

Bealy poems defy gravity for Saturday book launch

The title poem of Joanne Bealy's new book paints a planet and its lives as dust-mite small within a startlingly vast universe, but the Salt Spring writer will launch her salient and substantial words at Sabine's Fine Used Books on Saturday.

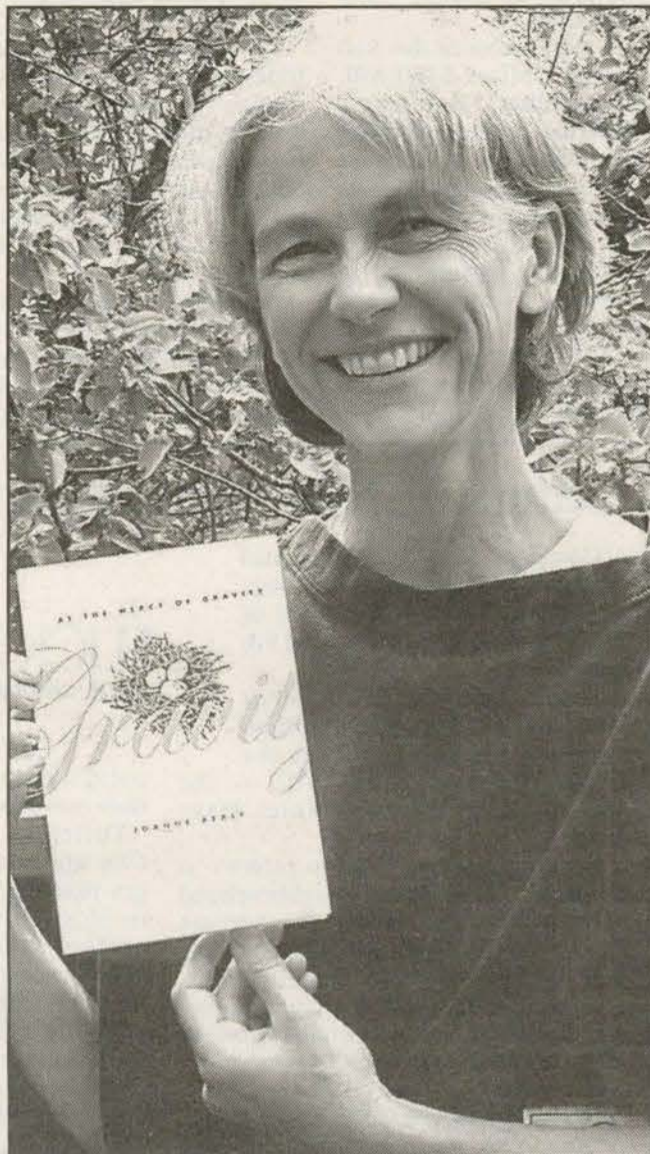
At the Mercy of Gravity is Bealy's first full-length collection of poetry, and she will read from it at the Grace Point Square store beginning at 4 p.m.

While several of the poems were published in literary magazines, and earlier versions of eight others were in a 1999 Crooked Love chapbook published by Small Poetry Press, many more carry signs of her past three years on Salt Spring. She celebrates the comfortably reliable visitation of window-passing ferries, and wildlife visitors such as scrub-eating deer, eagles and hummingbirds, "which offer homage to the colours/one by one, no blossom overlooked."

West coast imagery, such as "drops of crystal hanging from the branches of Douglas fir," appears along with scenes from places like the Berkeley Hills, "where the wind/cloaks the cries/of those that were/and the loss goes/unnoticed/by those that are."

The poem called At the Mercy of Gravity recalls time spent on Galiano Island, and is dedicated to the late Helen Sonthoff, who Bealy notes did not recover from injuries suffered in a fall.

With a gentle peeling of memory's sometimes-tender skin, she visits major life relationships with renewed perception. Seeing You in Lenin's Eyes seeks answers to family history with equal measures of playfulness and disappointment.

Bealy often writes in a questioning mode, and occasionally disturbs with her plaintive queries, as in the poem called A Queer Villanelle, which gives readers a painful front-row seat to the attempted beating of a homosexual.

That poem is also an example of Bealy's penchant for experimentation with style, where she uses an unusual 19-line, five-stanza,

a-b-a rhyming villanelle form. It works particularly well in this case, with repeated hard-consonant word endings adding forceful impact.

For contrast, there's the jazzy John Coltrane-seeded poem called Opus, where a "rapping" saxophone, piano and bass wends through the writer's thoughts of a loved one.

"I'd like to read it with

some background music," she observed.

Besides reading poems at the July 5 launch event, Bealy will gladly field questions about what it's like to publish one's own book.

At the Mercy of Gravity was accepted by a publishing company, but Bealy grew weary of the long gestation period, so she decided to publish it herself as Dancing Crow Press.

With access to the talents of her brother Allan Bealy, a stunning design job resulted.

"If you look back in time and see who has self-published, you're in very good company."

Unlike some authors, who relish writing words but not reading them for listeners, Bealy enjoys both, and hopes to be part of future multi-author literary reading events on the island.

"I think it's important for people to read their poetry, and to write, even though it's hard to get it published."

Bealy came to Salt Spring after years spent working in the California computer industry. She was born in Montreal and lived in Victoria for a time in her 20s.

She has always practised the writing craft, but until recently let it "take a back seat to everything else."

Now she also freelances essays and non-fiction work, including social commentary on films.

But poetry holds the most revered spot in her literary life.

"The reason I like it," she explains, "is because it forces me to get to the essence of what I'm trying to say."

Bealy acknowledges that isn't always an easy task, and sweat-laden re-working of words is often required.

Weather permitting, time

between the writing finds Bealy in another inspirational environment: "I could live 24 hours a day in the

garden," she admits.

Bealy invites islanders and visitors to join her in Ganges at Sabine's on Saturday.

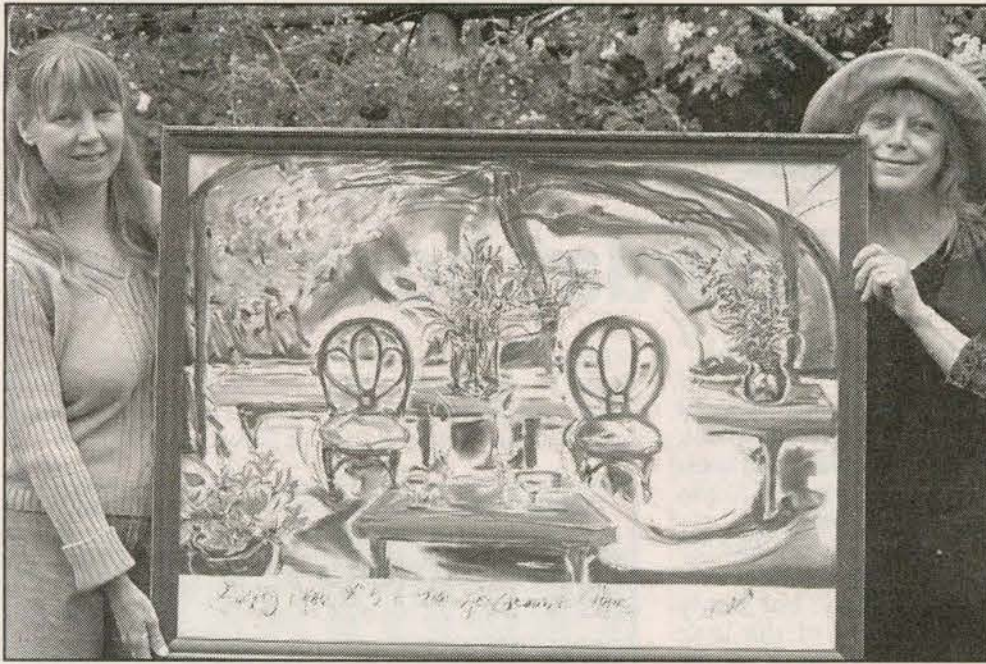

Gangs of New York: historic epic film

Gangs of New York is Martin Scorsese's highly anticipated saga of the brutal and violent world of the Big Apple in the mid-19th century.

It stars Leonardo DiCaprio as Amsterdam Vallon, who as a child watched his father die at the hands of gang leader Bill — the Butcher — Cutting (Daniel Day-Lewis).

Seeking revenge, Vallon returns to the fabled "Five Points" neighbourhood of New York and manages to become Cutting's right-hand man. However, his plan meets with many complications, not the least of which is a city perpetually teetering towards chaos brought about from the tensions of race, class and religion.

Scorsese had wanted to make *Gangs of New York* since the 1970s, but has instead focussed on smaller projects (*Taxi Driver*, *Raging Bull*, *The Age of Innocence*).

With a budget over \$100 million, a cast of thousands, and a running time upwards of two and a half hours, his latest work is nothing if not epic.

It perfectly reproduces a forgotten time period in American history; while we tend to focus on the Civil War down further south, another war was being fought in the streets of New York.

It is this other war that is most interesting about the film. We see a city fermenting with corruption, as gangs and

politicians and police blatantly exert their power over the average person.

Different firefighting crews battle over who's to put out a blaze, vote-hungry mayoral candidates hire gangsters to physically force voters into the polling booth, and men who can't afford an exorbitant fee are sent off to the Civil War.

At the end of the film, the anger spills over into a cataclysmic riot that leads to military intervention and the massacre of over a thousand New Yorkers.

The personal revenge stories of two men seem insignificant amongst it all, but Scorsese links the public and private realms perfectly.

Having heard the stories of cost overruns and greedy producers, I was all set to be disappointed by *Gangs of New York*. However, despite its flaws (45 minutes were snipped away, leading to massive jumps in the plot), this is a film that ranks as one of the greatest epics in film history. I eagerly await the director's cut — this is one film that should have been allowed to play itself out.

Double Exposure

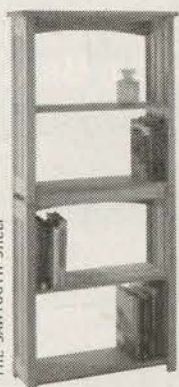

Captivating sound, movement and meditation in concert

Music tuned to touch people's chakras comes to All Saints By-the-Sea Church on Friday and it's an event for which instrument designer Geoff Fishleigh has worked long and hard.

Fishleigh has been building chakra chimes, instruments that resemble upright xylophones, for about four years, but Friday's concert will be the first live performance of the instrument.

Chime player and CD producer Ramesh Meyers and drummer Buff Allen will play music from their new CD *Stillness/Vibration*, a collection of music improvised on the chimes.

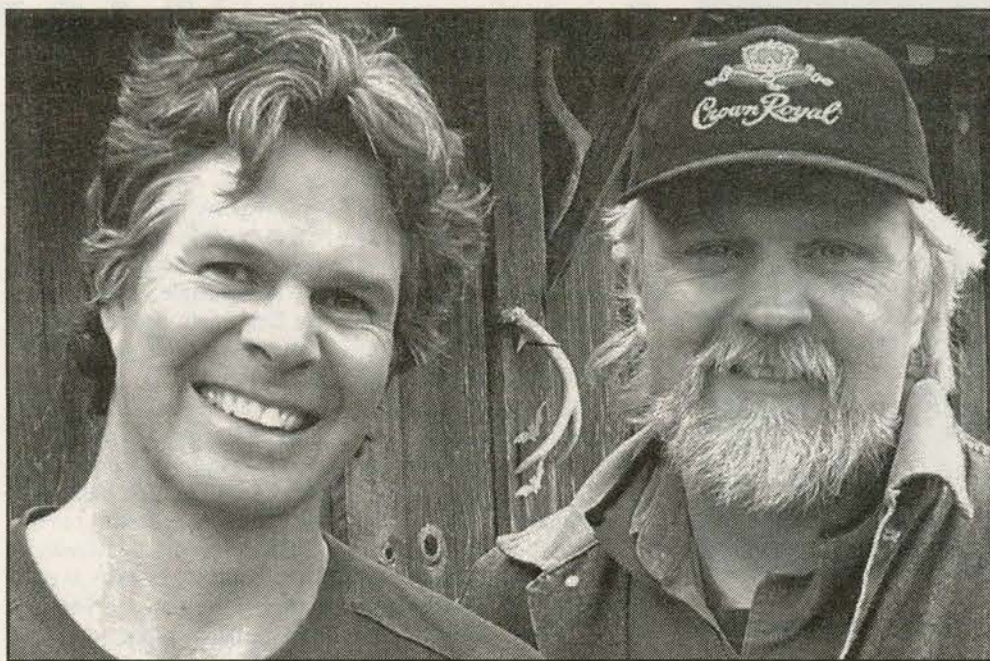
The eight aluminum chimes on Fishleigh's sleek instrument are meant to correspond to the body's primary chakras.

"It's the same thing as when you're by the ocean and you feel centred," said Fishleigh of the healing that can come from listening.

Fishleigh's chimes have Pythagorean tuning, a scale developed by Greek philosopher, Pythagoras. It's based on perfect fifths, unlike the more common, tempered scale.

"The idea is that various sacred texts relate the different pitches to the chakras," said Fishleigh. "The pitches are what the chakras resonate to."

The chimes are aluminum pipes cut to specific lengths and precisely angled. The wood box that holds them allows the sound to resonate

clearly and loudly.

"It puts out a huge amount of sound," said Meyers, adding that the notes are also sustained. "Any note you play you're going to have to live with for the next minute. That's the beauty."

Fishleigh learned about music in Zimbabwe and built marimbas, which have tuning similar to the chakra chimes, but it took him around five years to develop the right sound.

"I knew I could come up with an instrument that was clear and perfectly tuned," he said, but the process of developing it was not easy. Fishleigh tried glass, crystal and wood before discovering aluminum rods.

"It's been trial and error for years. Five years ago I was at a food bank. The struggle was unbelievable."

He remembers driving to his first trade show in Denver four years ago, with chakra chimes but not enough money for gas. He sold one chime on the way, which got him to the show, where he sold about \$5,000 US worth of instruments.

"It was a huge leap of faith. Somehow I always believed it would work."

He attended the International New Age Trade Show in Denver again this month, and will leave for Sweden to promote chakra chimes to Scandinavian and German distributors on July 6.

Fishleigh hopes to concentrate on the higher-end instruments in his line (which run for up to \$600 US), but he does produce single chimes that sell for \$48 CDN. So far Fishleigh estimates he's sold around \$200,000 CDN worth of chakra chimes.

"I see them going all over the world," said Fishleigh. "This is just the very very beginning."

Meyers is also committed to the chimes, and plans to keep playing and releasing albums. *Stillness/Vibration* is his second chakra chimes CD, but he has been playing guitar, bass, trumpet and piano for 25 years, and

works as a producer and musician on the island.

Both the inventor and the musician are proud to promote an island-created product.

Fishleigh has lived and worked on Salt Spring for 12 years, and Barry Livingston taught him Pythagorean tuning. He is also thankful to his wife, Annika Lund, for the hours she puts into book-keeping, administration and promotion.

Woodworker Michelle Macdonald is in charge of making the instruments in Fishleigh's Soul Vibration Instruments shop, which will soon be moving from its Beddis Road location because the operation has expanded.

Friday will be the first of several shows as well, and Meyers and Allen will soon play in Courtenay and on Gabriola Island.

Reactions to the music have been strong and posi-

tive, according to both Fishleigh and Meyers.

"Mostly [people] are captivated by the sound. They're really interested in a note that sustains so long," said Meyers, who says listening is like "having a massage or yoga session because it takes you through a series of feelings and leaves you on the other side feeling energized and relaxed."

But the chimes are meant as much for entertainment as healing, and Meyers and Fishleigh had a hard time deciding how to promote the concert.

"We don't want people thinking they're going into a meditation hut," said Fishleigh.

"When the beat is happening and the chimes are going it's a modern sound," said Meyers. "It's fun. It's moving."

Tickets cost \$10, and the chakra chimes concert begins at 8 p.m.

Artistic eyes opened at painters' exhibit

One of the island's eagerly anticipated annual arts events opens July 4 in the Birgit and Robert Bateman Gallery at ArtSpring.

This year's Salt Spring Island Painters' Guild exhibition is called *The Artist's Eye*, and features work from 42 of the guild's more than 100 active members.

An opening reception is set for Friday from 7:30-9:30 p.m., and the show is open daily from 10 to 5, through Monday, July 14.

A major part of guild life involves weekly workshops presented by professional B.C. artists and the guild's many senior members.

The Painters' Guild was formed in 1972 under the leadership of Emily Cosby.

Bawlf's Drake book released

Islanders can explore a radical and compelling theory about the first European to discover the west coast of Canada in a new book by Salt Spring author, geographer, historian and former B.C. cabinet minister Samuel Bawlf.

Newly released, *The Secret Voyage of Sir Frances Drake 1577-1580* is more than just another rousing high-seas adventure story.

Bawlf uses ancient maps and early accounts to demonstrate that the Elizabethan privateer explored the Pacific Coast of North America 200 years before captains James

Cook and George Vancouver caught site of anything resembling a Salish yoga retreat.

While numerous writers have already related Drake's infamous 40,000-mile circumnavigation of the globe and his plundering of the treasure galleon *Cacafuego* off the coast of Peru, Bawlf charts new territory to assert that Drake also travelled on a secret mission to find the fabled Northwest Passage and voyaged farther north than previously thought.

According to Bawlf's sources, Queen Elizabeth immediately imposed a veil

of secrecy around Drake's travels upon his return and his crew was ordered into silence on "pain of death."

Bawlf's contention completely alters what was previously known about Drake's voyage and the understanding of its central purpose.

His research has undergone an extensive review by historian peers but his final work also deserves perusal by local readers.

As a special bonus for islanders, Bawlf will autograph copies of his book at Volume II Books from 12-2 p.m. on Sunday, July 6.

Songwriters showcase makes debut mid-July at Lions Hall

Songwriters and those who love to hear their work can look forward to a bi-weekly songwriter showcase at Lions Hall.

Beginning Sunday, July 13, and continuing year round, Donn and Maddy Tarris will host the event.

Each evening will see three local songwriters performing "in the round," as well as a feature songwriter from on or off the island. Doors will open at 5:30 p.m. and an inexpensive, light vegetarian meal will be served before the first performers take to the stage at 6:30 p.m.

The feature act will perform following an intermission, with the whole evening winding down around 9 p.m. This is an all-ages show, so no alcohol will be served.

Audience members wishing to take part in the dinner portion of the evening are asked to bring their own cutlery, plate, and

non-breakable drink cup.

Admission is \$8 and there will be draws for CDs and other "prizes" during the course of each evening.

For the first event, tickets will be available on special before the date of the show at Acoustic Planet music store in Ganges for \$7.

The Tarrises ask that "songwriters and supporters of live original music promote the purchase of tickets before the event to show an interest in this happening on the island."

This series of songwriter events is the first of several developments that Tarris Innovations will initiate in the coming year, including workshops and a movie project related to forming a new songwriters' network.

Fisher, Valentine return for popular M&M show

When tenor Don Fisher and organist Barry Valentine performed together in concert in November 2001, All Saints Church was overflowing with music lovers who were not disappointed.

Music and Munch on July 9 offers the opportunity to hear these two sensitive and compelling artists again in the same lovely setting.

Both Fisher and Valentine have "an engaging way of talking about their passion for music," says a Music Makers press release, "and the feeling and intelligence with which they work together makes their performances inspiring."

Fisher is well known on Salt Spring for his warm, compelling voice and versatile repertoire. He began to share his love of music in the 1960s, by roaming the world with guitar in hand, singing in folk clubs and bars.

After returning to Canada and later on Salt Spring Island, he continued his love affair with music while maintaining a busy working life and raising a family with

his wife Melissa.

He was introduced to the art song and the art of singing by voice teacher Clemency Perrins and has several times been awarded the Arian Male choir Award for Best Male Vocalist in the Greater Victoria performing Arts Festival.

Fisher has been a soloist in Salt Spring Singers concerts, taken part in Music and Munch recitals and sung in the musical revue "Showtime with Sondheim."

Valentine, who was at one time both organist at McGill and assistant organist at the cathedral in Montreal, was instrumental in establishing the lunchtime music series in 1996. At that time he gave an organ recital twice a week and has continued to appear regularly both as soloist and accompanist to singers and fellow musicians.

In September of last year he began to play the organ recital series "Simply Organic" and has delighted audiences with both his playing and lucid commentaries.

Wednesday's free recital will be a beautiful program of songs interwoven with solo organ pieces, including songs by Bach, Purcell and Vaughan Williams.

As a special tribute to his teacher Clemency Perrins, who died in June, Don will sing one of her most beloved songs.

Music begins at 12:10 p.m. at All Saints By-the-Sea, followed by a delicious optional lunch.

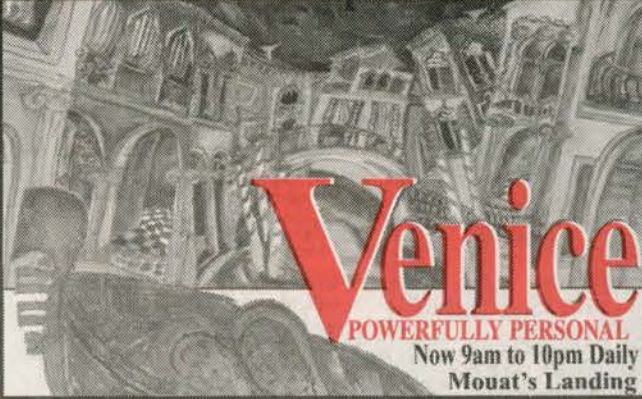

From getting fit to 'gonzo abusive,' SALT SPRING ROADS CHALLENGE CYCLISTS

BIKING ON SALT SPRING IS NEVER EASY.

That's according to the Island Pathways Heritage Map of Salt Spring Island, which lists and rates 10 bike routes ranging between "moderate" and "gonzo abusive," but doesn't even include a "piece of cake" category.

Ganges to Long Harbour, the Beddis Beach Loop and Ganges to Booth Bay are listed as moderate, and from Ganges up Mount Maxwell is rated the hardest of the hard.

But the Mount Maxwell route isn't the only challenge for bike lovers on the island, said Margeretha Nordine, an Island Pathways board member. Island Pathways is a Salt Spring organization that promotes non-motorized transportation & safety.

Nordine, the coordinator of Pathways' Helmets for Life

program, was an accident victim while riding her bike in February, and says she does not encourage road biking on Salt Spring because of the lack of road shoulders and increased traffic in recent years.

She does single out Long Harbour Road for its wider shoulders, but warns tourists not to expect quiet rural streets on Salt Spring.

"People who do bike have to be aware of the rules of the road and be very visible," says Nordine, who has been a commuter cyclist between Fernwood & Ganges for 20 years.

With due caution, people can enjoy riding the North End Loop, said Keith Beldam of The Bicycle Shop in Ganges, or the ride from Fulford to Ruckle Park, said Peter Allan, who runs Salt Spring Kayaking and Bike Rentals.

A three-day bike rental runs at \$45, and Allan will deliver a bike to someone's accommodation unit for \$15.

Allan agrees with Nordine that the island provides difficulties to those who want to bop around on bikes, and says most people who rent from him are adults.

"It's challenging riding.

All Salt Spring Islanders look forward to the day there are proper bike paths."

Randonnée Tours, a self-guided tour company based in Winnipeg, organizes five- to 10-day self-guided bike trips to the Gulf Islands. Tourists on these trips get special advice when they come to Salt Spring, said the company's Canadian development manager Loreleen Brittan.

"We say it's best to just pull over when there's ferry traffic," said Brittan. "One issue is that many people were unprepared for the difficulty. It's quite hilly."

But despite the challenge,

Brittan says Nova Scotia and the Gulf Islands are the company's two most popular biking destinations in Canada.

According to John Nilssen, who recently completed the 67-km Test of Metal mountain bike race in

tracks because they don't get a lot of use. We hardly meet another person on the trails."

Nilssen often rides on Mount Tuam, Mount Bruce, Mount Erskine, Mount

Maxwell and at Beaver Point or, for something "more mellow," he'll go off-road at Channel Ridge.

Part of the reason the trails aren't used much is because it's nearly impossible to give directions on how to find them. Tourists who want to check out Salt Spring's mountain biking scene would likely have to go with locals, said Nilssen.

He likes that he can ride a bike year round on the island and doesn't mind Salt Spring's roads.

"A lot of people say, 'oh, there's no shoulders,' but that doesn't bother me. I ride a lot of mileage on the roads

here. Some people don't like the hills, but they just make you stronger."

He recommends riders look out for the many hidden driveways on Salt Spring.

"I like to make eye contact with drivers; I never assume they see me," he adds.

Whether they want the mellow or the gonzo abusive, Keith Beldam sums up biking in a way many may agree with.

"It's a good way to get places and to stay fit, to get good oxygen — and it's a good way of thinking."
