## Breaking ground

*Charitable Lions are the foundation of many island projects*

Islanders know Pioneer Village. They know Portlock Park. Older people will remember the Fulford to Ganges Walkathon. But what many islanders will not know is that all these are connected. They are all sponsored by the Salt Spring Island Lions.

The Lions is an international service club started in 1917 in Chicago. Today there are more than 1.4 million members, and clubs in Russia and China, as well as all over the rest of the world.

Salt Spring has had its own Lions Club since September 1959. Today there are about 40 members.

"You start out wondering what you're going to get involved with," Stan Sage recalled when he joined up in 1966. "And then you discover the esprit de corps in the club

"You have the satisfaction of knowing you helped your community, you brought some of the little things the government doesn't do."

"It really gets your blood going," Ted Gear said of organizing and putting on all these events. As one of the senior-most members of the local club, with 30 years of experience behind him, he should know.

Some things are done on a province-wide basis, like the 24-hour marathon for disabled children in June. That event, in which islanders Myles Wilson and Bob Campsall are involved, raises money to send disabled children to one of three Lions summer camps, like Camp Shawnigan on Shawnigan Lake.

Some events are international, like the care program which sponsors water projects in countries like Peru and Nigeria. Eyesight projects, which can reverse diet-related blindness in people in Third World countries, is another international Lions project.

Most Lions events, however, are local. So the money raised locally stays local. These kinds of projects include seniors housing, support for youth sports and money for hospitals. This year so far, the club has raised about \$16,000, Sage said.

One of the earlier major projects the Lions club took on was buying the island's first two ambulances in about 1960. To ensure all islanders had equal access to the life-saving vehicles, the Lions only charged \$5 for an annual ambulance membership. That fee included any transfer of patients to hospital in Duncan or Victoria.

Lions shared the driving of the ambulance and Sage recalled one woman user of the service who hesitated once when she saw both Goody Goodman, owner of Goodman Funeral Home, and Rev. Horsefield, parish priest, behind the wheel.

Pioneer Village was the next major project, which provided bungalow-style homes for about 25 island seniors on property donated by Colonel Crofton, one

of the club's first members.

Not every project came to fruition. The Lions were behind a plan to build an ice rink in Mouat Park in 1970. But the Capital Regional District would not support the plan, Sage recalled. They were told the island's population could not support such a facility.

"We did not drop the idea of finding something for island youth," Sage added. "That's when we started thinking about a park at central."

The result was Portlock Park, named after Lion Tom Portlock and opened in 1975. Long-time Lion Colin Mouat used to get help from island kids to pick rocks and clear the land of brush before grass was planted.

"One thing I remember is that one woman said there'll never be enough kids for Portlock Park,"

Sage said. "I remember that every time I drive by."

Among the regular club fundraisers are annual barbecues and beer gardens. And the Lions show up at most events, from the annual spring Horse Ploughing Competition in Ruckle Park to the Fall Fair in September. Last weekend they were at the Challenge Cup Soccer Tournament.

Hank Knudson, who is almost always behind the grill, won't reveal the secrets of Lions-cooked burgers. He did say he likes to make sure everyone gets a well cooked burger or pancakes and sausage.

Ted Gear was organizer of the beer gardens when the Lions still ran them at all these different events.

"I like to meet people," he said of the beer gardens. "And I like to be around when things need to be

fixed."

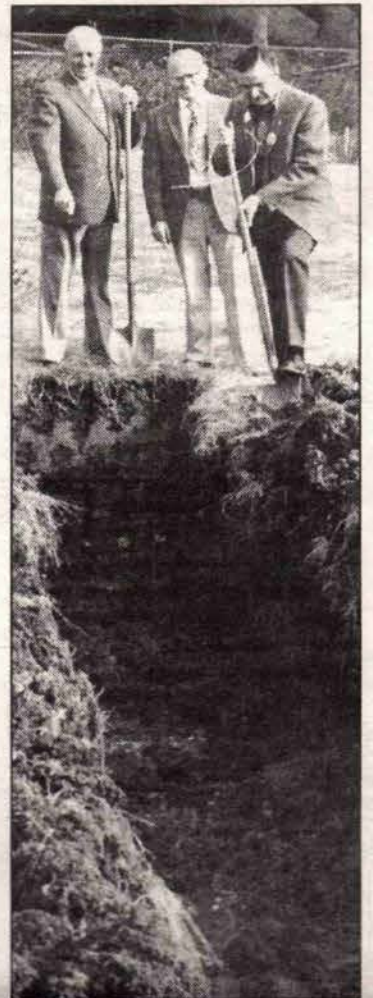
Gear, with connections to wine distributors in Vancouver, also organized the Lions wine and cheese parties. Islanders would be invited to sample different wines from across the province and overseas. Afterwards there would be a dance. Beer gardens and wine and cheese parties were a good source of revenue, he said, until liquor control board regulations made them more and more difficult to hold.

For the present, local Lions are concentrating on building a new hall. The Hart Bradley Hall, named after the first president of the island club, is scheduled to be finished by the end of September. It will be a community hall, not a Lions club, Sage was clear to point out. The Lions wanted the space to hang some of their trophies and memorabilia, which has been kept in various closets through the years.

The building may eventually be connected to a seniors complex which may be built on the site in the future. The Lions also have their eyes on upgrading Pioneer Village, which is now more than 25 years old. And they want to maintain their ties to youth sport and other programs involving young people.

Speaking of young people, Sage said, the Salt Spring Lions are always looking for new members and younger members. While there is almost always the will, some of the older members are not able to lift as many bags of cement as they were in days gone by. New members can be assured of all the "satisfaction of doing good in the community," Sage said.

"You won't have idle hands if you become a Lion."

# Library seeking donors to help raise money for new computers

The Salt Spring Island Public Library Association is seeking donors willing to buy bits, bytes, hard drives, CPUs and other computer hardware and software to help the association with its \$42,000 conversion to a computerized library system.

"A computerized library is much more accessible," said chairman Tony Burrige. Computerization will make it easier to check books in and out, to determine if a specific book is out on loan and to find books on certain topics.

He expects it will take the library's volunteers 18 months to complete the conversion of 30,000-plus items to the computerized system.

Donors of \$100 or more will have their name put on a plaque, which will be displayed in the library. Those who donate \$1,000 or more can designate their donations to a specific piece of equipment, which will also be marked with a plaque.

All donors will have a chance of winning a piece of software from Berkeley Systems. Two numbers between 0 and 42,000 have been chosen at random.

The donor whose contribution brings the total to or over either of the two numbers will win the software.

"For example, if one of the chosen numbers happened to be 2,000 and \$1,990 had been collected in donations, someone who then made a \$10 donation would win one of the software packages," Burrige explained.

In addition to fundraising, the library is seeking volunteers willing to help with the massive job of converting all of the books and other library items to the computerized system.

Burrige said volunteering would be a good way to gain some training in using computers or managing book stocks. He hopes there will be a team of nine people working in the library each day on the project.

Computer literate secondary school students are also welcome to help over the summer, he added.

# Workshop to discuss intervening in abuse

Salt Spring child rights advocate Jan Hunt will present a workshop on intervention of public child abuse this week at the Community Services Society's new Family Place.

Although she has a Master Degree in Sociology, Hunt says it is from parenting her now 14-year-old son that she has learned the most.

As a child rights activist she supports concepts such as the family bed, extended breast feeding, home schooling and intervention of public child abuse.

She is the B.C. coordinator for the Canadian Society for prevention of Cruelty to Children, the editorial assistant for the society's journal — Empathic Parenting — and has written numerous magazine and newspaper articles on various aspects of parenting.

The free workshop runs from 2-4 p.m. this Saturday at the Family Place. Child care is available by pre-registration.

Family Place coordinator Rags Hildred says the workshop will be a "discussion on supporting the parent and child by the observer of emotional or physical child abuse in a public setting."

It is the first of a series of ongoing free workshops at the Family Place. The second runs Wednesday, May 31 and focuses on daycare subsidies and income assistance for young families. Call Hildred at 537-9176 for further information.

# Beaver boasts impressive resume

Imagine the "Help Wanted" column asking for someone with these skills: developer, lumberjack, home builder, and hydraulic engineer. Who do you know who'd qualify?

Enter one large, wet rodent. The beaver might fail the interview but, my, what an impressive resumé!

When beavers move into an area, the landscape is altered. Trees fall. A dam may be constructed. Water flow changes. Family life commences, including home building, home maintenance, food gathering, food stockpiling, and quality child care.

Beaver pond-building encourages biological diversity. The wetlands they "develop" provide homes for waterfowl, fish, insects, frogs, salamanders,

otters, muskrats, and water shrews. When beavers and humans share land, though, conflict may soon arise. Farming areas can be flooded, irrigation canals blocked, and prize trees felled.

Recently in the Lower Mainland a pair of beavers went to work on a subdivision stream, building a dam virtually overnight. Some residents were delighted; others appalled. The latter prevailed, and the dam was destroyed.

The beavers, however, were determined to stay, and rebuilt. The dam was destroyed. The beavers rebuilt. The dam was ...

well, you get the idea.

The intelligence of beavers has been questioned — are they smart, or are they merely acting on genetic programming; called "instinct?"

You might suppose that an animal capable of monogamy, developing land, controlling water, building homes, and storing foods would be respected as intelligent by the species that is capable of the very same things. (That would be us, of course.) But we consider ourselves superior because we have to learn these things, whereas beavers are born with this innate knowledge.

Go figure.

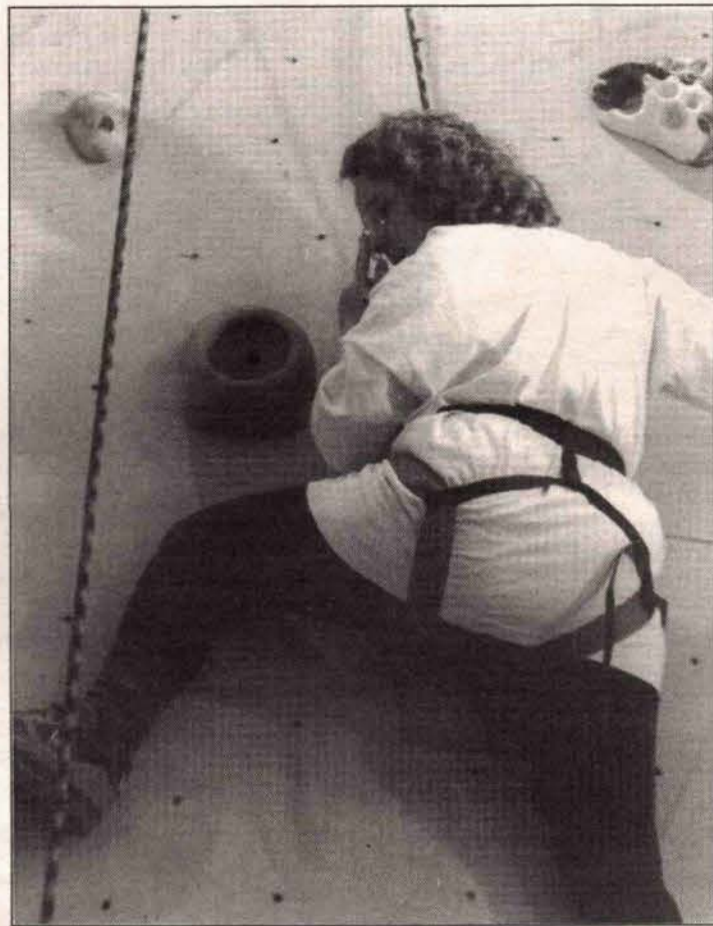

## 400 players compete for 3 challenge cups

Monday saw a weekend of soccer madness come to a close as the Salt Spring Challenge Cup completed the final games, made all the presentations, and then saw the 400-plus players and their many supporters wearily trudged home to different parts of B.C.

Twenty-four teams competed in 55 games on four Salt Spring fields to try and get their name on one of the three cups up for the winning.

Along the way these teams met with upsets, disappointments, triumphs, spectacular high-lights and, unfortunately, injuries.

Highlight of the tourney may have been the women's section, expanded to six teams this year. Not only did these women put on a great display of soccer skills, but also proved they could definitely out-party most of the men's teams. This section featured two semi-final upsets, as Courtenay defeated favoured Vartridges, and Gorge upset Powell River to advance to the final.

The final was closely fought, ending in a 1-1 tie before Gorge won the game and the Ed Lumley Challenge Cup on penalty shots. The MVP also came from Gorge: Julie Vanderweerde, who scored a crucial goal in the penalty shoot-out.

The Over-30's section also featured an upset as Victoria West ousted last year's champion Cowichan on a thrilling comeback from a 3-1 deficit in the semi-final. However, their luck ran out in the final as Lakehill prevailed 2-1 to win the Sir Richard McBride Cup and also take the MVP in Craig Myer.

In the Open section 10 teams competed for the cup, but

Courtenay and Powell River were heavy favourites with Salt Spring F.C. (last year's winner) being a major challenger.

The first major upset occurred when Salt Spring F.C. did not qualify for the championship round and was relegated to consolation play (where they also fell to defeat in the final 1-0 to Victoria West).

Courtenay easily made the final, but Powell River was upset by Peninsula on a last minute goal to make for an interesting final. Unfortunately, Peninsula's luck had run out, as the more experienced Courtenay side, led by MVP Troy Brown, handily won 1-0 and took home the Eric Springford Challenge Cup.

So what happened to our two local teams — the S.S. Old Boys and F.C.? Was their opposition too strong, or did the lads consume too many of the brown elixir?

For the Old Boys it has come down to a curse. The team has been cursed to lose in its own tourney — for no matter how hard they try, the lads still lose. At the moment, the only solution appears to be to bring in some ringers (real soccer players) or to not play at all and spend the weekend in the beer garden. (The only problem is, we do this already.)

For F.C. their poor showing is a mystery — maybe their shaved heads affected their thought processes for the games (no! they are not known for thinking).

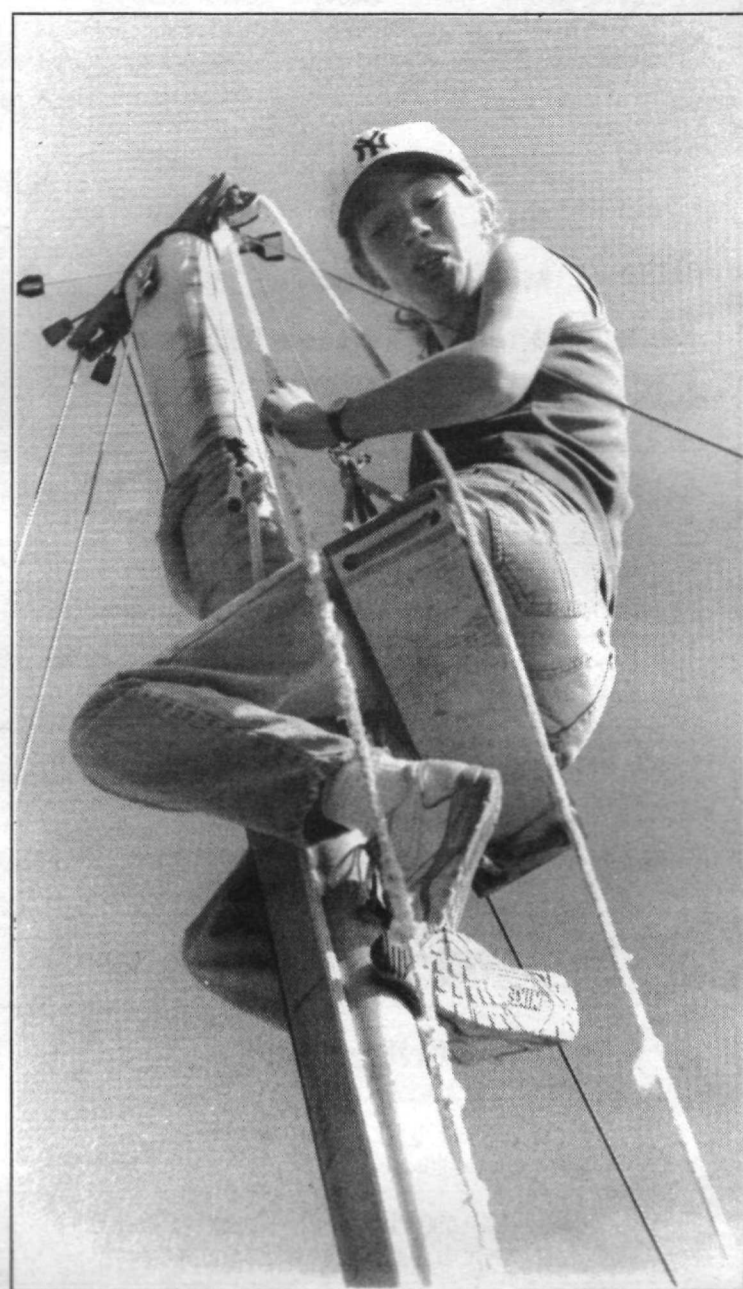

# Blowing in the wind

Sailors compete in biggest Round Salt Spring Race ever

**P**ender Island's Don Williams took home the Marshall Sharp trophy on the weekend in the biggest Round Salt Spring Race ever.

Of the 60 boats registered for the event, William's Ericson 23, Petrouchka, finished with a corrected time of 16:20:16, winning C division and the overall race. Second place overall went to Kevin Vine's Deryn Mor. Louis Renaud took third in Buckshot.

Race organizer Kevin Vine was surprised at his high-place finish. After several hours battling tides and little wind from Southey Point to Long Harbour, Deryn Mor "turned the corner and there was everybody just sitting at the end of the harbour."

Between 4:30 a.m. Sunday and 6:30 a.m., the race was a race again as about 15 boats found the wind coming out of Ganges Harbour. Tacking back and forth across the harbour and across each other's bows, brought the largest race on record to a fitting, spirited end.

There were some special prizes for outstanding achievement during the race. Lawrie Neish took home a set of bungee cords as the outstanding sailor from Salt Spring Island. He sailed his boat, Saorsa, single-handed in the race, coming second in his class and fourth overall with a time of 17:07:56.

The five-woman crew of Minke, skippered by Gayle Meek, won best all-woman crew in the event with their ninth-place finish in C class and 30th place

overall. They finished the race in 19:08:32.

Minke crew member Nina Tranter also garnered an award for outstanding crew member, for her "unfailing good nature." (Boats limping down Trincomali Channel, and more than a few campers on Wallace Island, were treated to a hearty rendition of Me and Bobby Magee by Tranter at 3 a.m.)

Other race results included a first place finish for Fandango in A division, with a corrected time of 18:02:58. Hard Drive, a boat from the Maple Bay club, came in five minutes later for a second place finish, while Something Special came in four minutes later for third.

In the B class boats, Maple Bay's J Walker came first with a time of 17:23:17 and captured fifth place overall in the race. Salt Spring's Impulse followed 11 minutes later and Hortense five minutes after her.

In the C class boats, Deryn Mor came first and placed second overall with a corrected time of 16:56:48. Louis Renaud's Buckshot came in four minutes later to claim second place in the division and third place overall while Tufted Puffin came in third in the division with a time of 17:23:46.

The fourth division, for boats with no spinnakers flying, was won by Petrouchka, which won the race overall. Neish came second in this class and fourth overall in Saorsa, in a time of 17:07:56. Tony Burrige came third in the class in Tinker with a time of 19:17:04.

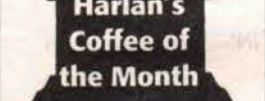

Despite the results, and Marr's injury, it was a good tournament for F.C. It was certainly fun anyway. The effort was there, the results weren't. What more can one say?

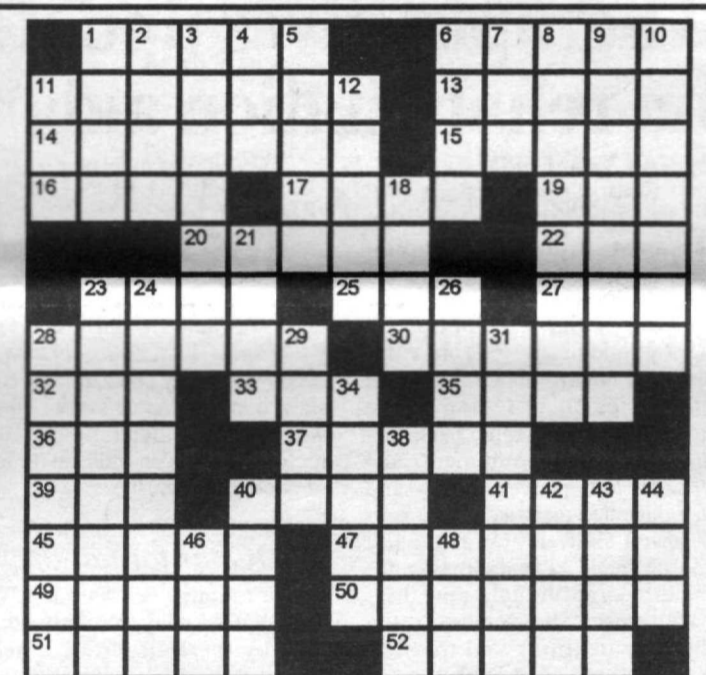

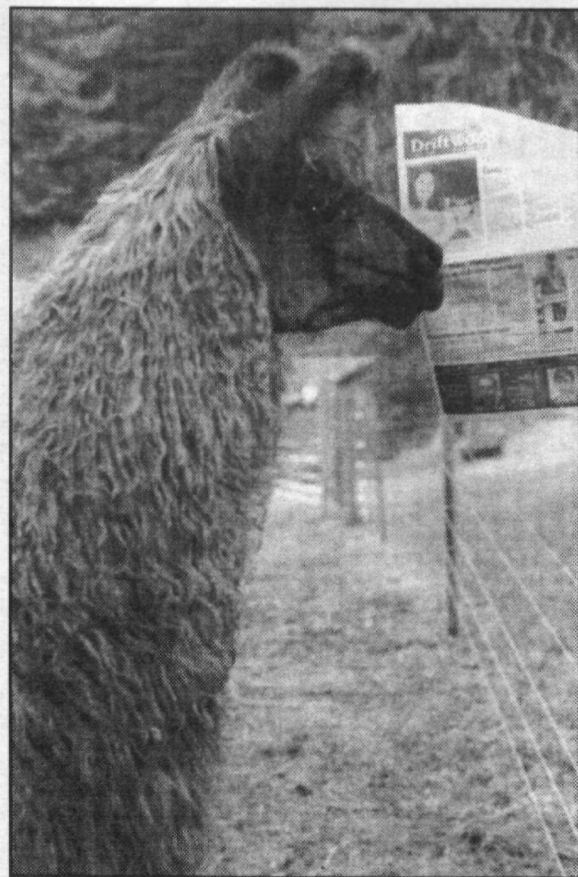

# Therapist gives update on rehabilitation aids

Cheryl Jewett, a rehabilitation therapist from the Capital Regional District, spoke to the Saturna Women's Club recently. She presented information on what physiotherapy aids are available and how to obtain them. She had advice about setting up the home with safety rails, bars, lifts and other such equipment. She brought along several items and demonstrated their use.

Jewett showed how home life can be made safer and easier for disabled individuals and their caregivers. She demonstrated methods of lifting and transferring patients. Although regular physiotherapy is not available on the island, she suggested using hospital services or the pool program at Panorama Centre in Saanich.

There is a well stocked loan cupboard on Saturna thanks to Jewett's efforts. She has gone to the Canadian Red Cross and to the Adden Chase Foundation in order to obtain medical equipment such as crutches and walkers which are available to islanders on a temporary basis. Laura Paul, community health nurse, will help islanders who need assistance getting physiotherapy equipment.

Paul will be operating an Adult Immunisation Clinic June 1 from 1 to 3 p.m. and June 5 from 3 to 5 p.m. at the J.E. Money Medical Clinic. Islanders are reminded that their Tetanus/Diphtheria booster shot is due every ten years. This is especially important for anyone who does gardening or who comes in contact with soil.

Ellen Garvie invited all Saturna parents of young children to participate in a child care survey. She is studying the need for child care on the Outer Gulf Islands. Those who were unable to attend the meeting will be able to respond with a questionnaire.
