Jim & Lorraine a SATURNIA INSTITUTION

The new developer's road, accessed by a path from the farmhouse, is so steep, you feel you want to walk it on your toes. And it seems to go on forever, from sea level to mountain top.

Yet Lorraine Campbell regularly takes this route at 5:15 a.m. when she's off to catch a boat from home on Saturna Island to school board meetings on Salt Spring.

The Campbell's 660-acre property — with its 22 cows, 70 sheep, fences, roads, pastures, gardens, fruit trees, tractors, truck, chickens and artesian springs, not to mention its 1930s farmhouse, numerous outbuildings and guest cottages — requires a lot of attention.

Yet Lorraine and her husband Jim prefer to do the work themselves and don't have any hired help.

The two juggle the farm, as they always have, with civic responsibilities, constant guests, and their animals, and they do it with seeming ease, taking time to chat with us, and to show us around the beautiful property.

Several visiting friends, who really consider this farm their second home, clamber onto the back of the truck for the 2-1/2 mile sightseeing trip along bumpy roads. Lorraine also climbs up and perches there comfortably, insisting I need to be in the cab to hear Jim's knowledgeable running commentary.

After Taylor Beach, we head down to Breezy Bay, original site of the famous Saturna Lamb barbecue.

We're going to pick up their daughter, Jacques, fresh from civic duties of her own, and at the helm of the old faithful "chugger" Ann Elizabeth. This old boat is as almost as well known as the Campbells on Saturna, having served as mailboat, freight boat, visitor boat and transportation since 1949.

Today the freight is several containers of gasoline, which Jim hefts off the deck, and with the

help of a "second generation summer guest" who's been coming here for 30 years, muscles it onto the old pickup truck.

It is hard to believe Lorraine is 75 and Jim, 78.

When the two came to Saturna in 1945, they were continuing a tradition that Lorraine's family started. She had been visiting the island with her family for the summers since 1932, when her father had a few sheep here. She met Jim while they were both studying agriculture at the University of British Columbia.

They married and came to settle in Saturna in 1945, when Lorraine's mother offered to lease the place to them.

"I'd never had a full time job in my life," remembers Jim. "When I took agriculture, I was thinking of a career in science, but when I had the opportunity to come and live here, it made science look really dull."

"We were going to raise seed potatoes," Lorraine adds, "but that didn't work out too well, and we found that livestock was better. We've survived here, with a little tree selling to loggers once in a while. We lived at the beach for several years and then we moved into this house, and we've been here ever since."

"Ever since" is no small potatoes to a couple who celebrated its 50th wedding anniversary last year. When Lorraine's mother died in 1949, Lorraine and Jim had the upper part of the property. They leased the lower part from

her brother for 35 years until it was recently sold to a developer.

In the 1940s there were around 60 residents on the island, and because the services weren't

affairs since almost the first day when I got here. We formed a group round about the time the CPR was leaving us (these were the days of the Princess Mary) and worked on getting power and getting telephone systems. We had this organization which consisted of one person from each of the outer Gulf Islands.

We called it the Gulf Island Improvement Bureau and we met quite regularly on each of the different islands."

"And then I got on the school board — I was 12 years on it — and all this time Lorraine was at home taking care of kids, sheep and things like that, and she was on the hospital board!"

He went on to become vice president and then president of the B.C. School Trustees Association for two years each, with subsequent involvement as a Canadian school trustee.

"I got involved when they built a school for Saturna and I went to the opening, and I was pretty surprised at the things that went on. We didn't have a trustee at first and I didn't think we got the attention we needed.

Finally there was an election and I was voted in as the first trustee, 7-6. I stayed for 12 years."

They both laugh at the memory of the tiny public vote.

Lorraine laughs with her eyes — a startling and beautiful blue. She's quieter than her husband, who tells stories succinctly with practiced and forcible clarity.

Lorraine remembers working on the Advisory Planning

Commission of the CRD when it was involved in zoning bylaws. Red rag to a bull! That pulls Jim in.

"I didn't know what that was all about and started reading the bylaws and found they were planning to make a farm like ours capable of having no more than 100 chickens or seven pigs.

"The commission was dominated by urbanites. I went to the meeting and said 'I don't think you really mean this,' but they did. So the way you got to have 101 chickens was to have part of your farm zoned for that purpose, and I didn't know what that meant, so I started looking it up.

"I also found out I could get two years in prison if my damn hen got loose and consorted with a rooster. That moved me to fight, and I ran for election to the regional board to represent all the Gulf Islands. I campaigned on the proposal that each island should have its own official community plan, instead of one for all of the Gulf Islands. "That was my first challenge, to get the regional board to agree to that. Now my challenge is to get the Islands Trust to understand that just regulating the rate of destruction is not preserving or protecting the Gulf Islands."

Now I could write about the "battle of the boats" when Jim and other outer Gulf Island representatives joined to offer ferry service to Sidney and Steveston between Saturna, Hope Bay on Pender, and the other Gulf Islands, at the same time as Gavin Mouat from Salt Spring got his car ferry service from Port Washington on Pender Island subsidized by Gaglardi.

Or I could write about how the Saturna Lamb Barbecue got its origins from an Argentine raised Scot, and I could give you many pithy and provocative quotes from the strong minded Mr. Campbell, and ironic and insightful comments by Mrs. Campbell, but darnit all - I've run out of space!

This couple needs a book written about them and their amazing accomplishments, and I want to be the one to write it!

In debating the issue, trustees noted graduation ceremonies were usually held well in advance of the writing of final exams, so students would not be distracted from the exams. However, this meant the ceremony was held before the students had graduated.

It was also argued that the ceremonies become an unjustified emotional binge with all-night parties. Instead of a graduation ceremony, a Departure Day dinner and dance was to be held at the high school June 30. Students had already shortened the name of the event to D-Day.

School trustees rejected a proposed referendum to support a new auditorium and gymnasium for the school, arguing that the outer islands should not be expected to bear the cost for a new facility in Ganges. They also doubted the facility was needed, despite the size limitations of Mahon Hall.

Thirty years ago

A Richmond man who went missing five days earlier while fishing off Salt Spring Island was found alive on Prevost Island by his brother and a friend.

Jerry Brda had fallen overboard between 7:30 and 8 p.m. Sunday evening while kicking at a stuck oarlock. When he surfaced the boat had drifted away so he swam to the nearest land. He thought it was Scott Point but it was actually Prevost Island.

Crawling ashore and finding shelter in the bush, he slept for an estimated 36 hours. After waking, he searched the bush for a better sleeping place and fell asleep again. He then found an old barn for shelter. He ate green rose shoots and oysters from the beach, unaware that he was only half-a-mile from the deBurgh home on the island.

He was found Friday at approximately 3:30 p.m. by a brother and friend who were searching the Gulf Islands for him after the official search ended Wednesday.

Twenty-five years ago

Young 'Lions' were roaming the streets of Ganges as more than 100 Leos attended a convention for the international youth movement. The club was open to teens aged 15 to 20, who ran their own clubs under the sponsorship of a Lions club. The young people were on

Salt Spring from Friday until Sunday.

School trustees were changing the pattern of education in the islands by advertising for a water taxi operator who would transport students from the outer islands to and from Salt Spring each school day. The new system would eliminate the dormitory in Ganges. Also under consideration was a central elementary school on one of the outer islands to which students would be transported by boat each day.

Twenty years ago

A recount of the votes from a recreation referendum on Salt Spring reversed the outcome. Although the initial count had the referendum fail by eight votes, the recount produced 456 votes in favour compared to 414 opposed.

The successful referendum included a one year, single levy of 2.5 mills for acquisition and some development of the 10-acre recreational property at Central which had been purchased by the Lions Club. The Capital Regional District (CRD) board had already approved the purchase and the tennis courts and soccer fields were to be in use later that year.

A new recreation commission was to be formed to operate under the CRD board. This group would replace the Salt Spring Recreation Commission, which operated under the provincial government. Regional Director George Heinekey said the community would still be able to vote on the members of the new recreation commission.

Fifteen years ago

Pilot and passengers escaped injury after a Cessna 180 crashed on North Pender Island. The plane was flying over a privately owned airfield before attempting a landing when the engine quit. The plane dropped approximately 30 feet to the ground, doing an estimated \$15,000 to \$20,000 damage. Aboard were 49-year-old pilot Malcolm Ashwell and three passengers, all from the lower mainland. The plane had been rented.

A partially-finished post and beam house on Galiano Island was destroyed by fire shortly before 8 p.m. on a Friday evening. When the fire department arrived, the house

was burning fiercely and nearby brush had also been ignited.

House and contents belonged to the Prevedoro family. Janice Prevedoro had left the home at 6:30 p.m. to baby-sit for a friend. The cause of the fire had not been determined.

Douglas John Thompson of Richmond, the 29-year-old skipper of the Gulf Kid, died in hospital after falling overboard from his fishing boat earlier in the day. Thompson fell overboard near Gossip Island in Active Pass at approximately 1 p.m. He spent about 20 minutes in the water before being rescued by hovercraft and rushed to hospital.

Ten years ago

Two dog owners were fined after their dogs were judged responsible for terrorizing a flock of sheep near St. Mary Lake. Animal control officer Howard Byron said three sheep were injured in one attack and four were injured in an attack three days earlier. The sheep were owned by Mary Stepaniuk, who spent most of the day after the attacks treating the injured animals.

The CRD had no position on the return of outboard motors to St. Mary Lake, chairman Howard Sturrock said after writing a letter referring to a compromise solution. Sturrock's letter noted the alternate director to the CRD had said he could support allowing gasoline engines of up to 10 horsepower on the lake. The ban on gasoline engines was being challenged before the Supreme Court by a group of resort operators and one resident.

Five years ago

Some residents of St. Mary Lake joined in a B.C. Court of Appeal bid to overturn the restriction against gas engines on St. Mary Lake. Tripp Road resident Ed Davies, one of those listed on the appeal notice, said the electric motors allowed on the lake were not powerful enough to propel a boat when a strong wind springs up. Backing the ban on gasoline motors were the Salt Spring Water Preservation Society and the North Salt Spring Waterworks District, both of which are concerned about water quality in the lake.

Quilt for breast cancer raises \$800 on Galiano

Judy Reimer, a person living with cancer and a former Galiano resident, was back on the island last week with the three main panels of the life quilt for breast cancer.

On display in the north hall for five days, the quilt attracted islanders who flocked to see the panels and to add a "few stitches" in a show of support.

The quilt beautifully depicts scenes from nature — the devastation of a clear-cut forest (representing the woman who is diagnosed with breast cancer), the early recovery of the forest with fireweed and thistles (the cancer removed, recovery begun) and the forest renewed (recovery complete and a full life resumed).

When quilting is complete, the panels will each be surrounded by three rows of eight-by-eight inch quilted squares — the work of men and women from all over the province. Many of the squares carry a message, the creators having experienced cancer personally or had a loved one suffer from the disease.

Members of the Galiano Needle Guild were among the first to contribute squares — about two dozen finished last September. Many more are needed to complete the project. In order to effect continuity in what is submitted, backing pieces are supplied by the organizing committee. More will be available on Galiano very soon.

Contributors of squares, or of funds to keep the quilt before the public, can do so by contacting Johanna Pollard at 539-3105. More than \$800 was contributed during the quilt's showing here.

When the three panels leave Galiano one will find its way to the Victoria Quilt Show at that city's Trade and Convention Centre, while the other two will be taken to the Sunshine Coast for display and further quilting.

Keeping your COOL

How does your cooling system work? Coolant circulates through the engine, picking up engine heat and back through the radiator, where it cools. The components of the system are:

- 1. Radiator:** A core, or tube, is surrounded by fins of light metal. The more surface area these fins expose to the air, the more heat they can reject.
- 2. Water pump:** Running off a belt connected to the engine, the water pump forces the coolant to circulate. Keep an eye on the belt to make sure it's not worn or cracked.
- 3. Hoses:** The hose running from the bottom of your radiator takes coolant into the engine block, the hose at the top returns hot coolant to the radiator to be cooled. There are also hoses running to the back of the engine compartment - these are for the heater in your car.
- 4. Thermostat:** The thermostat is in the return (top) hose. It closes when cold, to reduce coolant circulation and help your engine warm up as fast as possible. Then it opens to maintain a constant engine temperature by regulating the flow of coolant.
- 5. Fan:** The fan behind the radiator doesn't blow-it sucks. It draws air through the radiator to increase the cooling effect at low speeds. At highway speeds, it usually isn't needed as the ram air from driving is ample to keep cool. These fans operate off a thermostat so they are not using engine power all the time.
- 6. Pressure cap:** Cooling systems are pressurized to raise the boiling point. This pressure depends on the pressure cap on the radiator (sometimes on the overflow reservoir).
- 7. Overflow reservoir:** Most cars have a translucent plastic container which contains coolant. This allows you to check the level without opening the radiator.
- 8. Coolant:** We talk about water-cooled engines and water pumps, but the coolant of choice is actually a 50/50 mix of ethylene glycol and water. Water alone would cool the engine, but it would also lead to corrosion. The coolant cools the engine efficiently, resists freezing in winter, resists boiling in summer, lubricates the water pump, and inhibits corrosion.

University women meet here

Past presidents of the Winnipeg university women's club had a longer than usual commute to their May monthly meeting.

They met on Salt Spring.

The group gathered on the island last weekend, arriving Friday and taking part in a series of events before a wind-up dinner Sunday evening.

One inspiration for the cross-country meeting was Freda Gray, who was president of the Winnipeg group in 1986-87 and who has maintained her membership despite moving to Salt Spring eight years ago.

"I retained my out-of-town membership so I get all the bulletins," she said, adding that she paid a visit to Winnipeg three to four years ago.

But she has been unable to go to the monthly past presidents' meetings of the Winnipeg club, so this month the meeting came to her. "It was really a shocker to get a letter from them saying 'we're coming for a meeting.'"

Gray, who has degrees in home economics and education from the universities of Manitoba and Toronto respectively, hosted a lunch Saturday for her Winnipeg friends. Their meeting followed the lunch.

Also at the meeting were Sharon Farquharson, who belonged to a club in Vancouver and hopes to start a branch on Salt Spring, and the presidents from five clubs on Vancouver Island.

The visitors from Winnipeg stayed at the Wisteria Guest House and enjoyed a steady stream of Salt Spring hospitality. On Saturday morning they visited the Market in the Park, downtown Ganges and local galleries and on Sunday they visited some island gardens and studios.

Sunday night they wound up their visit with a catered dinner at the guest house.

"It is an unusual and exciting departure for the Winnipeg club to meet outside of their locale," Gray observed.

But exciting departures are part of the delight of belonging to the Canadian Federation of University Women, judging by Sharon Farquharson's description of the group.

"Some of the women you meet are the most interesting people," Farquharson said.

One past president who came to the island from Winnipeg was Dr. Doris Saunders, who is now 94 and who graduated from university in 1921.

The only requirement for membership is graduation from an accredited university. With the support of 11,000 members in 130 clubs across Canada, the group promotes education, the pursuit of knowledge, participation in public affairs, human rights and improved status for women.

Both Farquharson and Gray suspect there are many women on the island who would be interested in the group.

Plans moving ahead at Core Inn building

Success in obtaining grants, holding events and paying off money owed on the building were all reported at the annual general meeting of the Core Inn Youth Project Society last Wednesday.

The outstanding debt on the Core Inn building is down to \$10,000 on personal interest-free loans made by supporters. The three-storey heritage building housing the Core Inn youth centre is otherwise mortgage-free.

The main floor of the building has been open since last November. Since then four dances have been held with music by local bands. A number of informal dances have been organized to recorded music.

Treasurer Patricia Nobile said young people have approached the directors and volunteered to organize some of the events. Friday nights started as drop-in evenings where the young people could meet friends and play games, but have now developed into open stage evenings with volunteer entertainers.

Theatre sports are being held Mondays and Thursdays after school.

Plans for the coming year include establishing a stronger youth leadership council to organize more events and initiate activities, and seeking more volunteers from the community.

"The kids all want the Core Inn to be open more," Nobile observed. An orientation session will be held for volunteers.

A \$47,100 Heritage Trust grant to restore the building is expected at any time. The society has been advertising for bids on the project from building contractors. The work will allow the second floor of the building to open.

The Heritage Trust grant requires matching funds which are being provided in part by donations in kind, volunteer labour and a \$16,500 grant from the Vancouver Foundation.

One proposed use for the second floor has been a youth wellness clinic. Capital Regional District nurse Chris Smart reported Planned Parenthood is interested in the project.

Also planned for this summer is a multi-purpose concrete deck behind the Core Inn which can be used for skateboarding and other sports. A \$7,500 grant from Salt Spring Parks and Recreation is helping finance the project, Nobile said, and an application has been made for a Vancouver Sun Fund grant.

A grant has been received from the provincial Summer Career Placement Program for a youth program coordinator who will be hired for 13 weeks between June and August to manage the Core Inn and facilitate activities. A university or college student will be hired to fill the position, Nobile said.

New members on the board are Arvid Chalmers, Roy MacMillan, Nicholas Gate, Nick Tenabain and youth members Magdeline Joly and Nayana Filkow.

They join chairman Bev Unger, Nobile, Meredith Knox, Catharine Marzalik, Larry Bishop and youth members Kirsty Chalmers and Arika Korrison.

The board has been meeting weekly but will now meet once a month. Eventually Nobile expects the adult advisory group will deal with grant applications, fundraising and business requirements and young people will organize many of the youth centre events.

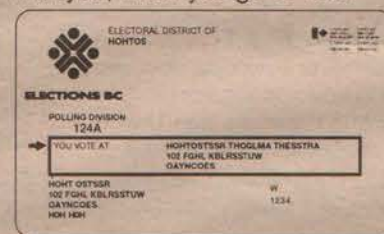

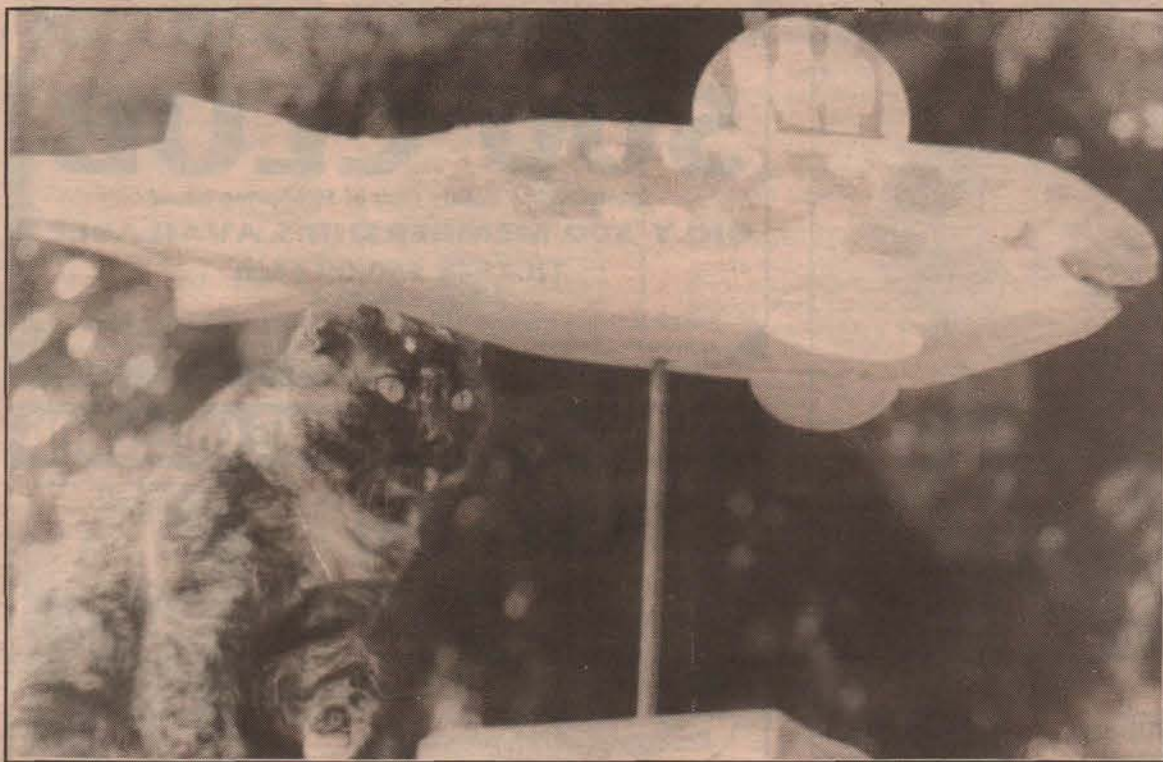

Neutering, spaying help offered

Don't litter. That's the message the Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) of Salt Spring wants to get out to owners of cats during May — Be Kind to Animals month.

The branch is cooperating with local veterinarians to offer a limited number of subsidized cat spay or neuter operations.

"We want this program to reach people in our community who would not otherwise be able to afford it," said Salt Spring SPCA president Pat Jacquest.

The program will reduce the cost of spaying a female cat to just under \$50 and neutering a male cat to just under

\$30. The program is a joint SPCA and B.C. Veterinary Medical Association project. The pet owner pays half the cost of the operation, the SPCA picks up 30 per cent and the participating veterinarians reduce their fees by 20 per cent.

Those taking advantage of the program will be asked to sign a form attesting to financial hardship. It is recommended that the cat's vaccinations be up to date before the operation.

"With so many animals unable to find homes, spaying or neutering is the responsible thing to do," said Jacquest, adding that such animals make better pets.

Province-wide, the SPCA received 13,000 cats and kittens last year for which homes could not be found. Spaying and neutering programs can dramatically reduce the need to destroy animals.

"Our society's goal is zero euthanasia of adoptable animals," said Jacquest. "With numerous cats being turned in to us last year, reducing the number of unwanted cats is our top priority. The days when you could count on your neighbours to take your cat's kittens off your hands are long gone."

Salt Spring animal control officer Wolfgang Brunnwieser said the elk hound-husky cross has already passed the amount of time given to homeless dogs before they are destroyed.

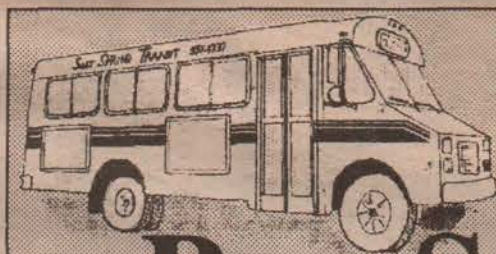

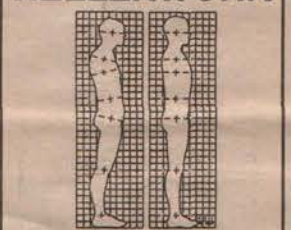
