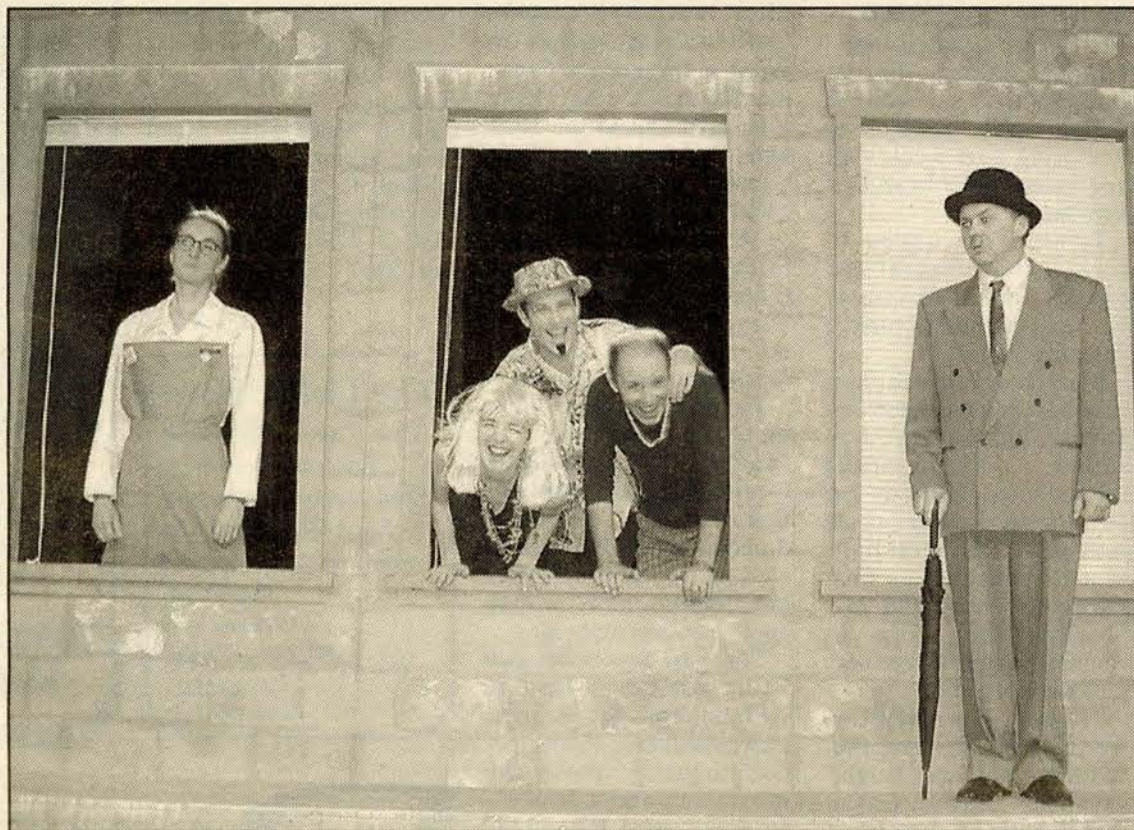

## Graffiti Theatre hoists Panych play to lofty heights of humour, pathos

A talented troupe of ledge-dancing thespians has cracked an amusing and insightful window on philosophical questions about the human condition with a masterful production of the existential tight-rope tumbler Seven Stories.

Fans of clever comedy who missed Graffiti Theatre's show Seven Stories last weekend should take the leap and catch performances running Wednesday (tonight) through Saturday at ArtSpring.

Written in a "theatre of the absurd" style by acclaimed Vancouver playwright Morris Panych, Seven Stories presents a humorous look at a self-absorbed group of characters from the stoic perspective of an "everyman" perched on the crumbling footing of uncertain convictions.

Patrick Cassidy gives a remarkable performance as an unremarkable character who eavesdrops on the fabricated realities of quirky people occupying the world around him while he contemplates suicide on a building ledge.

He witnesses the bizarre destructive dance of a couple who loathe each other, the whining delusions of a paranoid shut-in and the shallow ambitions of a suitor who is willing to relinquish his personality in exchange for a money-making marriage.

By contrast, the ledge leaper is calm, observant and unassuming. He provides a sympathetic foil to the grotesque behaviour occurring around him.

The storyline begs for someone to provide the jumper with an example of relevant existence, but instead he is presented with one episode after another of emptiness concealed by

pathetic fantasy.

Fortunately, the audience is spared from misanthropy by the compassionate craftsmanship of the troupe's acting, Panych's writing and Yvonne Adalian's direction. Throughout, a delicate tension between feelings of disgust, humour, pity and hope is maintained.

The audience will howl at the multiple roles crafted by Graffiti actors Eileen Barrett, Vaughn Fulford, Stewart Katz and Olivia Olsen.

My favourite performances included Barrett's pro-active religious zealot, Fulford's "master of counterfeit emotion," Katz's manic insomniac and Olsen's fashion casualty.

All cast members performed their trio of roles with such convincing authenticity that they seemed oddly under-staffed when they stood together on stage for a curtain call after the performance.

Slick technical support from Neil Morie (set design), Sue Earle (costumes), Marv Coulthard (lights) and Clifford Knox (sound) didn't distract from the action onstage.

Among the highlights are Panych's madcap dialogues and his self-reflective digs at the absurdities of the arts.

A whimsical post-modern ending might leave some realists scratching their heads but audience members will be fine if they let their minds expand beyond the confines of their hats, to use a metaphor from the play.

Theatre-goers who like delightful amusement, along with a bit of weighty substance, should definitely catch Seven Stories before it drops off the calendar this weekend.

## 'Wild Cellist' storms island this Saturday

As a kid, Corbin Keep just wanted to play guitar. Unfortunately for him — but fortunately for anyone with ears — the 44-year-old Bowen Island-based musician was forced to take up the cello in his sixth grade band class.

"It was the closest thing to a guitar," says Keep, who performs under the moniker The Wild Cellist.

"Guitar wasn't an option. You could have a band instrument, or you could have a violin or a cello."

What began as a marriage of convenience has transformed into an all-consuming love affair, with Keep pushing boundaries and transforming this thickly traditional instrument into a tool for musical experimentation.

Keep plays at Lions Hall on Saturday, November 8 at 7:30 p.m.

"To some extent it's simply a much more unexplored instrument than, say, guitar," he says. "If you look at guitar as being one mine shaft and cello as another, really a lot of it has been mined out by guys with guitars."

In his music, humour gives way to intense introspection about the nature of our existence before jumping into a tune that drives like a train with a choo-choo beat. It's often cinematic and sometimes strange.

One of his songs, called Aliens, blends no less than three musical genres and features a voice reminiscent of Dr. Who's Daleks, stimulating the unmistakable urge to leap up and dance like a

robot, Michael Jackson-style.

Unlike other experimental cellists, Keep doesn't rely on any external effects or electronic devices for the strange noises that he coaxes from his instrument. With the exception of his vocal renditions, everything at his solo shows — from the sound of waves crashing on a beach to the seagulls flying overhead — is generated entirely on an acoustic cello.

"You know when you're in a kitchen and you've got limited ingredients, you're not able to go to the store to get everything you want... the lima beans have to substitute for the fish," he laughs.


"It's a little bit like that for me. I like keeping the limitation of the acoustic cello."

In spite of these limitations, or perhaps because of them, Keep still manages to discover novel approaches to creating new sounds using nothing but a cello and his imagination, and he doesn't see it stopping any time soon.

"The reason I'm so motivated with it is that I keep finding so much more to do with it."

On Saturday Keep will play songs from his new CD, Call of the Wild Cello, along with well-known favourites in many styles (including classical).

Tickets are \$12 advance and \$15 at the door. Kids and seniors pay \$8 in advance or \$10 at the door. They may be purchased at Acoustic Planet and Stuff & Nonsense.

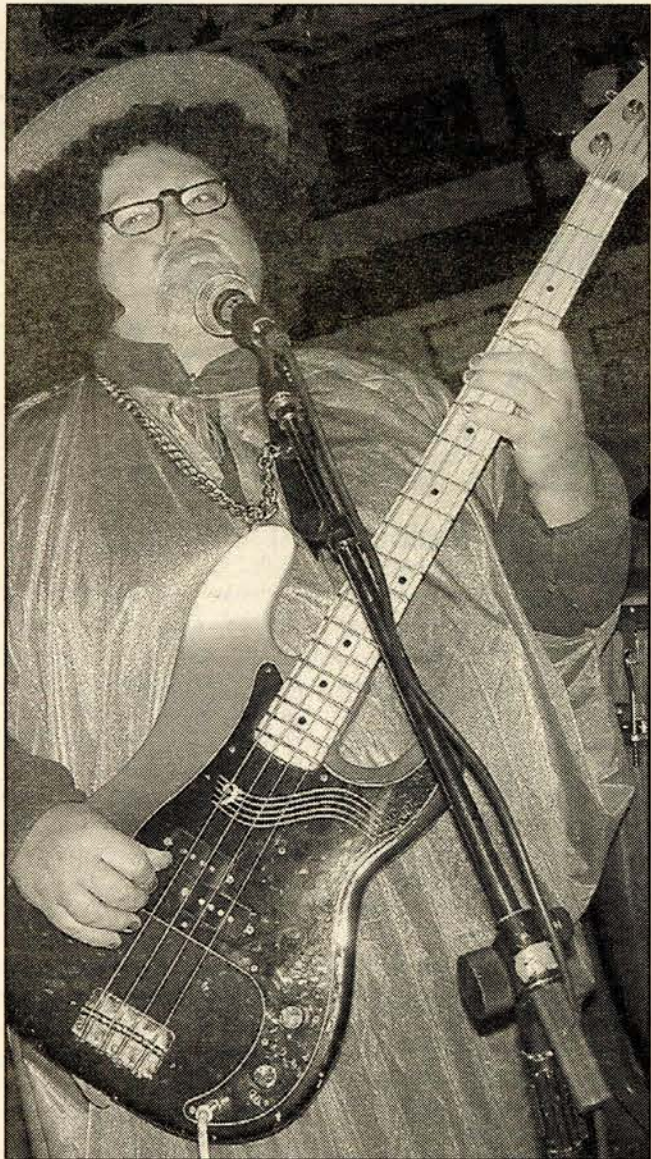

# Primadonna audience should prepare for fun

Mary Lou Fallis, Canada's adored Primadonna, returns to ArtSpring next week with her inimitable brand of humour.

Joining the queen of song, entertainment and comedy for the November 12 performance is pianist Peter Tiefenbach.

Mary Lou Fallis is probably best known as the creator of five one-woman shows, including Primadonna, based on her own life as a singer (which won an ACTRA award); its sequel Primadonna's First Farewell Tour; and Ms. Mozart, the story of Nannerl, sister of the more famous Wolfgang.

"I've known Mary Lou for years and she has never failed to make me laugh," says Paul Gravett, executive director of ArtSpring. "I still remember when she appeared at ArtSpring almost four years ago — she had the sold-out audience rolling in the aisles. We just had to bring her back!"

Fallis' latest CD, entitled Primadonna on a Moose, with members of the Toronto Symphony, features little-known and

often uproarious early Canadian gems such as Oh What a Difference Since the Hydro Came, Take Your Girl Out to the Rink and Paddle Your Own Canoe!

Fallis is regularly heard on CBC's Take Five on Friday afternoons reading from The Primadonna's Diary in which she documents travels real and imaginary across Canada.

Recent seasons have included engagements in Japan and in England's Covent Garden Festival, Ontario's Stratford Summer Music Festival, as well as appearances with the Edmonton, Winnipeg and Toronto symphonies.

This past September saw Fallis perform in Dublin, Ireland and St. John's, Newfoundland, shooting a documentary about the music in James Joyce's Ulysses, called Bloomsday Cabaret to be broadcast on CBC.

No musical tradition or composer is safe from Primadonna's irreverent humour, and audiences have come to expect the unexpected during her performances.

"Just last week I heard a rumour that she is bringing a special guest artist. I

wouldn't put it past Mary Lou, you just never know what might happen," says Gravett.

The Wednesday night show begins at 8.

# Hulk squeezes decent story into action flick

"Me like Hulk. Hulk smash tanks. Hulk save Betty. Hulk want sequel."

Yet another summer movie rolls onto shelves this week with Hulk, the silver-screen debut of our favourite purple-trousered angry green guy.

You all know the story: scientist Bruce Banner gets himself exposed to some nasty radioactive stuff that makes him a little, well, volatile, not to mention super-strong. As the Hulk, Bruce smashes up lots of big things, usually attracting the attention of military folks with lots of tanks, helicopters and other expensive things.

Yet this isn't your average action blockbuster, mostly because it was directed by none other

than Ang Lee.

Yes, Ang Lee of Eat Drink Man Woman, Sense and Sensibility, and Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon.

I have no idea which studio exec risked his career green-lighting that plan. But if the Hulk we got is to be taken as an example result, every art-film director should get a shot at making a big-budget Hollywood escapade.

This doesn't mean that Lee's Hulk turned out to be shot in black and white with subtitles. After all, Hulk's most expressive dialogue goes along the

line of "Hulk angry."

But Lee spends a considerable amount of time establishing and caring for his characters; in particular, the love story between Bruce Banner and Betty Ross is nuanced and surprisingly touching.

It doesn't hurt that Betty is played by Oscar-winner Jennifer Connelly, the most intriguing combination of beauty and acting talent in Hollywood today.

And we can't forget the presence of Nick Nolte, who, like Kurt Russell,

seems to get more sinister as he gets older. Nolte plays Bruce's father, who may have been responsible for the accident that created the Hulk.

This sets up a pretty obvious Oedipal situation and drives the film to a wild and almost incomprehensible climax that is far from anything you'd expect.

As a result we get a film that may not be accepted by that many viewers.

It's a little slow and character-driven to be enjoyed by most kids, yet maybe too silly for most self-respecting adults to admit appreciating. But it's perfect for those of us who like a little story along with our flattened tanks.

Wightman decided to hitchhike from her home in Vesuvius and watched cars slow down and then speed up.

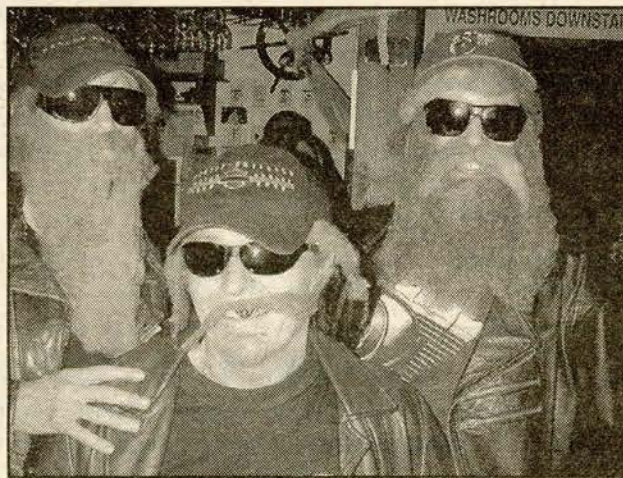
The vehicle that stopped to give her a ride turned out to be one of Wightman's friends.

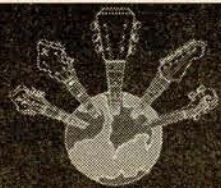

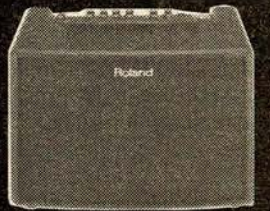

"How I discovered myself living on an island" will be the loose theme of next Friday's stand-up comedy night, he said.

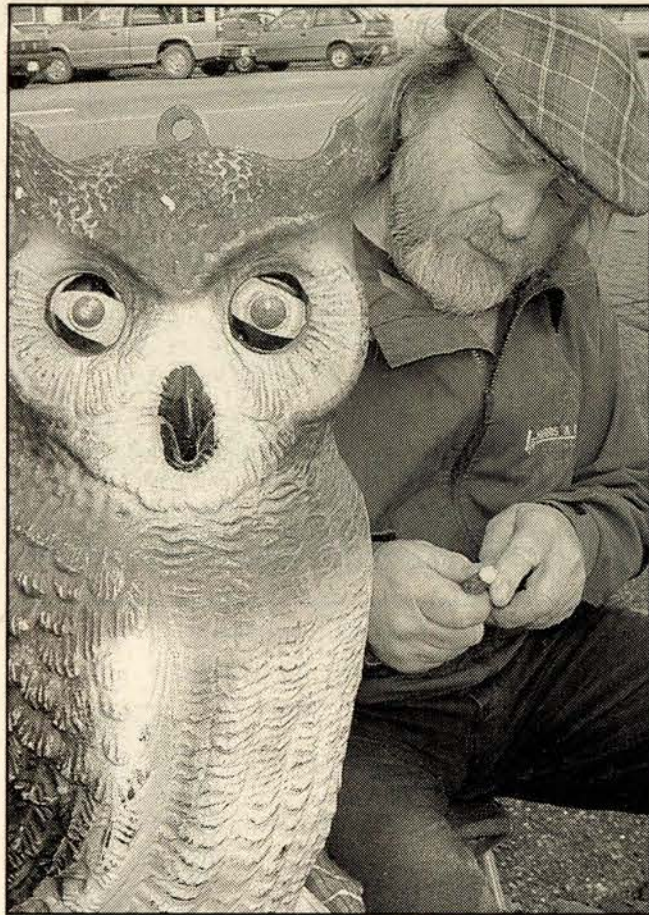
Having nailed down the event's title Monday was a major triumph, after toying with Arvid Unplugged, and James and Me — in reference to Chalmers' late, great friend James

In order to earn it we must get the island community to re-visit the Vesuvius Pub and decide for themselves whether spending their hard earned money here makes sense.





# Marimba heats up Mahon Hall

The six members of Victoria's Jambanga Marimba enjoyed their last Salt Spring performance so much they booked a return event for a Saturday night show.

With only 12 chairs lined against two walls in Mahon Hall, this clearly was a night meant for dancing and not sitting.

Band member Dalton Wilcox, who played percussion for a large portion of the night, said the set-up was intentional.

"Live music is so participatory," said Wilcox. "What I love about Zimbabwe music is that typically the division between performers and audience is dissolved."

"The relationship in North America is that we're here to see the music," he said. "So much of our exposure to music is through TV, which is so passive."

## Senior peer counsellors 'lend ears' and fill important community need

Thanks to the Senior Peer Counsellors program, local seniors have someone to turn to for help dealing with the death of a spouse or other stressful events.

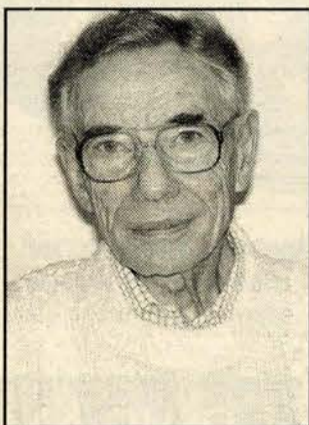
Since its inception more than 10 years ago, the Senior Peer Counsellors program has filled an important community need, said Wellness Programs coordinator Sharon Glover.

"The Senior Peer Counsellors help other seniors who are experiencing mild to moderate social or emotional difficulties by visiting them in their homes for about an hour a week," said Glover.

Nine seniors currently volunteer their time, and the service is confidential and free of charge.

Glover said the individuals who call are often dealing with some kind of loss, whether it be the death of their spouse or a decline in health.

She often receives referrals from the seniors them-

selves, but they can also come from friends, family members and physicians. In addition, various health services staff might call on behalf of a senior.

Glover, a registered clinical counsellor with a master's degree in counselling psychology, then contacts the senior by phone and determines if he or she wishes to see a counsellor.

In conjunction with

Seniors In Touch, a smaller group of peer counsellors, Glover decides which person best suits the newly referred senior.

Peer counsellor Mike Webb views this as a crucial decision.

"It's very important. The chemistry has to be right. These people are in a vulnerable state," he said.

Weekly visits can encompass a variety of issues, from depression to elder abuse.

Webb cautioned that not all visits are about major problems. Seniors often suffer only from loneliness due to physical problems that keep them at home.

Webb has worked in counselling programs in England, Victoria, Qualicum Beach and Kelowna.

He hopes more Salt Spring seniors become peer counsellors.

"You just need to be willing to help other people," he said.

"There are rewards. You're being privileged to enter someone's emotional life and hear things sometimes

even the individual's family hasn't heard."

The 60-hour peer counsellors course, led by Glover, teaches volunteers about the need for empathy, respect and how to be an active listener.

Volunteers also meet on a monthly basis to share experiences and insights.

Edna Gatt has been a peer counsellor for 10 years, and regards the program as an essential service.

"I think it's very important," she said, adding, "There have been one or two occasions where we've uncovered a very serious problem."

Wellness Programs is currently undertaking a fundraising drive to ensure projects such as the Senior Peer Counsellors and Friendly Visitors can continue to be offered on Salt Spring.

## Huot talks heritage to historical society

One of the delights of travel in Eastern Canada is the abundance of attractive heritage buildings, many built of durable brick or stone.

Here in B.C., many of our old buildings are made of wood, so the ravages of moisture, time and termites make their preservation a more difficult proposition.

As a building ages it might go through the stages of being merely unfashionable, then dilapidated, then perhaps (frankly) becoming an old wreck, before reaching that hard-to-define stage at which it becomes a heritage building worth preservation.

At the wreck stage it is tempting to an owner simply to knock the building down and start over.

Bill Huot is coming to talk to the Salt Spring Island Historical Society and interested members of the public on the topic of heritage buildings at its next monthly meeting on November 12.

Huot was the Senior Policy Analyst with the

Heritage Branch of the B.C. Government for more than 20 years.

He is the principal author of the legislation used to protect heritage buildings, archaeological sites, shipwrecks and other heritage sites in this province, and is considered one of Canada's leading experts on heritage protection.

However, don't expect Bill to advocate heritage designation as the best way to protect heritage buildings, or to encourage public acquisition so that they can be managed as historic sites or museums.

Instead, he will primarily be discussing the underlying causes of threats to our collective heritage, and how communities can work with heritage property owners to address these threats.

All those interested in the preservation of old buildings, or who are themselves owners of heritage buildings which they would like to see preserved, are invited to attend the meeting at Central Hall next Wednesday, starting at 2 p.m.

## 10 More Reasons to Support Vacation Rentals

ASTAR (Association for the Short-Term Accommodation Rentals) wishes to sincerely thank the members of the Resource Sub-Committee on its hard work of the last five months, in particular its chair David Wood. Last Thursday's public meeting was a chance for our community to receive the Committee's Report and to express opinions on the issue. It was refreshing to see our neighbours offer thoughtful balanced feedback as there has been much misinformation and vitriolic rhetoric of late.

Here are some further facts we ask you to consider:

- Approximately 70% of Vacation Rentals are owned and operated by full-time local residents. It is clearly a resident based industry. (OCP - B.1.8.4) Because the majority of VR's are owned and operated by Islanders, it follows that they are as active and involved in this community as any other segment of the population.
- 18% of Vacation rentals are owned and operated by part-time island residents who live here when their jobs and lives permit, and in many cases plan to retire here. They too love SSI and care about the Islands future, as it is also their own future. Vacation rentals augment the livelihoods of their owners and allow them to afford to maintain their home on the island and improve their quality of life. The Official Community Plan (OCP) recognizes the "important role that varied livelihoods and a vibrant economy play in our community's unique character". (OCP - B.1.10.1)
- Vacation rentals are single family dwellings discretely dispersed about the island rather than "concentrating benefits and impacts in only a few locations". (OCP - B.3.1.1.2)
- On Salt Spring it is against bylaw 355 for any seasonal cottage to be occupied for more than 30 consecutive days with a maximum of 45 day's use per year. If owners wish to rent them, other than as a B&B, for any amount of time it must be short-term (less than 30 days). Legalizing these cottages (as well as suites) as long-term rentals may help alleviate the housing shortage.
- Vacation Rentals do not drive up property values. Property values in every community in South-western BC have risen steadily for the last twenty years. This is caused by inflation, an increase in population and 40 year low mortgage rates. The increased demand for homes drives up property values.
- Many neighbourhoods are currently supportive of the local VR's. Prior to the program of proactive enforcement initiated by the previous trustees, the Islands Trust Office admits to having "perhaps one complaint" on record per year regarding vacation rentals.
- At the public meeting an audience member requested a vote by show of hands. The overwhelming majority agreed to allow vacation rentals with appropriate regulations and limitations. Only a handful wished to see none.
- Vacation rentals represent only 3% of the housing stock. There were 154 in operation this past summer. Many are rented in the winter season by part-time islanders or occupied by their owners. Some PT islanders, for example, are construction workers or annual snowbirds, including future retirees from Central and Eastern Canada.
- Our OCP says "the Trust Committee should establish a Tourism Advisory Committee, made up of community members and of tourist accommodation operators to provide advice regarding land use decisions related to Tourism" (OCP B3.1.2.1.). Islanders wish to talk about a management plan for the future of this important resource. Vacation Rentals are only a fraction of the story.

# Islanders share stories for justice

Operating as a court-diversion program run by local volunteers, Salt Spring Community Justice is quietly helping islanders accept responsibility and build reconciliation through a process of sharing stories.

"It's time spent with people and it's time spent hearing their stories. It's not like we're social workers or counsellors. We're people in the community who care about each other," said program coordinator Roberta Temmel.

She's been working with Community Justice for the past five years since she first became involved with the program as a victim of crime herself.

"I had a business and there was a lot of shoplifting happening," she explained.

Temmel often found herself in an awkward position when she would meet people who'd been caught stealing in her store.

"I'd go to a potluck dinner and I'd be embarrassed because I'd caught somebody's daughter shoplifting."

Through the Community Justice program, Temmel was able to meet with offenders and a mediator who would allow each party

to share their thoughts with confidentiality.

"People can move on and accept apologies and work together in a community. If you hide that under the table, everyone is uncomfortable."

Temmel recognizes that everyone makes mistakes and would like to see islanders get a chance to re-integrate into society after a crime, instead of suffering further alienation.

"This is a small community. We realize we're not above anybody. We're just helping people through difficult times."

The program manages one to three cases per month with approximately 30 active volunteers, but it also requires a lot of cooperation from local police, Crown prosecutors, offenders and victims of crime, she said.

"You have to thank the victims for giving all their time."

Temmel recognizes that it's a difficult step to face a person who has committed a crime against them. But the experience is ultimately rewarding, she said.

"The offender hears from the victim the effect that the crime has done to them."

And the court process does not really allow victims

to share their side of the story, Temmel said.

"Because when they go to court, they might never be able to say, 'This is what it was like for me.' They might have a victim impact statement read but there is no chance for them to speak directly."

Community Justice also allows victims to hear the offender's side of the story, which can aid healing from feelings related to a crime.

"Sometimes they are surprised when they hear it from the offender. It helps them to understand how it happened."

Meeting with the victim of a crime can be equally challenging for offenders, Temmel said.

"It's really difficult for offenders to meet the victim and hear their violation and pain. They are often quite shocked. The sincerity is amazing."

The connection made through listening to a victim of crime can compel offenders to take responsibility for their actions, she said.

"It's almost like people feel this weight on their shoulders when they meet the victim and they want to make a positive step toward moving forward."

Under the guidance of a

Community Justice mentor and a recorder, the two parties design a process that works for their individual situation.

Some cases use a family-conference format while others, where many people are involved, might use a "peace-circle" format, Temmel said.

"The new part is that the Crown can divert cases and that's freeing up the courts."


And the program has grown in scope and volume over the past year since the new Youth Criminal Justice Act enabled the Crown to divert cases.

The Community Justice group is hosting a peace-making circle workshop with Mark Wedge at Stowel Lake Farm November 14-16, but there is already a waiting list for the program, she said.

Temmel is delighted the workshop will be attended by local youth and she hopes to do some recruiting to collect more Community Justice volunteers.

"I feel passionate about this process. It's important to have this option open for people in the community. I hope one day we will get more cases and we will have more people demand this process. I think it builds community."

Using a theme of "parks near and far," his talk will be accompanied by a slide presentation.

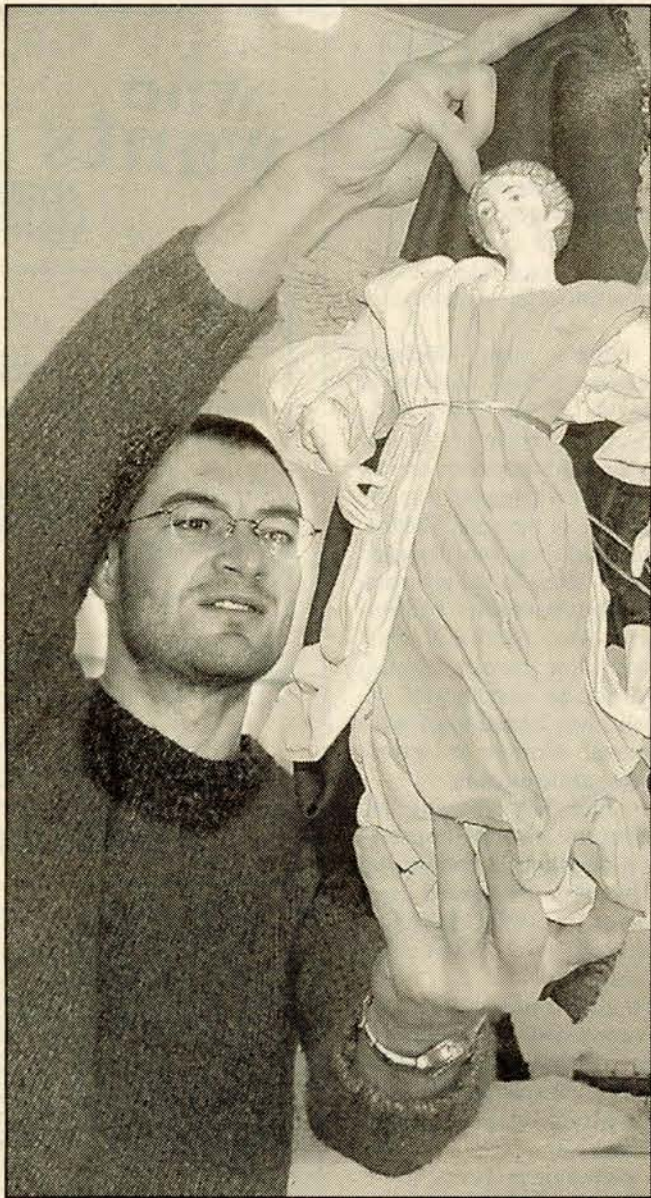
Bateman has been a long-time supporter and advocate for the preservation of parklands and other protected areas in Canada.

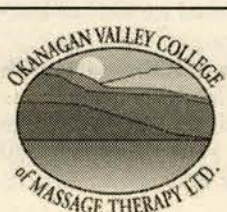

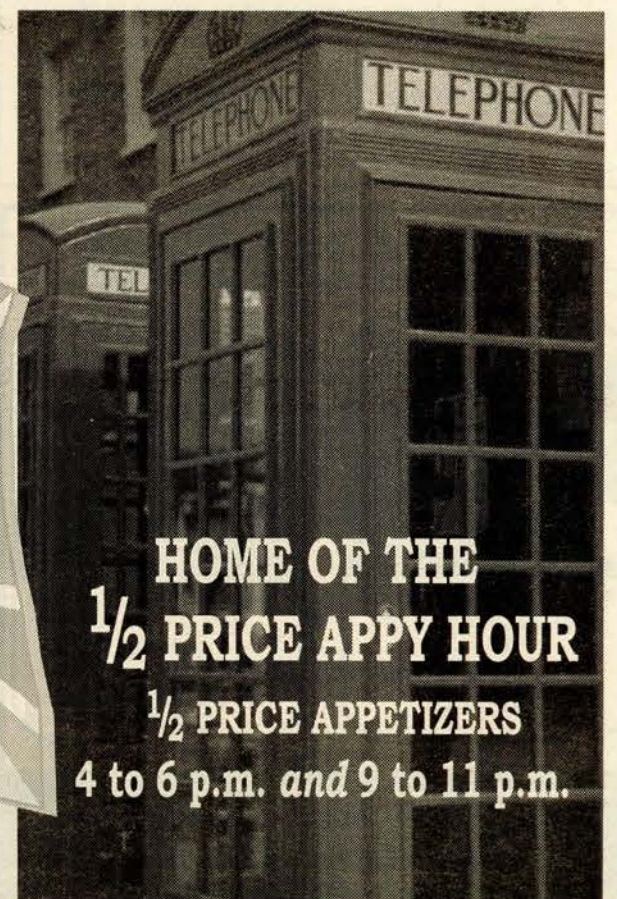

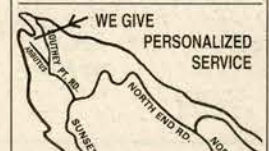

# Name game plays out in weird ways

The late great Marshall McLuhan once said that a man's name is a numbing blow from which he never recovers.

Maybe that's true. And maybe that's why so many folks up and change their birth names. Some handle-switchers do it for obvious reasons: Vanity. Embarrassment. Ambition.

Tony Curtis looks better on a marquee than Bernie Schwartz. And who's going to line up to see a celluloid cowboy with a moniker like Marion Morrison? Nobody, figured Marion. So he changed his name to John Wayne.

Occasionally, entire metropolises change their names. Ontario used to have a town named Berlin until, in a fit of anti-German patriotism, the citizens re-dubbed it Kitchener.

And but for an impassioned plea from the British writer Rudyard Kipling, we would have lost Medicine Hat, Alberta.

"It is a lawful, original, sweat-and-dust-won name," wrote Kipling, "and to change it would be to risk the luck of the city, to disgust and dishearten old-timers . . . and to advertise abroad the city's lack of faith in itself."

Just as well Kipling's jeremiad carried the day. The citizens of Medicine Hat were thinking of changing the name of the place to Gasburg.

Musicians come up with some truly loopy name changes. Arnold Dorsey was a London lounge singer whose career was going nowhere — until he changed his name to Englebert Humperdinck. Go figure.

And the singer Yusuf Islam can't seem to make up his mind. He calls himself Yusuf now, but his birth name was Stephen Georgiou. Although if you've got any gray in your thatch at all, you'll remember him better as Cat Stevens.

We won't even touch on the pretentious fop who insisted that he be addressed as The Artist Formerly Known As Prince.

But you don't have to be musical to be nominally nut-soid. Consider the case of Zdravkov Levichov. He is — was — a Bulgarian construction worker, but an unhappy one. Until he exchanged the name he was born with for that of an English soccer club.

"I've always been a Manchester United fan," he explained to a reporter from the Edinburgh Scotsman, "and I've wanted to change my name ever since I was a schoolboy. But under communism it was not possible."

Bulgaria became democratic in 1990 and Zdravkov became Manchester United shortly thereafter — but his fight isn't over. The Bulgarian courts have ruled that his new legal name is Manchester Zdravkov Levichov United.

Manny says he won't rest until the two middle names are history.

Could be weirder. We


