## David whisked away on a wish

A wish came true on Friday, July 16 for 12-year-old David Piperno when he and his mother, Mary Piperno, left Vancouver Airport on a two-hour flight to Las Vegas, courtesy of the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

It was David's first time on a plane. "It was a little scary when it turned but the landing was all right," he said after. Having never travelled in a plane, David remained glued to the window seat for most of the ride. "You could see desert below and there were coyotes running around."

After arriving in Las Vegas, David was given the opportunity to step into the cockpit to meet the pilot and co-pilot. Exiting the plane, Mary and her son were amazed at just how warm it was.

"It was like walking into a fire," said Piperno.

David suffers from a rare genetic disease. Six months

ago he underwent brain surgery. "It was supposed to be a two-hour operation but it turned into four," said Mary.

It happened that a Driftwood story about David's case attracted the attention of the Make-A-Wish Foundation. The non-profit organization's mission is to "grant the wishes of children with life threatening medical conditions to enrich the human experience with hope, strength and joy."

Founded in 1980, today the Make-A-Wish Foundation has granted wishes to more than 97,000 children worldwide.

Make-A-Wish's Vancouver chapter contacted Piperno and her son, offering David a total of three wishes.

His first wish was to meet country singer Tim McGraw and see him in concert as well as to drive a fire truck.

His second wish was to see the Toronto Blue Jays and if neither of those could be granted, David asked to meet country singer Kennie Chesney.

Luck was on David's side and the foundation granted him his first wish. Mary and her son were now on their way to Las Vegas for a four-day vacation in the United States. "It was fun. We would like to go back," said Piperno.

Mary and her son were given four nights' accommo-

dation at The Luxor, a top-notch hotel boasting a large video arcade, much to David's delight.

The following night the pair were given tickets to see the Blue Man Group, a group of actors who like to involve the audience in their shows. "We had to put on these clear ponchos for when they throw Jell-O at the crowd," Piperno said with a laugh.

Later that day David was given the chance to shake Tim McGraw's hand and have a photo taken alongside him.

That night mother and son went to the Colosseum in Caesar's Palace where McGraw and his band the Dancehall Doctors were performing. "The concert was nice and Tim sang all the songs that I liked," said David. Songs such as Barbecue Stain, Cowboy and Me, Blue Jean Baby and She's My Kind of Rain had David smiling the whole way through.

What was most memorable about the trip? Piperno recounts meeting an 11-year-old girl whose first and most important wish was

that other kids with cancer could bathe in swimming pools and not be discriminated against or segregated from the others.

For the last part of his wish David got to ride a fire truck outside Richmond Airport. "It had eight wheels and was really hard to turn. It was exciting." A ride down the runway became a quick switch into the taxi lane as a plane approached for landing.

David is scheduled for kidney surgery on a tumor in one month's time. This fall he will go into the eighth grade at Salt Spring Island Middle School.

## Group of international students finish up Canadian tour on SSI

Thirty students from 18 countries ended a cross-Canada tour on Salt Spring Friday with a barbecue and time to stroll through Ganges.

The Rotary exchange students began a 35-day tour in Moncton on June 22, and wrapped up the tour at the Seabreeze Inn.

Salt Spring's local Rotary

Club members picked up the 30 students and their over 50 pieces of luggage from the ferry, and Alex Kovats of the Seabreeze Inn sponsored a barbecue for their last day on the island.

The students had all spent a year living in the Maritimes, but are from Indonesia, Denmark, Slovakia, Austria, Thailand

and Venezuela, among other places, and said Salt Spring was a great place to end their educational Canadian tour.

"It's really very peaceful," said Lisa Brunner of Switzerland.

"The ocean is still something special to me when I get to breathe in the salty air. The Salt Spring air."

# Peace card photo Aug. 6

People can support peace by smiling for the camera next Wednesday in the Peace Park across from ArtSpring.

Anyone who wants to promote peace can go to the park at 5 p.m. on Hiroshima Day, when photographs for the Salt Spring community peace movement postcard will be shot.

"If we had a community postcard for peace it would be a very simple way of saying, 'peace matters to us,'" said one of the organizers, Lynn Thorwaldson.

The idea for the postcard came when she visited Port Townsend in March and met people selling a Port Townsend peace movement postcard outside a health food store.

"I just thought the image was so incredible," said Thorwaldson. "After I went home, I phoned one of the women and . . . said how moved by that I was. She said, 'keep in touch,' and I've meant to write her a letter. But I'd much rather send her a postcard."

Thorwaldson and the other organizers, Michael Surman, Jan Slakov, Joanne Montrichard, and Bob Stuart, share a vision of using the postcards as links with other peace groups.

According to a press release from Slakov, the postcards would be useful for personal mail, but also to "affirm those people who sometimes must show great courage in speaking out for peace."

Graphic designer Diane Weatherby will design the postcard, and they will be sold at the peace booth in the Saturday market. The money will go toward local charity, and eventually Thorwaldson hopes to have the postcards in stores.

For now the organizers are concentrating on getting "those smiling faces" in the photo, said Thorwaldson.

"Bring dogs and kids. Wear your bright clothing so you can find yourself in the crowd," she said. "It should be fun, a real family photo. A family for peace."

## Variety of farms featured: 'magical' Co-op farm tour

Organizers of the third annual Growing Circle Farm Tour are promising a "magical mystery tour."

Set for this Saturday and Sunday, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., the event will feature several "new and exciting" highlights, including the "Seed and Plant Sanctuary for Canada," dedicated to the preservation and promotion of heritage seeds.

Started by Dan Jason and other islanders just this year, the sanctuary is already home to hundreds of varieties of lettuce, beans, peas, and tomatoes. Also new this year is the

inclusion - thanks to the Farmers' Institute - of two sheep farms on the tour.

Also included are a flower farm and a flour mill, orchards and herb gardens, heritage farms and greenhouse operations.

There are 13 farms in all, seven on Saturday and six on Sunday, from one end of the island to the other.

While organizers feel this year's selection is the most diverse yet, the participating farms still represent just a small sample of the co-op's more than 80 producer and value-added producer-members.

Tickets and maps with full descriptions of each farm on the self-guided tour are available at Morningside Organic Bakery and Café in Fulford and the Growing Circle Food Co-op, in Gasoline Alley in Ganges.

Tickets are \$12 per day and funds raised from the tour will go towards financing new equipment for the store.

Because these are all working farms, children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult, and no dogs are allowed on the tour.

## Festivities celebrate lavender

A celebration of lavender will be the focus of a "u-pick" event this Sunday at Sacred Mountain Lavender Farm.

The event runs 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at 401 Musgrave Road.

Over 50 varieties of lavender, ranging in colour from white to deep purple, will be on hand for viewing and collecting.

Highlights of the day include demonstrations of lavender preparation from propagation through growth to harvest.

According to organizers, "Our gastronomic whiz will be conjuring up selections

of tasty treats with lavender as the main herb of choice."

As well, participants can "learn new and exciting ways" to prepare their favourite foods, pick lavender to make crafts or enjoy sprays of lavender in their homes.

Those attending are invited to wear "lavender lovelies" (hats, clothing, scarves, etc.) and bring children dressed as fairies. There will be prizes for the best costume and hat.

Other island vendors will be also be there, including a Tarot card reader.

There will also be a raffle with lavender prizes.

Sacred Mountain Lavender farm was conceived four years ago by Jacqueline and Ben Sutton and Leslie Ross.


Dubbed as Salt Spring's first fully-operating lavender farm, Sacred Mountain is not usually open to the public.


Lavender has been used for medicinal, aromatherapy, and culinary purposes through the ages, note organizers, and the "open farm" event is set to celebrate it in all its "purple carpet" glory.

## Solaris heads for cult status

In the new science fiction film *Solaris*, George Clooney plays

Kris Kelvin, a psychiatrist assigned to try and understand exactly why the residents of a far-away space station have gone, well, loony.

Kelvin arrives to find only two human survivors, but quickly discovers that the planet (called *Solaris*) seems to be an entity all on its own. When a strange visitor from Kris's past arrives out of nowhere, it will destroy whatever ideas about reality he had left.

Admittedly this doesn't tell you much about the film, but revealing any more would take away from *Solaris*'s wonderfully imagined mysteries.

This is actually a remake of Russian auteur Andrei Tarkovsky's 1972 film of the same name, itself made as a response to 1968's *2001: A Space Odyssey*.

The recent version is

directed by Steven Soderbergh (*Traffic*, *Erin Brockovich*, *Ocean's Eleven*), who once again proves he can make just about any kind of movie he wants. His *Solaris* is perfect in almost every way, alternately eerie, romantic, frightening, and most importantly, soulful.

The visuals, both on Earth and on the space station, are stunning in their composition, and composer Cliff Martinez's minimalist electronic score is haunting as always. Even Clooney, who is forced to emote quite frequently here, is good — despite the fact his bare bum will steal the show for many.

What's really fantastic about *Solaris* though, is that it is such a strange production for a major studio. Here we have a \$40 million science fiction film with no shoot-outs or explosions (indeed the best special

effect for a lot of admirers will be Clooney's bare bum), a film that focuses on deep spiritual and metaphysical issues.

Naturally, it didn't do all that well at the box office, but I think *Solaris* will develop into a cult favourite.

As always, I have to sing the praises of Soderbergh, whose talent for bridging the massive gap between art and pop culture could serve as an inspiration for filmmakers everywhere.

The art exhibit, hosted by Jackie Walker and Carola Heydemann, celebrated its opening night last Friday. Doors opened to a crowd eager to view the stunning artwork of more than 50 island artists.

Inside, the hall is lit as though by a dozen candles with each piece of art encompassing its own circle of light. Soft classical guitar music adds to the peaceful setting thanks to local musician John Forbes.

Looking around the room, it is amazing to see how much work went into the creation of each piece not to mention the set-up.

"I think what Carola and Jackie have done is amazing," said artist Jonathan Yardley.

island resident Abbey Clark and indeed there is everything from weavings and mosaics to furniture. Terra cotta sculptures such as Kathleen Horsdal's Aphrodite, haunting black and white photographs

by Melissa Nannini, Rachel Vadeboncoeur's exquisite copper shell lamps, Gerry Kaye's watercolour, Trees Above the Lower Field, and Nancy Van Patten's wooden carving, Our Lady of the

Garry Oaks, are only a few examples of the magnificent workmanship on display.

"I find it very exciting to have this quality of art showcased. It creates inspiration," said Walker.

Evocative colour, a sense of freedom are comments made in praise of Nancy Van Patten's Old Ruckle Farm House. Melissa Nannini's thought provoking photograph Undressed portrays a gash in a Douglas Fir with beads of sap clinging the ripped bark. Admirers are left with a sense of vulnerability, of loss.

For many, Beaver Point Hall represents more than an art venue. "The hall is like our home. It has a particular feeling to it," said Bly Kaye, an artist specializing in collage landscapes.

Nature plays a strong theme in many of the pieces, such as Elaine

Potter's Summer Garden, which is as fresh and colourful as it sounds, and Paul Bryan's Idol Island where mood dominates.

Many artists agree that it is landscape which creates art. "My paintings come almost 100 per cent from nature. The early morning mist, the fog in winter, the fall colours — it's what I know best," said artist Gerry Kaye.

For many, inspiration is the West Coast. "The grey, the rain, it gives you different perspectives — a depth that you can't get with a blue sky," said Yardley.

Artist Johanna Hoskins

finds inspiration in old pictures. Her monoprint diptych labelled Fading Past is taken from a 19th century family photograph. "I do a lot of different mediums. I go with whatever happens," said Hoskins.

For Sarah Morris, writing and art go hand in hand. Her work entitled Mixed Media includes the lines, "I wanted a rescue. Some sort of fly by night. Be someplace by tomorrow. And make me new."

Art I opened in memory of Paul Hart, a renowned wood carver who first began the tradition of showcasing art in

Beaver Point Hall.

Three years later, Salt Spring's only south-end art exhibit has bloomed and expanded. Once having run a mere three days it is now a 10-day event.

Art Now III is an opportunity for island artists to share their work not only with other artists but also with the community. "What I like best is that there is art here which is not seen very often. Almost closet artists," said painter Sandra Mc Kerrell Wright.

Art Now III runs to August 4 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily at Beaver Point Hall. Admission is by donation.

### Robertson's Husk show opens

An island artist will recognize "community mentorship" in an upcoming exhibit of her surrealist-influenced artwork.

Most of Asha Robertson's work has a figurative component, notes a press release, which brings a human quality into the pieces.

For the exhibit, called "Husk," Robertson has sculpted figures that sit on "impossibly" high stools.

They are joined by minute metal figurines suspended in tiny boxes with even smaller windows for the viewer to peep into.

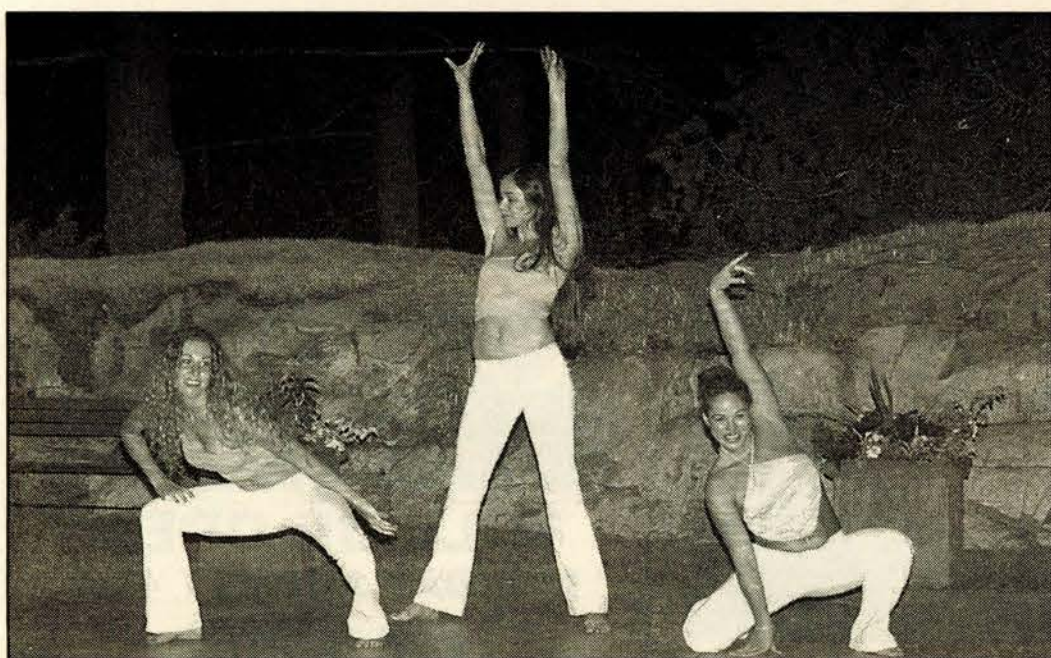

## Comedy Show is Lunar Afflicted

Leslie Parrott is a writer and performer who wants to share a laugh, and hopes to do so with the audience at her one-woman show on August 8.

Lunar Afflicted, a series of performance readings by Parrott, will be shown at the Lions Hall at 8 p.m., and tickets cost \$12.

"There's nothing like sharing a laugh. It brings you closer to a whole bunch of people for a moment," said Parrott, who was a professional actor in "another lifetime" and now lives and writes on Gabriola Island.

"When they laugh they're revealing themselves, and because I wrote it and am performing, I'm revealing myself. It's a big revelation,"

Parrott laughs. "A big strip tease."

Many of Lunar Afflicted's performance pieces, which have been published in booklets that cost \$2 each, meditate on things most people take too seriously, she said.

Her subjects include one-night affairs, "artistic affliction," and menopause. Most are funny, but one piece deals with alcoholism, and another takes a serious look at the life of Edith Piaff.

The writer-performer likes to customize each show by choosing which monologues to do in which order.

"I can feel the crowd out and see where the energy is. It's good to be flexible," said Parrott, who enjoys being the only one on stage. "I like that no one else is to blame.

It's just me and the audience, so it's my rhythm and mostly it's their rhythm."

Parrott said audience members can expect to "be comfortable, to laugh, to share vulnerabilities, to laugh at themselves," and she notes that the show is about interaction between herself and her viewers.

"I keep it very informal. I don't consider myself a big performer," she said. "It's a combination of relating to the audience, and them relating to the material."

Shilo Zylbergold, who is helping to produce and promote Parrott's show on Salt Spring, calls her "one of the funniest women I've ever seen on stage."

"She has the ability to turn the mirror back on ourselves," said Zylbergold,

who saw Parrott perform on Gabriola two years ago.

Parrott acted professionally for nine years until she had her son in 1982, but she has been pulled back into theatre "little bit by little bit" by performance groups on Gabriola.

"I'd been writing stuff like this for a long time, but I hadn't found a venue," said Parrott, who is also bringing her show to Saturna and Mayne islands.

Though she betrays a light-hearted nervousness about her Salt Spring gig ("I suppose there's a billion things going on on Salt Spring and two people will show up"), she has confidence in her readings after positive reactions from Gabriola audiences.

"They struck something."

**Indian Butter Chicken (serves 6)**

Marinade - prepare in blender

- 1 tsp fresh ginger
- 4 cloves garlic
- 1/2 cup blanched white almonds
- 1/2 cup yogurt
- 1/2 tsp chili powder
- 1/8 tsp cloves
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp garam masala
- 1 cardamon pod

- 1 14 oz can tomatoes
- 1 tsp sea salt

Let the above blended marinade sit for 2 hours or overnight.

- 5 tbsp clarified butter
- 1 onion, sliced
- 2 lbs skinned boneless

- white chicken meat
- 6 tbsp fresh cilantro leaves
- 4 tbsp whipping cream

Prepare chicken. On medium heat cook onions in butter.

Gently cook chicken pieces 5 to 10 minutes. Turn heat to low, add cilantro, marinated mixture and cream. Allow flavours to seep out and blend on low heat for 10 or 20 minutes more. Adjust to taste salt and chili powder. Avoid curdling cream by stirring often and using low heat.

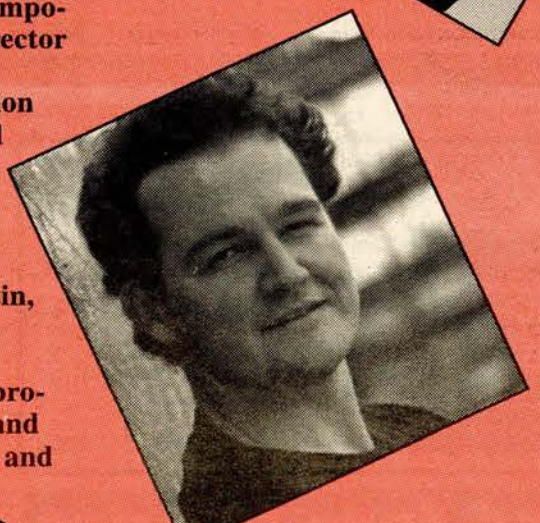
## FESTIVAL ARTSPRING

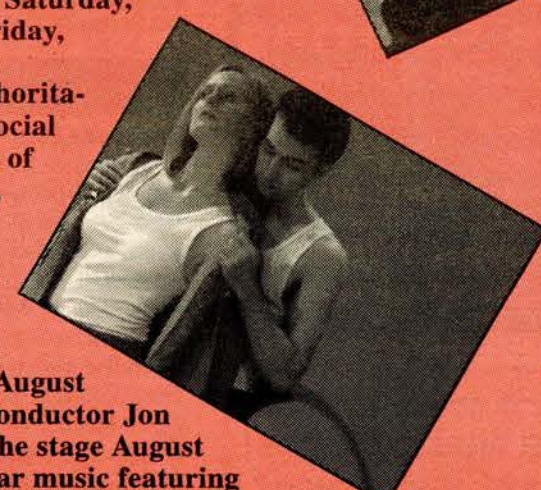

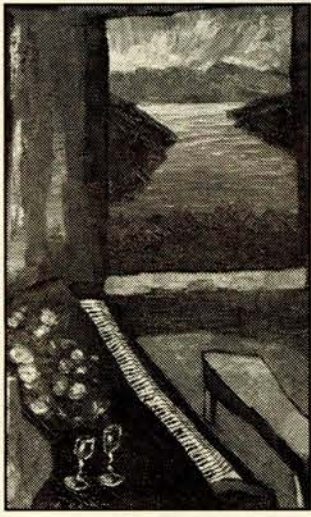

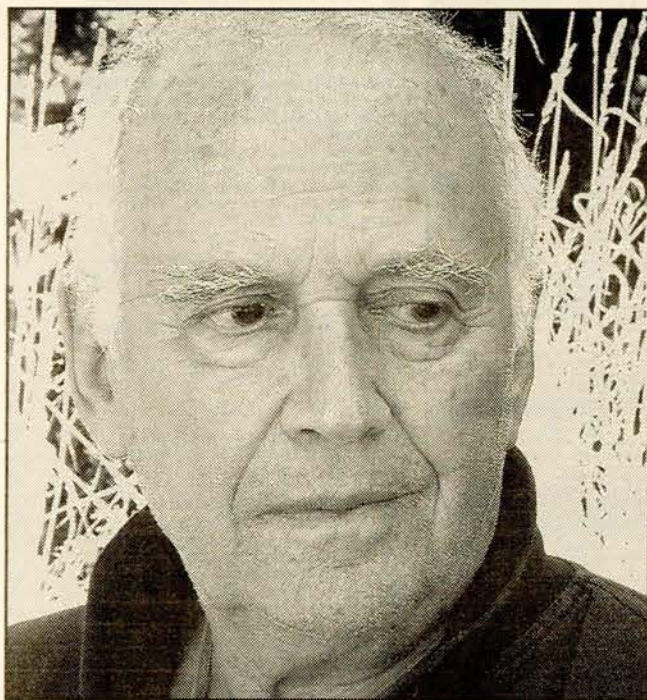

It was 9 p.m. on a Sunday evening and Carmen had just given me the bad news. Get her a bottle of her favourite Tibetan wine, an interesting blend of yak's milk and cloudberry juice, or she would surely die.

Skeptical of success, I was nevertheless on the case.

First stop on my list of liquor alternatives was The Harbour House Cold Beer and Wine store. A quick tour of the aisles revealed no Tibetan wines but an excellent selection of libations in a good range of prices. I noticed in particular the well-designed display of bubbly that even included my favourite champagne, *Veuve Cliquot*.

A fine selection of organic wines, including three from Hainle Vineyards, probably the most notable winemaker of organic wines in B.C.,

and their big seller, I learned, *Colli Euganei*, at \$20.70 for 1.5 litres — a whole lotta organic vino.

At the till I was informed that our local wines were selling well, the funky Salt Spring Vineyards label being a big hit with the tourists. With bottles in hand the quest for wine spurred me on.

The Local, private liquor store, bar and bistro, was my next stop. Once again I noticed a good selection of B.C. wines, including a summer-loving Ortega from Vignetti Zanatta vineyards in the Cowichan Valley.

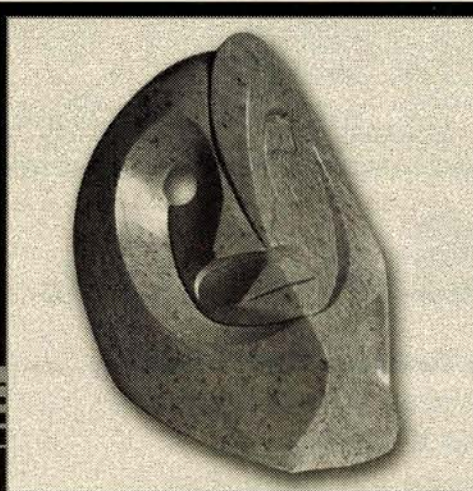
And, what was this? A cosy little bar just right for those late-night rendezvous with sultry ladies, or perhaps a glass of Garry Oaks Vineyard pinot gris out on the patio overlooking the

harbour. This would need closer investigation at a later date.

Bottles, sans Tibetan Delight, under my arm, I hustled out to the jalopy and down to the Fulford Inn Beer and Wine store before the 11 p.m. closing. Upon arrival my trained investigator eye noticed two things: a small store, but much wine.

It beheld an excellent selection of B.C. wines, including the never-fail Calona Vineyards Artist Series of wines (very good wine at an excellent price). Yes, here was a wine store I could spend some time investigating. A great display of Merlots and lots of Australian wine. Something for everyone. Their biggest Canadian seller is Copper Moon 2001 Harvest Red, \$8.95.

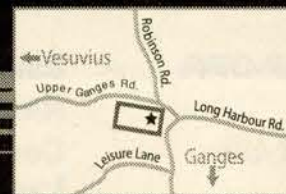
Once again, an exhaustive search into all the little nooks and crannies Alf has created failed to turn up Carmen's yak milk libation, so how did I end up with this case of wine?

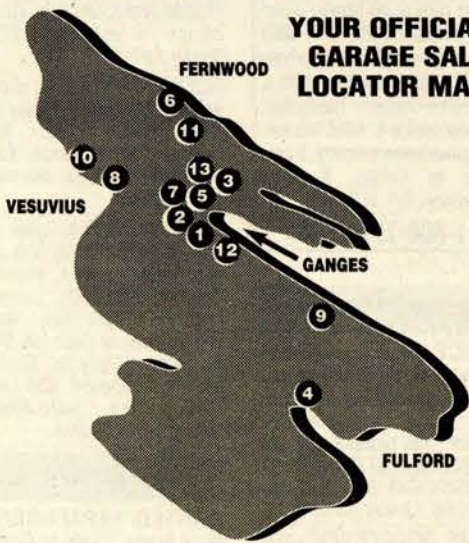

I'm talking about an idyllic necklace of tropical atolls nestled in the Caribbean just south of the Bahamas. Visualize, if you will, a half-dozen islands

lightly dusted with about 25,000 permanent residents who are forced to endure a relentless regimen of sunshine, golden beaches and an average yearly temperature of 28 degrees Celsius.

And they're ripe for the plucking. In fact, they're begging to be plucked. Politically, they are a protectorate of

The director of tourism for the Turks and Caicos, John Skippings, isn't shy about it.

"Make us an offer," he said recently.

"We're going to be associated with somebody, and already, many of our businesses and resorts are Canadian-owned. There hasn't been much discussion about a union in recent years and we'd love to revisit it."

Mister Skippings is referring to an historic shame that you won't find mentioned in Canadian history books - one that marks a pathetic pivotal point in the non-evolution of our country.

And did CBC management do anything to bolster my campaign? Did they devote, oh, let's say even one-ten-thousandth of the dough they routinely fork over to bankroll curling bonspiels and Stanley Cup semifinals?

They did not. No vision. Just like those dimwits in Ottawa.

But this time, I've got back-up. A group called Canadians for a Tropical Province is collecting signatures on a petition asking the feds to "officially study and rigorously pursue the notion of annexation" and to make the Turks-Caicos our 11th province.

Well, sign me up, CFATP. Why should winter-weary Canucks continue to leave literally billions of loonies and toonies each winter in the coffers of Honolulu, Myrtle Beach, San Miguel de Allende and other foreign destinations when we could be boosting the economy (and basting our backs) in our very own Caribbean province?

C'mon, Ottawa - flex a little. Try to think outside the igloo. And if it takes an on-the-spot goodwill ambassador to make this happen, I'm your man.
