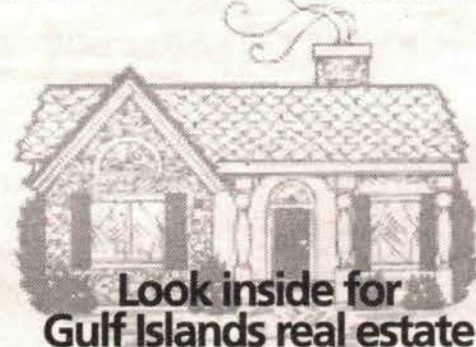

85 years of Guiding

An international movement was formed by early feminists

Nesta and her friends were self-made scouts.

Determined scouts. Independent scouts. Scouts in spite of the expectation that a proper upper-class Edwardian girl divided her days between needlework, piano lessons and learning to curtsy.

A scout in skirts, Nesta became part of Guiding history as one of the "Crystal Palace girls." She was there at the precise moment that Lord Baden-Powell, the chief scout, realized he had to form an organization for girls which would parallel the popular scout movement.

The famous conversation occurred during a September 6, 1909 Scout rally at the Crystal Palace in London. Among the 11,000 scouts were a handful of girls who had snuck in among the boys, wearing the shirt and hat of the scout uniform with their own skirts.

The chief scout approached the girls. "Who are you?" he asked.

"We're the Girl Scouts."

"You can't be," he said. "There aren't any Girl Scouts."

"Oh yes there are, 'cos we're them," the girls replied, creating a quandary for Baden-Powell which he resolved by founding the Girl Guides.

What had happened was simple. Baden-Powell's book, *Scouting for Boys*, had taken Britain by storm and scout troops were springing up throughout the country. Adventurous girls also got their hands on the book and began forming their own scout troops.

Margaret Spencer of Salt Spring is Nesta Maude's daughter. Her mother was born in 1893 into an upper-class English family in which boys were clearly preferred to girls.

"From an early age Nesta chal-

lenged this assumption that boys were better than girls. If boys could play hooky from school so could girls — which she did at the age of six! If boys could ride their bicycles recklessly, so could girls. If boys could be scouts, so could girls," wrote Mary Ashworth, another of Nesta's daughters, in an introduction to her mother's memoirs. (The memoirs were written when Nesta was 81, seven years before her death in 1982.)

In 1995, 86 years after the Crystal Palace rally and 85 years since the first Girl Guide companies were formed in Canada, it is difficult to recognize how revolutionary it was for girls to go camping on their own, drill and wear uniforms. Had she done equivalent ground-breaking in the 60s and 70s, Nesta would have been recognized as a champion of women's liberation.

But it was 1908 when Nesta broke out of Edwardian restraints for girls. She and a friend, Rotha Orman, were preparing for their confirmation in the local Anglican Church when Nesta's older brother gave her a battered copy of *Scouting for Boys*. Nesta and Rotha studied the book avidly while dressing for the ceremony and by the time they arrived at the church they had memorized the scout law.

The sermon that day was on devoting oneself to a higher ideal. The two 14-year-old girls looked at each other and whispered, "Scout law." From then on, they were confirmed scouts.

"I suppose we came under the heading of the poor little rich girls," Nesta recalled. Rotha Orman's family was wealthy and Nesta had been unofficially adopted by the Orman family as a companion for their daughter. Fortunately for the strong-minded Nesta, Mrs. Blanche Orman encouraged both girls to be self-sufficient.

The girls lived in a large house supplied with servants, had a governess, ponies, purebred dogs, an estate to explore and — once their few hours of daily lessons were completed — virtually nothing to do.

"We were thoroughly bored. Scouting just opened up everything," Nesta said. Instead of going for staid walks around the Forest Mere estate, they laid tracks and tried to follow them. They fished in the estate's lake, built a fire and cooked their catch. They built a shelter, tied knots and practised semaphore.

After completing all the scout tenderfoot tests, the pair decided to register as scouts. Girls were

I have several acquaintances of long standing who write at odd intervals. I have no way of listing them so I presume any correspondence will be rejected by the postal authorities. I hope I'm wrong. But I am advertising my fax number to ensure that anyone who does want to keep in touch may do so readily.

It all comes back to me, this pattern of mail and delivery.

In 1940 I left France as the enemy forces were driving through that unhappy country. I had made friends in the Marne, where I was stationed with the Royal Air Force. We left with such haste that I was unable to advise them that I was moving.

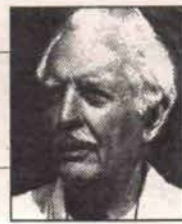
Five years later the roads to France were open again and I wrote to my friends with no idea of their correct postal address. The letter was addressed to "M. et Mme. Blank, La Rue a la Gare et le Cinema." And, of course, the town. My friends received the letter and promptly replied.

Could that happen today, 50 years later? I would like to think it could, even without an appropriate postal code.

Flying around

As often as I travel, so often do I screw things up.

Last week I flew from Vancouver to Leeds-Bradford in northern England. Along with other passengers I paced the corridors of Vancouver airport while the airplane was undergoing needed maintenance. I left almost two hours late.

We were still more than an hour behind schedule arriving in Amsterdam, but in good time to make my connection.

I sat in the area dedicated to travellers for Leeds-Bradford. When I thought I heard my name called over the air requiring me to board from Gate B6, I went to that gate. Twenty minutes later I learned that the message I heard

was not the message sent out and that my plane had left without me.

The next two hours were spent reading and familiarizing myself with the airport. Schipol Airport is clean and bilingual. All signs are in Dutch and English and I never freak out over bilingual signs when one of the bi's is English.

I was impressed, as always in Europe, with the vast number of people who speak English. Holland is a monolingual country, yet an anglophone is readily absorbed into the secrets of travelling. I wondered, idly, whether a francophone in a bilingual land could find his way as easily and as readily in Vancouver airport.

Not the first

My delayed journey took my mind back to the 1950s when I flew to England with my young family of squawking brats. Getting there was no problem. Coming back was deadly.

We sat in the waiting room all morning as the plane was delayed for a mechanical check. My three patient infants grew noisier and more difficult by the hour. After about four hours I advised the desk that we were leaving the building.

"When you find a serviceable plane, send me a postcard and we'll come back," I urged the passenger agent. With minimal delay we were bundled into a taxi and set down at a hotel.

It was now evening and we ordered dinner. As the meal came into the room the phone went to

advise us that the airplane was ready for us. The valve trouble which had been plaguing one of its piston engines had now been resolved.

Airborne, we were informed that we had to land at Glasgow for a special customs clearance. The procedure was unusual, but we could not refuse to land. Herded into the usual primitive facilities of the period, we waited for an hour or so while crews once again worked on the errant motor.

Once again we filed into the well-worn Stratocruiser. We taxied out and stood on the threshold of the runway, ready to take to the air.

Again the announcer; we had to return to the apron because a plane was on the runway with his brakes jammed and immovable.

It was almost automatic, this filing in and out of the machine. We had to leave, said the company spokesman, because the crew was going to pump out fuel to lighten the plane. We would then land at Shannon to refuel in readi-

ness for the Atlantic crossing.

By this time my wife was climbing the wall. No way was she about to wake up her sleeping baby, fuel or no fuel. She won and was one of the only two passengers who did not disembark.

Another hour or so later we once more took our seats, only to hear the most ominous of all the announcements.

The captain has decided not to land at Shannon but to "try and make it to Gander." He tried and we made it, but by a narrow margin. Several hours into our flight, my son commented that our plane had only three engines. I jeered.

"You count them!" he demanded. Sure enough, the errant motor was dead. More valve trouble, I assumed.

That landing at Gander was one of the most welcome I can recall.

By comparison, last week's minor delay was nothing to match the flying of half a century ago. I had lost some of the excitement!

Salt Spring Guides will have 85 years of history to ponder

When Salt Spring Guides mark their annual Thinking Day today (Wednesday), they will have 85 years of Canadian Guiding history to recall.

The history starts in England, with the holding of the first national scout rally in 1909. The event was "crashed" by girls who also wanted to become scouts. As Scout founder Sir Robert Baden-Powell later remarked, he had started the scouts but the guides started themselves. (See main story).

Guiding spread quickly. The first companies were formed in Canada in 1910.

On Salt Spring, the first guide company was formed in 1925, under the sponsorship of the IODE.

The first Brownie pack was formed in 1938 to 1939.

At present there are approximately 85 Salt Spring girls in Brownies, Guides and Pathfinders. District commissioner Frauke Prystawik notes the program is constantly being updated to meet the needs of each generation of girls.

"We go with the time. It's an ever-changing world," she remarked.

This Saturday, the girls and their parents will be looking back. Heritage will be the theme of their annual banquet and the guest speaker will be Margaret Spencer, the daughter of one of the original English Girl Guides.

not allowed to be scouts but Nesta and Rotha sidestepped sexual discrimination by signing their letter to scout headquarters as N. Maude and R. Orman.

Through the scout catalogue the girls acquired shirts and hats — which they supplemented with skirts sewn to match. They invited girls from the two neighbouring villages to join their newly certified Forest Mere Troop.

Two local school principals supported the idea but warned Nesta and Rotha not to mention their plans to camp in tents and teach girls to swim and row. "They thought we should be wise to stress to the parents the more womanly aspects of the training, such as cooking and nursing."

For the next year, the 16-member troop built fires, made dampers and tea, learned to signal with Morse code, to tie knots and to swim in the lake. They practised first aid on wounds made gory with grease paint and staged rescues.

"We dragged our patient out of the lake with her face nicely draped with duck weed," Nesta recalled. The "patient" usually giggled through much of the procedure, which included practising artificial respiration, calling for help and making a stretcher.

But few of the girls had the leeway granted to Rotha and Nesta, who spent a week in the spring of

1909 camping on a little island in the middle of the estate lake. Although directed to take enough tinned food to ensure one good, hot meal a day, the two girls vowed not to open a single tin but to live off the land.

They caught fish, snared a rabbit, collected moorhens' eggs and milked a nearby cow for milk, some of which they churned into a passable version of butter. "Every tin of food was returned unopened and everyone laughed when we confessed that the only thing we had forgotten to take was a tin opener," Nesta reported.

The following September, the Crystal Palace rally was held. Nesta originally welcomed the creation of Girl Guides but admitted in her memoirs that the new organization was a disappointment.

A small annoyance was renaming of the Forest Mere troop

patrols from foxes and badgers to the flower names used by Girl Guides.

A visit with the president of the new organization, Miss Agnes Baden-Powell, did little to reassure Nesta. "We must remember we are a girls movement and not copy boys," Nesta remembered being told.

The handbook written for the first guides was entitled How Girls Can Help to Build Up the Empire.

Fortunately, Nesta reported, many groups continued to rely on Scouting for Boys as their training manual even if they were operating under the name of Girl Guides.

Nesta continued to be active in Guiding throughout her life. She was still in her teens when she started the Lone Guide program, which allowed girls to become guides by mail.

"I didn't mind the letters which came ... but they sent anything that applied to their tests." One of the tests in the scout handbook was to skin and cook a rabbit — so uncured skins and messes of cooked rabbit arrived in Nesta's mailbox. "It was August ... some of these rabbits had had long, wearying journeys from the north

of Scotland."

She also worked to bring handicapped youngsters and those in hospital into the movement, adapting the tests as required. In her personal life, she was equally determined. During the first world war, she drove a crash tender for the Royal Flying Corps and during the second world war she drove a canteen through the bombed streets of London.

"She was women's lib personified," Spencer said.

Nesta passed her convictions on to her family. Daughter Spencer echoes her mother's belief that girls could be scouts as well as boys. "I was a Girl Guide leader for 17 years and I had one daughter and three sons. There was nothing that the scouts could do that the guides couldn't do just as well."

Still going strong at 104 years, Emily Burrows has spirit

Even the Grim Reaper steers clear of Emily Hudson Burrows.

A staunchly independent rebel who left England to escape the class system, Burrows is still going strong at 104.

She has plenty of spirit. "Smile, damn you," she cheerfully announces in response to a photographer's gestures.

Deaf since an attack of meningitis at age 80, she radiates an indomitable wit. Although questions must be printed out so she can read them, her replies are quick, often witty and very definite.

How did you happen to come to Canada?

"On a boat," she quips, a barely concealed twinkle underlining the joke.

How are you going to celebrate your birthday?

"Wine!" She grins, delighted. She could be teasing, aware that ladies of 104 are not expected to be enthusiastic drinkers. Nor is there any evidence that she drinks.

For her birthday, celebrated Saturday, she said she wanted a Rolls Royce, a border collie or a horse.

John Healy quietly objects, struck with visions of such a gift arriving on his doorstep. There is no room for horses or border collies.

But two years ago, after the death of his wife's aunt, there was plenty of room in the Healys' home and hearts for the 102-year-

old Burrows.

Until then, Burrows had been a companion for Toni Healy's aunt, Susan Walker, in North Saanich. Before living with Walker, Burrows had been a housekeeper and companion for Toni Healy's grandfather.

Burrows says she doesn't know how she has managed to live so many years. "At least I've had a good time."

She was born in Devonshire, England, on February 18, 1891. The fifth of 10 children, she grew up in a little cluster of seven houses known as Calke Village. Her father was the games keeper for Lord Cervantes Crewe and Lady Crewe, who lived in the massive Calke Abbey mansion.

She was never impressed with the class structure in England. "The gentry, you have to bow to them. The boys have to salute and the girls have to curtsy."

Thanks in part to her father's profession, the family's table was often graced with game although, officially, only the gentry were allowed to hunt.

Burrows attended public school for eight to nine years, starting when she was five years old and finishing when she was 14. An older sister had emigrated to Canada and Burrows was determined to follow. For five years she worked to save the fare to Canada. Those years, working as a servant in Calke Abbey, made a

dramatic impression on the teenage girl.

"You tried to get as far away as you could from the gentry. You didn't want to be a servant to the gentry."

Burrows made the trip in 1910, sailing from Liverpool to Montreal and then taking a train from Montreal to Calgary.

She found a job as a cashier in a hotel. There she met John Robert Burrows, a cook in one of the hotels. At year later, when she was 21, they were married. But in 1918, she was widowed when Burrows died, a victim of the flu epidemic.

She stayed in Calgary for more than 30 years, working in hotels and taking up riding and showing horses. She was still staunchly independent. One evening as she was walking home, a man followed her for 11 blocks.

"I got very, very angry. I hit him on the jaw." She knocked the man to the ground but also broke her own wrist.

It was a shared interest in horses that drew Burrows and Walker together, after Burrows had moved from Calgary to Saanich. The two became good friends — a friendship which spread to encompass other members of the family.

For Burrows' birthday, John and Toni Healy hosted a luncheon on Saturday. They both note that Burrows delights in life.

"I wake up every day surprised — I'm still alive," Burrows said.



Flower tally finds 30,744 blooms—before snow flies

While Victoria was digging out from its 10-inch snowfall and Vancouver was about to endure its evening traffic chaos in the snow, the folk on Galiano were counting flower blooms in their gardens. Early February's mild weather had brought on spring flowers earlier than most years, so it was decided by a garden club member that a flower count would be appropriate. After all, Victoria has its annual flower count so why shouldn't we?

The count took place on Valentine's Day when an appropriate number of members — 14 — braved the cold to count and estimate. A total of 30,744 blooms were counted — it was easier to count the blooms that morning than it would have been in the snow which fell later in the day. Fifty-one varieties of trees, shrubs and annual and perennial flowers were represented in the total.

High counts were registered for snowdrops (2,578), primulas (2,095), Christmas roses (1,216) and crocuses (1,070). In the tree and shrub category, daphne led with 8,440 flowerlets, followed by

skimmia with 3,350, witch hazel with 1,719, viburnum tinus with 3,000 and winter jasmine with 1,175. Oddities reported were a miniature rose, sweet William (two blooms), calendula (six), candytuft (six) and summer stocks (two).

Cold winds on the two previous days did not do much for the beauty of the flowers or the comfort of the tabulators, but the exercise did have a plus: the garden club now has an excellent list of what one might expect to see blooming in an island garden in February during a mild winter.

Minor damage

Damage from the severe wind storm February 12 has been relatively minor on Galiano.

Tremendous waves breaking on east-side beaches made docking impossible at Sturdies Bay, so B.C. Ferries used its alternative facilities at Montague Harbour.

A South Galiano resident lost

his work van when a large tree fell on it while it was parked near his home. A couple at Montague Harbour had two skylights broken and a camper damaged when an old tree fell (it had been scheduled to be removed later this month). Jack Gillespie, the householder, had only moments before moved the family car up to the road as he was planning to leave for the ferry.

"It (the tree) came right down the driveway and into the front door, and it didn't even ring the bell!" commented his wife, Esther.

Power outages seem to have been the worst feature of the storm. The power was off at North Galiano for 29 hours, but parts of South Galiano fared much worse, notably the Salamanca Point area and Georgeson Bay. There power was not restored for at least another 24 hours.

B.C. Hydro linesmen and BC Tel employees put in long hours clearing fallen trees and restoring downed lines. Our road crew soon had island roads passable once again.

All is black and white

The Dandelion Gallery opened its doors last week with a new look.

Physically the gallery is changed — no larger than before — but with better organization it appears to be more spacious. New display units for cards, pottery and glass were designed and built by member Bill Boyd. The new racks not only give more display space for cards, they allow for better display of other items as well.

A black and white theme was chosen for the cooperative's opening show. Eroded sandstone beach forms, in and out of the water, was the theme chosen for newcomer Larry Foden's work. Imagination and infinite detail are constants in his paintings. Lea Maberly's beautiful coloured fabrics were laid aside for this occasion, and she created an interesting fabric picture in black and white, plus a "wearable" black fabric mask. Occasions for its use might be somewhat limited here on the island.

Painter/photographer Brian Mitchell was represented in the show by a series of black and white photographs. In them is the island we all know, captured with a good camera lens and sensitivity. With light and shadow, Mitchell sees what others miss. Also noteworthy were the calligraphy-like acrylics of Penny Prior

painted, as always, with humour.

Also represented in the show were Win Stephen, Elizabeth Steward, Flora Hawbolt and this writer.

Victoria actor, teacher and director Clayton Jevne is coming to the south hall on Saturday evening where he will present his highly recommended one-man production of Shakespeare's Hamlet. The performance will begin at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$10 each and are now on sale at the Daystar Market and the Corner Store.

- 2 tbsps butter
- 2 tbsps rice vinegar
- 2 tbsps mirin (sweet cooking wine)
- 1 tbsp Kikkoman soy sauce
- 1 cup finely chopped green onions

In a large frying pan, heat oil and fry salmon on both sides over high heat until just done. Discard

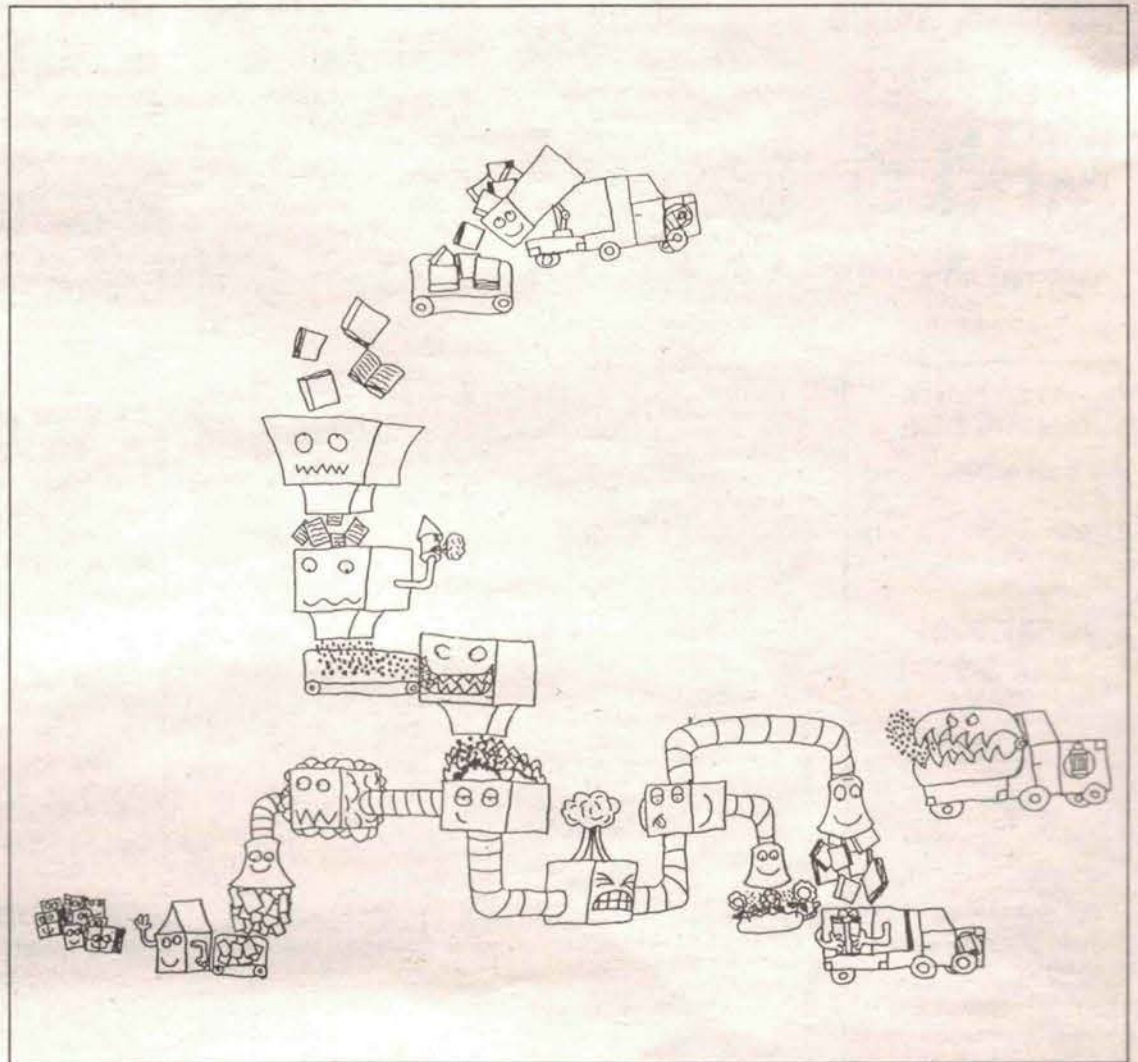
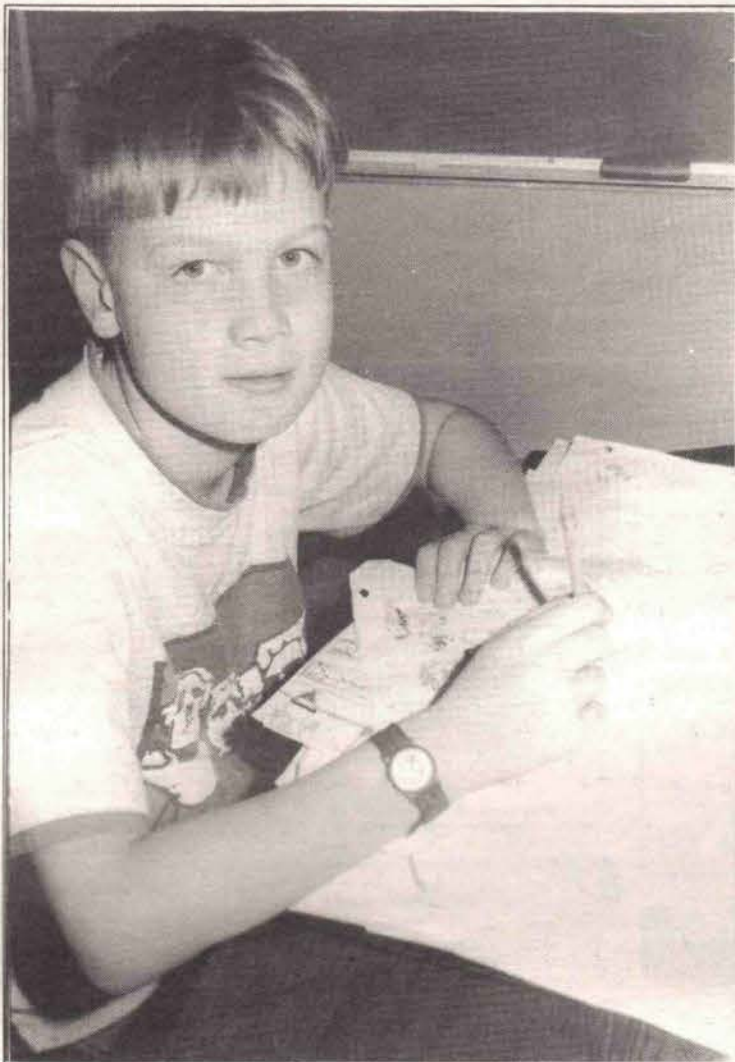

Mad magazine, video games inspire young artist

A whimsical view of recycling by nine-year-old artist David Mackie is promoting Fernwood School's campaign to collect old phone books.

The school can earn 20 cents for each phone book turned in for recycling, so is appealing to islanders to drop off their 1994 phone books at the school. Money raised by the drive will be used to support the school greenhouse.

David created the sketch on the posters which advertise the project. In his drawing, the collected phone books pass through a series of humanized hoppers and are

reincarnated as books, newspapers or garden compost.

Creating the drawing took about a week, David said. His vision of recycling starts with phone books dumped on to a conveyor belt, which drops them into the first hopper. This hopper removes the covers and drops the individual pages into a second hopper, complete with steam whistle, which chops the books into chunks of paper.

The chunks travel along a conveyor belt into the "mouth" of a third hopper, which chews them into a pulpy mass. David compared the action of this hopper to a human chewing on a piece of paper.

The chewed globs of paper are dumped into a fire in hopper four, which then separates the partially burned globs into two streams.

Cartoons in Mad magazine, particularly Spy vs. Spy, and video games give David inspiration for his work.

One goes to the right, where it is subjected to an explosion — "to get rid of the bad stuff," David said — and then divided again, ending up as either bits of com-

post or finished books. The stream which goes to the left is transformed by a bulging machine into newsprint and then into bundled newspapers.

In the distance to the right is a nasty looking garbage truck, which carries away the "bad stuff" which David defines as "some kind of dirt on the paper."

Cartoons in Mad magazine, particularly Spy vs. Spy, and video games like Sonic Hedgehog, give David inspiration for his work. His drawings often echo the multiple layers of a video game screen and feature odd mechanical creations which can trap or slow passage through the layers of the screen.

"I play computer games and video games. I get some ideas from it," David said. Robots show up in several of his drawings, including one scene in which a camper is helped by a tent-pounding robot, a chef robot cooking over a campfire and a robot specially designed to collect and bring wood for the fire.

David said he has been drawing for the past five years and admits that he sometimes picks up a pencil and begins sketching when he should be doing other work. "I get too carried away with drawing stuff."

Eventually he would like to become a cartoonist or a creator of video games.
