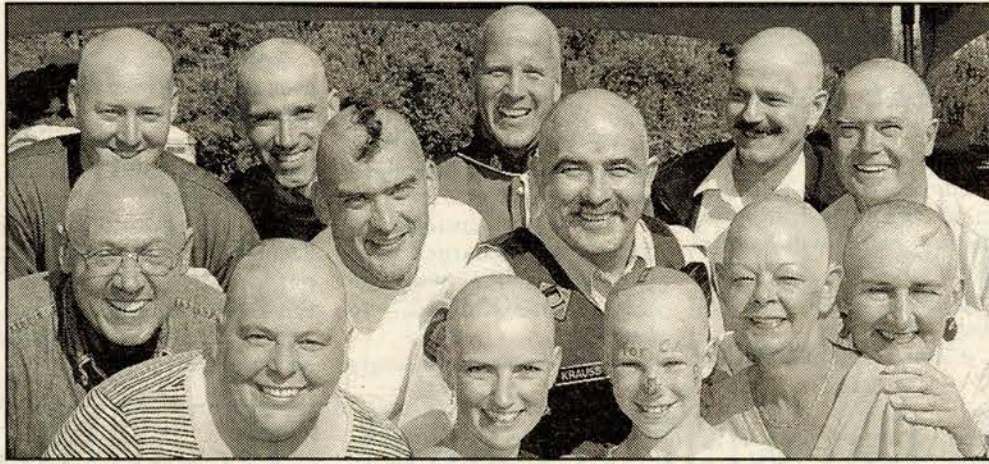

Clean-up helpers combing beach

South Salt Spring Residents Association members are taking part in the Great Canadian Shoreline Clean-up (GCSC) on Saturday, September 20, and welcome more helpers.

The clean-up of the Fulford/Drummond Park beach is part of the International Coastal Cleanup, which has seen more than 4.5 million volunteers from 120 countries participate in the last 17 years.

"Clean-ups are more than just collecting trash," said Barb Lyngard of the residents association. "They are examples of communities working together to create solutions that ensure our oceans and waterways are kept clean."

The GCSC has grown into a national conservation program designed to reduce aquatic debris, said Lyngard.

"Garbage can dramatically affect how animals breathe, eat and move through their environments. Shoreline garbage can have a serious impact on people, habitat and water quality."

At one point, Wrate even used the head of Driftwood office manager Andrea LeBorgne to mimic Black's masculine-tonsure-look before he shaved off the last of her hair.

Wrate gave two "horns" to arts council treasurer April Steel and Driftwood advertising account representative Rick MacKinnon was left with the vestigial remains of a recently grown ponytail.

Volunteer firefighter and ferry worker Laurence Spencer even ended up with a thin Mohawk.

Some people actually looked

pleased with their fresh look. Firefighter Jamie Holmes and sailing club member Mike Byrne seemed at home with their new baldness.

cake for his fundraising effort with \$3,100 total. I also learned that late-comer Leslie David collected \$2,000 in just over a week before our haircuts.

And herein lies the greatest challenge of the event. It is one thing to agree on a whim to shave your head for charity, it is another to have your head mocked in public with a comical shaving display, but collecting money for a charity among friends, acquaintances and colleagues is another matter altogether.

Personally, I felt a flush of embarrassment every time I hauled out my pledge book; almost as if I was trying to enlist people for a pyramid marketing scheme.

Howe's Arctic tour fulfills life-long dream

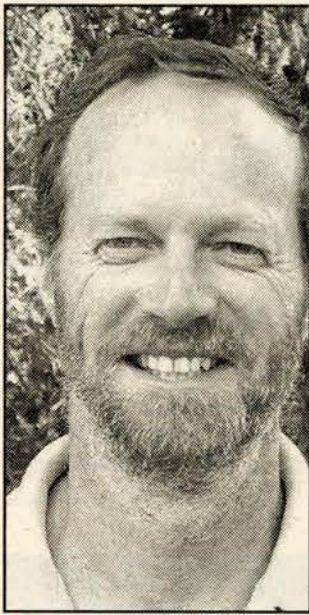
An Arctic adventurer has returned to Salt Spring full of excitement after fulfilling a life-long ambition, but he is equally concerned about the effects of climate change he witnessed in the far north.

"It was a dream come true. This was one of the best summers of my life," said islander Bob Howe.

Self-described as a full-time parent and husband, Howe always held an aspiration for scientific studies in the north. But he didn't expect to find a job guiding an Arctic research team at this point in his life.

"I used to think, 'If I get my masters degree and a Ph.D., I might be able to get a job like this several years ahead.'"

But Howe was able to secure work as a guide through his own enthusiasm for scientific exploration and connections he made in previous Arctic visits.

"If you work toward your dreams, you are going to meet certain people along the way. They will learn of your abilities and other opportunities will come your way."

Through July and August,

Howe guided a team of five scientists from the National Polar Institute of Japan for a global warming study on northern Ellesmere Island.

"I mostly enjoyed being with other scientists and connecting with the natural surroundings."

Their camp was located at the base of a polar glacier.

"We were looking at deglaciated areas and mapping the ages of various ice-age moraines."

A herd of muskox resided near the base camp and Howe saw Perry caribou, Arctic hare, rock ptarmigan and Arctic wolves.

"Two overly curious scientists were charged by a bull muskox. They were fine but a little startled," he laughed.

The team had surprisingly

good weather during the 25-day study, with temperatures around 15 degrees Celsius and little of the customary wind and near-freezing temperatures of Arctic summers, Howe said.

But the warm weather was also cause for concern.

"This study is predicting average global temperatures to increase by 1.4 to 5.8 degrees Celsius [over 100 years]."

And the warming trend is even more severe at the polar ice-caps, he said.

"The Arctic is warming eight times faster than the global average."

According to Climate Change 2001, a report prepared by the U.N. Environmental Organization and the World Meteorological

Organization, most of the world's glaciers will have melted by the end of the century, he said.

"Although there are some Arctic glaciers that are stable and some others are expanding, by and large, most of them are retreating."

The average thickness of Arctic ice has decreased by 42 per cent in the last 40 years, he noted.

"The Earth's surface is warmer than anytime in the last 1,000 years."

Howe plans to return to Ellesmere Island next summer, for the fourth year of the 10-year polar study.

"I learned an awful lot from these guys and I will be able to do some of their work next year."

Pursuing his own interests, Howe took photos and video footage of the research area.

"If anyone wants me to do a presentation in the community, they just need to contact me."

He particularly enjoyed working with such a cooper-

atively oriented team and he spent a lot of time laughing with his Japanese colleagues.

"One of the best parts of the whole thing was that I was surrounded by curious, keen people who were willing to share their knowledge and teach others."

The research group was blessed with uncommonly good fortune, he noted.

"At every turn good luck and good fortune was with us. Even when there were setbacks, they turned in our favour."

Though Howe is eager to return to the Arctic next summer, he is equally happy to be home with his wife Nairn and their children Sarah and Christopher.

"Our focus is our children, their schools and our community."

Koppel crowd gathers

The Salt Spring Historical Society used the carrot and stick method to secure attendance at their September 10 meeting.

Last week's "carrot" was local author Tom Koppel, who spoke about his experiences from researching his recently published book.

The non-fiction book, titled *Lost World: Rewriting Prehistory — How New Science is Tracing America's Ice Age Mariners*, discusses archaeological finds from digs in B.C. and Alaska that refute the Bering Strait land bridge theory.

Koppel also gave a short slide show presentation.

Koppel shared many stories with over 80 individuals at the meeting.

"Over a 10-year period I've had the great privilege to follow scientists around," he said.

From his research Koppel found that archaeology did a 180-degree turn in its thinking.

"During this period the entire picture of how people got here was different," he said.

The profession is now more accepting of the idea that the coastline had ice-free refuges where people could move to new areas.

"[Before] there wasn't much belief in ice-free areas or people's boating capabilities," he said.

Koppel added that he believed in another theory.

"My feeling is that it makes complete sense that people would've come down the coast and not through the corridor," he said. "You wouldn't have had to change your hunting methods drastically... [you just] move from one ice-free refuge to another."

Koppel noted that archaeology has been a "terrestrial subject" and archaeologists haven't worked on the coast as much.

He explained to audience members that the melt that occurred after the ice-age caused the sea to rise. "It hid the shoreline," he said. "[Evidence] is all 300 feet under water."

Koppel admitted that theories and methods are changing. In the past 10 years, more archaeologists are heading out to sea.

Some of Koppel's research was done on the Vector, a Department of Fisheries and Oceans boat. On one trip, the boat used a large shovel-like tool which scooped up sediment from the ocean floor for closer examination.

"Most of the research is in the Queen Charlotte Islands and Alaska," he said.

Koppel added that there are still many unanswered questions and new developments. All kinds of new discoveries also "continue to thrill" him.

Lost World is available at island bookstores.

The society's next meeting will be held Wednesday, October 8 at Central Hall, when Malcolm Bond is the guest speaker.

Candidates were selected

40 years ago

• Four candidates were nominated in the Nanaimo and the Islands riding to run in the September 30 provincial election. Earle C. Westwood was chosen as the Social Credit candidate. Robert C. Weir, a Nanaimo lawyer, was the Liberal candidate. Dave Stupich, a chartered accountant, was the NDP candidate and Mrs. Cornelius Wildman was chosen to carry the Progressive Conservative banner.

35 years ago

• National New Democratic Party leader Tommy Douglas was chosen by the New Democrats to contest a local federal by-election. Douglas had lost his seat in a general federal election the previous June. Mladen Zorkin was running for the Liberals. The by-election in the Nanaimo-Cowichan-The Islands riding was called following the death of incumbent Colin Cameron.

30 years ago

• A \$105,400 extension of the Ganges fire hall was authorized by the trustees of the Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District. The job was awarded to L.S. Brown Construction of Salt Spring. The project would add

equipment bays, storage and work space as well as a hose tower. Also planned was the addition of a second pumper truck to protect the growing number of homes on the island.

25 years ago

• Municipal Affairs Minister Hugh Curtis brought a gift to the annual fall fair: a promise of \$25,000 in lottery funds to help the Salt Spring Farmers' Institute move the fair to their own property. The institute discussed the acquisition of land for a fair site but no decision had been made.

20 years ago

• Enrolment in Gulf Islands schools was up by 2.4 per cent, with 1,123 students returning to school. The greatest increase was reported at Fernwood school, which increased its numbers by 12 per cent. The board finalized plans for Fulford school to be built at a cost of \$1.36 million on South Ridge Road to ease pressure on the overcrowded Salt Spring Elementary (SSE) in Ganges.

15 years ago

• The issue of logging on the Gulf Islands was examined by a task force from the Assessment Authority and several provincial ministries. The Islands Trust received a committee report suggesting the method of logging used, not the size of the acreage cut, was the most important factor when developing rules to control logging. Controlled site-specific logging avoided scarred hillsides, danger from slash fires and erosion, committee members noted. The committee recommended private landowners be given the right to clear-cut up to 30 acres per year and to selectively log a larger area.

10 years ago

• The Salt Spring Community Centre sought input in deciding the future of the old youth centre building behind the Community Centre on Ganges Hill. The building once acted as an alternate school for teens. In 1992, it was upgraded for use as a youth centre.

5 years ago

• The Lady Minto Hospital Auxiliary Thrift Shop moved to Upper Ganges Centre from its long-time Mouat's Mall location.

Motorcyclists rev up for annual toy run event

Lil Irwin doesn't mind donning a Santa suit three months before Christmas. She's used to it.

"I've always done this," she said last week, referring to the annual motorcycle toy run that takes place each September.

Irwin said she hoped other people will donate toys even if they aren't motorcyclists.

"Anyone can donate," she said. Last year some people on the ferry saw the toys on the visiting bikes and donated money to the cause.

Salt Spring ceramic artist Denys James remembers his early days as busy ones.

That's when he spent more time sending out slides of his work than he does today.

"It's a funny thing about invited shows," he said. "People who don't get invited don't know why, and those who do aren't necessarily sure why either."

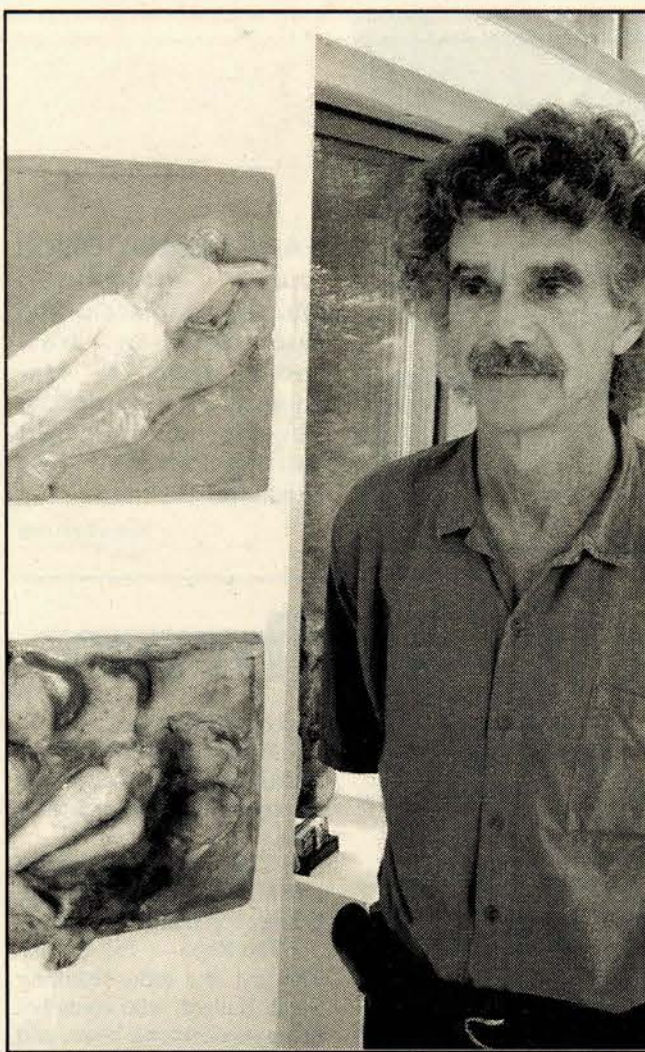
James wished he could attend the event but will be in Turkey acting as a tour guide of folk pottery.

Ulrich visited the island with Pied Pumpkin in June 2002, but hasn't otherwise treated locals to a show for three years.

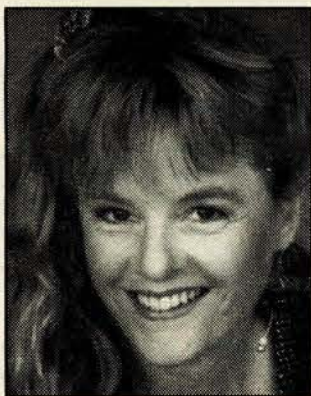
She lived on Salt Spring between 1978 and 1988 and now calls Bowen Island home.

Armenian massacre film trumpets history's failings

Ararat is the newest film by Canada's most important filmmaker,

Atom Egoyan (*Exotica*, *The Sweet Hereafter*).

At its centre is the much-debated massacre of 1.5-million Armenians by Turkish troops during the First World War, but in no way is this your typical historical film.

In fact, *Ararat* is mainly a film about historical films, as it shows the difficulties of representing historical facts — if there can be such things — through art.

It all develops from a young modern-day Armenian's discussions with a Canadian customs clerk; in an attempt to explain his activities abroad, the teen is forced to relate the entire story of how a mainstream historical film about the massacre is being made.

Thus most of the story of the filming is related in flashbacks that occasionally mix with scenes from the film-within-a-film that is itself being made. After a while, it becomes difficult

for we the viewers to discern what is real and what is not.

This may be Egoyan's point. When a culture is wiped out, by which means can we remember them? Only through the telling of stories (a common theme here), which are themselves fraught with inconsistency and bias.

Egoyan avoids creating a diatribe against Turkey, although that country still ended up banning the film.

He also avoids making *Ararat* a film experience as sombre as his other works.

In fact, there is many an absurd moment to be found as we watch the sentimental and manipulative "Hollywood" version being made before our eyes.

Even the shocking scenes of murder and rape, which should normally make us cringe in despair, seem contrived and phony. Thus when we see the film's premiere and watch as the lead actor cries in his seat, it is a disturbing moment for more than one reason.

But all the while, in the back of our mind, we are reminded that no matter how silly and banal the style, the subject of it all is still genocide.

Thus, *Ararat* succeeds brilliantly in forcing us to reconsider our preconceptions of how history is told.



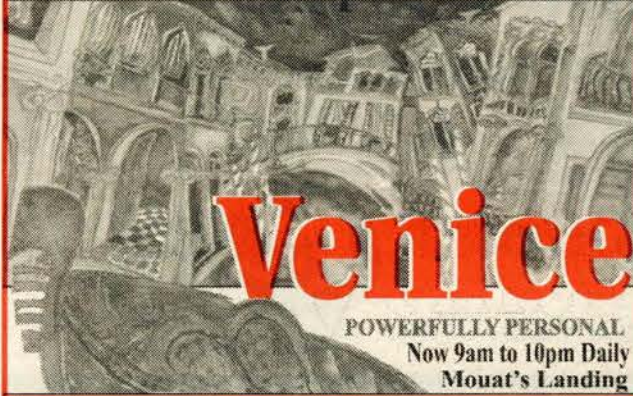

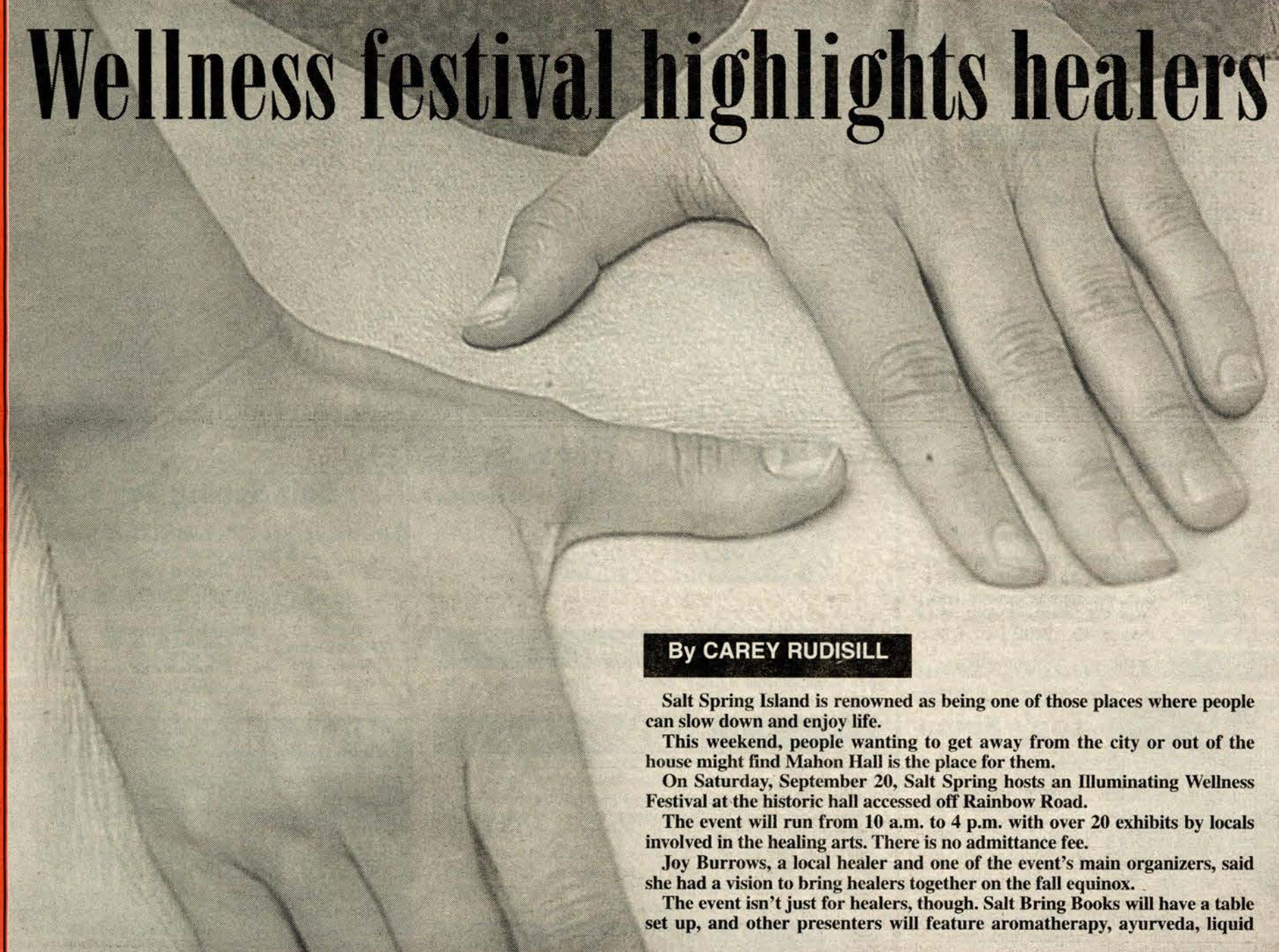

vitamins, tarot cards, tea leaf reading, and astrology readers.

"There's a great variety," said Burrows. "There's not too many people doing the same thing."

The group includes such locals as Debbie Brockenshire, Meriel Cammell and Amanda Winn-Roberts.

Brockenshire will discuss medical intuition.

Cammell plans to offer shiatsu sessions.

Winn-Roberts will offer aura and chakra cleansing along with reiki and reflexology.

"We wanted to help the public see what we do and know we're here," she said.

The event also allows people who live and work in the field on Salt Spring to get to know one another.

"Basically there's so many creative and dynamic people on the island," she said. "It's great to get people involved in healing together."

Burrows' area of expertise is what she terms energy work and includes "sekhem," an Egyptian method that helps people open the heart system, electromagnetic field (EMF)

balancing and foot readings. Her clients are mostly guests at her bed and breakfast that she runs with her husband.

The event isn't just about getting names to go with familiar faces. For islanders and visitors alike, the day is packed with activities that will tantalize individuals' minds and senses.

"I want the festival to be fun," said Burrows. "Humour and laughter are great healers. We want to make it as much fun as possible. The more relaxed people are the more likely they are to feel better and it

helps you in your healing." Burrows added that the atmosphere will even aid people who are just in the room.

For the more extroverted, a stage will be set up for those who want to engage in activities such as dancing. For others wanting to watch, there will be background music and crystal bowls to listen to.

"We want to involve the public. It's not just a place to see 'this' and 'this,'" said Burrows.

Aside from the stage, a small room will be designated as a speaker's corner.

There, a variety of local healers will discuss different aspects of their practices.

Another area will be set aside for mini-sessions such as chair massage. Those sessions will be priced individually by festival members.

"One of the biggest things is we want to educate people," she said. Burrows has been thinking about doing a festival for a while. Her main goal is to unite healers on the island but to also draw others here.

"My main dream is to get people over here from all over the world," she said.

For now, Burrows looks

forward to seeing more people from the area this weekend.

"I've had several phone calls from Vancouver Island," she said. "People wanted to know what's happening."

And that, for Burrows, is what this weekend is about.

"Besides the people who do this work, it's to let other people know so they're not threatened," she said. "It's not like they have to go and make an appointment. They can just come in and talk."

Murfitt plants alpine ideas at garden club meeting Wednesday

The Salt Spring Garden Club kick-starts its new membership year on Wednesday, September 24 with a slide presentation by Rex Murfitt, a distinguished author and nurseryman specializing in alpine and rock plants.

His talk is titled Alpine Gardening in Small Spaces and he will show various ways of growing these delightful little plants in limited space and with minimal energy.

Born in England, Murfitt trained as a nurseryman, later specializing in alpine plants at the famous W.E. Th. Ingwersen, Birch Farm Hardy Plant Nursery at Gravetye, Sussex. Murfitt subsequently moved to Victoria, where he was responsible for the creation of the Finnerty Gardens while superintendent of grounds at the University of Victoria.

He is co-author of Creating and Planting Garden Troughs, for which he received an award from the American Horticultural Society.
