## Capturing History

*Henk Lantinga's camera caught images of the past*

Condemned war criminals, heads down and flanked by guards, were captured by Henk Lantinga's camera.

The tension of troops dismantling a bomb discovered in a field after the end of World War II was caught on his film.

He recorded the rebuilding of Arnhem, an area bombed during the Allied advance through Holland and looted by the Germans after the civilians were

driven from the city.

Also preserved through his lens was the gradual return to normal life: the December 6 arrival of St. Nicholas, a child milking a cow, a wagon loaded with hay, children skating on a flooded and frozen field, the installation of a mayor, a service in a cemetery filled with rows of small white crosses.

Using an old-fashioned, wooden box camera Lantinga covered assignments for a national newspaper, took portraits of children at home and snapped technical pho-

tographs for businesses. He pedalled to assignments, balancing the bulky box camera on a bicycle,

"You'd have to do everything on a bicycle. You didn't have a car," Lantinga recalled.

Although making a living was difficult at times, life was easy compared to the war years. Lantinga's family suffered its share of tragedy, with his mother killed during the evacuation of Arnhem and his brother in a prisoner-of-war camp.

The Battle of Arnhem, dramatized in the book and movie "A Bridge Too Far," was a pivotal event in Lantinga's life. A large painting of shattered troop vehicles on the bridge is displayed in his home, 51 years after the four-day battle.

On September 17, 1944, a massive assault was launched by the Allies in a bid to take the Arnhem bridge and open a path into northern Holland. From his home, Lantinga recalls seeing hordes of British paratroopers falling out of the sky to the north of the city, which was still in German hands.

Dropped 64 miles behind the German front lines, the allied troops were expected to seize the Arnhem bridge and the large Nijmegen bridge to the south. The assault failed and after four days of fighting, 17,000 allied soldiers were killed, wounded or missing in action.

For the civilians in Arnhem, the attack had an immediate aftermath. The Germans ordered all civilians in the city, an estimated 100,000 people, to leave. "They plundered the city after that," Lantinga recalled.

At the time, Lantinga was 24 and working as a draftsman at Kema Arnhem, a large company which tested electrical components. His family owned a large wagon and a horse, used for deliveries from his father's fruit and produce store in Arnhem. Lantinga recalls the family packing goods into the delivery wagon. "There was no organization, you just went."

With his family were three

women, refugees from another part of Holland, his sister and brother-in-law, their two children, Lantinga's sister-in-law and four neighbours.

They travelled a short distance out of the city and stopped for the night in the bush, failing to realize they were in the middle of German encampments. "About 5:30 that evening, we got bombed."

Everyone scattered into the trees and flung themselves to the earth. Lying beside Lantinga, one of his neighbours was hit in the foot with a piece of shrapnel. Lantinga's brother-in-law, lying on top of his children to protect them, was hit in

did not starve over the winter. Their host had a supply of coal, which could be traded with nearby farms for food. Their diet was limited, but no one died.

But in the cities, where the majority of the Dutch population lived, the last six months of the war became known as "the hunger winter." Railways did not run and there was no food coming into the towns. People died of starvation.

A few weeks after arriving in Friesland, Lantinga was picked up by the Germans for "failing to register." His brother-in-law, who spoke German, distracted the

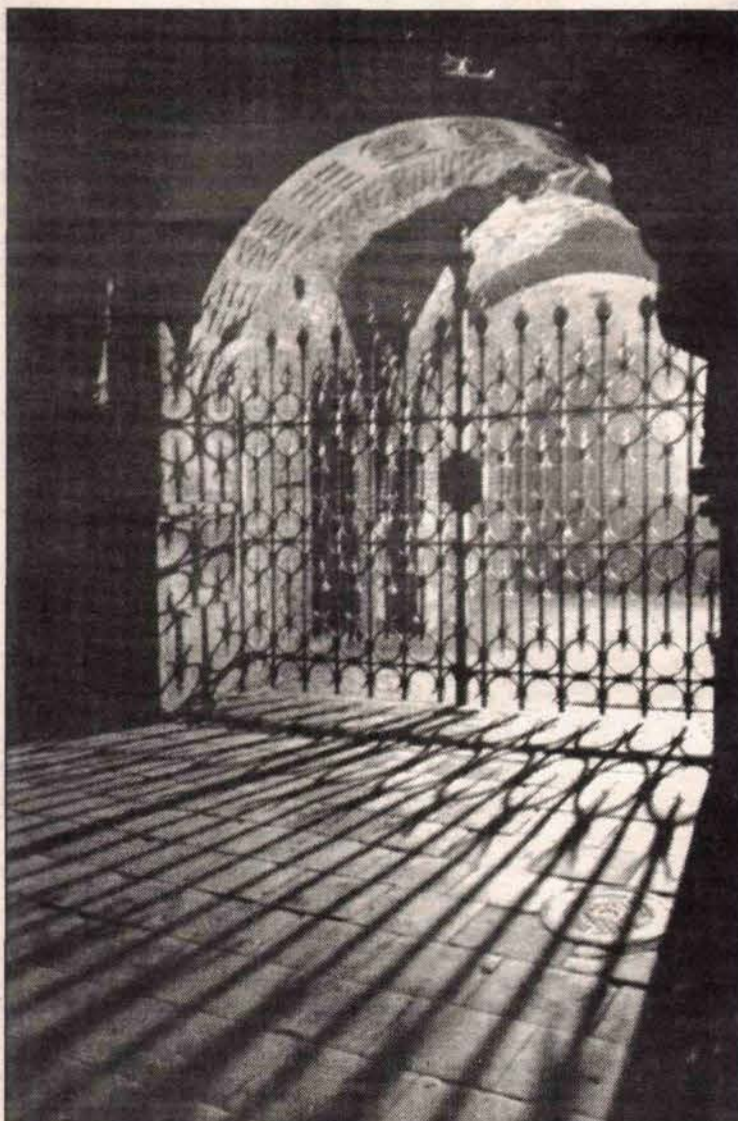
Germans by talking about the battle of Arnhem and finally convinced them to let Lantinga go, claiming the family had just arrived in the province so

there had been no time to register. That incident was more than enough warning. Lantinga went "underground," going to live in the northern village of Marsum, where he had been born. Everyone in the village knew he was there but none would turn him in to the Germans.

Many other able-bodied young men were not so fortunate. "Several of my friends got picked up earlier. They took them to Germany as slave labourers to work in factories," Lantinga said. After the war, most came home but a few had died in bombing raids.

All of this — the threat of forced labour, the shortage of food, the loss of loved ones and the tension of war — made the joy

# Vancouver airport could use communications face-lift

It was a good idea to meet my friends at the Vancouver Airport. It was so good an idea that I was up at five in the morning to take the early Tsawwassen ferry.

Those lovely scrambled eggs for breakfast! And the plastic forks that snap off as you try to spear a rasher of bacon! I faced up to these hardships that haunt island living and I arrived in the city with hours to spare.

It was 1 p.m. when I arrived at the airport. The construction was familiar. The parking was not.

I parked where the sign invited "Hourly Parking." If it had offered "expensive" parking or "Top of the Market Parking" I might have been less shaken by the cost of a two-hour wasted delay: \$9.

That was when I lost my car. I walked round the airport twice before a helpful commissionaire identified the lot into which I had strayed. And before you start jeering, try it out. Nothing is for ever and the old parking system was a

cinch in comparison.

Naturally, the plane was late. Scheduled for 1:15 p.m., it was now expected at 2 p.m. I could take that. After all, it was still only nine hours since I had risen from my bed. I enjoyed a hot chocolate for lunch in the slightly eerie semi-basement that is the overcrowded, inadequate reception area so eagerly condemned and even now awaiting elimination.

One thing for that crowded cellar is the consolation that you never know whether it was an eager traveller heading out that knocked the cup out of your hand, or a weary watcher waiting in patience for friend or family com-

ing in from foreign parts and foreign ports. Never seems to matter all that much.

Somewhat later I checked the silent board and learned that the plane had already arrived. The time was something after 2 p.m.

Now it was just that usual waiting game. Passengers coming off the international flights are held in security until they come out into the half-light of the reception area. There are few signs and only one live voice to guide them.

If they push the stacked buggy up the first ramp they've got it made. If they head straight on, they join the hordes heading for warmer climes, and the passengers

and the waiters and the eager observers get together in a whirlpool of people, all circling and none knowing clearly how he got into this mess or how he might get out of it.

For two happy hours I watched the ways. There were elderly ladies pushing their possessions up the ramp and there were young travellers back home in British Columbia and sporting duty-free bags, perched perilously on top of their luggage.

Every type and style of British Columbian was there, happy, sweating, jetted out and not yet lagging. But of the two happy Brits I was expecting there was nary a sign.

By 4 p.m. I had lost all hope. Either my passengers had missed the plane or had been denied admittance to British Columbia or they had walked past me and I had failed to see them.

I paid my \$9 and looked for my car. After a brisk constitutional I

made contact and got out. A brief visit to my family filled in the time to the late ferry and 17 hours after rising I was back home and ready to resume snoring.

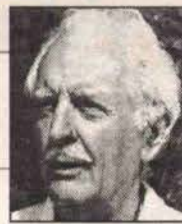
It was the sequel that really set my ears back.

I had a call from my friend Wynne Davies in the hotel that had been my target. He explained that the plane was delayed in Holland to permit the return home of thousands of soccer fans who had been supporting their team in an international tournament. The Vancouver-bound plane was an hour and a half late. They arrived in Vancouver late that afternoon and left the airport even later than I did.

I'm happy that the airport should be improved. I'm not all that happy that I have to contribute to the cost every time I fly. But above all, I hope that a new airport with new facilities might include a means of communication with the waiting public.

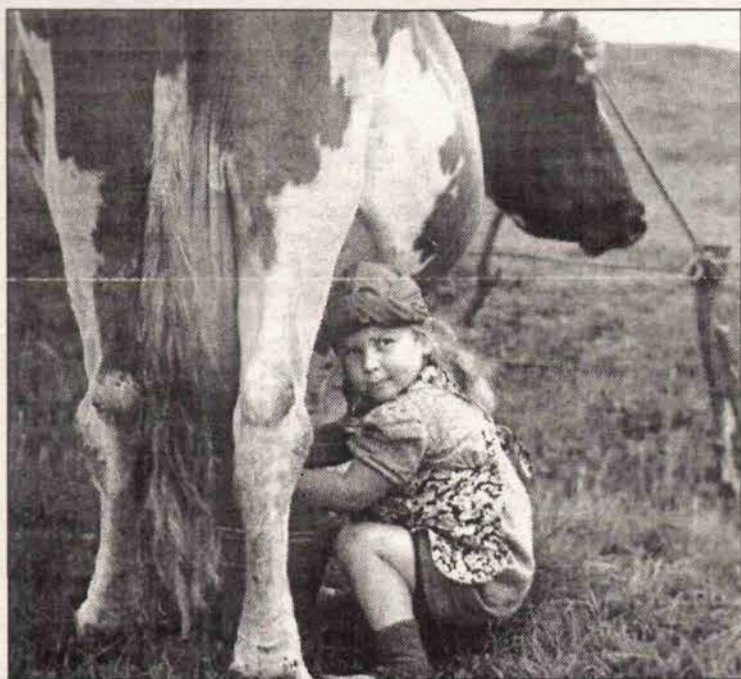

of liberation even more acute.

"After living like that and being hunted by the Germans — all of a sudden you're free," Lantinga recalled. "We got liberated by the Canadians. They brought a lot of food."

He couldn't resist recording the event. As the Canadian tanks rolled into Marsum, he dug out a camera and began taking photographs of the soldiers, the tanks and the celebration.

"It was like a big festival. It was incredible."

Despite the jubilation, the war was not yet over and unauthorized photographs of troop movements were not allowed. Lantinga's film was confiscated, although his camera was returned. "They weren't nasty about it."

The end of the war gave Lantinga the chance to turn his photographic avocation into a vocation. In 1946 he completed the first-ever photo-journalism course offered in the country and joined with a friend in operating a studio, which handled everything from portraits to news photos to technical photographs.

The Canadian liberation of Holland developed into another opportunity. His best friend's sister married one of the Canadian soldiers. After his best friend left for Canada, Lantinga realized he could also emigrate.

"If you had somebody living in Canada, it was very easy to emigrate because they could sponsor you." Lantinga also had two trades to offer his new country, drafting and photography.

Now married, he felt economic prospects would be better in Canada. There was also a growing apprehension in Holland that the German invasion would be echoed by Russian troops.

By 1950, Lantinga was ready to cross the Atlantic. By 1952 he was in Calgary, working as a darkroom technician for a photographic plant. He was then hired by one of Calgary's top studios, Mackie Photo Studio, as a darkroom technician and photographer.

He returned to drafting a year later, accepting a job with Imperial Oil. He stayed with that company until his retirement in 1982, when he moved to Salt Spring.

But he has never stopping taking photographs. The walls of his Salt Spring home are a gallery of his work, from photographs taken in Holland to photographs of the west coast.

Among his favorites are a series of photographs taken in Holland, showing a five-year-old child milking a cow. The appealing photographs are a photographer's dream.

# Cross-Canada newspaper people gather here for annual meeting

Community newspaper representatives from across Canada were on Salt Spring last week for two days of meetings.

Regional and cross-Canada bulletin board systems, the information highway and its importance for newspapers, marketing and sales along with Canada Post were main topics for discussion.

Gulf Islands Driftwood publisher Joyce Carlson is this year's president of the Canadian Community Newspaper Association that includes 680 newspapers across the country. She held a welcoming reception at her home Thursday evening after people had arrived.

Presidents and vice-presidents met Friday at the Harbour House Hotel while the regional association executive directors met at Seabreeze Inn. A joint meeting followed at Harbour House Saturday with the two groups in attendance.

Each year a meeting is held so presidents and vice-presidents get acquainted and discuss items of common concerns. It helps provide direction for the incoming national president and board of directors. The national association is a federation of seven regions. Yukon is part of the BC regional, Northwest Territories hook up with Alberta and the Maritime provinces and Newfoundland form the Atlantic region.

"It's a microcosm of Canada and you appreciate the difficulties of governing this country," said Carlson. "Each region has its own needs and while some are shared, others are very different."

The meeting concluded with an evening at the oceanside home of

Dal and Joan Ingram's Solimar resort at Beaver Point. Other members of the Driftwood staff and guests joined the group.

"People were not kept so busy that they did not have a chance to see the island," said Carlson, adding that many of the delegates brought spouses who also visited island home-based businesses, shops, restaurants and the

Saturday Market in the Park.

"With perfect weather, Salt Spring looked its best for the week. Visitors were amazed at how hot it was here. The Saskatchewan representatives left their province when it was minus three and had a light snow. Everyone remarked how friendly people were and how well they were treated."

# Four components to new CAAP course planned for fall

Two weeks ago we received the curriculum guide from the ministry for the Career and Personal Planning 11/12 (CAPP) course that is supposed to be implemented this fall.

This course is made up of four general areas: personal development, career development, personal planning, and the one you have likely heard the most about — work experience.

## Work experience

The work experience component is already well under way. Most students entering Grade 11 will have already completed this portion of the program thanks to Scott Bergstrom, Maggie Allison and the cooperation of the business community.

I strongly recommend to those who have not yet completed their work experience that they do so during Grade 11 — even if

they have an excellent idea of their longterm goal.

I make this recommendation for two reasons. One, first-hand exposure to a career tends to make it a lot easier for students to make good course selections during their final year in high school. Two, it is not uncommon for a student to think that his longterm career plan is exactly what he wants, only to find that a week on the job brings to light aspects of the career that he had never thought about. The result, sometimes, is that the student changes career plans completely.

## Career development

This component of the program is closely tied to work

experience. Its main concern help students become aware of career opportunities, the processes they need to follow to enter a career, and what they can expect to find when they get there.

Students determine where their interests lie and what their particular strengths are through such instruments as interest tests and aptitude tests. They explore careers in many ways such as using computer programs like "Choices," video-taped programs, field trips, and presentations from visiting career practitioners. They learn how to seek out careers and how to apply for jobs within different career areas.

## Personal development

This area concentrates on Healthy Living, Mental Well-Being, Family Life Education, Child Abuse Prevention, Substance Abuse Prevention, and Safety and Injury

Prevention.

We do not know, yet, exactly how we will be presenting the material in this area; but probably we will use the combined skills of students, parents, teachers, community resource people and counsellors. We will be attempting to develop specific plans over the next three months.

## Personal planning

In this area you will be hearing about "Student Learning Plans."

Using information from the other three areas, students will be expected to develop their own

plans. This planning process will likely conclude each year with a booklet that will demonstrate the student has made shortterm and longterm plans, and it will likely include evidence of all of those successes that each student will have had during that school year — diplomas, certificates of participation in different events in school and out of school, etc.

Fundamentally, at the end of Grade 12, a student should be able to review the learning plan booklets and see evidence of planning over a number of years, successes in a variety of areas, and a tentative plan for the immediate future after leaving high school.

## Potluck will celebrate anniversary

St. Mary's Church in Burgoyne Valley is celebrating the anniversary of its consecration with a special service of thanksgiving and a potluck dinner Friday, June 2. The church was officially opened June 3, 1894 and cost \$705 to build.

Last year, the Anglican parish of Salt Spring Island celebrated the church's centenary with a service, roast lamb barbecue and dance.

St. Mary's congregation member Nancy Wigen was recently lamenting the decline of church-going in the mainstream churches throughout North America and not just on Salt Spring.

"One of the best ways to get reconnected is to have an event where everyone can get together."

Wigen had hoped the success of the centenary event last year could be duplicated and carried forward as a St. Mary's and Burgoyne Valley tradition. But advanced ticket sales for a barbecue dinner and dance could not justify an event of that scale this year.

So the St. Mary celebration has been scaled back to include a 5:30 p.m. service of thanksgiving in the church and a potluck dinner in the church afterwards. All members of the parish and community are welcome to attend.

Salt Spring Islanders are acknowledging the work that women do. Members of the Central America Support group are putting together a project to help establish a women's weaving workshop in Guatemala.

"It will enable Guatemalan women in Nueva Esperanza to become more autonomous," Linda Brierly explained. Linda and Bill Brierly recently returned from three months in Guatemala and are spearheading the plan to form a "partner-relationship" with the refugee community of Nueva Esperanza.

Seed money from Salt Spring will buy supplies for making traditional woven squares, wall hang-

ings and other goods. Half of what is produced will be bought by the group to sell on Salt Spring, leaving half for the Guatemalan women to sell themselves.

The Brierlys have been writing to members of Mama Maquin, a women's group in the village to find out what the women can make, how much each item would cost to make and how much to buy. Linda Brierly emphasized this aid was not a "donation."

"They have the skills. They have the time," she said. "But theirs is a man's culture. This is one small step on their way to acknowledging themselves and being acknowledged in their own community."

## Toy library gives kids a chance to enjoy whole range of toys

For children whose parents are members of Salt Spring's toy library, Christmas comes every two weeks.

That is how often they can visit the toy library in the basement of Our Lady of Grace Catholic church, 135 Drake Road, and pick out four new toys to enjoy.

Usually they are so excited about the chance to borrow new toys, they don't mind bringing back the toys they have enjoyed for the past two weeks, organizer Ann Cronin said.

Since the library was started in the fall of 1993 with a few participating families and a small collection of toys gleaned from garage sales, the project has grown to include 179 toys and now serves an estimated 30 families.

Toddlers seem to benefit most from the toy library, Cronin said. The majority of toys in the library are for that

age group, in part because toys for toddlers are sturdy and do not have a lot of small pieces which can be easily lost.

Cronin often finds toddlers' toys in excellent condition at garage sales. She also receives some through donations once the children have outgrown the toys. Member families either pay \$20 a year to join or contribute toys to the collection.

The collection includes a few baby toys, a large selection for toddlers to age four, and a smaller selection for older children. Cronin notes the first toy purchased for the library was a Brio train set, which she and co-founder Sandy Kyle each contributed \$20 to buy.

The group also collects grocery tapes and used the proceeds from those to purchase more toys. The church donates the space, Cronin noted, and built a cupboard to hold the toys.

The toy library is open every second week, on Monday mornings from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m.

In the summer, the toy library is open once in July and once in August.

Any parent interested is welcome to drop by or to call Cronin at 653-9548.

## Lou Gehrig's Disease fought by ALS funds

The second annual tag day for the British Columbia ALS Society will get underway in Ganges on Saturday, June 3 with more than 30 volunteers stationed at the various collection points.

More commonly known as Lou Gehrig's Disease, ALS (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis) is a devastating disease of the nervous system which kills one in every thousand adults in Canada.

Last year on Salt Spring close to \$1,500 was collected, making it the fourth highest in a group of 34 collection stations in the Greater

Victoria and Gulf Islands group. The total for the entire group was \$21,387.

Ninety-five per cent of all funds collected go directly into the research programs seeking to find a cure for the disease.

A person suffering from ALS will become totally paralyzed within a period of three to five years, but will remain mentally alert as the disease does not attack the brain. For the victim it creates a period of enormous frustration which can only be alleviated by death.

# 'Dreams and Nightmares' entertain Galiano audiences

"Dreams and Nightmares" was the title given to last week's Galiano Players' production of five short plays.

The first three plays were written by a group known as the Actors of Louisville and included: Apres Opera — a man dreams of getting back with his girl; Perfect — a matchmaker appears to be thwarted by her best friend; and Intermission — making it big on Broadway turns nightmarish.

Sets were simple but effective on the small stage in South Galiano's hall. The actors, amateurs all, understood their roles. Their voices were good and characterizations excellent.

After the evening's intermission two more plays were seen: Professor Taranne by Russian playwright Arthur Adamov and Heroes by Ken Mitchell of Saskatchewan.

In the latter play Ken Pattison as Superman and Marek Czuma as The Lone Ranger were great fun, and ably supported by a flirtatious Lois Lane (Kathy Sharp) and a crafty and financially successful Tonto (Kiyoko Okuda). Rene Mahlow gave an excellent portrayal of Professor Taranne in the preceding play. A large supporting cast of 12 helped make his a memorable performance.

Director David Clothier has brought his actors a long way in a very short time — stage movements were easy and suited to the action, voices were clear and well modulated. The whole cast presented a professionalism we have rarely seen on the island.

Adding to the enjoyment of many were the risers created by Dennis Olsen. Now those at the back of the hall can see the action on stage just as well as those at the front — a marvelous improvement.

## Confusion in the ferry line ups

The ferry system was taxed to the limit on the Victoria Day weekend and overloads occurred frequently. Travellers were sometimes left waiting at the depots to catch a later sailing, or had their Tsawwassen-Galiano fare returned and were counselled to take a ferry to Swartz Bay and then return to Galiano on the next sailing from there.

One couple who booked into a

local resort (for Friday and Saturday, to return to the mainland on Sunday at noon), had their holiday shortened somewhat when they followed the B.C. Ferries' advice. Instead of a scheduled 10 a.m. arrival here, they drove off the Queen of Cumberland at 5:50 p.m. Friday was pretty well over by that time.

A local resident returning on Saturday morning was told by the ticket agent at Tsawwassen to wait in line 18. She had a paid reservation and had arrived at the terminal 40 minutes ahead of time as required. She wondered about the lane 18 line — Galiano usually waits in line 2 — but there were other Galiano cars in that line, so she decided not to worry. Her wonder later turned to concern, then apprehension and finally dismay as the ship arrived, unloaded, loaded and departed while she and the others in line 18 remained in the parking lot.

Her fare was returned and a free voyage to Swartz Bay was offered. She later paid the cheaper fare from Swartz Bay to Sturdies Bay. What galls many islanders is B.C. Ferries "superior attitude" in providing reservation travel. The \$10 penalty charge for a traveller's change in plans bothers many, also the ruling that paid reservations must be picked up so long before sailing time, when the ferry itself may, or may not, arrive or depart anywhere near its scheduled departure time.

## Bus travel

Another B.C. Ferry ruling, as posted, states that at the Tsawwassen terminal all foot passengers must obtain boarding passes at least 10 minutes prior to sailing. Buses bringing passengers to Tsawwassen from the Lower Mainland are very dependable but do, sometimes, get caught in heavy traffic. If they arrive at the ferry depot after the 10 minute cut-off, what then?

With the 10 minute deadline approaching, buses arrived and disgorged their passengers on a recent Sunday morning. Only one cashier was on duty and not a very patient one — she had

more to do than she could handle. The purchasers of tickets were looking at their watches and hoping they would make it to the wicket before the "cut off," and were apprehensive. The announced cut-off time was shown on a poster nearby, would they make it? They did, another wicket was opened to relieve the beleaguered cashier. Perhaps the "rules" should be posted but less obviously. Those of us who know the system worry less about B.C. Ferries "humanity" than those first time travellers.

# Islanders were concerned about cuts to ferry service

Thirty-five years ago

May 19, 1960

Fears that ferry service between Fulford and Swartz Bay would be cut back to allow the Motor Princess to serve the Outer Islands were laid to rest after protests were filed with the government by the Ganges Business Man's Association and the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce.

The province agreed to an expanded service for the Fulford to Swartz Bay route, starting June 3 and continuing until September 5. The service was to start at 6 a.m. daily with sailings every two hours until the last sailing from Fulford at 6 p.m. Assigned to the route was the Delta Princess, which docked at Fulford every night.

The Fulford to Swartz Bay schedule was designed to link with the new Swartz Bay to Tsawwassen route.

Outer Island service was to be provided by the Motor Princess and the Geo. S. Pearson was to serve the Vesuvius-Crofton route.

Thirty years ago

May 20, 1965

An inconsistent Ministry of Education policy on school construction was creating problems for the Gulf Islands school district. The district had been planning a new secondary school to serve the Gulf Islands. A referendum had

been passed to finance the project.

However, while the plans for the new high school were still being drawn, the Ministry of Education changed the requirements for industrial arts, home economics and commerce departments. As directed by the ministry, the board incorporated those new requirements into the plans for the new school and then approached the ministry for permission to borrow additional funds for the project.

However, the ministry turned down the request, telling the board

that other schools the same size as Gulf Islands Senior Secondary are able to manage with the equipment already approved in the referendum.

Twenty-five years ago

May 14, 1970

A parents committee on Salt Spring Island was trying to establish a dental clinic for pre-school children. The group presented their request to the school trustees. Medical officer of health Dr. J.L.M. Whitbread said that the Greater Victoria Metropolitan Board of Health had collapsed and no money was available from the provincial government. He predicted the Capital Regional District would inherit responsibility for health.

## Child care needs meeting to provide base for future

Discussions at a June 7 public meeting on child care could provide the basis for future planning on Salt Spring.

Ellen Garvie, who is conducting the Southern Gulf Islands Child Care Needs Assessment, says it is critical that those who need or use child care on Salt Spring turn out to the meeting.

Similar meetings on the Outer Islands have proven to be spring boards for development of child care plans, Garvie said.

Child care will be provided at the meeting which begins at 7 p.m. in the Salt Spring Elementary School library.

Garvie also encourages all islanders who have received the child care needs assessment questionnaire to please fill it out and return it.
