#### First World War

628,736 Canadians served.

66,573 died and 138,166 were wounded. 2818 were taken prisoner of war.

175 merchant seamen died by enemy action.

#### Second World War

1,031,902 male Canadians and 49,963 female Canadians served.

44,927 died and 53,145 were wounded.

8,721 were taken prisoner of war.

1,146 merchant seamen died by enemy action.

#### Korea

26,791 Canadians served.

516 died and 1,558 were wounded.

33 were taken prisoner of war.

#### The Gulf War

3,837 male Canadians and 237 female Canadians served.

There were no Canadian casualties.

No Canadians were taken prisoner.

## Pender kids honour vets

Children and veterans will join hands for a special commemorative candlelight tribute at the Pender Island Cemetery.

"It's pretty touching watching these old people take the young kids by the hands and lead them to the graves," said Pender school trustee Russ Searle.

"It's something worth watching."

Students from Pender Island School will attend the ceremony at 1 p.m. on November 10 (today) by invitation from members of the Royal Canadian Legion, Searle said.

"What they do is place candles on each one of the veteran's graves."

Pender Island seems to have a disproportionate number of veterans, he said.

"There's quite a few of them on Pender; it's surprising given the small number of people who lived here before WWII."

Following a brief service at the cemetery, participants will attend the Pender Island Legion Branch 239 for snacks, listen to the Highlanders pipe band and then

the veterans will watch over the candles from 5 p.m. until midnight.

"We have over 100 here at the cemetery on Pender," said Pender Legion past branch president Doug Pirie.

Pender Island Legion members have been holding the candle ceremony since 1999, he said.

"We light the candles and keep them lit till midnight. Just above the candle is a long red throat so it looks really pretty at night with all the candles lit and everything."

The distinctive candles and the tradition both come from the Netherlands, he said.

"In Holland, the children look after one of the areas of Canadian graves from the Second World War."

The town of Holten houses a 14-acre cemetery for 1,400 Canadians killed in the northern Netherlands during WWII.

Dutch children place candles on the soldier's graves each Christmas Eve in recognition of the Canadians' war-time contribution.

"I think we're one of the few that hold it here in B.C.," Pirie said.

"It's nice for the kids because it takes away some of the fear of the cemetery."

## Veteran nurses recall whims and wounds of WWII

A group of islanders who served as military nurses meet for special luncheon every year before Remembrance Day to revisit their shared experiences and honour those fallen in war.

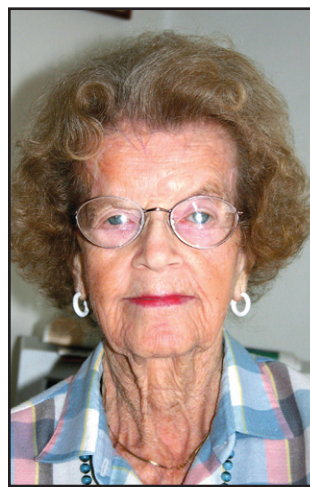
"You tend to remember the good parts . . . Some you can't get rid of," said Eleanor Lloyd.

But members of the small group still recall moments from the last world war, even after 60 years.

"They're not all relics from the war because there's not too many of us left."

Lloyd joined the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps (RCAMC) in 1941 and served as a nurse in Esquimalt, Vernon and then England during WW II.

"By the time I got over

there, the worst of the bombing was over and the tide had turned."

Her greatest safety threat was the unfamiliarity of bicycle travel, she laughed.

"It was worse for the civil-

ians. They were all on short rations."

But she recalls counting planes with concern when they returned to a nearby air-base, the threatening sound of "buzz bomb" attacks and the depression of injured patients she attended.

"A good friend of mine was married to an airforce man. She was pregnant and he was killed before the baby was born."

Though Lloyd met her own husband John in Victoria, they were married overseas in 1943 while he served with the Canadian Navy.

"I was sent home not too long after D-Day because I was pregnant. I was listed as a 'war wounded' because they didn't have any category."

Islander Muriel Osburn also served with the RCAMC

in England during WW II and in Germany after the war.

"I was young and adventurous and didn't realize the seriousness of it all," she

said.

Osburn even had glass blown into her eyes from a bomb blast beside the hospital, but she didn't make much of the incident.

"We were reasonably safe except for what came out of the sky."

The nurses even enjoyed dances, camaraderie with patients and periodic leaves where they could travel around the United Kingdom.

"The hardest part was seeing the young soldiers being so badly maimed."

One of her strongest memories of the war was when she attended Major Fred Tilson, who had won the Victoria Cross, Britain's highest award for gallantry.

"He had both legs blown off. He was at the front of things. He said to me, 'I

guess my girlfriend won't have anything to do with me."

Osburn made Tilson write to his girlfriend and later saw a photo of him driving in a parade with the girl as his wife, she said.

"It was a bad time for him, yet he never complained and always smiled."

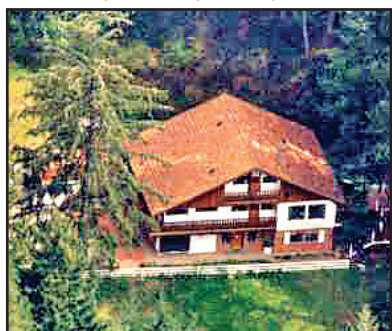
Osburn met her own husband Bill in Germany while she was serving with the army of occupation.

"It was such a different feeling when the war was over. We did a lot of partying."

She returned to Canada in 1946 and hopes to never see another war.

"The horrors of war were sort of like nightmares. You didn't get over it just because the war was over. I think you were changed forever."

# Stefancsik scores mini-series role

A local actor and model is looking to break out in the film industry now that he's been cast in a big-budget mini-series.

On Thursday, Greyston Stefancsik learned he'd scored a role in a 12-hour mini series produced by Dreamworks Television and Turner Networks Television (TNT).

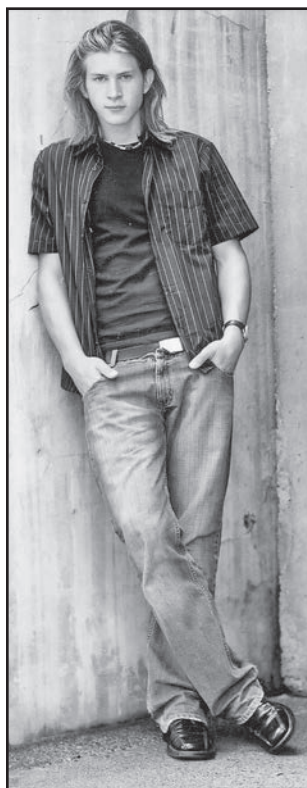
"It's not a western but it's called Into the West. It takes place in the 1860s," Stefancsik said.

The \$50-million mini series shoots in Calgary and New Mexico with Steven Spielberg as executive producer.

"It's not like a huge part. It's not a lead or anything, but it shoots for five days."

Stefancsik hasn't seen a script but he knows he'll be playing the son of a wheelwright in one episode.

Since Stefancsik gradu-

ated from Gulf Islands Secondary School in 2003, he's had offers from numerous modelling agencies, including firms in Los Angeles, Paris, New York, Miami and Milan, and he took parts in three movies.

In March, he went to the Caribbean for a small part in a low-budget horror film titled *The Sisterhood*.

"It wasn't in the theatre — it went straight to video," Stefancsik laughed.

"It was fun. It was like a college-vampire-girl movie."

More recently he had a small part in another low-budget horror film called *Killer Bash*, and was also in *Perfect Romance*, which was filmed in Victoria.

"It was a one-line kind of thing for the Lifetime Network."

First released in June, the movie airs again on Novem-

ber 14 on Lifetime.

"I'm obviously working my way up now; from those low-budgets going into this 'Steven Spielberg as executive producer' is a nice step up."

Now living in Vancouver, Stefancsik just finished a six-week session of acting classes and plans to take another before attending the Lyric School of Acting in the new year.

"I'm just furthering the craft, so I'm excited."

He found he enjoys acting much more than modelling.

"[Modelling's] kind of neat but not really satisfying for me. In modelling, if somebody doesn't like you or you don't work, you can't do anything. But acting, you can work on it and practise more."

Into the West is set to premiere on TNT in the summer of 2005.

# Unique mix as McDades take folk club stage

Most Canadian folk-roots bands have a regional stamp or a single cultural taproot.

But the next Salt Spring Folk Club act reaches out to all corners of the country and brings back a striking and unique mix never heard before.

As The McDades' website explains:

"On an average evening their audience will experience everything from modern bluegrass sounds reminiscent of Nickle Creek or Allison Krauss to Tuvan Throat singing. The musical adventures and arrangements will move from bowed bass and violin parts that remind you of George Martin's Beatle Productions to Horn improvisations in the style of Oregon or the Paul Winter Consort. Percussion sounds range from frame drums to

sounds more modern, much-like the sounds that come from David Lindley sidekick, Wally Ingram.

"Add to the above an upright jazz bass player, a master violinist and a guitarist whose style has developed somewhere between modern Celtic, traditional French Canadian and jazz, and you begin to understand The McDades."

Comprised of Edmonton brothers Jeremiah and Solon McDade and their sister Shannon Johnson, teamed

with Yann Falquet and Francois Taillefer of Montreal, The McDades play at Fulford Hall on Monday, November 22.

Tom Nelligan of Dirty Linen magazine recalls how The McDades offer up a unique, breakneck arrangement of the Quebecois call-and-response classic V'la Bon Vent, backed by a Persian hammered dulcimer and tabla.

"It's hot stuff, and very entertaining," he wrote.

James Reaney of the Lon-

don Free Press said, "As the McDades closed the opening night . . . most of the heat was finally up on stage . . . The McDades found their groove somewhere between a down-home kitchen party, a jazzy after-hours club and a folk festival . . . blazing and soothing."

## Flick Pick

Before Sunset is director Richard Linklater's crowning work

With *Before Sunset*, director Richard Linklater establishes himself as perhaps America's most capable filmmaker.

He has made low budget "art" films (*Slacker*), animated films (*Waking Life*), teen dramas (*Dazed and Confused*), and even a mainstream comedy (*School of Rock*), all of which are top notch.

His 1995 romantic classic *Before Sunrise* told the one-night story of Jesse (Ethan Hawke), an arrogant yet sensitive American, who met the volatile yet sensuous Celine (Julie Delpy) in Vienna. He had to leave the next morning, so the two spent the night wandering the city and eventually falling in love. Just before Jesse gets on the train, they agreed to meet six months later.

However, as we find out in *Before Sunset*, this meeting never

happened. Taking place some nine years after the first film, Linklater's sequel has Celine finding Jesse, now a published author, in a Paris bookshop. They only have an hour or so before he has to leave for a flight, so they begin a wandering tour of Paris sidestreets and parks.

What has happened since that one fateful night in Vienna? What will happen here, in the supposedly most romantic city in the world?

Of course, I should be specific when evoking the notion of "romance" in *Before Sunset*. This is not a Hollywood romance, with annoyingly witty side-characters, a "misunderstanding" and a climactic kiss at the top of some NYC skyscraper. It is more realistic, in that real psychology and character is in play.

Linklater has always been the master of dialogue that, while care-

fully scripted, feels soothingly authentic. Add in that the film follows the conversation along in real time, and *Before Sunset* becomes one of the most amazing and intimate films about a relationship ever made.

However, there is a major caveat: it is essential to see *Before Sunrise* before you see *Before Sunset*. So much of the latter film's energy rides on the character's emotional hangover from the night in Vienna. For me, who saw the first film years and years ago and became emotionally attached to Jesse and Celine, the sequel is a masterpiece.

I use that word not meaning "good movie," but to mean an artist's crowning work, the film by which he will be defined. *Before Sunset* is perfect in every way. Thankfully, Linklater has hinted at another sequel nine years from now.

# Librarian brings 40 years of experience

The new chief librarian at Salt Spring's public library points excitedly to Louis de Bernières' historical novel *Birds Without Wings* on her desk.

"That's brand new and nobody gets to read it until I finish it," Marilyn Ming jokes about the perks of being the first paid librarian in the history of the library.

Although she worked as a yoga teacher in Kuwait until she and her husband were evacuated when the Americans were about to invade Iraq last year, don't let that fool you.

Ming brings more than 40 years of library-related experience to her new part-time job, which she started last month.

She was the library board's top choice out of 17 applicants from throughout North America, including one from Manhattan, said board chair Garth Hendren.

"It was just amazing to have an opportunity to choose from the best and Marilyn was the best of the best," he said.

Ming has a Master of Library Science degree and a graduate teaching diploma, and will oversee the technical tasks such as cataloguing, research and purchasing. And, although a volunteer coordinator deals with the library's 140 volunteers, Ming's experience working with volunteers will benefit the library tremendously, Hendren said.

As well, with experience in designing libraries, Ming

can contribute ideas toward the design of Salt Spring's new library.

She was program coordinator for the library technician program at Vancouver Community College and, while teaching at Southern Alberta Institute of Technology, Ming developed a distance education program for community librarians called the Rural Library Training Project.

In Nigeria, she established a small library for the Nigerian Conservation Foundation and was teacher-librarian for the International School there. In Trinidad, she consulted for the International School and helped design the library for their new school.

Before working in Kuwait, Ming managed a large branch of the Houston public library in Texas.

Her husband, an exploration geophysicist, has just retired and the Mings are building a house near Sidney.

The librarian position was created because the library has grown in complexity and size, Hendren said.

At the same time, Salt Spring's regional director Gary Holman ensured the library would receive the full tax amount to which it is entitled from the Capital Regional District. Salt Spring property owners pay \$4.61 per \$100,000 taxable assessment of their land toward the library's operations.

Considering property owners in Victoria pay more than \$32 per \$100,000 value of their land, that's a "meagre amount," Hendren said.

Compared to other districts in B.C. with similar population sizes, local government support per capita for the library is also quite small, according to the 2003 B.C. Public Libraries Statistics. Libraries receive \$45.43 per capita in Nelson, \$33.84 in Gibsons and \$30.91 in Whistler, whereas the Salt Spring library receives \$6.61.

Ming said hiring a chief librarian would be worth it in the long run.

"The library will be more efficient and the money will go further in the end," she said.

Ming expects to face several challenges ahead, including remembering the names of all 140 volunteers.

"They have a great dedication, responsibility and knowledge of the way the library works," she said. "It's very impressive."

However, Ming would like to "bring coordination to their practices and to follow accepted library practices." Not all library procedures are written down so it's sometimes difficult to know who's responsible for what.

For example, some books such as biographies of artists, aren't classified rigidly according to the Dewey decimal system. Instead of filing these under biographies, they're placed with art books.

However, Ming said she would need to keep some Salt Spring traditions in mind.

"We don't want to lose any volunteers," Ming said. "As we implement the changes, we need to make sure the volunteers remain the backbone of the library."

Another challenge Ming faces is acting as the middle-person between the board and volunteers, who may sometimes have different views on issues.

Aside from improving service, Ming said she would also like to increase the collection choice, including children's books and reference materials.

The singer-songwriter now lives in Vancouver but came home to Salt Spring to record the CD at her mother Susan's Nomad Music studio, with help from Ryan Trigg.

Other musicians on the CD are drummer Kenton Loewen, Pepe on guitar, Nadya Blansfield on flute and Kevin Wilkie playing brushes on one track.

Copies of the CD will be for sale at the November 13 event.

The Salt Spring Island Foundation is a charitable organization whose purpose is to enhance the quality of life in our island community. It does this by providing grants to a wide range of the island's charitable organizations. Donations to the foundation are preserved in a permanent endowment fund. Contributions are not spent, but the income earned on the capital in the endowment fund is distributed annually.

### Highlights of the 2003 Year from the Board of Trustees...

- In 2003, the Salt Spring Island Foundation contributed over \$50,000 in financial support to a wide range of charitable organizations serving Salt Spring Island. The foundation has given more than \$230,000 to the community since its inception nineteen years ago.
- Prudent management achieved a 10.97% rate of return on foundation investments in 2003, with an average return of over 7.3% in the last five years.
- The foundation's endowment fund jumped significantly in 2003 – from \$837,618 to \$1,421,760 – thanks largely to a substantial bequest from the Shaw Family Estate. The foundation will now be able to distribute \$75,000 or more in grants annually – even more as additional donations and bequests are received.

# Sustainability: pitfalls of progress

Are we doomed to repeat a cycle of boom and bust that has plagued humans since the dawn of civilization?

"The kind of self-destructive pattern we are seeing now is not something new and only faced by big industrial societies like ours," said Salt Spring writer, archaeologist and historical philosopher Ron Wright.

"It goes back to a time even before farming, to those paleolithic hunters who killed all the big game and asked, 'What do we eat now?'"

Wright poses the question of ultimate sustainability during a series of Massey Lectures, titled *A Short History of Progress*, set to air on CBC's Ideas radio show.

"I'm concerned about the past and present threat of ideological pathologies," Wright said. "An ideological pathology is a self-destructive religious belief that blinds you to reality."

Relocated to Salt Spring in the last year from Port Hope, Ontario, Wright finds some consolation in the island's natural setting and the vibrant mix of community.

"There's no hope for the landscape in Toronto but there are some old growth firs [on the island] from before the time white man was here."

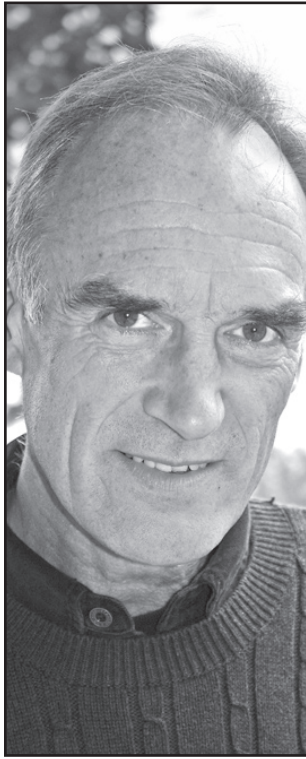
Drawing from a background in archaeology, Wright has written eight books musing over the problems of mankind in different times and locales.

"Archaeology is the best tool we have for looking ahead," he said.

His non-fiction books *Time Among the Maya* (1989) and *Stolen Continents* (1992) were both bestsellers that investigated the historic relationship between new-world and old-world civilizations.

"The present is simply the cutting edge of the past," he said.

Conversely, his award-winning first novel, *A Sci-*

*entific Romance* (1998), explored the destruction of our own civilization from a futuristic perspective.

"I wanted people to get a sense of how fragile civilizations are."

Genetically, we haven't changed in 50,000 years, said Wright.

"We are ice-age mammoth hunters."

And while modern civilizations face critical problems for long-term survival, early humans were just as successful at creating crises with simple technologies, he said.

"The perfection of stone-age tools almost caused us to starve to death."

Wright's new book and lecture series discusses the repeating pattern of pitfalls plaguing humans in pursuit of growth.

"The biggest thing stripping the Earth is naked greed on the one hand, and desperation on the other."

Tracing the collapse of Sumerian, Mayan, Greek and Roman civilizations in his studies, Wright observed similar patterns of unchecked growth that outstrip natural resources.

"Civilizations have

behaved like ecological pyramid schemes . . . They have to expand — but sooner or later they wear out their welcome from nature."

Wright believes that we can break free of the self-destructive cycle if we let go of the ideological pathology of progress.

"If you listen to the rhetoric of politicians, it's all about growth . . . but it can't go on forever."

Carefully conserved and distributed, there might be enough natural resources to sustain our civilization without the need for excess growth and inevitable collapse, he said.

"The world's population has grown by four times since Queen Victoria died but the world's economic growth has grown at least 40 times."

But the poorest populations have seen no economic growth in the last century, he said.

"The wealthy sector in each population have grown insanely rich and the poor are just as poor as they ever were."

Wright isn't calling for a radical change such as Communism, he notes.

"I'm talking about a reasonable spread instead of the free-for-all that we have right now."

People listening to the

Massey Lectures will find *A Short History of Progress* broken into five independent chapters that link issues of current sustainability to our stone-age past.

And Wright believes the link might be tighter than we think.

"I think I've got this Neanderthal bump on the back of my head," he grinned.

Many archaeologists believe Neanderthals weren't completely eliminated by their Cro-Magnon contemporaries in the oldest documented genocide, he said.

Neanderthal genes possibly live on in modern Homo Sapiens.

"It won't be settled until they find one flattened under a mammoth with some DNA."

Unlike progressive Cro-Magnons, who carved an untenable path through their ecosystems, brawny big-brained Neanderthals might have built a sustainable society.

"We use the word 'Neanderthal' pejoratively but they may have been smarter than us."

*A Short History of Progress* will air on CBC's Ideas radio program November 22-26.

# King Clarentz returns

King Clarentz, who thrilled a Lions Club crowd earlier this fall, returns to Salt Spring for a Friday night concert at StarBooks.

The Missouri native is described in a press release as a cross between Lightning Hopkins, Son House and John Lee Hooker and as "one of the most significant yet obscure artists of this decade, a modern primitivist from the John Lee Hooker stomp 'n' moan school."

Armed with a resonator, stomp box and tambourine, King — who is also known as Clarence Brewer — delivers authentic, live blues reminiscent of the originators of the Mississippi juke house.

"I'm genetically plugged to the guys of the 1930s and '40s," he explains.

His songs range from traditional tunes about the devil, women and whiskey to modern themes of politics, fast food and spooky Halloween voodoo. King Clarentz is a raw slide player and singer, and his 1999 debut release on Hightone Records called King Clarentz was dubbed the best debut CD of the last decade by blues publications.

The November 12 concert at StarBooks is at 7 p.m. Tickets are \$5 to \$10 (sliding scale) and partial proceeds go to support the Green party.

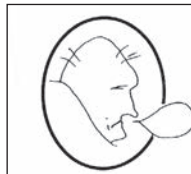

## Students show science smarts

A contingent of young scientists from Fulford Elementary presented their findings from a study of Weston Lake to adult peers at an international conference in Victoria on Friday.

"It was fun to watch adults quiz the kids to see if they really knew what was on their poster," said Fulford Elementary principal Judy Raddysh. "After talking to them they'd walk away saying, 'Holy Cow, these kids really know their stuff.'"

Fulford students have been measuring water clarity, temperature, particulates and the dissolved-oxygen content of Weston Lake every two weeks since spring, she said.

"Over the summer, some of the families carried the project on, so it's a real community project."

Attending the North American Lake Management Society (NALMS) symposium, Raddysh accompanied student representatives Ruby Barnard (age 9), Sam Lewis (9) and Leh Smallshaw (10) to the Victoria Conference Centre.

"They were quite nervous going over. But once they got there and had the opportunity to talk to a few people, they very quickly got quite comfortable," Raddysh said.

A visit to the conference with their 4x8-foot bulletin board also allowed the young scientists to investigate high-tech scientific goodies on display, she said.

"We've got really highly technical equipment here but there is always better stuff... They were going around saying, 'We need one of these little submarines for the school.'"

However, Raddysh and her students learned that regardless of equipment used, work

by the other lake scientists was pretty similar to their own study.

"All they are really doing is what we're basically doing out there on the water at Weston Lake."

The Fulford Elementary group has been working in partnership with the Fulford Waterworks District and the Ministry of Water, Land and Air Protection (MWLAP).

"We'll continue this for years to come. The whole point is to collect the long-term data because our lakes are in trouble. It's one set of indicators about how Weston Lake might be doing and whether we need to take more care of it," Raddysh said.

Scientific studies are nothing new at Fulford Elementary, she noted.

"We've been working on real science out in the field for about four years at the school," said Raddysh.

Fulford Elementary has also conducted numerous field studies and maintained a weather station in support of their research at Weston Lake.

This year they're also hosting nature programs in cooperation with the Gulf Islands Centre for Ecological Learning (GICEL).

"The really cool thing is the connections the kids are making," she said.

"It will go wherever they want to take it. They're asking questions now: 'What does this graph mean?' 'How do I make this graph on the computer?'"

Following the NALMS conference, the Weston Lake presentation will be on display at Fulford Elementary.

The school will also host a one-day program with GICEL called "You Are Here" on Friday, November 19.

"This program will be designed to challenge our older naturalists with alternate activities for younger participants," she said.

"We will be working with maps, compasses, and GPS to find our way and to build our own maps."

New participants can either download a registration form from the Fulford

School website (<http://trinet.sd64.bc.ca/%7efulford/>) or call Raddysh at home (653-0025).

The last Friday nature program — called Things That Creep and Crawl — saw 12 participants enjoy a combination of exploration, science, art and physical activities at Fulford School on October 29.

**Students wanted at new Christian school**

A new island-based Christian school is seeking devoted students. "We saw the need on the island for an alternative in education," said Salt Spring Pentecostal Assembly pastor Jim Cornock. "This school is giving a Christian perspective." The new Cornerstone Learning Centre is situated in a separate building adjacent to the Pentecostal

Assembly on Baker Road. Students, parents and teachers from the school held an open house on October 27. "It's not a Pentecostal school per se, it's a Christian school. It's for the entire community," Cornock said. Currently, many families interested in Christian values are sending children to off-island schools. The Cornerstone Learning Centre offers a local alternative, he said. "They would not have to travel and they can get first-rate instructors right here on the island." Qualified teachers Robin Rudolph and Barbara Robinson are providing instruction at the school. "They're starting small but they're full of zeal." The two-classroom school has been open with a handful of students since September, he said. "Regardless of the size of the school, the intent is to keep small classes." Students will work at their own pace within a standard B.C. curriculum that has been augmented with the Beca program Christian curriculum. "It's a Christian perspective on every subject." For added support, the school is a member of the Langley-based Society of Christian Schools. The local school is also offering evening adult classes in French, Spanish and Japanese, he said. 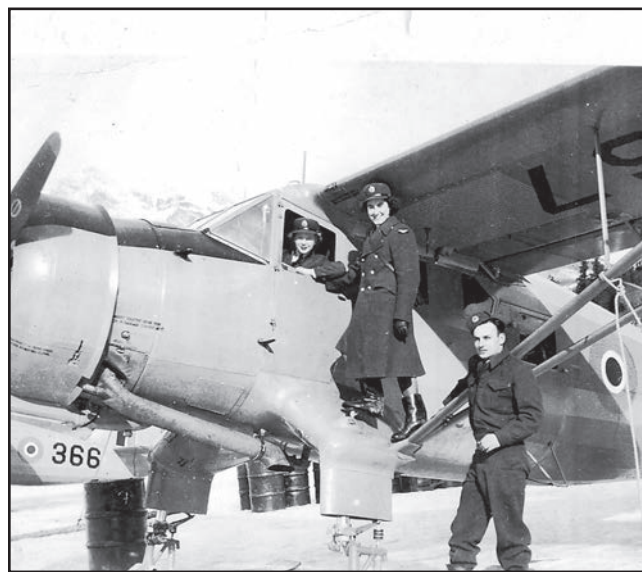

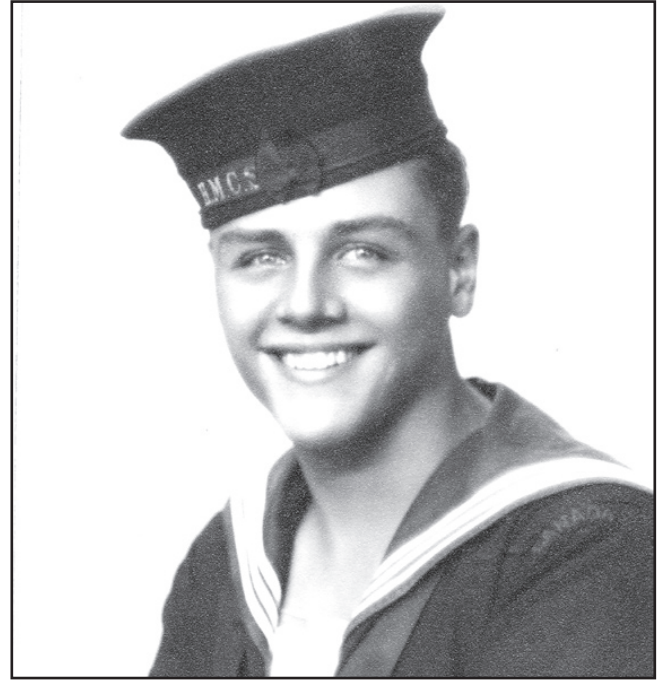

"The man in the picture is my father Hans van Zanten. The little girl is me," writes Marjolyn van Zanten. "It was the last photo of us together, taken on North Sumatra in March 1942. I was almost two years old. Hans van Zanten was a professional officer in the Dutch East Indies Army. Shortly after the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbour, they invaded the Dutch East Indies, now Indonesia. European women and children were rounded up and put in concentration camps. A total of 85,000 were incarcerated for 2 1/2 years. I was one of them and I survived. Men were taken away to labour camps, mostly in Burma, to build a railroad. My father did not surrender and disappeared into the jungle of North Sumatra to fight a guerilla war and prepare an Allied leading from Ceylon (now Sri Lanka). The Allies never arrived and one year later my father was captured. For months he was interrogated and tortured for not revealing his contacts with the Allies. In October 1943, my mother and I were taken out of our camp and driven to the jail. Japanese soldiers surrounded us, pointing their guns at me when we were confronted with my father. Years later my mother told me that they threatened to kill me if my father would not speak. He did not. For some reason, I was not killed. Mother and I were taken back to our camp. It was an eight-hour drive through the mountains. I became carsick and threw up over our Japanese guards. Hans van Zanten was only 25 years old when he was beheaded on October 25, 1943. I am his only child. His genes and spirit (not to promote war, but peace at all possible means) are in me and my two sons. One of them is Bart Terwiel, Salt Spring's harbour master. Last December his daughter Uma was born on Salt Spring. She is the great grand-daughter of Hans van Zanten."

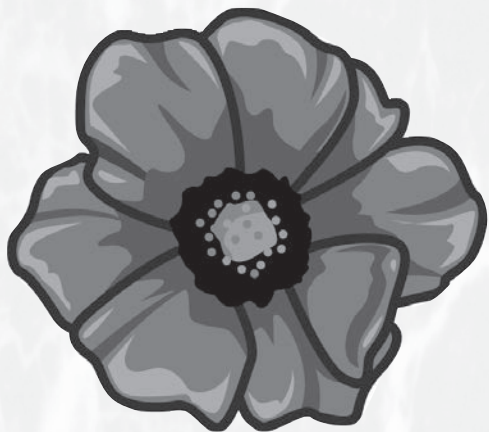

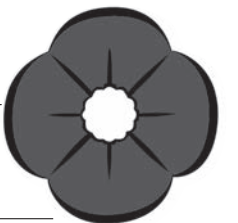

Ernie Sampson served in the Navy from 1940-1945, travelling the North Atlantic Triangle run. Ernie cooked on the Quesnel and the Dunner. He loved the rough Atlantic seas. "Ernie makes the best pancakes I've ever tasted," says sister Lil Irwin.



Stan Sampson served in the Navy from 1942-45. He travelled to Northern Ireland and the British Isles. His duties were depth-charge patrol on the navy ships, until his ankle was injured at sea. It took a year to recuperate.



Vic Sampson served in the 4th Infantry, 4th Division Highlanders, from 1943 to 1946, earning six awards. Vic was in France, Belgium, Berlin, Germany and Holland and trained for the cross-country Canadian Run. He ran 16 miles twice a day until he got chicken pox. He saw a lot of action on the front line. Vic's twin brother Cliff also enlisted for the army but was turned down because he had only one eye. Cliff then joined the Rangers.



Albert and Bill Sampson served from 1940-45, and travelled to Holland and Germany. Driving supply trucks to the front line, they had to drive at night with no lights on. Albert and his brother Vic were in the same house while under fire but didn't discover that was the case until they came home and compared notes.



Harold Sampson holding sister Lily on Salt Spring in the 1940s.



William J. Kane (front row, second from left) joined the Royal Navy at age 18. His ship was the "Indomitable" and it did the Burma run and ended up in Ceylon for two and a half years. William's wife Elizabeth was part of the Girls Training Corps (and wanted to join the Women's Royal Navy at age 16 but the war ended before that.) Elizabeth met Bill in his Navy uniform in Ceylon, they were married in 1948 and came to Canada in 1952. (Submitted by Elizabeth Kane)

He also flew the Tiger Moth, Fairchild 51 & 71, Ventura, Wapiti, Norseman, Oxford, Battle, Anson, Lysander, Bolingbroke, Lockheed 10, Vampire, Dakota, Mitchell, Expediter, Lancaster and Harvard. Marshall retired to Salt Spring in 1961 and died in 1973. He is survived by his wife, Nora Sharp (Brinkworthy) and five children (with Betty Taylor and Don Sharp on Salt Spring) and numerous grandchildren.



Wing Commander William W. Wolfenden, O.B.E. in Egypt, 1944. William is the father of Salt Spring resident Sheila Christensen. William served in the Royal Flying Corps from 1914-1918, Belgium, and in the Royal Air Force from 1939-1945, serving in Greece and Egypt (Western Desert and HQ 206 group); U.K. (Air Ministry). 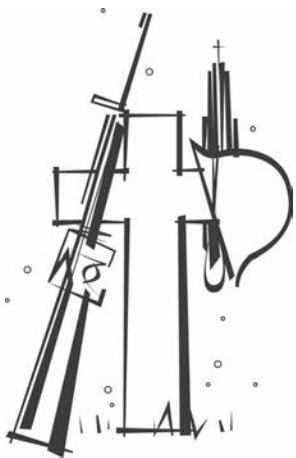

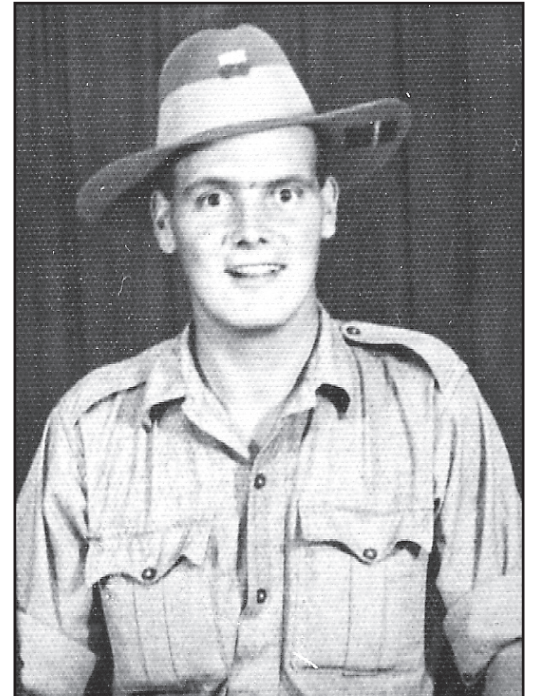

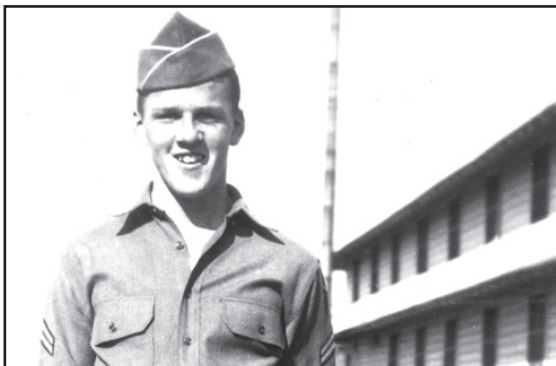

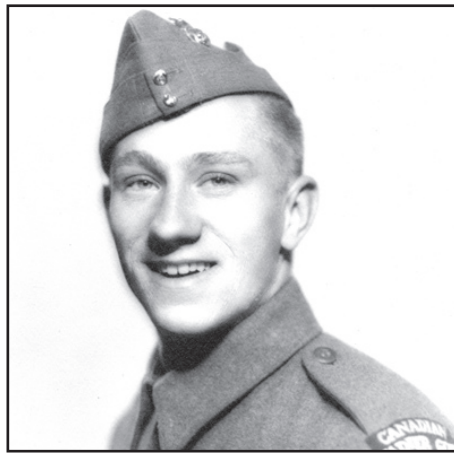

Hopkins were proud parents of seven sons, all born and raised in Regina, Saskatchewan, who joined the armed services in the Second World War. From oldest to youngest, the sons were Frederick, William, Walter, Stanley, Gordon, James and Stuart (Stu). Harold enlisted in 1939 and went overseas with the first division. William joined the R.C.A.F. and was stationed in St. Thomas, Ontario. Walter joined the navy and served most of his time on the East Coast. Stanley joined the navy and was aboard the H.M.C.S. Baddeck stationed at Portsmouth. Gordon joined the navy and was aboard H.M.S. Nabob, which was torpedoed off of Scotland, but he did survive. James was in the army and stationed in western Canada. Stuart was in the navy and was aboard H.M.C.S. Westmount, one of the many escort vessels on the Atlantic Ocean taking supply ships over to England. He earned the Star, Atlantic Star and Volunteer Service medals. Stu and his wife Jean have resided on Salt Spring Island for the past 32 years. 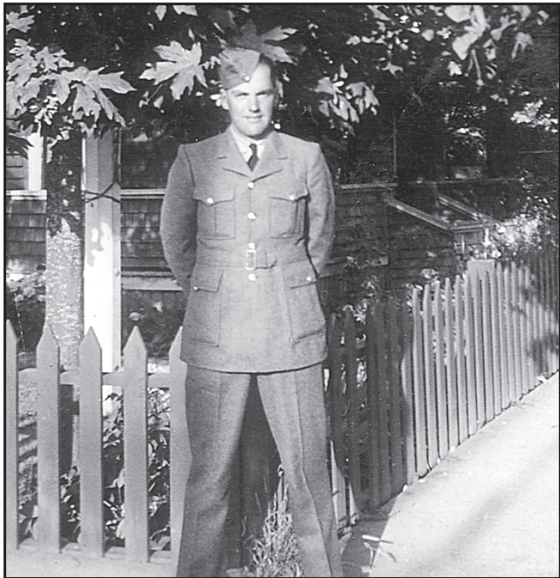

Louis served in England, France, Germany and Belgium. When he returned to Toronto in May 1919, he continued to play in bands and was among the original group of musicians in the Toronto Symphony Orchestra.



Robert E. Dodds enlisted in 1941 and served in Canada, England, Belgium and Holland. He was a Sergeant in the Army, anti-aircraft division. While in England he was on loan to the British Army and dealt with veterans returning from the front on leave. Later he was sent to Europe. After the war he joined the RCMP Marine Division, working on Salt Spring, the Gulf Islands, Vancouver Island and the entire West Coast. He farmed on Salt Spring and died November 30, 2000. 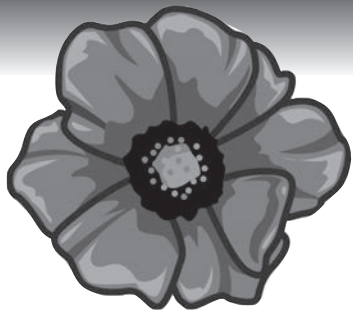

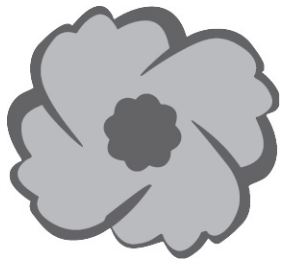

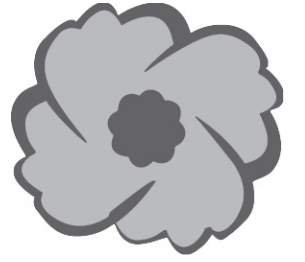

John also went on a mission with the Commandos to Dunkirk in three small boats." John became an office manager and also earned war medals.
