of property for the relocation of number one firehall.

When the 40-year-old association was revived and reorganized in 1981, the object was to restore an aging building and also to organize a fire department — something lacking north of Montague Harbour at the time. Then president Dr. Hart Scarrow negotiated with MacMillan Bloedel for a lease on a small portion of its property (District Lot 83) where it touches Porlier Pass Drive.

Here the number one firehall was built with volunteer labour, and became the scene of all fire department activities until the number two hall was built (also on leased land) at the corner of Retreat Cove Road and Porlier Pass Drive.

With the sale of MacMillan Bloedel's forest lands in 1991 the community's number one hall's future might have been insecure but for the forest company's insistence that the new owners protect the community's interest and work out a lease arrangement. The new owners, Steve Garrod and Barbara Coward, were as good as their word. Recently a 10-year lease agreement was worked out between the two parties, and at a very nominal cost to the community.

As the community grows (and it appears it is about to grow very quickly judging by the number of new roads and subdivisions now being prepared), the association is preparing for the larger populated area and is looking at other options for fire protection, and

ways of better utilizing present manpower and equipment.

Several months ago it was suggested to the writer, then president of the community association, that a larger commercially zoned property could be purchased for a very reasonable sum if it was desired to relocate number one hall. The location, at the corner of Cook Road and Porlier Pass Drive, would be closer to the centre of North Galiano's presently developed land. And by means of Cook Road, it would more easily access areas on the north-east side of the island — Dionisio Point Park, Therah and other developing areas. The new site has a creek running through it for most of the year (there is no water at the present site) and has the advantage, as well, of a gravity fed supply from a hillside source nearby through installation of a pipeline down Manastee Road.

In late August the community association made a tentative offer to purchase the property subject to acceptance by the owner and with the approval of association members. It is with this in mind that a special general meeting has been called at the north hall for 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 22. Fire Chief Ted Waterman has prepared a list of advantages and disadvantages of the purchase proposal for members to consider before this meeting. These, along with a map and a covering letter from current association president Nancy Davidson, is now in the hands of all members.

In listing advantages the new site presents Waterman comments on its larger area (one acre) compared to the present quarter acre of the lease on District Lot 83. He goes on to note the need for more space in the hall itself, space for the storage of equipment and for the training of firefighters, something which would be difficult to achieve in the present hall on the currently leased land.

The new area has been checked out as a location for a helicopter pad — the only helio pad on the island at present is at the Health Care Centre on Burrill Road at the other end of the island. The Cook and Porlier site was chosen by the B.C. Ambulance Service as one of the best for that purpose at the north end of the island. Islands Trust planners likewise approve of the move to the new site, it is said.

A new hall, aesthetically designed and placed, might, Waterman says, be a very acceptable addition to a beautiful area. Zoned commercial, as it now is, there is any number of enterprises which could be carried out at the site, many of which could be less desirable than a community firehall.

### Cobwebs

Spiders seem to be very numerous this fall. A large one glistens in the morning sunlight in front of our house anchored on trees at least 25 feet apart. A trip down-island the other morning offered another treat. With the sun low in the sky (and blinding the driver every now and then as the road leaves the protection of trees for an eastern-facing section) the webs were in evidence. There they were in the hundreds, hanging from the power lines and anchored

below on B.C. Telephone cable, looking for all the world like a lot of silvery compact discs. Nature is wonderful.

### Fruit flies

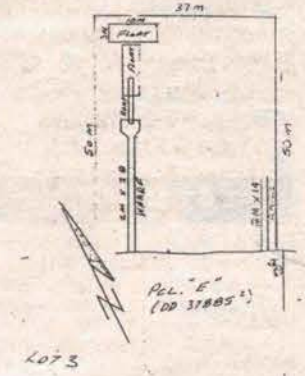

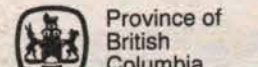

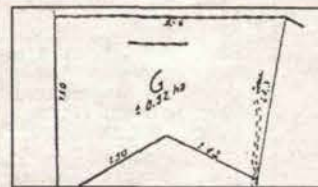
