

Photography given due respect at Galleons Lap

Who hasn't driven by the brown building with the purple trim across from All Saints By-the-Sea and wondered about its interior?

According to owner Seth Berkowitz, who recently bought and opened a photography studio there called Galleons Lap, the numbers are many.

"We've had an excellent response since opening the gallery in June from both tourists and locals," he said last week. "Often the locals are interested in the property."

The gallery's unusual name comes from the final paragraph of the last book in the Winnie the Pooh series, where Galleons Lap is described as "the enchanted place on the very top of the forest."

Most recently from Vancouver but originally from St. Catharines, Ontario, Berkowitz has made his living at commercial photography for the last 15 years while fulfilling his muse through artistic photography.

Berkowitz's photographs of Inuit youth are lovely examples of his skill and

his way with people. They tell stories of their lives, validating their existence in a very life-affirming way. Encouraging people to be that open takes supreme people skills while the shots are also excellent, technically.

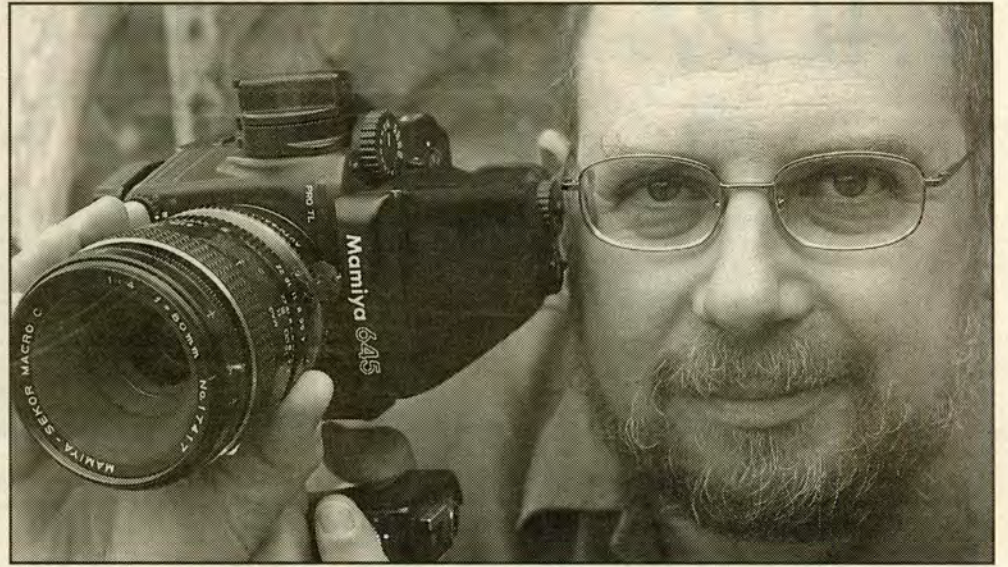
He pushes the boundaries with manipulations of Polaroids, by taking an image — after the strip of paper is ripped off but before it sets — and blurring it so it looks like a German Expressionist painting. Depending on the original image, the

effect is startling.

Pressing a freshly wet image and pressing it to another surface also makes for an interesting effect, like an ephemeral daguerreotype that has been manipulated around the edges.

Opening his doors to photographic portraiture will be welcome on Salt Spring as, surprisingly, this niche has not been filled. We don't have an outlet to produce photos of our cloying kids with silly props. At the same time, those of us with digital cameras think we can take decent photos. Let a professional do it, I say.

Berkowitz's work alone presently fills the gallery space, but this gregarious soul is interested in showing others' work as well. He believes that "photography deserves more respect with a venue of its own."

Ganga Giri returns with didjeridu and funky beats

Australian Diege-Man Ganga Giri will return to Salt Spring on Sunday, August 29 with an event at Beaver Point Hall.

The all-ages dance will feature the explosive, powerful and pulsating experience of Ganga Giri, the didge-man from Down Under, following his performance on Salt Spring last August.

Fans still talk about his visit as "the" dance event of the summer of 2003, says organizer Sean Hill.

Ganga Giri blends an array of tribal percussion, including congas, darbouka and djembe, with pumping,

fat, funky beats and deep earth dub accompanied by his trademark didjeridu. As he carves a niche in the DJ-dominated world of dance music, he creates a melting pot that is a celebration and unification of the many musical genres and cultures that reflect today's multicultural Australia.

Fresh from a recent tour of world-class festivals in Spain, Switzerland and Austria, Ganga recently headlined the Shambhala Music Festival in the Kootenays to an overwhelming response from the sell-out crowd. He is accompanied by dancer/

percussionist Vika, Yasmine Amal on drums/percussion, and local Sean "SirBassa" Hill on bass and beats.

Quoted on Ganga Giri's website (www.gangagiri.com), Peter Gabriel said "Ganga Giri is a wonderful musician. I first heard him at a Womad Festival and loved the mix of his ancient and primitive instruments with a wide range of great dance grooves. Ganga is really taking the didjeridu to places it has never been before and developing a unique style of music."

The event will be held at 9 p.m. with tickets (\$12) at the door.

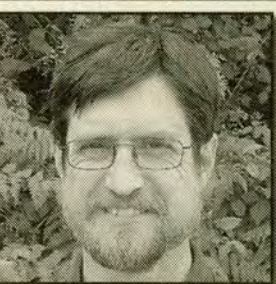





'Birds in flight' lands in Mahon Hall

Five stellar artists have grouped five varying techniques inspired by the beauty and structure of birds for a special ArtCraft Showcase.

Opening Thursday, August 26 and continuing to Tuesday, September 7 at Mahon Hall, the show called "For the Birds, the Beauty of Flight" features new work by Ulrike Benner, Paul Burke, Gary Cherneff, Anna Gustafson and Melissa Searcy.

Birds are the most ancient symbol we have of freedom and song. The first music ever heard by man was the singing of birds. A bird in flight is still one of the loveliest sights in the world.

As Vladimir Nabokov said, "Only the birds are able to throw off their shadow. The shadow always stays behind on earth. Our imagination flies: we are its shadow on earth."

Their imaginations touched by this themed show, each of the artists selected has assembled work using their various mediums of felt, wood, ceramics, paint and clay to extend their observations.

Benner, well-known felt and fabric artist, says she creates "vibrant colours and shapes as an expression of wordless flight energy to the unformed icons of the soul which enfold the spirit with delight and carries it to flight."

Paul Burke and Anna Gustafson, the husband and wife co-owners of the Blue Horse Gallery, are invited artists. Using a folk-art style, Gustafson has fashioned "bird portraits" of local birds. These amusing acrylic visions drolly suggest human portraits.

Burke has been creating wooden folk art since 1988 and presents a special group-

ing of ravens for this show.

His interest in natural history connects his creations to the animal but in a stylized form that provides a whimsical sense of each. Using sculpting, carving and painting, pine, apple and pear are finished with hand tools and various layers of paint from which his creatures emerge.

Burke has just completed an installation for Circle Craft on Granville Island called "Government Wharf," which features seagulls on a red railing, crows eating French fries, and a curious Labrador. The interest from this work engendered a recent interview on North by Northwest on CBC Radio.

An avian motif of owls was chosen by Gary Cherneff. Taking a page out of Picasso's painting on pots as an inspirational reference, Cherneff has merged graphic components inside and out, painting and drawing on a new

ceramic series of diverse pieces similar to casseroles that may be hung.

Framed drawings by this multi-talented artist and potter will be shown and he is hatching a collection of eggs. Austere in form, the elemental nature of eggs intrigues him. The theme showcases have provided him "interesting ideas to grip onto and have fun with."

The textures, structures and colours of birds perch, gather and fly across the clay plaques and friezes of Melissa Searcy, coordinator of this showcase. Her artful attention to detail supports her poetic visions in all her work and her life-long fascination with birds emerges clearly in these emotionally evocative paintings on clay.

This Showcase "For the Birds" continues daily for two weeks only at Mahon Hall within the main Art-Craft show and sale.

King Clarentz makes national debut

Blues music promoter Cheri Wilhelm is promising islanders and visitors a weekend they won't forget when King Clarentz makes his Canadian debut on Salt Spring.

"We are really getting something special here," said Wilhelm, the editor of Real Blues magazine who lives on the island.

King Clarentz, or Clarence Brewer, is a Missouri native who enjoyed notoriety over the years, but his 1999 debut King Clarentz release on Hightone Records made him "a household name," said Wilhelm.

Living Blues, *Discoveries*, and *Blues Revue* publications christened the release "the best debut CD of the last decade."

Brewer performs at Lions Hall on Friday night, August 27, beginning at 7:30 p.m.

The next day, at 1 p.m., he offers a slide workshop for journeyman players, followed

by another show at 2 p.m.

With a fine arts degree and articulate demeanor, Brewer is described as "the antithesis of a bluesman."

"Mere mention of his other artistic endeavor, metal sculpture, launches the artist into a bewildering dialogue of alchemy," said Wilhelm. "He is best known in his hometown for his life-size 'Mule' sculpture, a monument to the animal and symbol of slavery."

Often armed with a 1961 Silvertone complete with lipstick pickup, stomp box and tambourine, Brewer effortlessly captures a vintage 1950s sound.

"His songs range from traditional tunes about the devil, women and whiskey to modern themes of politics, fast food and spooky Halloween voodoo. King has the unique ability to appeal to the younger audiences as well as seasoned aficionados of the blues."

Tickets (\$12 for the concerts and \$20 for the workshop) are available at the door.

"Come out and support

some of the best blues you'll ever hear," said Wilhelm.

Sax-piano duo brings original sound to Music and Munch

The Perriam Abbink duo heralds the start of the fall and winter recital series of Music and Munch.

The unusual combination of piano and saxophone first delighted its island audience in the spring of last year, when pianist Jacqueline Perriam and saxophonist Erik Abbink made their Music and Munch debut.

"Their impeccable skill, together with an engaging charm and energy, makes their music accessible to music lovers of all ages," states a Music Makers press release.

Inspired by the expressive qualities of the combination saxophone and piano, Jacqueline Perriam and Erik

Abbink started giving their first performances in the Netherlands.

At their first Canadian performance in the summer of 1999, they included Murray Adaskin's work Daydreams. Adaskin was so excited about their performance that he asked them to record his work for the Adaskin Collection.

A concerted effort to explore the saxophone-piano literature resulted in a residency at the Banff Centre for the Arts where Lawrence Lesser, David Takeno, Jeremy Brown and Jane Coop helped the duo substantially.

That same year they were asked to play at the Interna-

tional Saxophone Meeting at the University of Calgary and a performance at the University of B.C. followed.

This summer the duo recorded their first CD — called Transcribed! — with works by Schumann, Vaughan Williams, Gershwin and others. It will be available in October of 2004.

For the upcoming concerts, Perriam and Abbink plan to give audiences the best of original repertoire for saxophone and piano combined with transcriptions that suit the combination so well.

Playing with conventions makes Taking Lives an odd thriller

Taking Lives is an example of what might be called a "serial-killer thriller."

Angelina Jolie plays the part of the plucky heroine (Ileana), in this case an FBI agent sent to Montreal to help explain a recent upswing in randomly found dead bodies.

Ethan Hawke plays the lover/potential serial killer (Costa), in this case a local artist who saw (or maybe participated in) one of the murders.

In this genre, it is required that there be a supposedly mind-blowing twist that completely rearranges everything we knew about an important character's motivations. Usually, it's a person we trust, who turns out to be evil.

Taking Lives, however, assumes that we are probably going to be further ahead

weirder by some curious filmmaking choices. New director D.J. Caruso takes his time setting scenes,

giving us lots of time to examine each and every word of dialogue. The cinematography is quite well done, especially for this particular genre. The score by Philip Glass (yes, that Philip Glass!) is alternately entrancing and disturbing.

Probably most interesting are the lead performances. Angelina Jolie continues to show that even the phenomenally gorgeous can act with subtlety (how she can even talk with those lips is the real mystery).

But Hawke, usually the subtle one, overacts so much

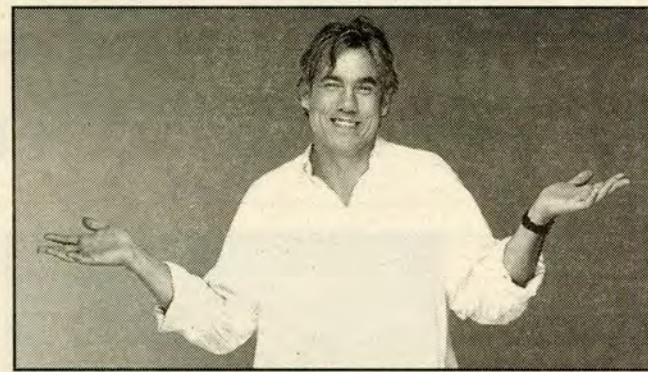
in deciphering the mystery than any of the film's characters. It refuses to give us one of those major twists, instead playing a continual game of cat and mouse.

From the moment the bright, cocky Foster steps on the screen, we realize that he is probably the bad guy. The key word here is "probably," because Taking Lives has a whole bucket of red herrings to throw at us. You think you have an idea of what's going on, then suddenly some minor character says something and maybe they are the killer.

It's weird stuff, made even

here that you can't help but think it is a riff on the "crazy bad guy" we usually get in this kind of film.

So, it's really impossible to recommend Taking Lives as a typical thriller — it's just far too slow and meditative. But for those who like Hollywood films that play with genre conventions, this one is worth a shot.

Adalian offers new writers' series

By revealing useful vocal techniques, professional theatre person Yvonne Adalian is offering her acting, teaching and directing skills in a September series to help writers improve their readings.

She says that far from selling their work, many excellent writers "actually sabotage it when they present their work to the public in a reading."

Adalian said that after sitting through hundreds of readings and squirming through hundreds more, she has a personal mission to try to change the status quo.

"It's time to stamp out the declamatory

and replace it with the meaningful," she stated in a press release. "The monotonous sing-sing style of reading poetry must go! And the inaudible flat delivery of prose should likewise be jettisoned."

The 90-minute classes, held at Ganges Yoga Studio, will be "exploratory, relaxed and fun, and a chance for writers, isolated by their profession, to work with their peers in a group setting."

After a short warm-up, students will read from their own work. Adalian has kept the price of classes low to encourage the hesitant to "give it a go."



Modern English novel course brings higher education opportunity to island

By curling up with a stack of great novels, Salt Spring's bookworms and bibliophiles can benefit from an on-island English course offered this fall through British Columbia Open University.

Beginning mid-September, retired English professor Hetty Clews will resume her role and educate local students on modern British fiction in the first for-credit course offered on Salt Spring.

Stanley Shapiro of the Salt Spring Society for Continuing Education said the course might interest people who are working towards degree completion.

"Not many people know that courses taken years ago can count towards a degree through British Columbia Open Education. Open universities are a lot more flexible. They allow you to build on what you've done in the past."

For university graduates, the class can count towards a

post-bachelor's certification that requires five three-credit courses.

"People might also be interested in taking a university-level course for the sake of it," said Shapiro, a retired professor and dean from Simon Fraser University and McGill University. "This will be a degree-credit course and people might like that challenge."

Salt Spring residents may not be aware that it's possible to earn a degree while living on the island, he said.

"We're still trying to get the word out and we found that it would be helpful if we offered some sort of course here on Salt Spring."

Shapiro approached Clews to instruct the fourth-year English course because of her many years of teaching experience at the University of Victoria and University of Saskatchewan.

"I eagerly accepted," said Clews. "I love teaching."

The course material will

consist of six modern novels published between 1920 and 1970. Works written after 1970 are considered post-modern and will not be included in the course.

"They're novels that will be familiar to most readers. If people haven't read them, they may have heard of them," said Clews.

Students will study novels by D.H. Lawrence, James Joyce and Virginia Woolf written before World War II. Post-war novels by William Golding, John Fowles and Iris Murdoch will also be examined.

"The three pre-war novels are foundational to the novel in the 20th century and they have become classics in the area of novel theory. My area of teaching specialization is novel theory," Clews said.

Grading will be based on four written assignments and a final exam, and students will have the opportunity to help develop topics.

"It's important that students learn to write clearly. There's a focus on that in the course as there is in any English course," said Clews.

"I will give as much time as is possible to the processing of the assignments with any of the students because that's important. It's very student-oriented. It's almost like private tuition."

If there are enough interested students, another course will begin in February, tentatively on the topic of modern Canadian fiction.

The course is scheduled to run on Thursday evenings for 12 weeks from 7 to 9:30 p.m. Classes will be held at Mary Hawkins Memorial Library starting September 16 and finishing December 2. The \$450 tuition fee includes books, and people aged 65 and older pay two-thirds of the price.

Off-beat movie theatre sisters' saga recalled

Once Upon a Time there were four sisters — just like in Little Women.

They loved going to the movies. The four sisters bought lots of movie magazines and even papered their bedroom walls with movie star photos.

"Many years passed, until one year three of the sisters moved to an island called Salt Spring. And it had a cinema. The three sisters put in an offer."

Now *that's* an opener. Okay — I didn't write it. That was Louise Nye's inscription on the front page of a scrapbook, one of five filled with movie-theatre memorabilia.

We met at her little house in the woods. The long gravel driveway led at last to a cottage overlooking a sun-drenched meadow. The owner greeted me from the inviting wrap-around veranda and promptly ushered me through the house, which has been hers for only a precious five months.

It was the 50th move in her lifetime and, she said confidently, the last one.

Souvenirs are everywhere, displayed on shelves, table tops, walls, including an impressive trophy inscribed "SHOWCANADA. Best promotion of a Canadian film — English. LOUISE NYE, Salt Spring Cinema. 'Margaret's Museum' 1996."

And oh, what a promotion it was. The Little Theatre That Could beat out the big guys, including Cineplex Odeon.

An old plush seat long removed from the theatre is prominently displayed in the guest room/office. A movie projection wheel sits on a shelf above. Walls painted in vivid blues and yellows are adorned with framed family photos, paintings, grandchildren's art, all a testimonial to times past and present. My immediate take on the surroundings was "off-beat charming." Rather like the owner.

Louise Nye, as this island newcomer soon realized, is a Salt Spring icon. Arthur Black interviewed her on his popular CBC radio show "Basic Black." Driftwood articles about her more spectacular promotions are dotted throughout the scrapbooks.

Louise was born in 1934,

the second of four siblings. She has pleasant memories of growing up in small-town Ontario, and the thrill of attending the Saturday night movies, a luxury in the "Dirty '30s" when money was tight. Everyone was expected to contribute; Louise's first part-time job, age 11, was potato picking at a nearby farm.

Over the years she would have 40 different jobs before settling on Salt Spring: house painter, hairdresser, furniture restorer, photographer's assistant, sales clerk, nanny — the list goes on. Other than coming from a movie-mad family, there was nothing in her background that would point to her eventual immersion in the world of "show biz." (Although she did manage a stint as a movie extra.)

Her first marriage, to a pharmaceutical salesman in Toronto, produced three children — two boys and a girl. The parents divorced (amicably, I was told.)

Now a single mom, Louise opened a rooming house, which allowed her to stay at home with the children until all three were of school age.

Louise, ever independent, reverted to her maiden name, Nye, and Nye she has remained.

In 1987 she married Brian Cornwall, a soon-to-retire businessman. On a visit to Vancouver's Expo they fell in love with the West Coast lifestyle. When they discovered Salt Spring Island, one look

was enough to convince them that here was where they wanted to be. (Sound familiar?)

They sold their Aurora home and became islanders in 1989.

Shortly after settling here, Louise was visited by her sisters, Gloria and Alberta. One evening the three women went to the movies. Of course. Before the feature began, a sign appeared on the screen: "THIS THEATRE FOR SALE."

"Let's buy it!" the sisters chorused in unison, to the amusement of patrons seated nearby.

"But wait — we don't know anything about running a theatre," Alberta cautioned, now having second thoughts.

"We can learn," piped up Louise. Agreed. One week later it was theirs.

The neophyte sisters had to learn fast. Multi-tasking was the norm. Alberta was designated projectionist, nightly racing to the booth after doling out popcorn and soft drinks at the concession stand. Gloria did the bookkeeping and took tickets. Louise chose the movies, arranged the publicity and did damage control, when necessary.

They installed real theatre seats, fine-tuned Louise's photos projected on the screen, and dreamed up inventive themes to accompany films.

For Louise, running a movie theatre was a full-time commitment; she was in for the long haul. Once things were running reasonably smoothly it was time for Alberta and Gloria to

get on with their "real lives."

Alberta went off to manage a movie theatre in Hawaii, while Gloria returned to her family and infant grandchildren. Staff were hired to replace the seemingly indispensable sisters, and the sky did not fall. The Little Theatre That Could continued as before.

After six wonderful years, Louise sold the theatre to care for a now ailing Brian, who died two years later.

Her employees — friends all — placed this notice in the Driftwood: "Please join us in celebrating Louise Nye for all her warmth, her joy of movies,

her love of photography, and so much more. Join us at 7 to sing her praises."

It was, appropriately, a night to remember.

"What do you do for fun?" I asked. Silly question.

"Go to the movies, of course," was the obvious reply.

She uses her life-time pass and presents her own inscribed bowl for a fill-up of popcorn.

We haven't heard the last of Louise Nye. She's currently writing a biography of her great-grandparents. "Someone" is interested in a screenplay. Watch for it.

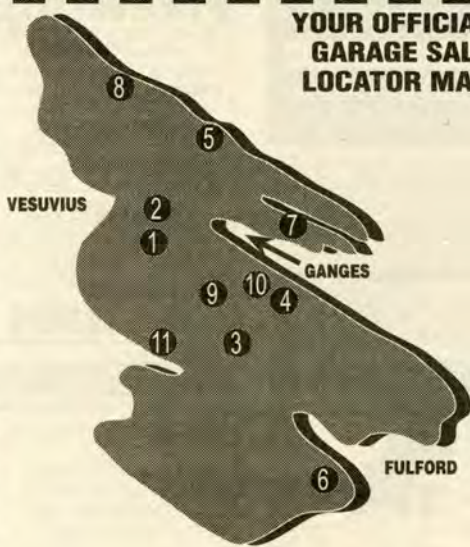
