

How they spent their summer holidays

From boot camp to Britain, some local students had some diverse experiences

Diversity is an island habit. And it is a trait found less in the older, more life-experienced population than in its young people. A sample of summer vacations from returning school-age islanders shows that pretty clearly.

Travel figured prominently this past summer, as did boot camp and the outdoors. The common experience was an expansion of experience: doing or seeing something new, knowledge these islanders brought home and will, no doubt, use to their advantage.

Grade 11 student Katie Watt spent part of her summer vacation camping, near Vancouver Island's Horne Lake. She learned to rappel down sheer cliff faces — little drops at first, but longer ones later. The best part of the vacation was spelunking in some nearby caves. With warm clothing and helmets that had little flashlights, the family was guided into a cave which had been a river bed through the mountain.

"It was really different," she said of the experience. "I've never done anything like that before. You could sit there silently and you could hear the water dropping one drop at a time."

There were some "really cool" rock formations, including one that looked like a little Buddha sitting on a rock shelf.

The outdoors figured prominently for two other islanders this

summer. But summer camp for 18-year-old Andrew Pickell and 15-year-old Jodi Pirie meant boot-camp. They were in the Canadian Forces Army Reserve and the air cadets respectively.

"It's like pee wee baseball," Pirie said of the air cadets. "This is pee wee air force."

We will cruise the information highway and stop at all the honky tonks along the way.

Pirie chose the air cadets because she loves to fly. She spent several weeks last summer at air cadet camp and plans to get her flying licence through a cadet program. Pickell's father is reservist, so he has always been familiar with military life. He plans to continue with the army reserve in Victoria part-time and then go back for more training in communications in the army next summer.

The training was similar in some respects: always polished

military boots and army-green uniforms (Pirie had the addition of an air-force-blue shirt); military rules like no chewing gum or smoking when in uniform; learning to march. Pickell said it is more difficult than most people think because everyone takes different sized paces. When they march in formation, everyone has to take the same sized paces.

One of the highlights for Pirie was meeting Snowbird crews.

"I was surprised to see how friendly they were and how interested in meeting the cadets. They were happy to see young people interested in flying," she said.

One of Pickell's highlights was a week spent on the base at Canadian Forces Base Borden in Ontario, where young reservists put their training to the test. As well as a gruelling 16-kilometre march one morning, they dug fox-holes and trenches and had to defend them in the middle of the night against "attack."

"It was tough," he said.

Grade 12 student Jasper Nielson spent two weeks of his summer at the Edmonton Fringe Festival — not watching but performing. He danced with other members of Salt Spring's Chien Lung group at three fringe festivals in August and September.

The show was "pretty wild," he recalled last week, adding that it was much changed from the performance islanders saw at Beaver Point in June. They had added different costumes and masks. People were "blown away" by the show and many expressed an interest in joining the troupe, he said.

Dancers were treated to the kind of hospitable billeting we associate with our own island, and they attracted attention busking in the city, just as they did in Centennial Park during summer practices.

The week of performances and practices did not leave much time to wander around Edmonton or see other shows, but Nielson said he did find some "great book-shops" where he spent time and some money.

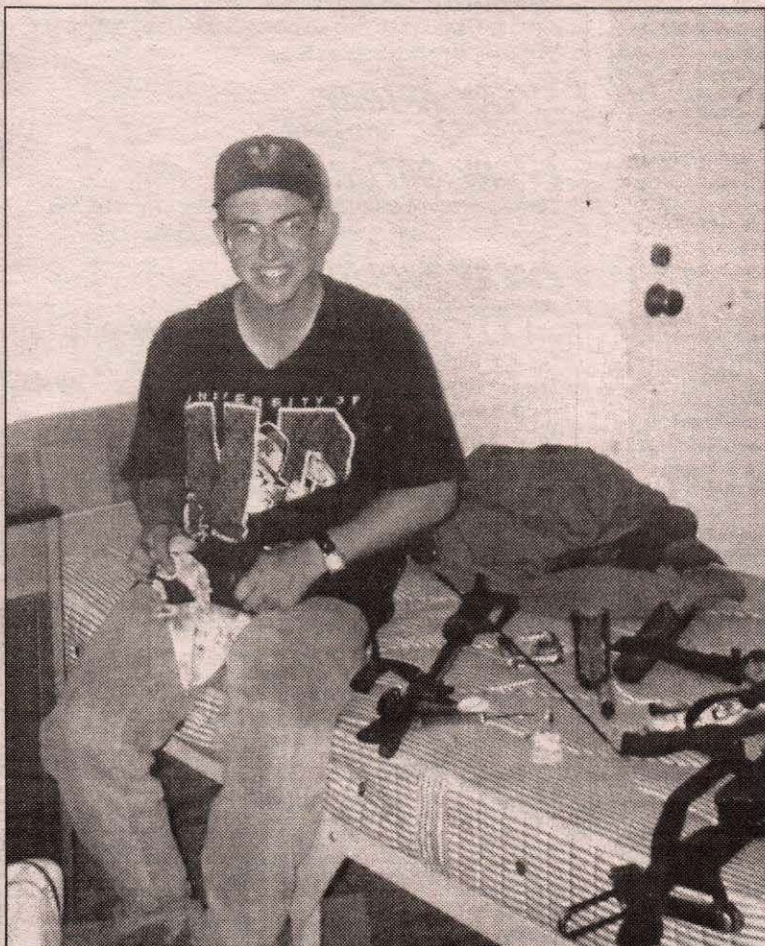
Ten-year-old John Michael McColl travelled a little further than Edmonton this summer: about nine hours flying time east over the Atlantic to Britain.

Old buildings, sidewalks made of stones and hotels with cage-like elevators that go "very slowly" were among the sites McColl saw. He also saw many of the traditional things: the changing of the guard at Westminster; pigeon-filled Trafalgar Square; the historic and naval town of Portsmouth.

And what trip to London would be complete without a West End show? McColl saw two musicals: *Oliver!* and *Les Miserables*. He thought the "opera houses" were fantastic with their marble columns and arches — "a lot better than going to the movies" —

and even saw the box with the Royal coat of arms for the Queen when she came to the theatre.

Queens of a different sort were part of Anastasia Cyprus' summer holidays this year. She went to visit friends and relatives in southern California for three weeks and was surprised to see a gaggle of travestites at one of the "Hollywood clubs" she went to with her cousin. She said the clubs

were quite different from Fulford dances, with different music, different clothes and more drag queens.

She did meet a real Hollywood actor — someone she recognised from the recent box-office hit *Legends of the Fall*.

But whatever adventures they had, most echoed the sentiments of Cyprus when she said, "It's nice to get back to Salt Spring."

Efforts under way to host Katimavik program

The time lines are short but the enthusiasm is strong to bring Katimavik back to Salt Spring.

The program that sends Canadian youths away to live in three different communities over the course of nine months was killed a decade ago by the federal government of Brian Mulroney. Not even a hunger strike by a Liberal senator could save the program at the time.

But a return of the Liberals to power in Ottawa has brought a reprieve. Katimavik's regional director for B.C. and Alberta said last week that Ottawa is funding the program on a trial basis.

Miriam Karp was on Salt Spring to meet with representatives of potential sponsoring organizations, among which is the Parks

and Recreation Commission (PRC). It sees potential in the program for making improvements to community facilities.

PRC administrator Tony Hume said on Monday some of the Katimavik participants' time is allocated to community-related projects. Improving trails and beach accesses is such a project.

"They would be able to do a lot of the trail stuff ... and beach (accesses)," Hume said.

A recent application by the PRC for Environmental Youth Team funds for that work was turned down. The bulk of the money available was allocated instead to the Juan de Fuca Trail, a decision that has been criticized as political by other communities applying for the same funding. The trail is located in Environment Minister Moe Sihota's riding.

The Katimavik program would get under way here November 15, when 11 participants aged 17-21 would arrive and remain for the next 11 weeks. By then, sponsoring organizations must arrange to rent a house big enough for 12 people, and hire a group leader.

The program will also be looking for islanders willing to billet a participant for one week as one objective is to show the youths what it's like to live in different Canadian communities.

Over the course of the nine-month program, Salt Spring would house three different groups of 11 participants.

Hume said that over the next month and a half it will be necessary to identify the beach accesses that should be improved so a plan is in place when the youths arrive. He said another legacy of the trail

and access work could be a map of access locations. The commission's "number one request" is for information on the location of beach accesses, he said.

If program sponsors are successful, it will not be the first time Katimavik has been active on Salt Spring. The program operated here in the early 1980s.

Hume said sponsoring groups are the PRC, Chamber of Commerce, community services society, trail and nature club, the salmon enhancement program and the Core Inn.

Hume said there is also an opportunity for Salt Spring youths to join the program and experience life in other parts of Canada.

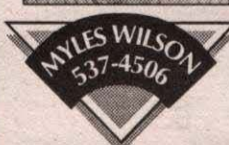

New columnist ready to unleash passion for earth and gardening

Thanks to his grandmother, Dave Banks has a passion for gardening. That passion will be unleashed in printed form this week when Banks begins writing a regular gardening column for the Driftwood.

A graduate of Gulf Islands Secondary School in 1979, Banks has since taken the master gardener's program at the University of Washington. He moved back to the island two months ago.

"I like the connection to the earth," Banks says of his interest in working the soil, and laments it is

something people have lost.

Banks describes himself as "a great fan" of Henry David Thoreau, whom he describes as the father of the environmental movement.

Banks' gardening column will appear every two weeks. In the first three instalments he will talk about lawns — everything from planting a new one to their care and maintenance.

After that, the column will attempt to answer readers' questions on gardening subjects.

Advance planning, maintenance can help create beautiful lawns

While lawns are by no means a mandatory component of the home landscape, a nice lawn can provide both an aesthetic quality and functional space which is unique.

But as many here can appreciate, achieving a year-round beautiful lawn in the Gulf Islands can be something of a challenge. In areas of chronic water shortages, for example, a lawn — even if carefully prepared — is usually not a practical option.

However, in most areas of the islands, an aesthetically pleasing lawn is quite feasible given a little advance planning and a conscientious maintenance program.

Whether you're planning a new lawn or renovating an old one, your success will hinge on three key considerations: how well you've prepared the soil, whether the seed or turf you've selected is appropriate for the site you've chosen, and, finally, whether you're prepared to invest the necessary time, money and energy into a regular lawn maintenance program.

If your lawn has just a few weeds and the odd bare spot, then simply aerating, fertilizing and overseeding will help appreciably. But if your lawn has become a weed jungle with more weeds than grass, or a complete moss habitat, then this is a sure sign of a serious compaction and/or nutrient problem with the soil. In this case the best solution is a complete lawn renovation.

You start by removing the old sod for composting and then begin the process of improving

your soil.

Ultimately, you want the new soil base to be deep enough to allow grass roots to easily penetrate six to eight inches. The soil structure needs to be amended with enough organic matter and sand to ensure the soil retains moisture yet drains properly and does not compact.

Begin by digging out any deep-rooted weeds still in the soil and then till the area to a depth of at

least one foot. If time permits, the next step is to plant a cover crop immediately after tilling. If you plan to seed your lawn in spring, then in September or October sow a fall cover crop like hairy vetch (*Vicia villosa*) or winter rye (*Secale cereale*). For seeding your lawn in September, sow a spring cover crop like soybeans (*Glycine max*), buckwheat (*Fagopyrum esculentum*), or oats (*Avena sativa*). When turned over, this "green manure" will provide the soil with valuable humus and nitrogen.

Another option is to plant a

crop of potatoes.

A pH lower than 5.8 or higher than 7.5 will starve your lawn by suppressing bacteria activity and locking up important nutrients like phosphorus. A soil pH of 6.5 is ideal for lawns.

If your soil is excessively acid it will require the addition of lime and if very alkaline will require sulfur.

Though there are patches of clay soil in the islands, most of the soil here is either a fine sandy or silty loam and thus organic matter needs to be added for moisture retention and to reduce soil compaction. Organic materials you can use include composed manures, well aged bark mulch, peat moss, composed sewer sludge, or home compost, if you have enough.

For a lawn, your soil should be in the range of four to 10 per cent organic matter and must never exceed 20 per cent by volume. Usually spreading two inches of organic matter over the surface of the soil and digging it in deeply is about right. In some cases you can also add sand.

If you're putting down turf in a high-traffic area, then laying the turf down over three inches of engine sand also works well provided you have several inches of good soil beneath the sand. While you're digging in the organic matter also dig in about two pounds of slow release nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. (If you were using, for example, a fertilizer like 10-5-10, that would mean digging in 20 pounds of the complete fertilizer per 1,000 square feet.)

INTRODUCING A NEW THROUGHFARE SYSTEM

Fulford Harbour-Swartz Bay-Tsawwassen

Starting Thursday, October 19, Tsawwassen-bound passengers on BC Ferries' Fulford Harbour-Swartz Bay route will pay their fares in a more convenient way.

If you're a **foot passenger** travelling to Tsawwassen as a throughfare, you will purchase your ticket aboard the ship from Fulford Harbour, rather than at the newsstand cashier aboard the vessel from Swartz Bay to Tsawwassen.

You will pay the \$4 fare by way of a ticket vending machine on the *Bowen Queen* which accepts VISA and MasterCard, or loonies and silver change. A change machine will be available on board.

Parties **travelling by vehicle** will have to purchase at least one passenger fare aboard the *Bowen Queen* to produce at the Swartz Bay ticket booth in order to qualify for the throughfare rate.

Please note that, as of October 19, you must have paid for a throughfare ticket prior to boarding the Swartz Bay-Tsawwassen vessel.

BC Ferries will monitor this program on an ongoing basis, with a view to expanding it to other throughfare routes in the future.

Want to buy a computer but confused by all the jargon? Not sure if you want the optional racing stripes on your Pentium 120? The answers are here, in the Bits on Bytes Cheapskate's Guide to Buying a Home Computer.

The first decision: Macintosh versus PC.

Macintosh computers are easier to use but tend to be more expensive overall. Initial prices are similar with multimedia home units on either the Macintosh or PC platforms available for \$2,100 to \$2,200.

Macintosh users can anticipate an easier introduction to computing and more uniformity when using and upgrading the computer, since operating systems and hardware are made by the same company.

Pluses for PC owners are cheaper components, a slightly lower initial purchase cost, lower servicing costs and a greater range of software, since PCs account for 90 per cent of the computer market and therefore have more software written for them.

The second decision: Which

model?

The first step in buying a computer is not increasing your credit card limit. It's deciding what use you have for a computer. Pick the software you want to use, check the system requirements (usually printed on the boxes) and make your purchase accordingly.

If you want to play the latest multimedia games, you will need a computer costing \$2,000 to \$2,500 with a fast processor, eight megabytes (meg) of random access memory (RAM), a CD player and, for an IBM or PC clone, a sound card and video accelerator card. If you want to do animation, three-dimensional graphics or computer-aided design, you should aim for the top of the heap — a computer system in the \$3,000 to \$5,000 range. This should get you a Pentium or Power PC processor, 32 megs of RAM and a one-gigabyte (1,000-plus megabyte) or larger hard drive.

If you just want to write plain

text letters to Aunt Ruth and are sure you will never want to do anything more demanding, check the classifieds for a used Macintosh Classic or an XT, AT, 286 or 386. Either should cost less than \$500 complete — XTs are so obsolete, owners now give them away.

Remember that computers have the shelf life of lettuce — values drop dramatically — so whatever you choose to buy will be out of date before you get it out of the box.

The second bit: Computer Channel

A computer show now carried by Rogers and Shaw Cable companies should be added to the line-up of Salt Spring Cable, suggests local resident Tony Markle. He is circulating a petition asking the local cable company to broadcast "Doppler Computer Television", a mix of advertising and information produced by Vancouver-based Doppler Computer Superstore.

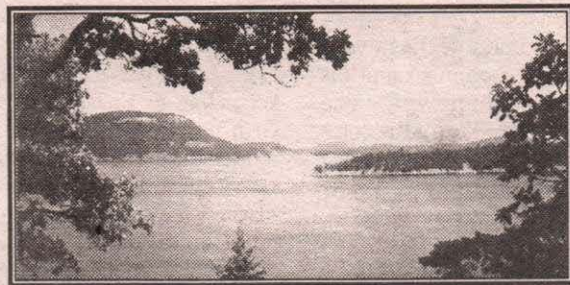

Galiano roasts, toasts Russells at special north end gathering

Doris and Norman Russell of Trincomali Drive were recently toasted and roasted by Galiano friends and neighbours at the North Galiano Hall.

Over 60 attended the suppertime event. At least a dozen spoke of their friendship and dealings with the former island plumber and his kindly and hospitable wife. The writer, former president of the community association and a long-time friend of the Russells, was master of ceremonies for the evening.

The speakers fell into three categories – the “old timers” (Basil Benger, Woody Coward, Mildred Jeffrey, Bill Stafford, Harold Wike and Terry Wishart), fire department cronies (Arne Haksi and Thom Liddell), and Norm Russell’s partners in the Bodega purchase (Rene Mahlow and Bill Paterson).

Weekender Ross Kenway spoke of the Russells’ kindnesses to him and his wife, and the couple’s sister-in-law, Eleanor Russell of Richmond, gave anecdotes of the couple’s former life in Vancouver.

Among the many things accomplished in the North Galiano community by the couple was Norm Russell’s overseeing of the installation of a metal roof on the hall during the early 1970s – a factor which saved the old schoolhouse from complete disintegration through neglect.

Mentioned as well was his appearance at the first children’s Christmas party after the revival of the community association in the early 1980s (he appeared as an “aquatic” Santa) and of his work for the community association and later for Galiano Lions Club as “Stormin Normin,” operator of the “flea market” at several summer Lions Club Fiestas.

Mentioned as well were his idiosyncrasies as an island plumber. His installations cover the island from end to end, most of them still working as he completed them, even though he retired about 14 years ago. Russell plumbed the community hall and installed the submersible pump in the well there. For a number of years he was in charge of the water system

for the Spanish Hills Water Improvement District, making sure there was always a good supply of water in the tanks.

Plumbing was in the family blood according to Russell. His father’s firm plumbed many Vancouver homes during the first half of this century, and it was with him Norm learned the trade. With not much building taking place during the depression years, Russell managed to get a job as a transit driver with the B.C. Electric Railway Company (later B.C. Hydro). There he remained until his early retirement to Galiano in 1972. During his years as a transit driver Norm worked tirelessly as well in Vancouver’s Credit Union movement.

Doris Russell is the daughter of a lighthouse keeper. Her father and mother operated the now long-automated station at Prospect Point in Stanley Park. From there each morning Doris Russell and her sister Florence Hepburn would walk through the park’s trails to school in the West End. As young ladies, the two sisters got summer jobs as waitresses at Ganges.

The Russells were married during the 1930s. The couple has one son, Bob, owner and operator of a Christmas tree farm near Duncan. Doris Russell worked for many years as a receptionist at Vancouver’s Maritime Museum and loved her work there.

Speakers at the “roast” brought to mind many of her contributions to community life. Bea Robson presented her with a giant chocolate chip cookie medal (the real thing on a red ribbon) to acknowledge her many years supplying coffee and cookies at the weekly volunteer fire practices.

Dorothy Ross, co-operator of the Friday “bookdays” at the Community Hall, presented Doris with a coffee table “book decoration” – a thank you for her years of faithful service. Community asso-

ciation president Nancy Davidson then presented the couple with a set of patio furniture for their new seaside apartment in Sidney.

Among the other gifts presented was a surprise box. “All this for fifty-cents,” it said on the top: this time to, not from, “Stormin Normin!” Lastly, Audrey Cook, as a “former Minister of Water Resources” in one of our governments, appeared fresh from an important bridge game to create the former plumber “King of the water closet,” making the presentation to him while he sat on one of his own porcelain fixtures, pilfered from his back yard only hours before.

The event was a happy one, long to be remembered by all present.

Life quilt for breast cancer
