

Midsummer Night's romp on stage this week

Fairy wings will usher in an early breath of sunny wit and warmth for Stagecoach Theatre School's upcoming production of Shakespeare's classic comedy *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, on stage at ArtSpring this Thursday through Saturday.

"Several plots interweave together. It's about mistaken identities, pranks played upon humans by fairies and lovers who are betrothed to the wrong people. But all things get untangled just in the nick of time," said Stagecoach's director-teacher Sue Newman.

Newman laughed about the central storyline of four lovers who visit Duke Theseus of Athens to get help changing partners.

"It's the classic story of 'I love her but she loves him and he loves her and she loves him and he loves the other one.' Ultimately, they all end up in love with the right people."

The island-friendly love story is accented by a group of tradesmen-actor-clowns who get tricked by fairies during an accidental visit to the forest.

"That's where the famous story of Bottom, the clown who gets his head changed into the head of an ass, comes from."

Titania, the queen of the fairies, is bewitched through magic to fall in love with Bottom; and the mortal is such a buffoon, he doesn't even realize the queen has been enchanted, she laughed.

The director had to admit her own experience with the play has also been transforming and enchanting.

"I've lived a long time in fear and awe of Shakespeare," she laughed.

But Newman didn't want to pass her fear of "the Bard" down to her students when they requested an opportunity to tackle a Shakespearian play this semester.

"I finally thought, 'This is ridiculous. Let's jump into it and get over it. We'll all learn together.'"

Stagecoach students showed interest in the Elizabethan poet after they took a Shakespearian workshop offered by Newman's daughter and fellow thespian Lauren Bowler.

"They all had a blast with it."



Joi Freed-Garrod adapted a script for the 15 actors in the company (aged 10-14) and the students "cut their teeth" on Shakespeare with assistance from instructors Newman, Bowler, Robbyn Scott (movement and choreography), Virginia Newman (vocal coaching), and Simon Henson (set design and stage management).

"They've all been 'gung-ho' since they began working at the end of January."

Newman wanted to emphasize that the production is being staged by a group effort of students, teachers and parents at the theatre school.

"They all have great ideas and they've been encouraged to bring them into the process."

And though the play offers the opportunity to distribute larger roles more evenly than in most productions, not all students wanted a major part, she said.

"They feel involved even if they don't have as many lines."

The collaborative nature of the project has kept everyone involved in the magic of theatre.

"It's very welcoming to all those different abilities."

A Midsummer Night's Dream runs at ArtSpring at 7 p.m. from April 10 to 12. Tickets are \$12 for adults and \$6 for children.

Graffiti Theatre launches hot-ticket play

Charming Ireland and brash Hollywood collide at ArtSpring next week when one of the world's hottest theatrical commodities hits the stage.

Stones in His Pockets, the award-winning comedy written by Irish playwright Marie Jones, caused fireworks of excitement at its 1999 Belfast debut, and hasn't cooled off since.

Graffiti Theatre's production is the first on the Canadian west coast, and runs for four nights only from Wednesday, April 16 through Saturday, April 19, beginning at 8 p.m.

Stones in His Pockets tells the story of an impoverished Irish village inundated by a Hollywood film crew.

As the antics unfold, audiences get to know villagers Jake and Charlie, hired as film extras; young locals Fin and Sean, and Sean's father Mr. Harkin; Wee Mickey the seasoned extra; and Brother Gerard.

Film crew invaders include director Simon, two art directors; Caroline the starlet; and John the accent coach.

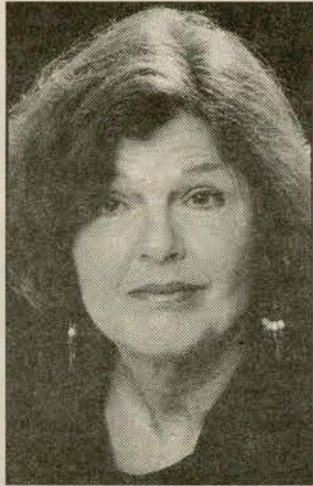
With that kind of line-up, one would expect a real crowd in the green room. But part of Stones' notoriety rises from the fact only two actors play all those characters and more — so 15 in total.

"Half the fun and the magic of the show lies in the audience witnessing these changes in the blink of an eye," said the play's director Yvonne Adalian.

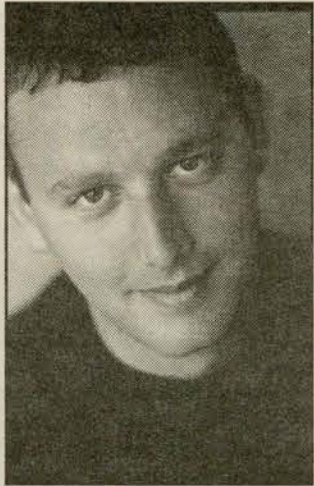
For the Graffiti production, Adalian hired professional actors Vaughn Fulford of Salt Spring, and Ian Farthing from Vancouver to take on the actors' dream project.

Proving its popularity, 35 actors from across Canada wanted to audition for the Salt Spring production, and Adalian chose 12 to try out.

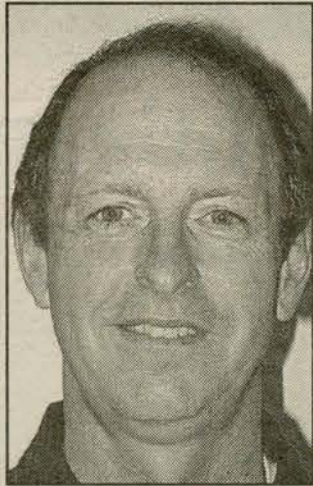
"I've worked with Vaughn since the first Graffiti show [in 1997] and he's a won-

derfully versatile actor," said Adalian.

Fulford has slain audiences with his hilarious work in shows such as Graffiti's two Random Acts, A Guide to Mourning and The Imaginary Invalid, and amazed them in Scott Hylands' Endgame and his Runaway Stage co-production with Hylands of Under Milk Wood.

Farthing, who spent the first few years of his life in Canada before his family moved to England, has made acting his passion and profession since high school.

Achieving his actors' equity card after only one year out of graduate theatre school, Farthing worked out of London for 10 years, performing in new plays and classics, including South Pacific and non-Shakespeare stints at The Globe Theatre.

Two years ago he moved permanently to Vancouver and has been busy with city projects since — from Nicola Cavendish's rendition of The Mousetrap to the Peter Shaffer comedy Lettice & Lovage.

Speaking about Stones, Farthing observed, "It's a great showcase play for actors."

Trying to name his favourite character, he said, "It's a toss-up between Wee Mickey and Aisling, the second art director."

With some difficulty at containing the sarcasm, he

explains, "Wee Mickey was an extra in The Quiet Man with John Wayne, so he's totally experienced at being an extra."

Among Fulford's challenges is depicting Caroline the spoiled American starlet. Fulford said playing a woman is not the daunting part, but that Caroline herself is a complex character, aching to be the centre of attention, as you'd imagine, while being quite fragile as well.

Adalian, Farthing and Fulford said they have been having a great time during intense rehearsals trying to craft the characters.

Farthing said he has really appreciated Adalian's encouragement of experimentation.

"We have a brilliant director," he said. "Yvonne lets us be stupid and try things

out, and some of the things work and some of them don't."

He also feels that sense of fun will benefit performances.

"If you are having fun doing that then it spills over to the audience."

Adalian adds: "They will be assured of having fun. There are plenty of laughs."

But the play is also extremely poignant, she notes, and parts of the plot will be utterly surprising.

Despite its far-away setting, it offers a tangible link to island culture.

"When I first read the play, I thought there are a few things Salt Spring can relate to."

Because of the extraordinary need to differentiate between so many characters, the play's lighting and sound are crucial elements.

Tim Crighton, who Adalian met in Nanaimo while working on The Dunsmuirs, is Stones' technical designer. Crighton also created the fabulous set for Graffiti's opulent Merry Wives of Windsor production last summer. Island lighting whiz Marv Coulthard is also working on the lights.

Farthing, who has had to adjust to the raucous sound of mating-season frogs on Salt Spring — a definite contrast to city sirens — was sold on the play after seeing the original London production.

Last year he wanted to self-produce Stones in Vancouver, but was told three other groups in the region had already applied for the rights.

Learning Graffiti was at the top of the list, Farthing contacted Adalian about an audition.

Adalian said Stones in His Pockets was reportedly created because Belfast's Lyric Theatre was broke and need-

ed a play with minimal set, costumes, props and actors.

"This, to my mind, is going right back to the roots of theatre," she said, "and I am jubilant to think that this kind of play, which relies more on talent than technology, is still popular with today's audiences."

From a 1999 debut at the Lyric Theatre in Belfast, the play has been mounted throughout Great Britain, the U.S., in Australia, Asia, Jerusalem, Iceland and Sweden.

It has been honoured with the Olivier Award and Evening Standard Award, both for "best comedy," plus three other official accolades. The Golden Theatre on Broadway production was nominated for three prestigious Tony awards.

Tickets for the show are \$18 on Wednesday and Thursday, \$20 on Friday and Saturday, and \$10 for students.

Pender company publishes Polish officer's history

In the Shadow of Katyn, by Stanislaw Swianiewicz. Borealis Publishing, Pender Island: 266 pp.

The battle over Poland was one of the shortest engagements of World War II. It was also the spark that set off the fuse to that war.

In the years and the months that saw Nazi Germany's preparations for what was to be a battle for Europe, the nations of the continent negotiated various strategies and agreements to counter further attacks on his neighbours by the German leader.

The fevered preparations for war were the background to policies and precautions by those nations when it was already too late. Despite a 600-year history, Poland was not prepared for war of any kind and still less prepared was she for the German style of war in all spheres, land sea and air; the blitzkrieg.

Germany marched into Poland on September 1, 1939. Two days later, Britain and France declared war on Germany.

Both countries had signed a defence pact with Poland. Neither had the reserves available to offer the promised support to the beleaguered Poles as undertaken in their separate tri-partite mutual defence pacts. It was, of course, a reminder that the lightning war came too quickly to allow communications or emergency preparations. It was, also, perhaps, a warning that mutual defence pacts were easily agreed and signed but were valueless without the military personnel and equipment to implement them.

A fortnight later, on September 17, Russia was eager to get into the act and marched in on the heels of the German troops.

One of the Polish officers and the author of this tale, Lieut. Stanislaw Swianiewicz, was among the prisoners taken by the enemy forces on September 28.

At this stage, the book borrows its name from the infamous treatment of the Polish prisoners of war. Initially they were held largely in concentration camps located near Smolensk. This story deals with holding camps at or near Katyn Forest.

Swianiewicz, in 1939, was already a veteran fighter in two wars. He had served his country in the First World War, or "Great War," in its latter years. He had also been a Polish Army officer in the 1920 Poland-Soviet

War.

Katyn was a death camp. Prisoners were transported to Katyn Forest to be held for extermination. Oddly enough it was the Soviet decision to hold him for spying that saved Swianiewicz' life.

En route to Katyn he was whipped out of his group and transported to the dreaded Lubyanka Prison in Moscow.

Swianiewicz was the only survivor of his party. His companions all died in the same manner, a pistol ball in the back of the head.

The writer of the story was not calling attention to the unique manner by which he escaped the death penalty of the two aggressors. He was probably motivated by the mystery of Katyn rather than its contribution to his own survival.

Swianiewicz explains in some detail that he was not only taken from the party heading for Katyn, but that he was never in that forest of death.

The outbreak of war in 1939 had brought German and Russian soldiers to destroy Poland. The statistics of the assault are a key to the degree of force exercised against the defending Polish military. The Russian invaders took 15,000 officers, including 5,000 police officers, as prisoners of war. In addition they also took a quarter-million troops. The officers were placed in three Russian camps in the vicinity of Smolensk.

Then the thieves fell out. In June of 1941, Germany turned on Russia and the Soviet government approved the raising of a Polish army on Russian soil. And they had the troops, 250,000 of them. But no officers. Missing were the 15,000 taken during the invasion. Where were they?

Stalin cleared that up. He had released them, he explained. No further enquiries were made.

Two years later the German troops in Russia found the missing men at Katyn, buried in mass graves.

They dug up 4,143 bodies. The officers had been held in three camps. The term "Katyn Massacre" was used to include the murders at all three concentration camps involved.

It is now ancient history. But it is far from forgotten history.

The book was originally published in Polish in 1976 and again in 1981 and 1990. It has also been published in Russian.

In addition to its historical importance, the book has a specific appeal to islanders.

The son of the author, Witold Swianiewicz, who translated his father's story, is a resident of Pender Island and the book is published by Borealis Publishing of Pender Island.

In the Shadow of Katyn is history. It is history as lived by the author.

FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2002

The financial results for 2002 are indicative of strong financial management introduced over the past two years. Through changed accounting procedures PARC was able to clearly identify the revenues and costs attributable to its many activities and recognize areas where it needed to reduce costs or was able to allocate funds to other areas. Priorities were then established in order to focus efforts where PARC had a mandate to provide services or where maintenance and renovation was most needed.

The principal sources of PARC's revenues are four distinct tax requisitions. The \$160,740 requisition for Community Parks provides funds for the development and maintenance of trails, Mouat Park, Rotary Park, Drummond Park, Centennial Park and the Market in the Park. The smallest requisition is \$84,380 received for Community Recreation. This funds the Shelby Pool, the summer Day Camp and support for Artspring.

The largest requisition is \$325,500 for Parkland and Recreation for general administration, Portlock Park, the Fulford ball park and waterfront access. Additional funds totaling \$109,881 were derived from fees for swimming, Camp Colossal day camp and Market in the Park, grants donations and interest. Finally, the tax requisition of \$134,621 provides for interest and principal repayment on the debt incurred to buy the property on Rainbow Road. In addition, a parkland acquisition fund of \$123,873 has been accumulated from cash-in-lieu payments from developers.

As a result of effective cost control in 2002, \$95,072 was set aside in capital and replacement reserves. These funds are being used to replace worn-out playground equipment and bleachers at the ballpark. Funds have also been set aside to augment grant funding for community initiatives involving improved recreation amenities. A transfer of \$50,000 was also made to the Capital Reserve Account for the new recreation center project.

A SUCCESSFUL SUMMER AT PORTLOCK PARK

Shelby Memorial Pool outdoor pool has operated at Portlock Park for eleven years. Due to its age and condition, it required considerable maintenance in 2002. Leisure Recreation Group has taken over operation and management of the pool to provide the expertise necessary.

The pool opened on May 6 to give the swim team an early training opportunity. School district learn-to-swim lessons, and public programs opened on May 21, and the pool operated until closing on August 31. A change to block scheduling for swim lessons proved to be popular with swimmers, and a convenience to parents.

Our new pool manager, Jim Raddysh along with former PARC pool staff, had a successful season. Total pool attendance for 2002 was 5500.

We just have so much green happening here along with daffodils, tulips, blossoms, and I am wearing T-shirts. It must be spring.

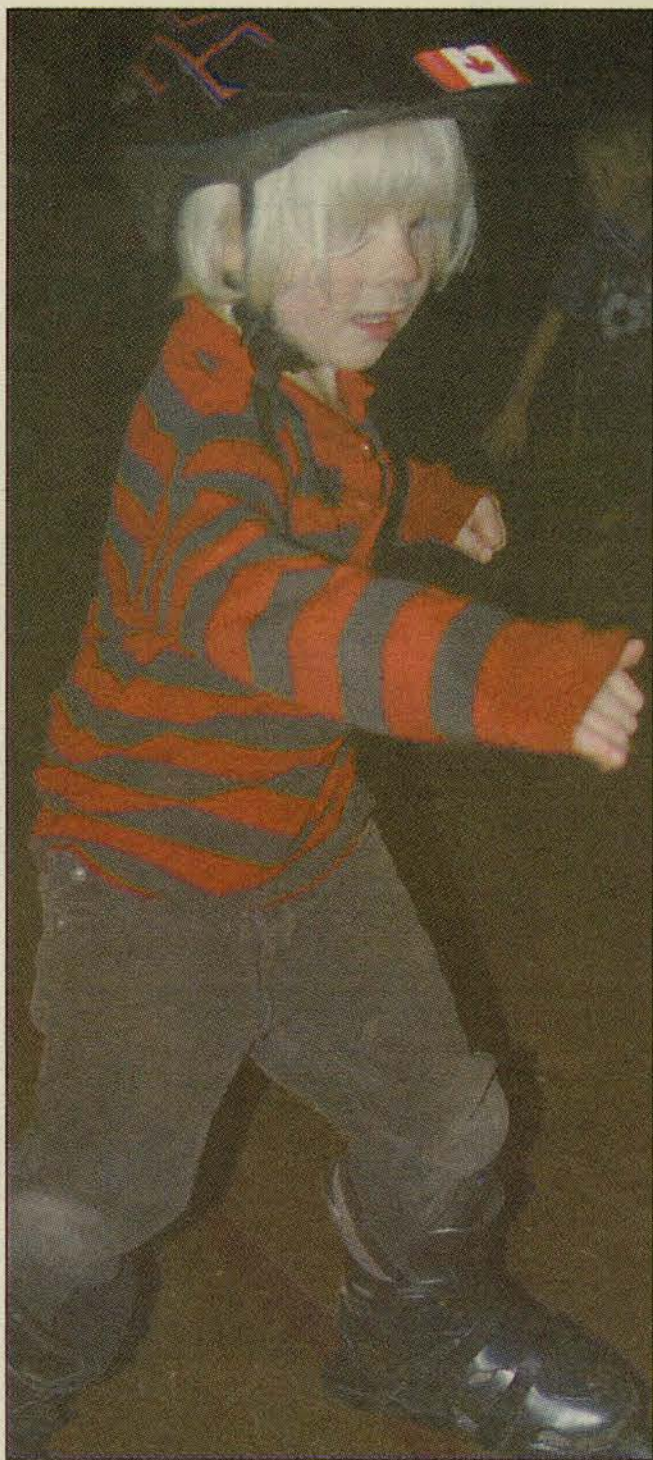

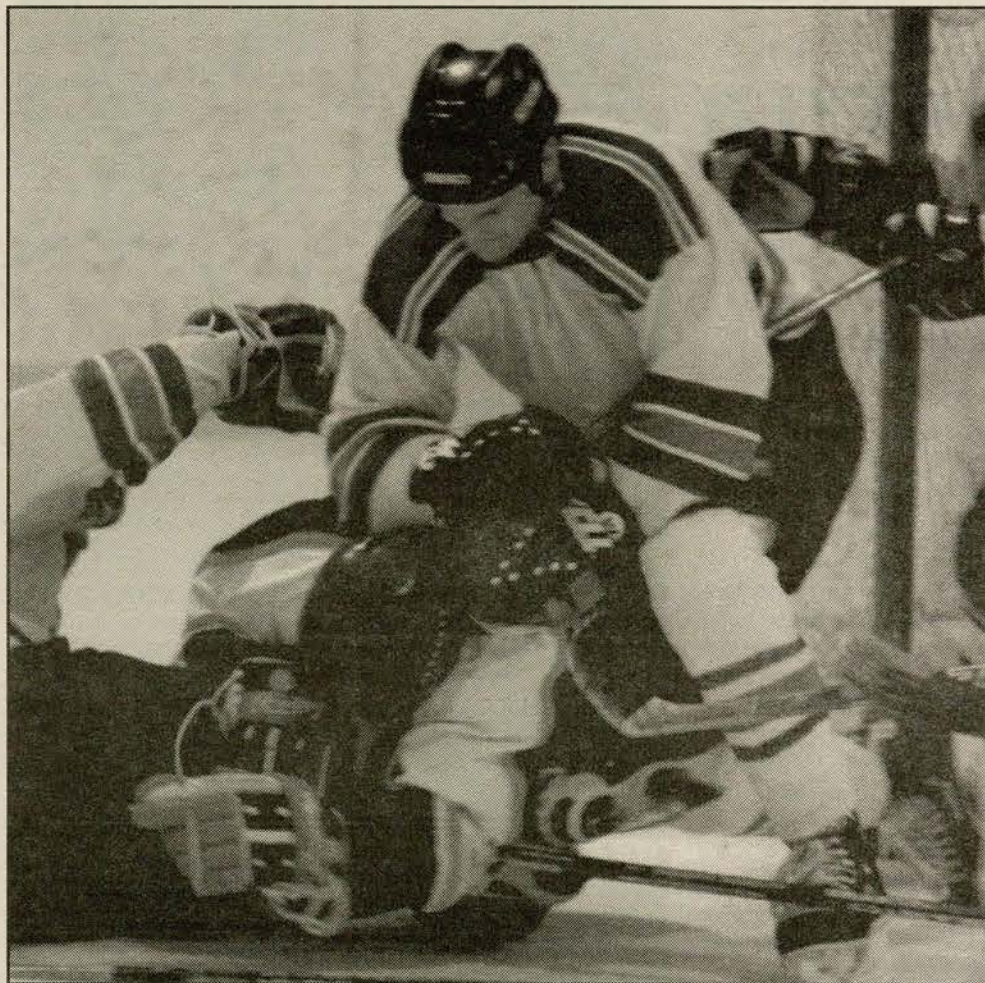
"We were up 2-1 at the end of the first period but they managed to get five unanswered goals to win the game," Topping said.

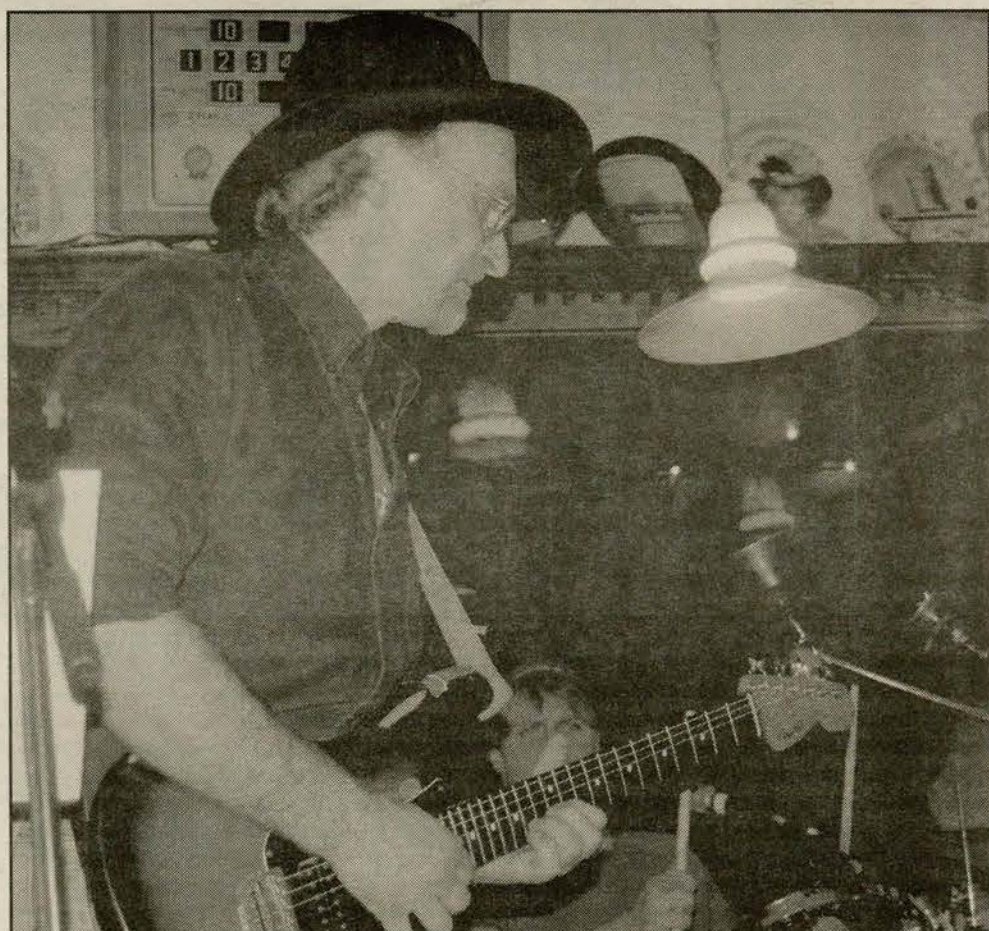

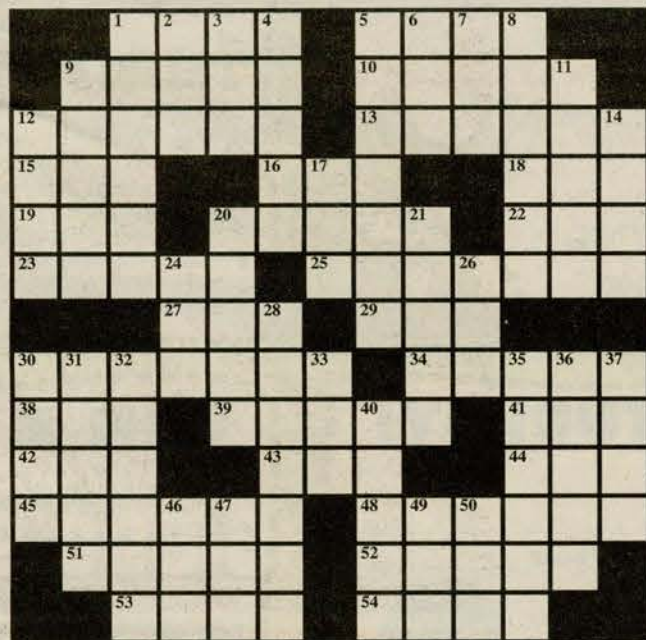
