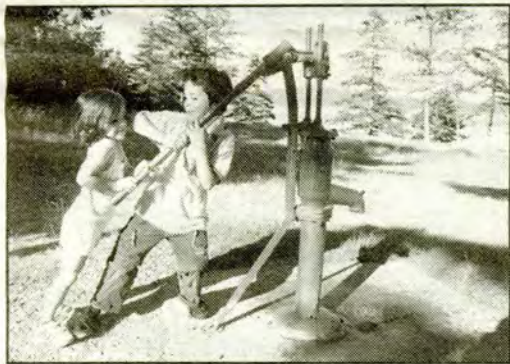

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A Day *in the* Life of Salt Spring Island

24 hours, one island and six photographers. A Day in the Life aimed to capture it all: islanders at work and play from morning to night.

Armed with cameras, keen eyes, lists of activities and a willingness to recreate the moment, photographers Ken Sakamoto, John Cameron, Derrick Lundy, Mitchell Sherrin, Peter McCully and Jennifer McFee set out on June 29 to document all aspects of island life.

On the following pages are more than 100 of the resulting images, selected from a catalogue of close to 1,000 photographs.

"The collection of images was really impressive," said Driftwood associate publisher Penny Sakamoto, who conceived and coordinated the local project. "It made the selection process tough."

"A Day in the Life" projects aren't new, Sakamoto added: many countries around the world have produced coffee-table books of photographs taken in 24-hour periods.

But only a handful of community newspapers have jumped on the idea.

"The concept is community-oriented and we're a community newspaper," says Sakamoto, "It seemed like a natural and exciting project to take on."

A random day was selected — Tuesday, June 29 — and Driftwood staff crossed their fingers, hoping for good weather.

"The photographers were prepared to be flexible," Sakamoto said. "They knew they had to have the ability to shoot under whatever circumstance presented itself."

Some of the photographers' time overlapped the others, while a few spent the entire day behind the camera. Topic lists were prepared ahead of time so the photographers had an idea of what the others were doing. Still, some images were duplicated, with three different shooters, for example, all catching the drama of three helicopter evacuations at Lady Minto Hospital.

"A Day in the Life went by in a big blur," recalled photographer Derrick Lundy, who took hundreds of images, starting in the morning and shooting until sunset.

Several "in the moment" images presented themselves that day and became his favourites.

He particularly recalls driving toward the south end of Salt Spring and spotting Ray Fraser on a tractor with his dog following behind. Lundy leapt over a fence, ignoring the barbed wire, and managed to beautifully capture the late afternoon moment.

Another stand-out photograph for him was a sunset shoot of Wendy Beatty and Lynda Blanchette, walking with sunhats in silhouette on the beach at Vesuvius.

"We wanted to capture people at work and people at play," said Sakamoto. "We wanted to get behind the scenes — like Peter McCully's photographs in the engine room of the Skeena Queen and the x-ray lab of Lady Minto Hospital."

"We wanted to document the stuff that happens every day."

One commonplace event that Ken Sakamoto was

eager to capture was the early-morning coffee crowd at Embe Bakery.

Rising early on the 29th, Embe was his first stop. He then headed to Shelby Pool, where the local swim club was practising.

At the Salt Spring Golf and Country Club, he was happy to snap a few shots of grounds superintendent Kirk Harris.

Like Lundy, photographer John Cameron was behind a camera most of the day, shooting the sunrise as well as the sunset. As a teacher, a big part of his morning was spent at Salt Spring Island Middle School where he documented last-day ceremonies and award presentations.

He said the entire exercise forced him to "look carefully at all the things that happen in a day here."

And he was impressed with the diversity. Within a short period of time, he recalled, he photographed an artist at work, a yoga studio and a Chevy cruising Ganges.

The car photograph was one of his favourites. Although not easy to spot in the reproduced black and white image, he said, the car is brilliantly hued with Ganges reflected along the side.

"Each photographer was encouraged to use his or her eyes to see things not planned," Sakamoto said. From her perspective, one of the most interesting shots was a late-night image found by Jennifer McFee.

"Jen saw a hitchhiker in the middle of the night and stopped to take the shot."

As the late-night, early morning shooter, McFee found herself with the police, in the hospital, with a taxi driver and at the Fulford Inn, documenting happenings that occurred

while the rest of the island slept. Her last shots of the 24-hour period took place at 5 a.m., June 30.

Photographer Mitchell Sherrin said he had to "shift gears" to move away from regular newspaper photography, which lends itself more to "posed" images.

"It was nice to have the freedom to look at subjects from different angles," he said.

He also liked the idea of documenting the more seemingly mundane aspects of island life.

"The guy loading the mail suddenly became the hero of the moment," he recalled.

Photographs included in the Day In the Life special section were selected through a group effort.

The entire collection of images was posted on four walls (and both sides of a door) in a room at the Driftwood office. Staff members and photographers were encouraged to view the images and check off their favourites. Images with multiple checks were the first to be included, and others were added as the size of the section grew.

Photographers contributed information for each photograph, and then Driftwood designers Sandi Poystila and Susan Lundy took over, splitting the section in half and placing the photographs in chronological order.

Driftwood managing editor Gail Sjuberg and Penny Sakamoto then edited the cutlines and proofed the product.

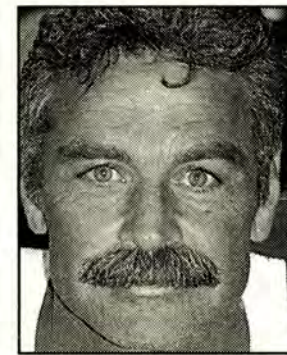
Sakamoto and the photographers hope to make A Day in the Life an annual event.

"It's been a fabulous project," Sakamoto said. "The staff and all the people involved did a great job."

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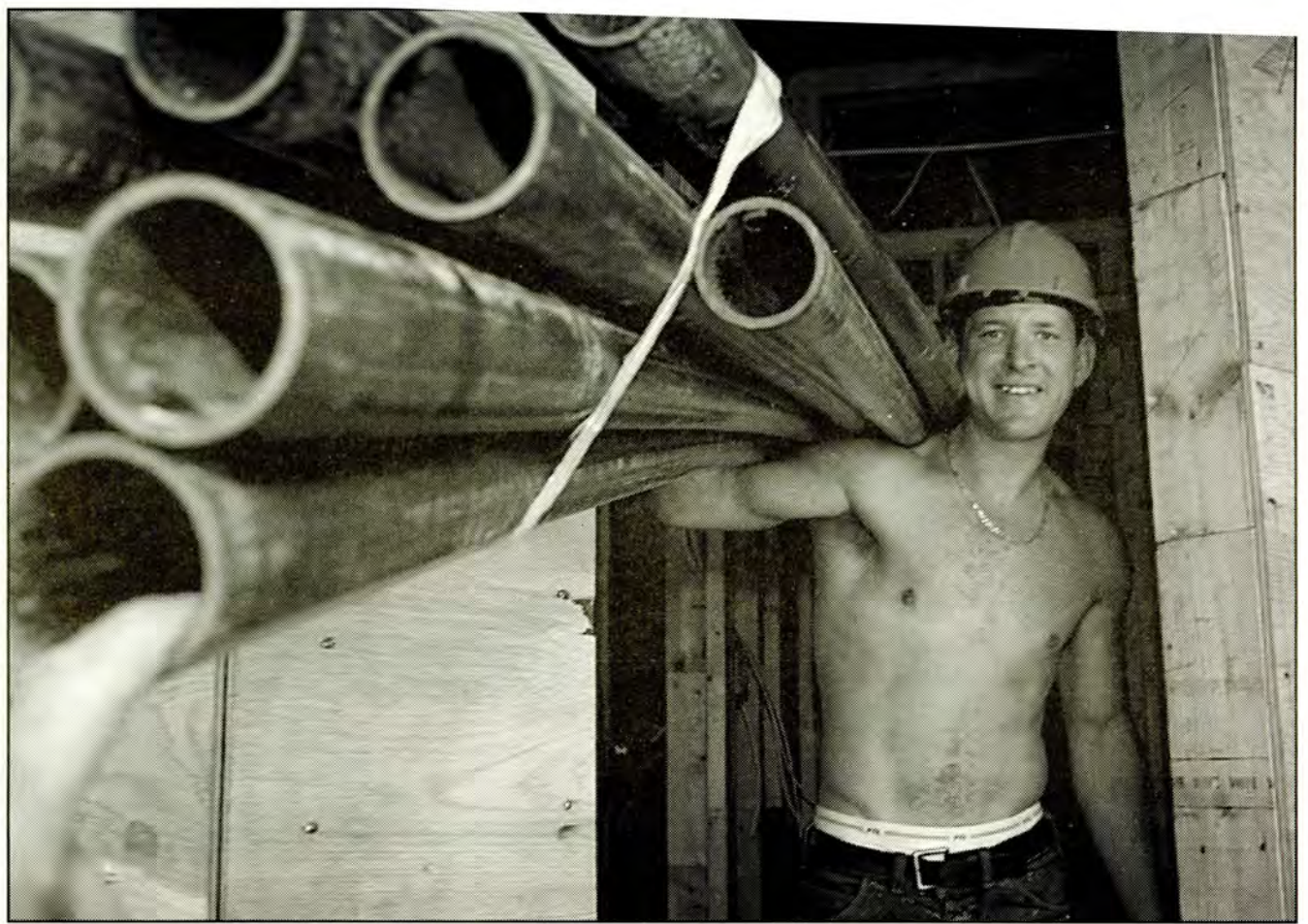

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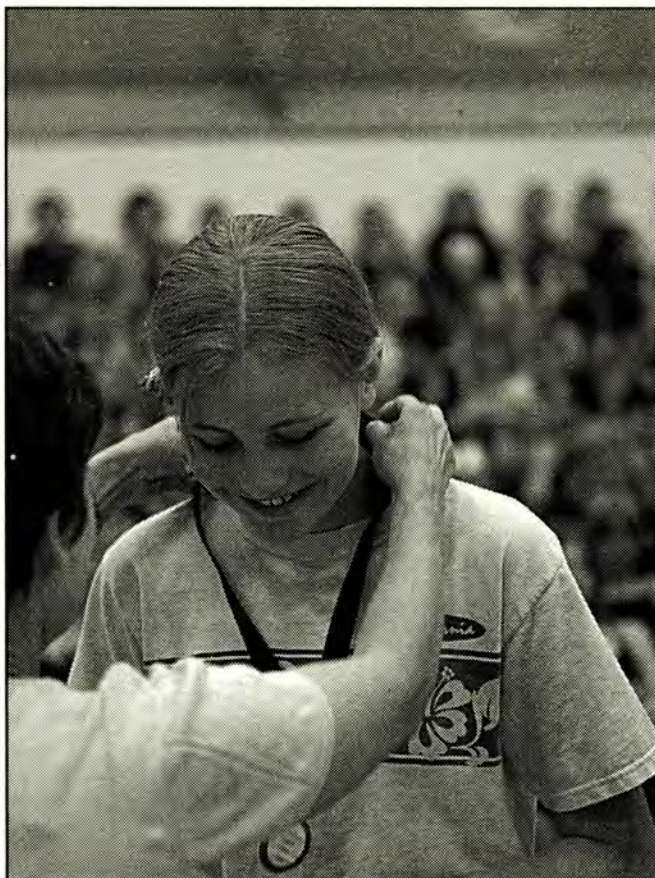

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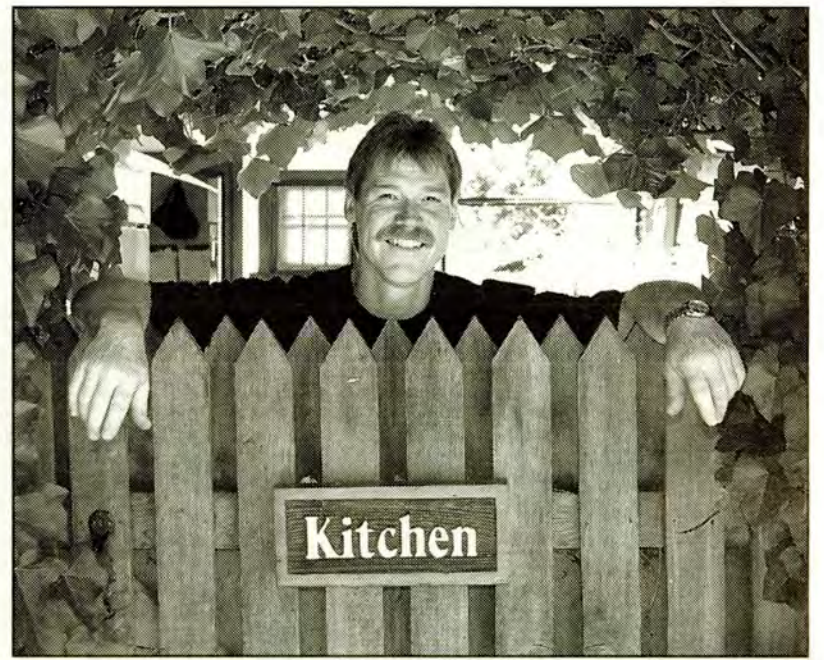

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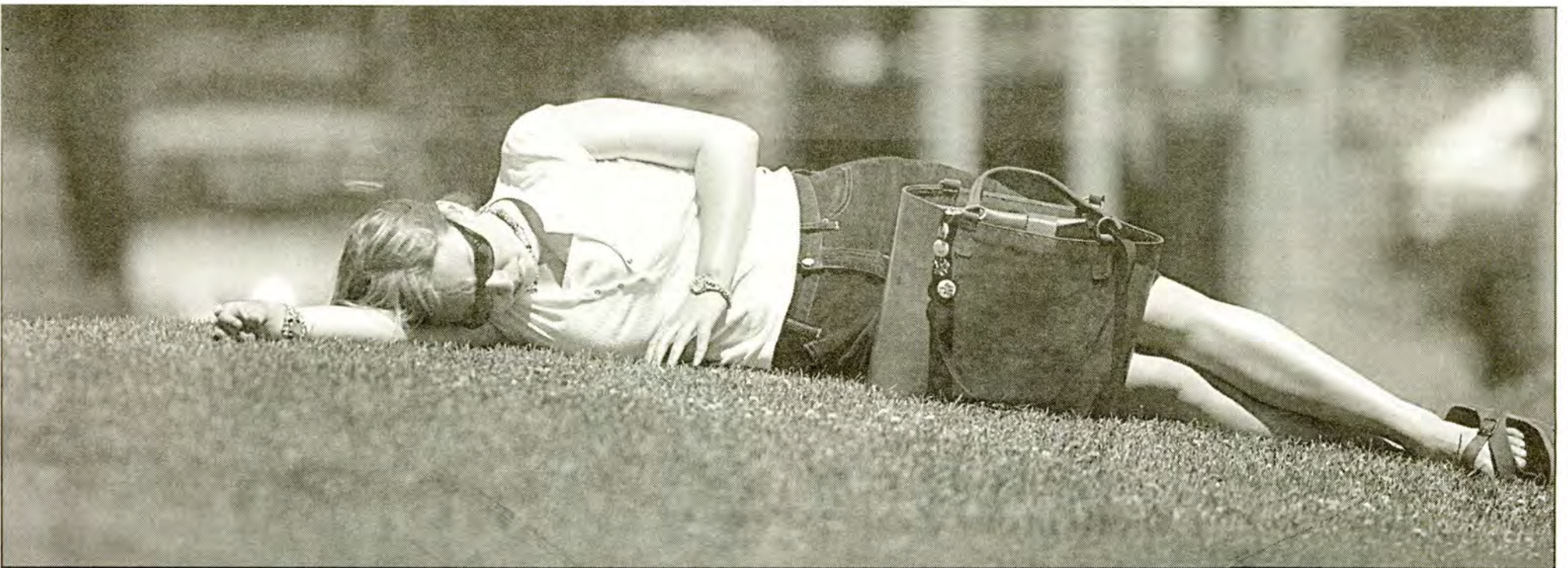

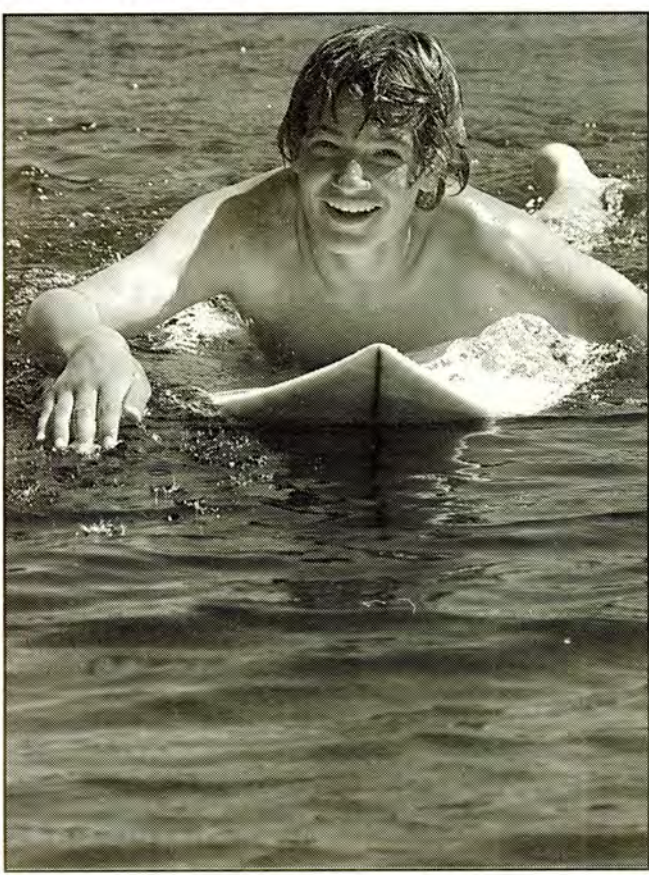

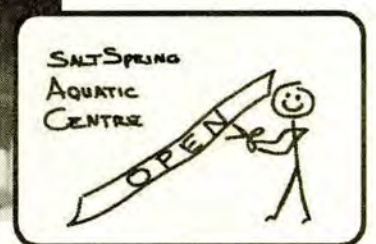

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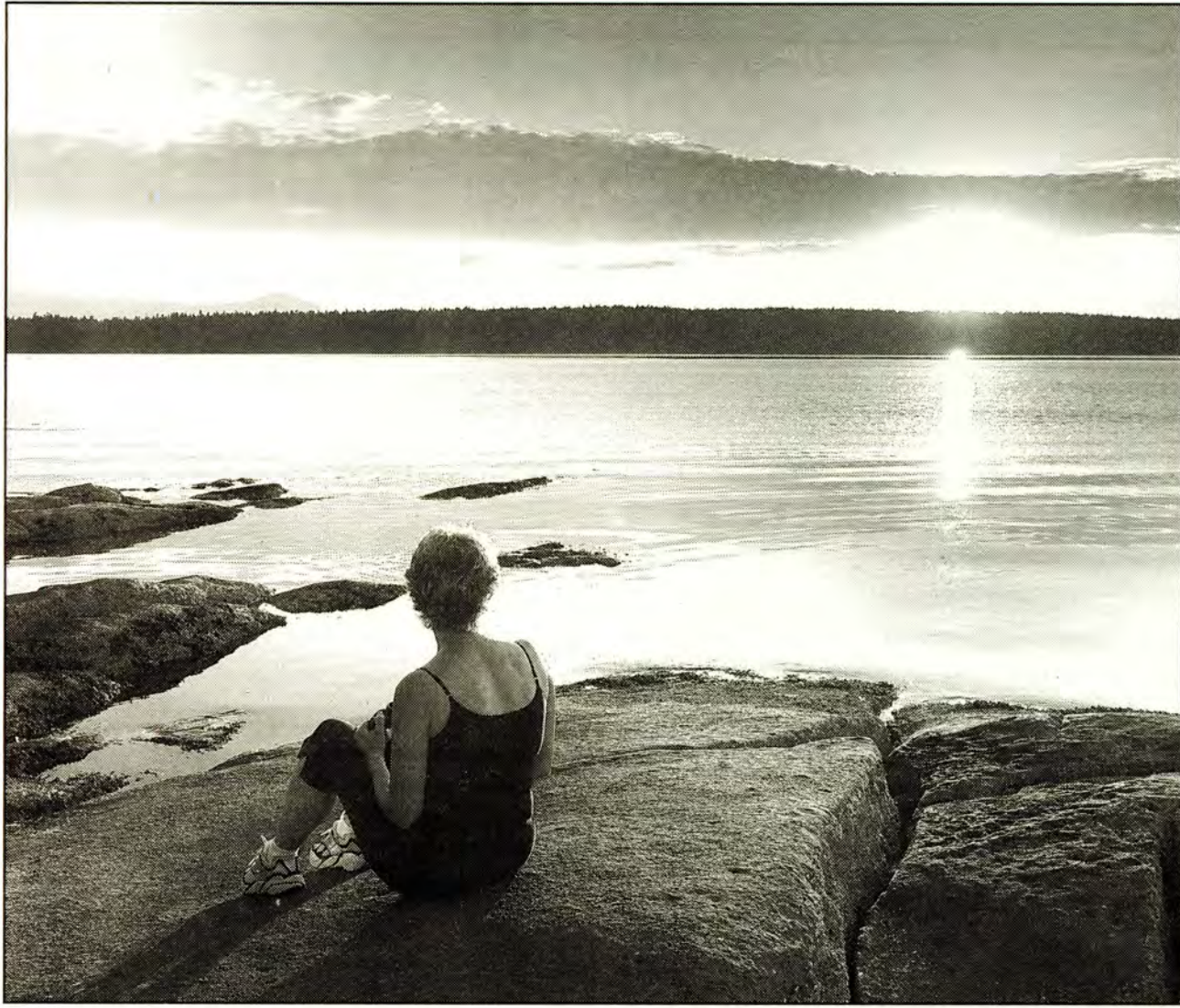
