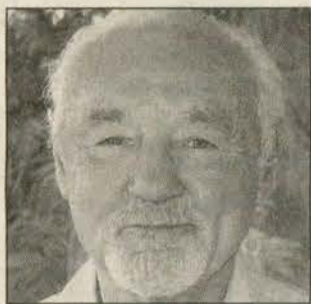

## Current events spawn Middle East memories

Modern Iraq appears to be a nation of irreconcilable extremes; a place where Third World poverty resides with massive oil resource wealth and outdated military might supports a feisty foreign poli-

cy. And while it seems incomprehensible that Iraq could teeter toward the possibility of war with the U.S. through diplomatic fencing matches, a Salt Spring man remembers his own bizarre experiences in the troubled Arab nation.

Fifty years ago, Anthony Kane-White went to Iraq as a civil engineer assigned to build an airport, roads and bridges for the burgeoning oil centre.

"Now things are heating up in the Middle East again. In Bush's State of the Union speech, he drilled Iraq and Iran more than Korea."

Having personal experience in the region, Kane-White believes a war against terrorism in Iraq would be vastly different from the 1991 Gulf War or recent military action in Afghanistan.

"Casualties would be much higher," he said.

Kane-White is no stranger to the dangers of war. He served as an air gunner on a fabric-covered biplane bomber with the Royal Air Force in Malaya during WWII.

After Java fell in 1942, he was captured and spent four years as a slave labourer in a Japanese coal mine under the sea.

"It was pretty scary. They were laying mines on the inland waterway above us and every once in a while a ship would strike a mine

and water would pour in."

Upon release from the P.O.W. camp, Kane-White had lost almost five inches of height and weighed only 60 pounds.

During his departure from Japan, he witnessed the aftermath of atomic destruction at Hiroshima where only sewing machines were left standing in the devastated city.

Following his wartime experiences, Kane-White went to Melbourne to study engineering.

"After graduating from university, I made a three-month tour of Europe with a couple of friends and when I got back to England I decided to get a job there. The only one I could find was with a big contractor who got me this job in Kuwait. When that ended, they persuaded me to go to Baghdad for a couple of years."

Over the two years Kane-White worked in Iraq as a civil engineer, he recalled being shot at by roving brigands near the Iranian border, a record-setting flood, a rescue mission to save an employee from a mob of student demonstrators and an airline crash on the inaugural landing at the Baghdad Airport.

"It was just the sort of thing that happened then," Kane-White said.

He remembered being shot at on several occasions.

"We always used to get shot at by Arabs sitting on the hills who wanted to rob us. I had an Armenian driver and I made him go faster and faster. We could hear the bullets all around us."

But Kane-White wasn't adverse to using intimidation himself.

He recalled a time when he received a fuel bill for three times what a tanker truck could hold. In reply, Kane-White sent his driver to rip up the bill with a revolver in hand.

"I told him to say 'That's the last order you'll ever get.'"

On another occasion, he was surrounded by 200

# Forum is 'eye-opening' for local youth

Two weeks ago I had the opportunity to represent the SWOVA youth team at a conference in Toronto.

Sponsored by the Canadian Women's Foundation, it was called Forum on Teen Programs to Prevent Violence Against Women and Girls. It was held at the Bank of Montreal Institute for Learning.

I went there with Lynda Laushway, the coordinator of our Salt Spring-based project.

When I first arrived I had a mixture of emotions. I was nervous, scared, yet very excited. The first night there was a presentation given by a group called D-WAVE (Deaf Women Opposed to Violence Everywhere). It was by far one of the most memorable presentations I saw during the whole trip. The women gave the whole presentation in sign language and it was interpreted in both English and French. The women were so confi-

dent and upbeat and never once said anything that might make us feel any type of pity but asked instead for equality.

When they talked about making workshops adaptable to as many kids as we can, I thought to myself that I had never once considered making things adaptable for deaf children. At first I was disappointed in myself but then I realized that was why the group was there. They were there to open all of our eyes and reach as many people as possible. I left that night feeling much more excited and a lot less scared about the weekend ahead of me.

The next morning was packed with presentations from the different organizations attending the conference. Every group had different opinions about preventing violence but yet we all shared a common goal.

It was very interesting, although throughout the whole morning I was anticipating the lunch hour when I would get to meet the other

teenagers who were present. At lunch time the teenagers were instructed to pick up their food and meet in a separate conference room. The discussion started immediately. It was so amazing to be with these seven other teens from all across Canada, who had so many different views and led such different lifestyles.

The next morning was the morning I had been thinking about the whole weekend. I was giving a presentation on our project along with Lynda. I had been nervous about this since I found out I would have to give it. I surprised myself by how confident and somewhat calm, I was. Afterwards I wondered why I had gotten so nervous. My fear of public speaking decreased immensely. For the rest of the day I relaxed and just enjoyed listening and learning from all of the presenters.

The following morning, our last there, started off bright and early with all of the teens giving a presenta-

tion about the forum and what we believed adults needed to know about teenagers. As a group we had decided to just leave it to the adults to ask us what they wanted to know and not have anything scripted ahead of time. I once again surprised myself during this session by continuously asking for the microphone to voice my opinions and to openly say what I thought about certain questions.

This trip was without a doubt one of the most eye-opening and confidence-boosting experiences of my life. I learned that I am perfectly capable of holding my own and can overcome some of my greatest fears. I hope more teenagers can have the opportunity to attend more conferences like this one.

When I returned to Salt Spring I was anxious to tell everyone what I had learned and to share everything I could. I had a new outlook on our country, life and, most importantly, myself.

irate road workers who hadn't been paid wages.

"When I looked into it, it turned out they hadn't gotten anything. At the office, they thought it was just overtime from the week before. I made sure they got it the next day."

Kane-White said local sheiks exerted a great deal of power and he had to hire their labourers and buy their provisions at exorbitant prices.

Occasionally armed conflicts would occur between sheikdoms and Kane-White would be forced to wait on work until the groups resolved their problems.

"This was the case like we've seen with Afghanistan; where there are lots of fiefdoms with their own armies and followers. But they had a king, like in Afghanistan before the Taliban.

Kane-White found road construction quite frustrating in Iraq. Existing roads weaved between houses in little tracks and locals were reluctant to assist in progressive changes.

"Every time we did something, we had to knock down a mud hut and a sheik would come up to us and say, 'You can't do that.'"

The engineer was commissioned to build a 500-kilometre road between Basra and Baghdad in March 1953. But he only completed 150 km before the Tigris and Euphrates rivers flooded to their highest levels in 4,000 years.

As result of the flood, Kane-White's attention turned toward trying to upgrade embankments to protect Baghdad from destruction.

"The waters were rising and the big embankments around the city were four feet too low . . . I had to go into the city. I bulldozed down nature strips between the boulevards and curbs," Kane-White said.

"I was working without a shirt or hat and it was 120 degrees in the shade. I got tapped on the shoulder and a man introduced himself as King Fasil III. He had a good Oxford accent and he said he was very appreciative of what we were doing."

Iraqi workers were often surprised by Kane-White, who drove bulldozers through lunch hours to save expenses on heavy equipment.

Once, while working on a small bridge on the Iranian border, he taught labourers how to wrap steel forms for a concrete bridge.

"They were shocked. 'No European has ever worked as a labourer before,' they said."

He managed upgrades of the Baghdad International Airport but experienced tragedy when the inaugural flight of Egypt Airlines

crashed on landing shortly after the airport opened.

"The plane was full of dignitaries and sheiks. It crashed and burst into flames on touch-down. There were about 5,000 Arabs and sheiks awaiting them in Baghdad Airport. They were all in tears and shaking their heads in disbelief. I was in the control tower and had a good view," he said sadly.

After his work in the Middle East, Kane-White emigrated to Canada where he worked on major construction projects, including the World Trade Center in New York City.

While watching media reports on the "War on Terrorism," he looks at his atlas and expresses concern over the possibility of yet another war in the Middle East.

"I'm not sure what will happen with Bush making all these threats."

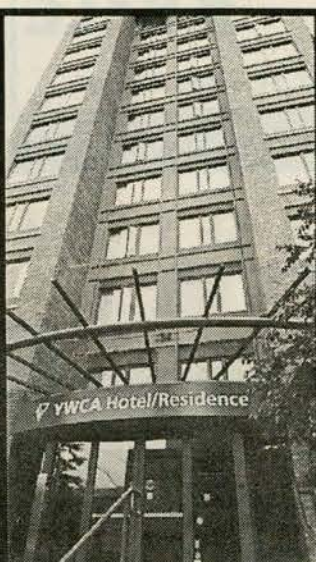

# Pinot Noir — great with food

Do you realize that not only do we live in the best region in Canada for climate,

but we are in close proximity to some of the best grape growing areas in the world?

Take that most difficult of grapes, Pinot Noir, for instance. Farmers have long considered it a finicky fruit that would grow and ripen in only very specific and limited areas. But, lo and behold, on our doorstep is one of the world's great Pinot producers: Oregon. If you take a trip down the coast you will be compelled to take a detour to the Willamette Valley and visit some of the wineries. You won't be disappointed. Of course it is not surprising, considering how close we are and how adventurous our wine makers are that Pinot grapes are popping up all over the place in B.C.

Here is a quick survey of Pinot Noir wines available at our local BCL. Calona Vineyards, Artist Series, Okanagan Valley, Pinot Noir, 2000 (\$11.95). This wine has a classic Pinot garnet colour and not too intense, which is typical of most Pinot (except perhaps the big Burgundian style of wine). On the nose it has light berry/strawberry fruit, some vegetal and earth. The taste has strawberry fruit, some pepper, still noticeable tannins, and a touch of mint. Overall a well-made wine, pleasant, not terribly complex and still quite young. In six months I'd give it SSS.

Sumac Ridge, Okanagan Valley, Pinot Noir, 1999 (\$14.95). The colour is garnet and medium in intensity. The nose has light fruit, some spice and vegetal underpinning. The taste is of strawberry, with a slight citric tang, some spice and pepper. Overall a refreshing tangy wine of medium intensity and body. SSS.

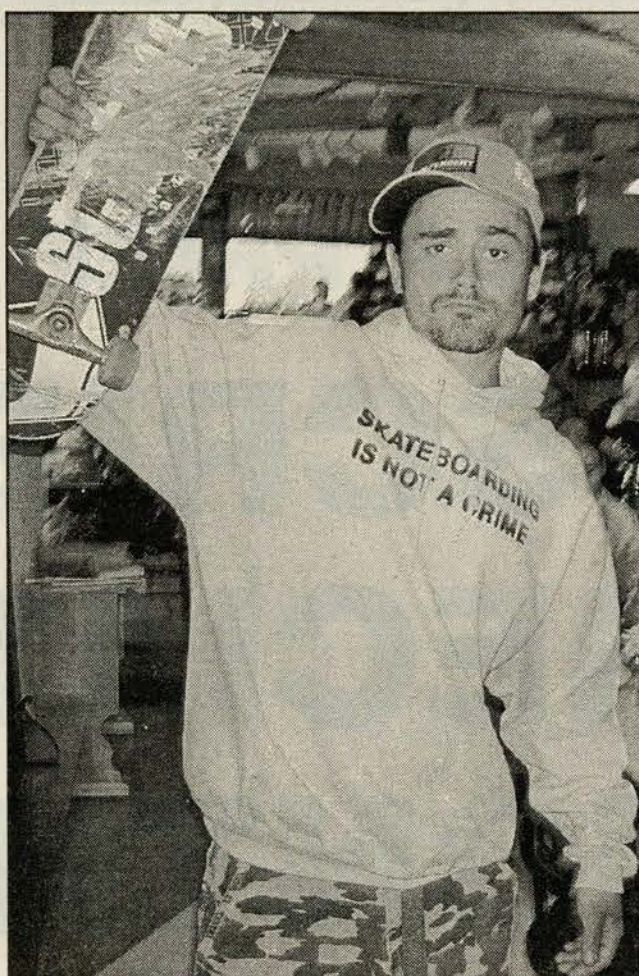
Jackson Triggs Proprietors' Reserve, Okanagan Valley, Pinot Noir, 1999 (\$14.95). The colour is garnet and medium intense. There is bright fruit on the nose with a vegetal and meaty aroma. The taste is of cherry/strawberry, with a vegetal and floral development. Overall quite soft and well integrated. SSS 1/2.

Firesteed, Oregon, Pinot Noir, 1999 (\$19.95). A classic west coast Pinot, garnet in colour, a lively nose with lots of zingy fruit, spice and cedar, and a tantalizing taste that starts fresh and fruity and ends with spice and earth. Lovely wine. SSSS.

Cono Sur, Chile, Pinot Noir, 2001 (\$9.95). Perhaps because it is so young this wine has a very closed nose (can't smell much, and I don't have a cold), there is some fruit on the attack and pronounced tannins, but nothing in the middle. The wine certainly needs more time, but even then I don't think there's enough here to make a difference. SS.

Trapiche, Argentina, Pinot Noir, 1999 (\$11.95). Classic garnet colour, some fruit on the nose with meat (bacon and eggs anyone?) and floral, the taste has cherry, some candy and charcoal. Mostly a one note wine but not unpleasant. SS 1/2.

Pinot Noir loves food. Try it with salmon for sure. Cheers!

# Students' \$700 will aid Guatemala kids

Salt Spring Centre School children presented a \$700 cheque last week to a woman who works with Mayan children and youth in Guatemala.

Sheila Reid, a Salt Spring resident and former teacher, was at the school during May Day celebrations to receive the cheque and watch a rehearsal for a play about a family in Guatemala.

"I wish I could make the gratitude of the Mayan children visible to you," said Reid at the school.

"Gratitude is expressed in many ways by the Mayan people and they believe it to be an important part of life. No matter how poor people are it is hard ever to leave their homes or have them visit you without them presenting a gift of some sort in appreciation."

Centre school children raised the money mainly through a skip-a-thon held in March.

The fundraiser was inspired by the school's year-end play called The Great Emerald Waterfall, written by teacher/performer Yiana Belkalopoulos and set for presentation on the Salt Spring Centre lawn at the end of May.

Reid will send the cheque and a book the children wrote and illustrated about the play to the Pop Atziak Cultural Centre in Guatemala.

There, the money will be used to purchase fruit and other supplies for needy children.

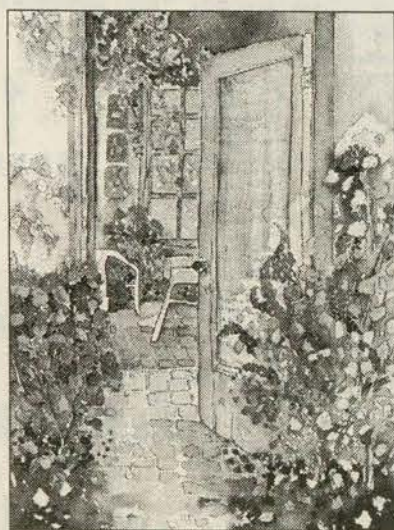

Ocean's Eleven is an exercise in pure mainstream fun from

director Steven Soderbergh, he of the simultaneous Oscar nominations (and one win) for Erin Brockovich and Traffic.

Of course, one might think it would be hard to screw up a film starring the likes of George Clooney, Brad Pitt, Matt Damon, Andy Garcia and Julia Roberts, but it's not hard to see a lesser director faltering under the pressure.

Clooney stars as ex-con Danny Ocean, who plots to rob three Las Vegas casinos on the same night. To do this, he assembles a super-team of criminals, and yes, there are 11 of them. For Ocean, however, it's not all about the money.

His ex-wife Tess just happens to be dating casino owner Terry Benedict (Garcia), so we're not talking about a straight up "smash and grab." As the film gets closer and closer to the big night, various distractions come into play. I won't reveal exactly how this happens, but I will say that Ocean's plan seems to be aimed at fooling both Benedict and the audience.

It's hard to make any serious complaints about Ocean's Eleven because the thing is just so darn entertaining.

The star power mentioned earlier is staggering; the only real problem is that Clooney seems to have more chemistry with Pitt than his supposed love interest in Julia Roberts. These guys make for the epitome of

cool, strutting around in their spiffy suits amid the glitz that is Vegas.

Now, some people have complained that the film doesn't have anything to say, and so it is a bit of a disappointment from Soderbergh. I disagree wholeheartedly. Why does the guy have to be serious all of the time? It's pretty clear that he is fully capable of making good "entertainment," as any viewing of Out of Sight or Ocean's Eleven will show. Let him have his fun — just not too much fun.

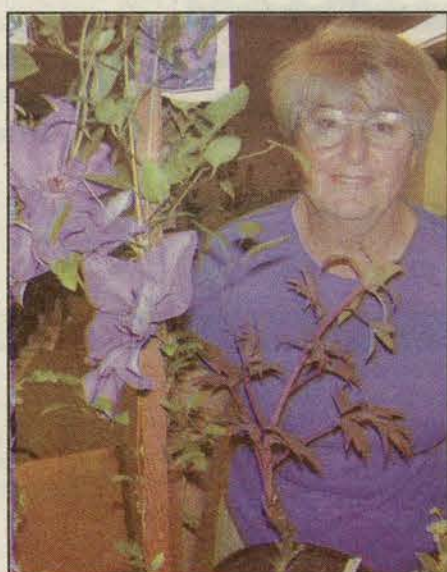

With a focus on poets of the 18th and 19th centuries, Salt Spring's Poetry Reading Group resumes its regular schedule on Wednesday, May 22.

The group, which was initiated last year by Chris Patton, will meet at 5:30 p.m. at Sabine's Book Shop in Grace Point Square.

Patton is a part-time professor of literature at Arcadia University in Pennsylvania, and resides on Salt Spring for six months of the year.

Participation is open to anyone with an interest in 18th and 19th-century poetry.

## Dean studio to show varied work

Gallery visitors in Richmond, Victoria and Nanaimo have been feasting on Diana Dean paintings in the past several months, but Salt Spring residents and visitors will be able to indulge themselves through the summer season.

Dean is opening her studio and Artemisia Gallery to the public on a daily basis beginning this Friday night from 5 to 8 p.m.

She will show a collection of work from the past and present, including some still lifes, figure painting and pastel landscapes.

While Dean is well-known for her huge, epic-like oil paintings steeped in allegory and Renaissance-like reverence, along with an astonishing timelessness, she is putting out both smaller and varied works for view this season.

People who have followed Dean's creations in recent years may notice a subtle shift in the style of her newest pieces.

"I feel like after having the show in

Nanaimo, particularly, where I saw the evolution of the paintings, there is a slight change happening," she said. "I'm moving into my next stage..."

Dean's March and April show at the Nanaimo Art Gallery brought together a representative sample of works from a 20-year period.

In that venue, she said, it was clear how the paintings from the mid-1990s were generally "quite dark both in colour as well as subject matter," gradually lightening in tone in ensuing years.

What will happen next is not yet completely clear, she said.

Dean's work is part of major collections, such as the Canada Council Art Bank, Confederation Centre Museum and Art Gallery and DuPont Canada.

Much of Dean's work is sold in Toronto through Nancy Poole's Studio, but she is trying to keep more pieces in B.C. — and the closer to home the better, in some ways.

"I love it when people on Salt Spring

buy my paintings so I can go and see them again."

Dean has christened her display space at 135 Northview Place Artemisia Gallery in honour of Artemisia Gentileschi, a female Italian Baroque painter in a time when few women were able to practise art.

(French filmmaker Agnes Merlet caused a stir a few years ago with a film version of Gentileschi and her relationship with painter Agostino Tassi.)

Dean said she is not particularly inspired by the work of Gentileschi, but that she has often thought of her as someone from the past who signifies the long movement towards women's painters.

Artemis, Greek goddess of the hunt and the moon, is also known as Diana, she notes.

Dean's studio and Artemisia Gallery will be open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. beginning Saturday.

## Popular Diallo back for Talons bash

World music fans should be ready to hear the best when Alpha Yaya Diallo comes to Talons next Saturday.

Diallo visits the island just a month after winning his second Juno Award for best global recording. His most recent recording, *The Journey*, won the country's top honours at the Newfoundland gala.

He also won the same award in 1999 for *The Message*.

Diallo and his band have a reputation for exciting live shows and runaway musicianship.

As a Calgary Straight review noted, "When Diallo breaks into a high-speed scalar run between verses of a song or rapidly flat-picks an arpeggiated melody, eyes bulge out of their sockets. The guy is that good. Also, one does not expect someone performing African pop to play in a style that has more similarities to a

Spanish guitarist or a rock guitar hero."

Diallo grew up in Guinea, West Africa, and absorbed musical traditions ranging from the Malenke to the Souso and his own Foulah people.

He also picked up the powerful "mbalax" rhythm while in Senegal, plus influences from Cape Verde and the Caribbean.

Now based in Vancouver, Diallo's music is irresistible for dancing fans.

In 1999, Georgia Straight readers gave him a Readers' Choice Music Award for favourite world music act.
