

Ringrose sense of fun, craftsmanship shine as new show opens at gallery

Playful, profound and downright gorgeous describes Jerry Ringrose's show at the J. Mitchell Gallery.

Covering many styles but staying in the realm of glass, Ringrose is finally sharing his brilliance in his first-ever show. Commissioned by the best designers and architects worldwide, his friends convinced him to share his vision with Salt Spring Island.

Numerous structures are loosely based on the universal wisdom: those who live in glass houses shouldn't throw stones are pristinely constructed buildings of etched glass.

Starting with the family home built by his father, Ringrose was spurred on to create a high-rise, a castle, a rose cottage (a removable roof reveals a tiny rose bush with live grass outside) and, my personal favourite, the No Vacancy Hotel.

Crossing the boundary between art and game show, the No Vacancy Hotel is a four-sided structure with rows of pictures cut from magazines and then laser printed onto acetate. Each side has known, though somewhat obscure, people and images that lead towards a saying or concept after examination.

Each side is different. Each side must be delved into knowing the artist's mind flow. It's a brain teaser; it engages onlookers in dialogue; and it's totally whacked. You get the key when you buy the piece.

The lamps, the stained glass triptych and a large screen of poppies created directly to glass without preliminary sketches are simply beautiful.

He uses ancient symbols from various sources, as he believes that these designs create energy that is still meaningful.

There is lightness and beauty to the work that mirror his longstanding Buddhist philosophies, but it is his

medium but similar in intention, the work delves into personal and often mystical subjects and uses vibrant colour to link the mix of paintings and sculpture curated by Joanne Evans.

Their other link is a collaboration entitled Harmony in Diversity created by the seven and sold at a silent auction closing Saturday, July 31 at 4 p.m.

Dean's large figurative work pays homage to 20th-century art movements like primitivism and creates work that is both intimate and iconic.

Haigh's floral still-life paintings rejoice in their colour while magnifying the individual blooms, creating beautiful renderings.

Hall's acrylic mixed media paintings examine what lies underneath our humanity. Internal anatomical structures like spinal columns and hearts join abstract forms to describe our desires.

Goddesses at Play, Harrison's acrylic on paper with mixed media, is a frolicking celebration of the female form that delights. Integrating torn paper, Yukon black sand and stamps, examination of the female nude is her forte.

Reiss' sculpture combines various objects to describe her vision. In Develop the Heart, she uses paper clay, under glaze, metal and wood to create a box with hands reaching out a door in the bottom, a multi-dimensional face on top, and a bird on the shoulder, encouraging individual interpretation.

Layers of paint are revealed after a thick, often black overcoat of oil paint is scraped away in linear rectangular shapes in Schnitzler's work. Dresden is especially poignant with its fiery red background and architectural shapes reminding us of the destruction man is capable of.

Smith's monumental sculpture hints at manmade structures that can be shifted through nature's violence. Her work explores the relationship between strength and fragility.

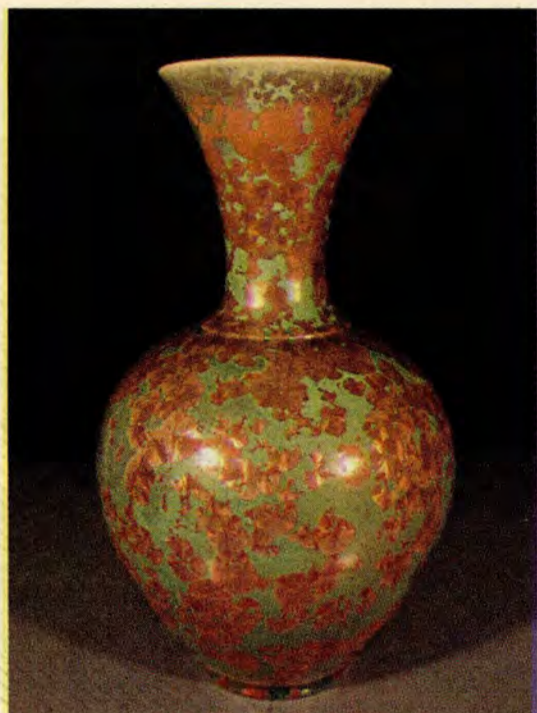

The Pucks — a fun dance band from Prince George — plays at Moby's Pub this weekend, and then the Filipino Gambetta Trio from Italy closes the festival on Thursday, July 29.

Inspired by the music of their native Chad, H'Sao presents an irresistible show at ArtSpring on July 27.

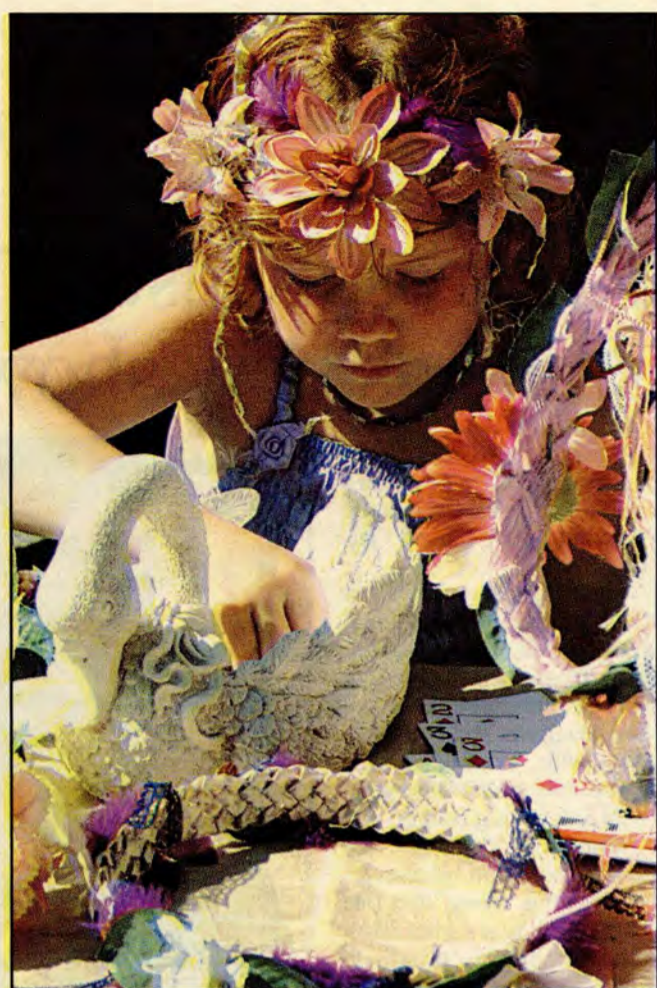

Patrons of Music and Munch can be sure to have their feet set a-tapping when they are treated to a feast of song with guitar, bodhran and Derek Duffy's inimitable style.

On Wednesday, July 28, singer-songwriter Duffy returns to the Music and Munch stage, having played several times in the early years.

Duffy won the hearts of audiences then with his skill, the ease of his presentations and his gift for storytelling.

He returns on Wednesday with a program of songs recorded in the past three years.

Born in Ireland, one can sense in Duffy's songs the influence of his ancestry and the love he has for the land of his heritage.

Quite early in his life, he settled in England where he apprenticed for seven years in many of the English

estates, to become a master gardener.

Now he calls Salt Spring Island home, although his expertise in landscaping has enabled him to travel widely. On his travels he gathers music for a project close to his heart — the influence of immigrant songs on Canadian culture.

The Lady Minto Hospital Foundation's Phantom Ball campaign was a success, earning \$37,823 for hospital equipment.

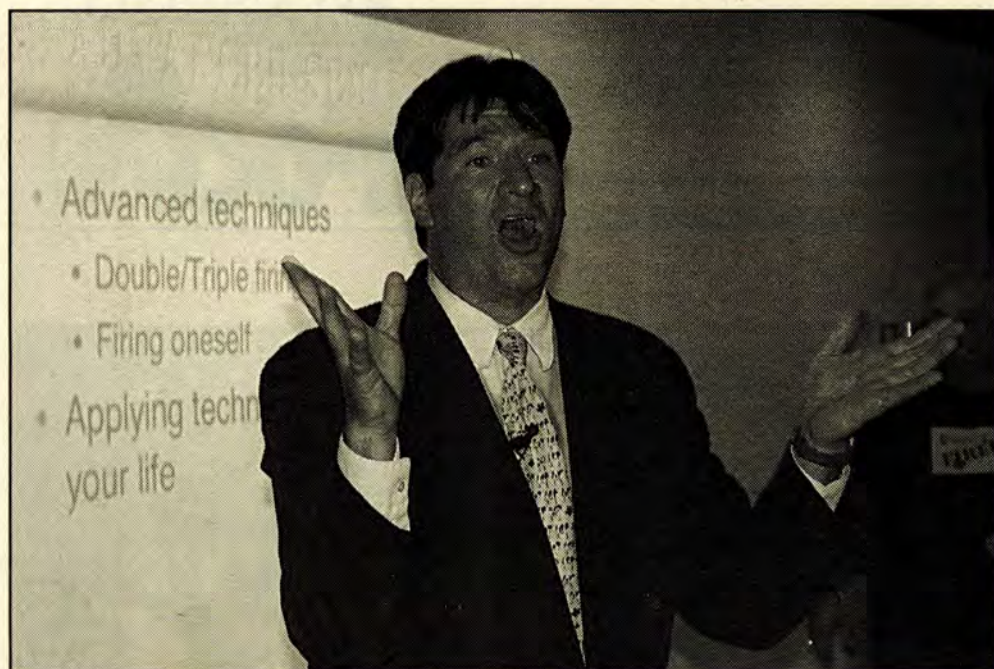

Synergy of silliness on tap as *You're Fired* entertains

With the strains of *Born To Be Wild* pumping up the audience, the chant, "I'm not a quitter, I'd rather be fired" frenzied the crowd into a Hallelujah chorus of hilarity last Thursday night.

Vancouver comedian Barry Greenfeld's stand-up show *You're Fired* — with Sid Filkow acting as his trusty sidekick (the chicken hawk to his Foghorn Leghorn, if you will) — used the conceit of a motivational infomercial a la Tony Robbins to excellent effect.

Firstly the theme of "getting fired" is very clever as everyone over the age of 25 has either been fired or done the firing.

Greenfeld and Filkow, looking natty in their power suits, roused the audience to pitches of enthusiasm, even

converting two youngsters to disciples with their chant.

Greenfeld's firing history is particularly varied and plentiful. With Andrew White working the cameras and stage manager Heather Swallow supporting technically, the hour-long show was structured with points displayed on a blank wall of Lions Hall.

It enabled Greenfeld to pick and choose the story associated with such diverse subjects as *Getting Fired* by Family Members (categories included parents, siblings and your niece); *Firing Yourself*; and, of particular interest to many Salt Spring Islanders, *Bankruptcy*, *Go Missing* ("You've got all this forest . . .")

In between the story telling, audience participation and Filkow playing straight man to Greenfeld's schtick, filmed people-in-the-street

interviews in both Vancouver and on Salt Spring were edited to suit the subject.

Cleverly done in that fine tradition that TV watchers are accustomed to from David Letterman, Conan O'Brien and Rick Mercer, responses broke up the live comedy to entertain in a way that our TV culture can understand.

The show engaged the audience with good fun using fast-paced recurring jokes, like the constant peddling of the advance workshop.

Related to Filkow through marriage, the two effectively play off of each other, creating a synergy of silliness.

I'm sure that I wasn't the only one who reminisced after the show about their own firing and getting fired stories.

Stay tuned for *Bankruptcy*, the Musical.

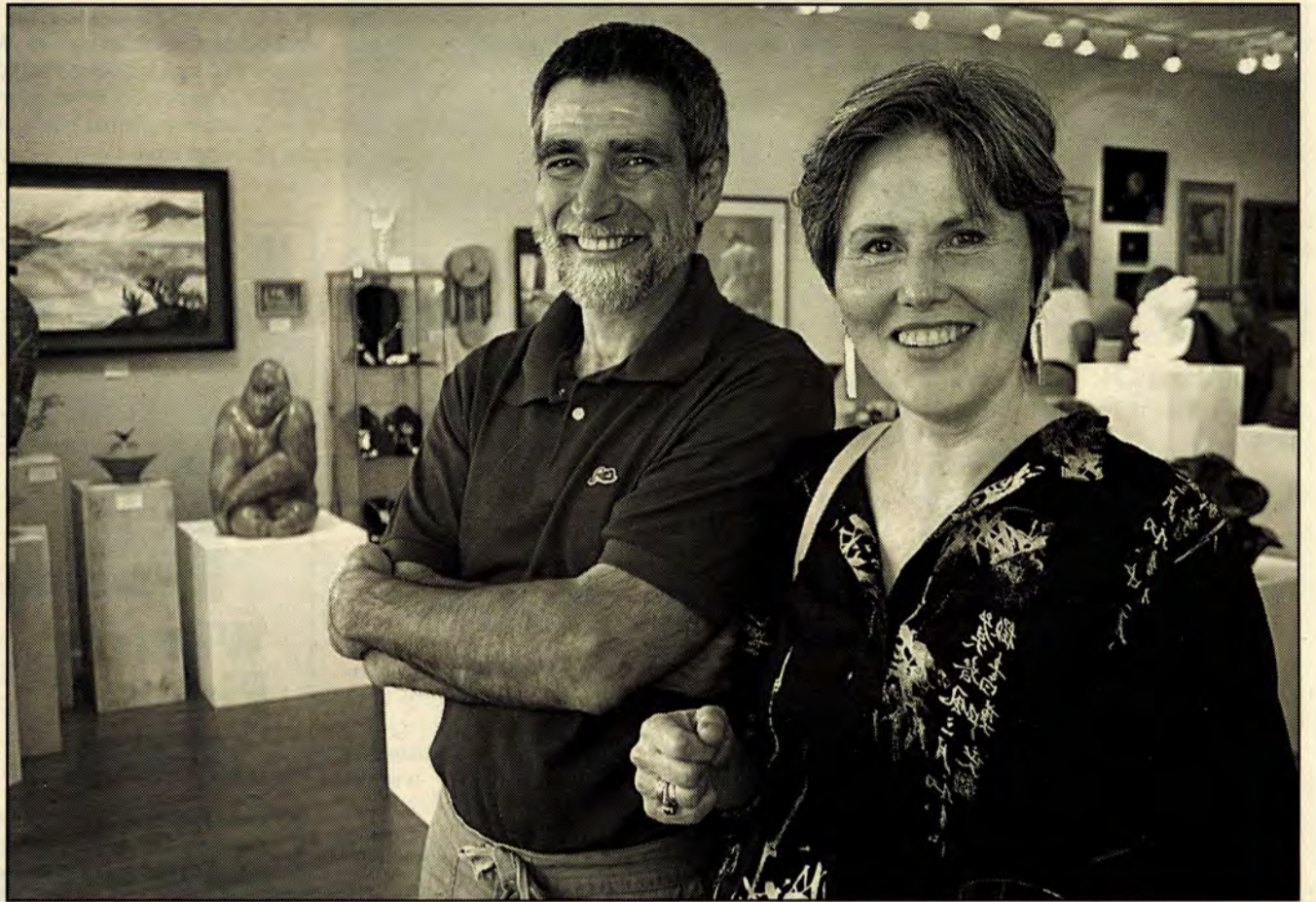

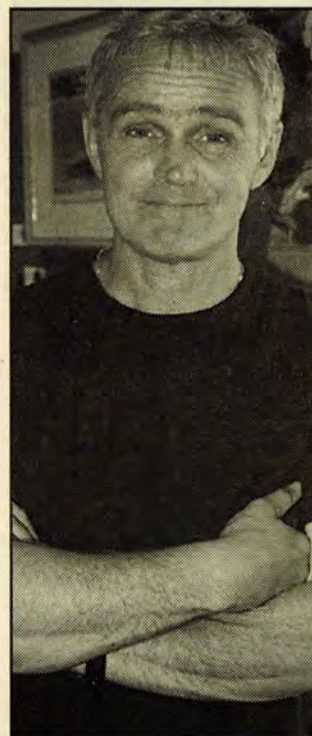

Write about love at weekend workshop

"Story goddess" Marlène Ochs believes that every story is a love story, and she strives to share these accounts of amour through unique writing workshops.

Next weekend, Salt Springers will have the chance to delve deep into their own tales of endearment at Ochs' workshop entitled Heartbeats: Writing Your Love Story.

"People love to hear stories about love. Who doesn't want to know more about their own love story?" said the former CBC writer, researcher and producer.

"It's all about the words. It's all about the story. All of us have extraordinary things that happen to us. All of these stories mean something to us because they could happen

to any one of us. That's why it's so potent to write about love. I get a lot of wonderful responses from people."

Love stories don't necessarily need to be about a romantic partner, said Ochs. Instead, they can focus on the love for a child, a favourite pet, an old friend.

"There's always this magic when people are touched by love. The inspiration, the beauty of it is from some incredible place inside of you."

Workshop participants need not have any writing experience. In fact, Ochs said she loves it when people realize for the first time that they can write.

"It's very sweet. It's very tender because it's about discovery and revelation," she said.

Ochs' interest in love stories stems from the 25

years she spent working as an award-winning journalist, when she researched heartfelt issues ranging from teen suicide to the Air India bombing.

"Journalists work with stories every day, and many of these stories are about people who've experienced tremendous loss. What struck me is that loss is always about love. When my own husband died, I think it brought that home to me."

Her husband, aquarelle artist Peter Paul Ochs, died of cancer 10 years ago, but Ochs said it feels like yesterday. She opened her heart to him, as well as to readers, in her 2001 book *Nine Letters to a Dead Man . . . Before Being Found by Love Again*.

"I like to connect through the power of writing and through the power of love,"

she said. "I think that when you love very deeply, you're transported to a different place. It's a very, very intense place."

In her Salt Spring workshop, Ochs will explore this intense location of love with participants as they try to overcome their internal editors. Writers will be able to share their results at the end of the day.

Phillip du Preez is hosting a complimentary meet-the-author wine and cheese reception at Ruphi art factory on July 30 from 7 to 9 p.m.

The workshop, which costs \$150, will take place the following day from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in Casa de la Playa's labyrinth garden.

The Rotary Club took care of transporting auction items, and will also receive donated funds.

"It's a real community event," said Gravett.

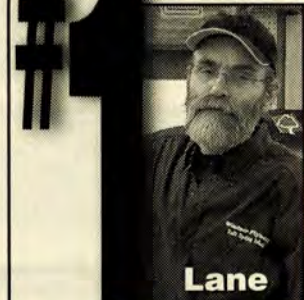

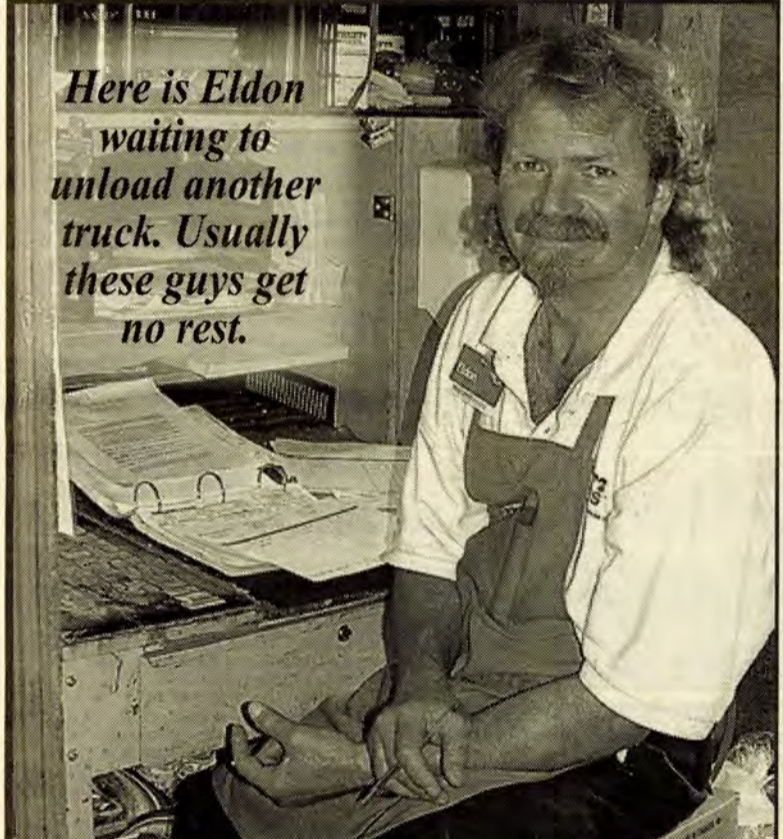

Annual Fibre Fest ready to astound the crowds again

The Third Annual Salt Spring Island Natural Fibre Festival brings a full weekend of fashion and festivities to the island.

The fibre fun begins Saturday with displays and vendors at the Farmers Institute from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Visitors can view spinning mill demonstrations, colourful quilts, heritage garments and current works of Salt Spring fibre artists.

"The quilt show is huge. It's fantastic. It's almost all local. Last year people were just knocked out by it," said Susan Berlin, a member of the event's organizing committee.

On Saturday evening, ArtSpring will host an 8 p.m. fashion show featuring works of Canadian designers from B.C. to Nova Scotia, plus the designs of a

Washington man who was inspired to work with natural fibres after attending the first Fibre Festival in 2002.

"The fashion show is going to have a full range of entries. Some of it is just spectacular. We have some wonderful stuff from local people. We have several entries from students, which makes me

happy," said Berlin.

On Sunday, festival events continue at the Farmers Institute with demonstrations of 10 different breeds of fleece sheep in the barn.

"There will be demonstrations about why their fleeces are different and what they're used for, plus angora goats used for mohair, alpacas and llamas. You don't get that too often all in one place," said Berlin.

"The chief reason we do this is because if we don't get manufacturers and designers to use different fleece for different purposes, we're going to lose the breeds. We really want to develop interest in breed-specific yarns," said Berlin, who even spins yarn from the fur of her dogs and cat.

Sunday's festivities will also bring a team from Capilano College to Salt Spring for a Sheep-to-Shawl event.

"Sheep-to-Shawl traditionally is when you come in with a live sheep and shear it. You have to pick it, then card it, then spin it, then ply it and then weave it into a standard-sized shawl. We will be doing a modification of that. The team will be starting with prepared fibres," Berlin said.

Other highlights for Sunday include hands-on demonstrations, kids' workshops and a Weavers and Spinners Guild sheep-to-sweater team.

"It's fun to have people come and have their jaws drop because they're literally astounded with what they see," said Berlin.

Admission is \$5 for the weekend's events at the Farmers Institute, and fashion show tickets are available for \$15 at the ArtSpring box office (537-2102).

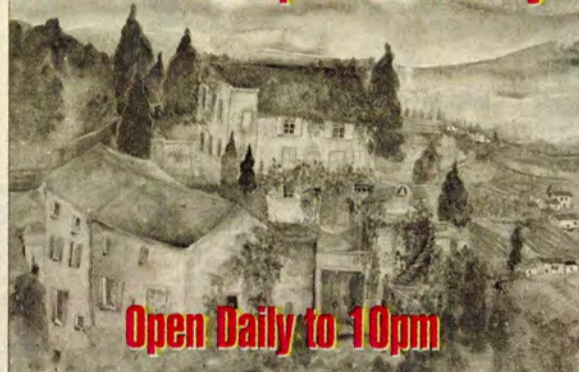

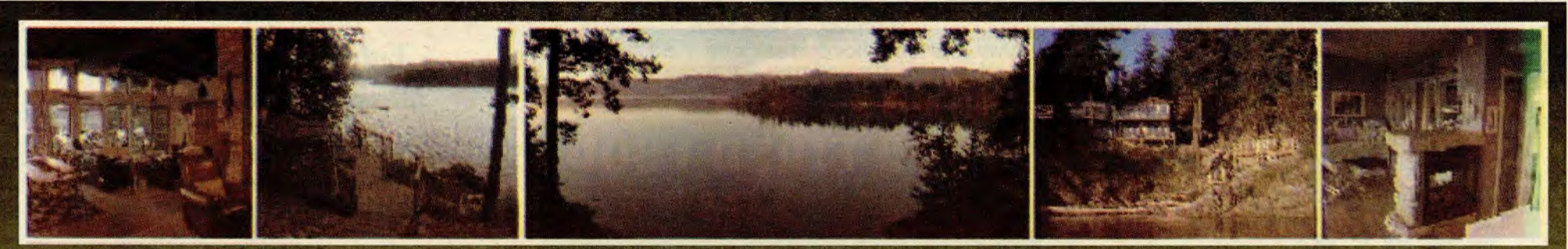

Negotiating a mind set

CURRENCY CORNER

Last week, I suggested money is not neutral. It shapes us and our community. If money is an agreement within a community to use something as a medium of exchange, we can create new agreements. Islanders can decide what issues are important and use \$\$ to deal with those issues. It is a frame of mind.

For example: If a group of your friends help you out with a project (say repairing a deck), usually you don't pay them in Canadian dollars. You might buy some beer, offer them a meal, or some such. In this activity, money is for temporary hires, not for long-term friends. The beer or the meal is payment for friends' help nonetheless. We have a different agreement with a tradesperson than we do with a friend. The tradesperson competes in the economy for money. It is her livelihood. Friends help each other out of affection and esteem.

Friend has a number of meanings but in general friends are not hostile, share a sense of affiliation, and often favor or promote the same things. Salt Spring Dollars (\$\$) are founded on this sense of "friendship". As a complementary currency, \$\$ are designed to promote the benefits of affiliation in common cause for our island community.

\$\$ are fully integrated with the Canadian Dollar. \$\$ don't isolate us but they can unite us. Based on studies I have read of other communities, increasing the circulation of \$\$ will also increase Salt Spring Island's income, wealth and employment opportunities. While going about our commercial business, spending \$\$ at home and growing the reserve fund, we are strengthening and funding our affiliation with one another. \$\$ can be used at home in the competitive economy and still, through utilization of the reserve fund, facilitate exchanges beneficial to the whole community.

What shape will our affiliation take? What will we regard as beneficial? It depends on our negotiated frame of mind.

I first met Liz Martin in 1988 when I managed a training grant in the early days of Off Centre Stage.

Liz wanted to train as a lighting technician. She had been part of the legendary Courtenay Renaissance Fairs and teched for known Canadian folksingers.

She soon became our gallery manager as well, gently interacting with many of our finest local artists and artfully displaying the work that graced the walls and greeted audiences.

The public at large does not often notice the technician and crew backstage. It is their aim to be invisible and magically support the illusion that is live theatre. Liz did this exquisitely.

You enjoyed her bright lights and quick changes throughout all of the Hysterical Society and Paradise Lots productions, probably not knowing that improv also extends to the lights when working with performers where anything can happen and usually does.

She trained them, eventually, and you might have noticed what became a curtain-call ritual of the cast extending their hands in the direction of the lighting booth to thank her after each show. It was a gesture of appreciation for how much they came to rely on her and her support for them.

Show after show you saw her, but not on stage. Her lights were dancing

and painting the set as the music and metaphor of the Fantasticks continued night after night. She energized the early fundraisers for ArtSpring, including each Academy Awards Show, auction and coffeehouse. She touched you time and again with the perfect slow fade and the blush of colour.

The many performers she worked with called her "the greatest audience" because Liz really listened. And, of course, they asked for her opinion, which was impeccable and improved many performances and productions.

Directors conferred, costumers and set designers consulted. Ms. Martin worked with everyone from the schools and benefits to the Festival of the Arts.

She stood on ladders as the lights came up and down, moving from venue to venue in the early days as we only had so many lights and they all had to be shared.

Cat walking and ladder climbing, reaching, hanging, focussing, burning her fingers, and wrenching her back for the moment she loved when the lights came up.

Many friends loved her deep compassion, her diplomatic manner, and her delightful laugh. Liz always looked for a laugh and yet was very serious and thoughtful.

She was deeply knowledgeable about art and literature and had been a weaver for a time.

For many years she worked in the island's group home with the physically and mentally challenged and contributed greatly to the community.

Liz Martin passed over peacefully late on Tuesday, July 13. She was supported by a circle of friends who delivered lovingly prepared meals, moved her from her small cabin to the home of a close friend and shared four-hour shifts to assist her transition.

She woke up and said, "What time is it? I'll be late for rehearsal."

And when it became difficult to speak as each loving friend came and went, she blew kisses instead. Graceful was her character and graceful was her end.

"God bless you Liz Martin" was written on a sandwich board in the market on Saturday.

For us, she was the Goddess of Light who shall be remembered and greatly missed.

There will be a potluck celebration of Liz Martin's life in her honour this Sunday, 4 p.m., at the spit on Liz Armour's property, 360 Beddis Road. People should bring blankets to sit on.

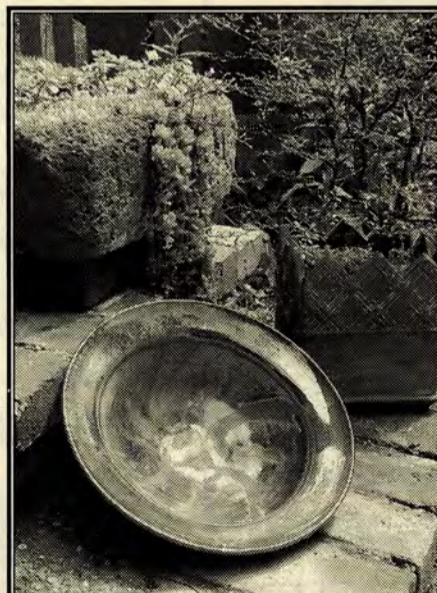
A \$10 donation is suggested for the event, and people should bring plates and cutlery, along with the potluck item.

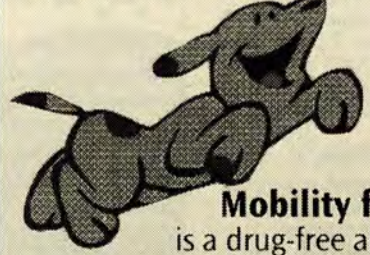

New programs, services at Mary Hawkins library

The summer reading program for kids is running on Wednesdays through August 17, from 1:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m.

This year's theme is "Anything can happen when you read," with different aspects being explored each week, along with crafts and activities.

Aimed at kids aged six to 14, the program is a fun way to keep kids interested in reading over the summer. A sign-up sheet is posted at the library, or call Jan Slakov at 537-5251 to register. Drop-ins also welcome.

There is now a phone located on the main floor which provides free calls via the internet to Victoria. This phone is available to all, though people are requested to limit the duration of their calls to five minutes.

Funding for this service was provided through a CAP (Community Access Program) grant from Industry Canada. This grant has also provided the library with a wheelchair accessible computer desk and a wireless system. Bring your laptop and use it anywhere — just contact the librarian.

The search for the library's first paid, professional librarian has officially begun. Grace Byrne, chief librarian, will be retiring from her current position by December 31, 2004 (at the latest). A team of board members has formed to find potential candidates for this milestone position, start date

and hours to be determined.

- A 30-minute per day limit on internet use on library computers is now in place. Computers automatically turn off after the time limit has expired. Card holders and visitors to the library may obtain a number from the librarian on duty to gain access to the computers.

- Free, private classes for those who wish to learn how to use the computers in the library, with a focus on the internet, are available upon request. There is a sign-up sheet posted in the library, and a phone number posted there if you'd like more information.

- If you have knowledge of, or background in, focus groups, strategic planning, foundations, government relations, marketing, financial management, or fundraising, the Long Term Planning Committee could use your help. We're forming advisory committees with limited time commitments to assist in the planning of our exciting new facility.

We'll also be setting up a "friends of the library" group and a library foundation in the near future. Contact Patricia Fraser at 537-4722 or bunyip@saltspring.com for more information.

40 years ago

Three cars collided on the brow of a hill on Fulford-Ganges Road as one driver attempted to overtake another vehicle and ended up crashing headlong into a car coming the other way. The driver of the oncoming vehicle was killed instantly. Four other people were injured.
