

## Films by all-ages in GIFTS' show

When Mary Burns embarked on her latest career a few years ago, she was the kind of person who cut people's heads off with a point-and-click camera.

For most undertakings that wouldn't have been a big deal, but the Salt Spring potter, painter and bookkeeper was pursuing a curiosity for film-making, where camera pointing is key.

Now when it comes to creating short films and digital arts installations, Burns can literally do it all. She's also in the fourth year of a Bachelor of Fine Arts program at the University of Victoria.

On Wednesday, April 23, Burns and her work will be part of the Salt Spring Made Film Show at the Central Hall cinema, sponsored by the Gulf Islands Film and Television School (GIFTS).

When the long-time Salt Spring resident — who is 63 years old, by the way — decided to investigate film-making, she turned to GIFTS on Galiano.

Because of that choice, she was inspired to keep her focus on the craft and believes she has a huge advantage over other film studies students at UVic.

GIFTS offers not only "hands-on" experience, but full body contact.

"They get you in there right away and you're on the camera and you run the camera . . . You deal with sounds, you're the editor, the producer, scriptwriter — you do the story boards."

By exploring all different areas, students get an immediate feel for what aspects of the field they do and don't like.

Her first week-long intensive in 1998 was spent working happily with several teenagers.

"They didn't have the prejudice against me that older people would have against them," she observed.

Katie Watt, who now lives in Victoria, was a Salt Spring teenager when she went to GIFTS, after she and friend Rob McMahon won a grant from ICBC to do a road safety commercial.

"It was a lot of fun," Watt told the Driftwood Sunday.

That stint resulted in three commercials being made, and Watt later returned for a month-long independent film producers course and was involved in five different films. One of them was a Super-8 project where she even hand-developed the

film.

She also liked the GIFTS environment. "The whole feeling is like summer camp . . . you all eat together and tell ghost stories around the campfire. It's a whole little community over there."

Like Watt, Burns later took the independent film producers course, with help from a \$5,000 GIFTS award for equipment and courses, as well as GIFTS' animation course.

Five of the seven films she made at GIFTS were nominated for awards. One team effort — the charming animation Fatal Strike '98 — won animation honours from Mainframe adjudicators.

She has most recently created "virtual environments" using self-created videos, sound sensors and the Martin lighting system that can be used by performers

on stage, for example. We're talking radically high-tech stuff.

"It's hard to say where I go from here," said Burns. "There are lots of possibilities."

With opportunities in the movie industry and doing web-pages, doing freelancing or "e-lancing," Burns said, "This is the most wonderful time in the world to be an artist."

Islanders are invited to the April 23 Salt Spring Made Film Show, where more than 30 short films — ranging from 30 seconds to six-and-a-half minutes — made by Salt Spring Islanders will be premiered.

It runs at Central Hall and doors open at 4:45 p.m.

The show is free to the film-makers, their friends and parents, and to people interested in attending the GIFTS camp.

For everyone else, there's a suggested donation of \$7.

- Also screening by James Sharp is the animation Shorty's Tree and the dramatic short Attack of the Killer Paintbrushes.

- Dawn of the Computer Nerd made by Salt Springers Robin Bardon, Jennie Rittberg, Sarah Wilkin and Kamloops resident Mark Feeney, mentored by Salt Springer Brett Gaylor and by Scott Hastings. It won Best Computer Animation, Best Comedy and Best Sound Design awards at the Eyelens Film Festival.

- Fatal Strike made by adult Mary Burns. She will also speak about her experiences as an emerging film-maker.

- Deep Shadow 3000, a computer animation by Robin Bardon and Amber Rockliffe.

The April 23 Salt Spring Made Film Show premieres more than 30 short films — not just animations — created by Salt Spring locals at the Gulf Islands Film and Television School (GIFTS) on Galiano Island.

## 'Artbreak' symposium aims to unite Canadian interests

Salt Spring will be immersed in the colourful language of art when a weekend symposium by the Federation of Canadian Artists (FCA) runs May 2-4 at ArtSpring.

Registrations are still being accepted for the event called Artbreak, which features keynote speaker Robert Bateman, who will also present on Saturday morning, and presenters Kathryn Amisson, David Goatley and Catherine Moffatt. Robert Genn will wrap up the weekend as endnote speaker on the Sunday.

An Artbreak showcase will also run in the ArtSpring gallery, including juried artwork from the Victoria FCA chapter's spring art show.

Entire weekend cost, including all venues, speakers, demonstrations, two nights hotel accommodation, two buffet lunches and the banquet dinner at Harbour House Hotel, is \$285 for FCA members and \$350 for non-FCA members.

For those not requiring accommodation, the package price is \$215 for FCA members and \$270 for non-members. Tickets for the Friday evening event can be

purchased at ArtSpring separately from the weekend package for \$40 for adults and \$15 for students.

According to an FCA press release, one of the objectives of the FCA when it was formed in 1942 was "to unite all Canadian artists, related art workers and interested laymen for mutual support in promoting common aims."

In order to do that, they wanted "to meet, commune and understand each other," which is why diverse styles of painters, such as members of the Group of Seven, Emily Carr, traditional artists like Holgate and Lismer, and abstract painters Fritz Brandtner and others met with art critics, art educators and interested laymen to form the FCA.

"The original membership list, very much like today's, consisted of the premier Canadian artists of the day, and those who aspired to join their ranks, or were just interested in the art world."

Sharing common interests is the goal for the Salt Spring weekend, "where artist techniques and style meets the challenge of marketing and the sheer enjoyment of painting with fellow

artists and enthusiasts."

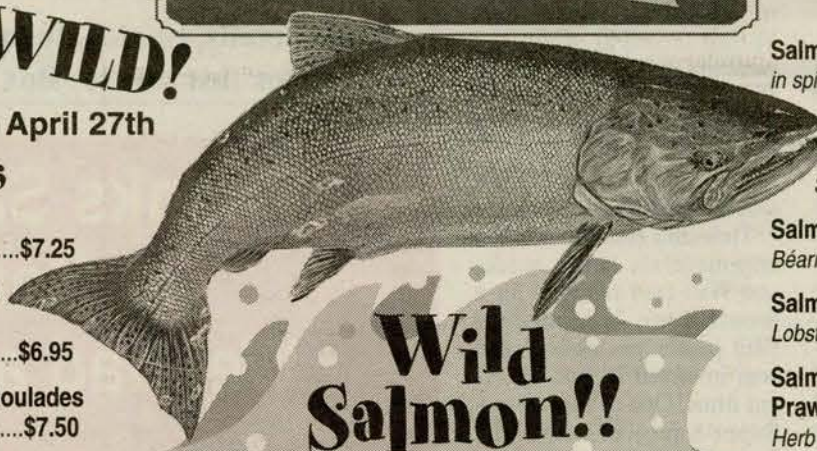

# 'Eye-opening' event planned at new Fulford gallery

With clematis-like beauty and movement, artists and community are entwining more than ever in Fulford village.

Eight island artists are currently involved with In the Public Eye Studio Gallery at 111 Morningside Road, where they take turns toiling on art projects while hosting a stream of visitors to the relaxed and charming little spot next to Dave Beck's hide-out.

Having spent winter months getting to know each other and warming up the space for the impending tourist season, group members invite everyone to drop by this Saturday for an "eye-opening" public event from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Besides the obvious visual treats, there will be goodies and refreshments, a chance to contribute to a three-dimensional public art work, and information on a kite-making extravaganza for kids. It will also be promoted in the schools, with kids returning to display their kites in late May.

With both at-work artists and art pieces inside and out, activity from In the Public Eye will be hard to miss this year.

That intermingling of artists with their community is a core part of the collective's philosophy, says its initiator Brenda Guiled, who took a leap of faith by leasing the space last October.

"Community is huge in this," says the watercolour artist who brings B.C. fish to life out of water. "How the community fits with the artist and how the artist fits with the community."

In an interview last week, four Public Eye artists observed how daily interactions between the collective's artists and people in the village end up being mutually inspirational.

Guiled also recalls doing

portraits at the Vancouver Art Gallery one summer where people loved watching the images appear.

"Art is a happening thing," she notes. "A very active, interactive thing."

Sam Barlow, who has both stunning photographs and multi-media pieces at the gallery, describes the day she was working on a mosaic tea-pot in the gallery.

"A woman came in and was very fascinated by [the tea-pot]... she then said she had a whole box of broken dishes at home and offered them to me."

Then there's island newcomer Jerry Mallette, who paints and transforms found objects into art and raises an eyebrow of interest at any tangible or ephemeral materials that come his way.

Guiled illustrates one thread of his eagerness: "Everything I find I say to Jerry, 'do you want it?' and he says 'yes' before he's even seen it."

(She even jokes that he may become "the new Dave Beck.")

While Nikki Menard's spiritual watercolour paintings draw deep from within, she's the ultimate extroverted artist.

"I love it when kids come in," she says. "And I love to encourage kids so I talk art with them."

Connecting with youth also inspired the kite contest idea of Bonnie Dalziel, the collective's fabric artist.

Other group members are Sarah Gadon, Rachel Vadeboncoeur and Laura Hughes McGrath.

Membership changes are expected, the group says, as

participants find it doesn't work for them, or others aim to give it a whirl.

Estimating the available display space, Guiled says, "We can have 12 artists if someone does floor cloths."

In the Public Eye artists also see their venture as part of an increasingly bustling Fulford business community, which boasts 18 retail, food and other service establishments between the village and the Fulford Inn.

"There is quite a bit for people to do while they're waiting for the ferry," says Guiled.

Art will be ever-changing at In the Public Eye, and the collective invites anyone to drop by for a peek, a chat or an exchange of friendly inspiration.

As Mallette points out, the group welcomes those who are "just looking."

"You can look at the art without being sold!"

The gallery is open daily from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Its phone number is 653-4608.

## Island pulls out stops to host Celtic Festival at weekend-long bash

From song circles to workshops, open stages and a concert, everything will be coming up Celtic at Beaver Point Hall next weekend.

It's Salt Spring's turn to host the annual Celtic Festival, which alternates with Hornby Island and has included Gabriola in the past.

Harry Warner is the organizing musician for the busy festival, which offers a laid-back atmosphere.

"It's loads of fun and a family affair and everybody is welcome," Warner said.

Festivities begin April 25 with a Friday evening song circle running from 7 to 11 p.m. The circle consists of up to 30 musicians in a circle "playing wild and wonderful Celtic tunes," explains Warner.

Saturday is filled with workshops for a range of instruments appropriate to the musical genre, as well as vocalists.

Those run from 10 a.m. to

5 p.m., with a concurrent open stage for any Celtic music performers.

The Saturday night concert of off-island musicians begins at 7:30 p.m.

A sing-along, more workshops and open stage round out the festival on Sunday, April 27 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

All activities are free, except the Saturday evening concert, which costs \$12. (Tickets are available at the hall from about noon on Saturday.)

The weekend also features "fabulous" food.

"All sorts of different people turn up," said Warner. "Some rock and roll stars show up and play Celtic music."

The Celtic Festival has been running for about 16 years, and was founded by Warner and Hornby residents Bill and June Cannon.

# Magic and mayhem in Shakespearian show

Mischievous fairies and mixed-up humans metamorphosed the ArtSpring stage into a midsummer night's dream last week, offering impish comedy on an ethereal backdrop.

Stagecoach Theatre School students cooked up an adapted version of the classic Shakespearian comedy, successfully creating a humorous platter of confused identities and mismatched romance.

A cast of 15 theatre students, aged 10-14, romped and flitted around the stage, the tough Elizabethan lines rolling off their tongues with apparent ease.

In its fourth year on Salt Spring, Stagecoach offered up a host of new faces with only a few veteran actors and none of its original students. The newcomers met the challenges of the play, exhibiting a range of talent.

A quietly elegant set and minimal props accented breathtaking lighting, which incorporated a full-size screen to create the play's two settings — a palace in Athens and the enchanted forest outside the city.

Master light man Marv Coulthard really rose to the task of creating a mystical, magical atmosphere with light.

The play's romantically challenged humans, including Hermia (Thea Stone), Lysander (Rigel Tessman) and Demetrius (Kieran Frey), succeeded in presenting their increasingly frantic plight, while Sarah Penhale gave an especially noteworthy performance in her simpering, love-pained role of Helena.

Naughty fairies, including Sarah Dann as Puck, Emily McPhee as Zae, Ruby Black as Oberon and Daisy Voaden as Titania fluttered about the stage, singing, dancing and wreaking magical havoc with fellow pixies Peasebottom (Molly Black), Cobweb (Jessica

Fettis), Mustardseed (Kailee Budd) and Bluebell (Kara Jones).

Clowning tradesmen played by Budd, Elisha Mathias, Pandora Morgan and Jakua Jordan drew roars of laughter with their humorous antics. Morgan gave a side-splitting (multi) death scene and honked out some guttural hee-haws as the tradesman-turned-donkey and focus of Titania's confused love.

Well-delivered narration by McPhee and Jordan sandwiched the drama, while Jones gave a creditable performance as Theseus.

Glimmering fairy costumes and simple but rich human outfits (coordinated by Sazjo Stone) added to the performance's extraordinary visuals.

This marks the school's first year with the versatile Sue Newman at the helm — following the well-deserved retirement of

Margaret Jardine — and under her direction came a few "Newmanizations," including the familiar presence of Virginia Newman playing the piano just below the stage.

As well, the performance was spotted with dance numbers (choreographed by Robbyn Scott) and simple songs.

Adapted for school-age youth by Joi Freed-Garrod, the play kept much of the original Shakespearian language but tapered it down to a 75-minute show.

Unfortunately, the production suffered like many youth shows from the undeveloped voices of its young actors. Many lines were swallowed by the theatre and the use of microphones might have been advisable.

But the mostly first-year acting students met the Shakespearian test with valour and passed with magical colours.

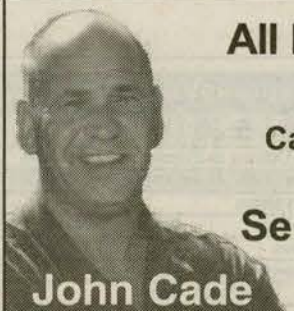

## Inuit musicians finger their fiddles

Salt Spring's Jamie Rokeby-Thomas has returned from a week in the Arctic sharing her fiddling expertise with young Inuit musicians as a community tradition is revived.

Rokeby-Thomas said she had an "incredible" time in Salt River, Northwest Territories, where she donated her time for a fiddling workshop sponsored by the Strings Across the Sky Foundation.

Rokeby-Thomas thanked everyone who donated violins, strings and accessories for the kids.

"They can be sure they are all being well used. One 12-year-old boy who was given a donated violin used to have access to a violin only two days a week, and on those days he would practise four to five hours a day. Now he can play every day."

More than 150 violins have been donated to 17 communities through the Strings Across the Sky Foundation, which Rokeby-Thomas said has been very successful at reviving traditional fiddling across the Arctic.

"This tradition originated with British seamen who spent several months locked in the frozen landscape when shipping routes were closed by Arctic ice," she explained.

"They played their fiddles, danced jigs and reels, and infected those around them with a love for fiddle music. The Inuit of the Mackenzie Delta and Western Arctic gradually adopted this new musical art as their own."

For decades, almost every village or settlement had at least one "entertainer," she said. "But with time, elders passed away, teenagers fell prey to alcohol and drug abuse, and the fiddling tradition began to fade."

According to Andrea Hansen, Order of Canada winner and founder of the Strings Across the Sky Foundation, "What began as a revival of traditional fiddling in the Arctic has become a life skills learn-

ing program for students everywhere. As children learn the magical language of music, teachers and parents marvel at the improvement in other subjects. After only a few short days of instruction, students are performing in public. They gain a new sense of accomplishment and self-esteem. Some children experience a sense of approval for the very first time in their lives."

Rokeby-Thomas is returning to the Arctic in August for another workshop and again with the help of Hannah Munro and Laura Stewart. They're two Gulf Islands Secondary School music students who are collecting donations of violins and strings, and tapes or CDs of old-time

and Celtic fiddle music to take to the NWT for music students.

"Any donations would bring much joy and happiness to many people," said Rokeby-Thomas.

# Added benefits to running

The benefits of running are often espoused by magazines and health advocates, but those claims are most convincing when you talk to someone who has experienced the benefits.

This past weekend a friend was telling me how much running had made her feel calmer with the rest of her life.

It changed her life by giving her an outlet for stress relief.

It's also given her a chance to meet with friends or have time to herself, depending on whether she is running with a group or on her own.

By taking the time for herself, she was able to be more present when spending time

with others.

It is never too late to start on a training program and feel those differences for yourself.

It is amazing what you can achieve by taking it slow and steady, as we will be able to tell at the Salt Spring Pool Association (SSPLASH) run fundraiser on May 25.

The following are two schedules, one for beginner runners and the other for advanced ones.

They are weekly schedules divided into three sessions or days. The sessions should be run on one day with a day off between running sessions.

Week 10 beginners' training schedule

**Session 1:** run 10 minutes, walk one minute and repeat four times (44 minutes).

**Session 2:** run 20 minutes, walk one minute and run another 20 minutes (41 minutes).

**Session 3:** run 22 minutes, walk one minute and run 22 minutes (45 minutes).

Week 10 advanced training schedule

(Remember, hills are fun)

**Session 1:** hill training — run slow and easy for 10 minutes, run uphill for one minute, turn around and jog slowly back down.

Repeat hill training seven times.

Run slow and easy for remaining 10 minutes (approximately 50 minutes).

**Session 2:** run 45 minutes.

**Session 3:** run 60 minutes.

# FC collects awards at Victoria banquet

Salt Spring FC captain Chris Jason and manager Ken Marr were among 16 islanders who attended the Vancouver Island Soccer League awards banquet to receive a division-winning trophy in Victoria Friday.

"I mean I know I'm big but I was watching a Maury Povich show where all of these 350-pound fat folks were waddling about and frankly they were disgusting. I just don't see myself like that."

"I'm sooooo fat," whined Cindy, who at 17 years of age is 108 lbs., 5'8" and cannot be convinced that she is not obese.

While these two patients seemingly represent opposite ends of some psychiatric spectrum, both suffer from the same problem — eating disorders. Their distorted body images reminded me of how as a kid I would pose in front of a Fall Fair funhouse mirror, bursts of compressed air shooting out of the floor and up my pant leg, frightening my nether regions. I'd marvel at the odd distortions the mirror reflected back at me, shapes that occur in regular mirrors now that I've reached middle age.

Pete suffers from so-called "night eating syndrome." He doesn't actually eat the night, but if the moon hit his eye like a big pizza pie, he'd down it. He rarely eats breakfast but crams in more than half his daily calories AFTER dinner. He grazes on carbohydrates continually throughout the evening and even wakes up to eat during the night. Despite feeling guilty the next morning he repeats this pattern night after

night, becoming increasingly anxious, upset and depressed.

A whopping 27 per cent of those who are 100 pounds overweight eat this way. The fact that they eat mostly sugars, which can stimulate "feel good" neurochemicals, have

researchers believing that these people may be self-medicating mood disorders. This is not to be confused with Nocturnal Sleep Related Eating Disorder (NSRED).

How often have you been awakened in the morning by the dog licking chocolate mousse off your face? Ever woken with a half-eaten tomato and soap sandwich sitting in Teddy's lap? If so, you may either suffer from NSRED or your dog may be having a little prankster fun at your expense.

Sufferers of NSRED sleep-walk and sleep-eat. Part of their brain is sleeping while the very large

area of the brain responsible for Snickers and alike is wide awake and screaming at the top of its neurons, "Suuuuueeeey!" High-fat comfort food is the object of their midnight missions; food they may be restricting themselves from eating during the day. Occasionally they get confused and end up slicing soap instead of cheese or, thinking they are munching peanuts, enjoy a handful of Kibbles and Bits. 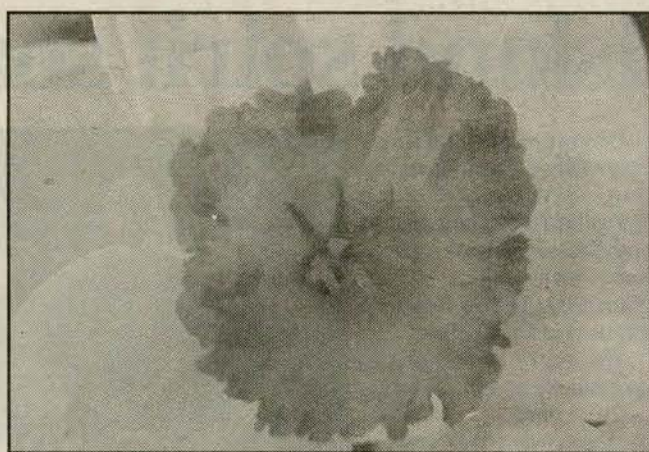
While eating rust and ashtray contents may appall you, how many people do you know who still smoke?

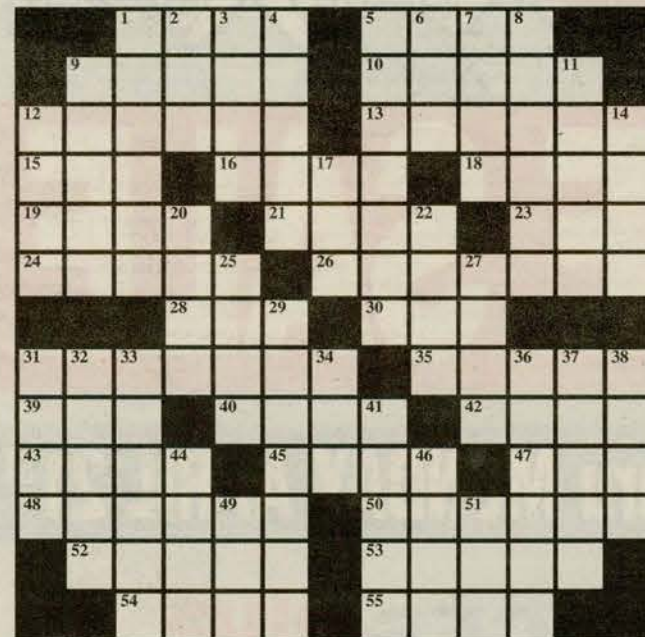
