

### Synchronicity, Japanese artists spawn intriguing art events

If you keep your ears, eyes and minds open on Salt Spring, amazing and inspiring events will unfold.

Works on Wood, a two-day exhibit, was one such happening. The Salt Spring Island-Japan Exchange Association hosted an exhibition of artisans from Yamanaka, Japan and local wood workers. The idea was tied to a cultural exchange where the seeds of collaboration could grow.

Speaking through a translator to Masanori Kamiguchi, chairman of the Yamanaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry and owner of a large hotel resort in Yamanaka, I found out that he procured a government grant to bring 20 artisans plus five officials to Salt Spring and subsequently Vancouver.

Their artisan traditions, like lacquer painting, use a generational mentoring system that results in work so fine and technically proficient that the young ages of the artists surprise.

Tomomi Nakayami, a 22-year-old female lacquer painter, delivered the most gorgeously delicate boxes and incense burners in a deeply traditional style that belied her funky cowboy boots. A fourth-generation painter, she hoped "to take advantage of the shapes and use of the grain in the wood from the Salt Spring artists to introduce more dynamic and unique concepts into her work."

Kamiguchi brought the artisans for a psychological lift as well. In Japan, much of their work is copied by factories in China and mass-

produced, lowering the value of the artisan's work. Raves from the Canadians gave a much-needed esteem boost.

They also do not market their own work but work out of collectives. The West's business paradigm of entrepreneurship also intrigues.

The Salt Spring work was varied, from functional, like Brien Foerster's paddle, to decorative like David Barclay's alder vase with wheat and birds.

David Grieg's subtly beau-

tiful console combined both beauty and function.

It was a bit like comparing apples and oranges as local artists created their work out of wood whereas most of the Japanese artists painted on already created wooden bowls, etc.

The Canadians used the natural beauty of the wood to make a statement. The Japanese recreated nature with a highly stylized painting of objects of nature.

The possibilities are endless if the two groups can collaborate. Make sure you don't miss it next time!

For Bruce Bott, making art is often a synchronistic event. Showing for the first time at the J. Mitchell Gallery until October 7, this large show has been in the making for six years.

Bott, the caretaker at Russell Island, finds wood — preferably burls as they're more interesting shapes and harder woods — then sets up on the beach and proceeds to discover what the wood and the world has to tell him.

In Young Eagle/Old Fish, a wall sculpture of an eagle attacking a salmon while the salmon chomps on his real leg with his mature salmon teeth, there were two synchronistic moments.

While he was working, an

eagle hovered directly above Bott, a sign that an eagle should be in the sculpture.

After the eagle was finished, he needed to find an eagle foot, not something one can find at Thrifty's.

That day a friend dropped by and told Bott of a friend whose wife, a most excellent housekeeper, wanted to get rid of the eagle foot that her husband had brought into the house. Ta da . . . there's the eagle foot.

Coming to Canada from the United States as a Vietnam War resistor at the age of 21, after a dream told him, "For the truth you seek, go into the sea," he became both a professional diver and enamoured of Orca whales.

That mystical connection to undersea life developed a boat builder, subsequently creating an artist who can use the same skills.

His work uses nature and animal themes, aligning with his native ideology. (His paternal grandmother was a member of Big Bear's tribe, an Alberta Plains Cree.)

While keeping the beauty of the wood and using its natural oils, he brings out characters that seem to have lived there all along.

He can then also tuck them inside rocks to create free-standing sculpture pieces.

Some of the smaller work can be sent to a foundry and bronzed, creating a work that will last forever.

### Garden Faire weekend concerts benefit local AIDS society

The Salt Spring Fall Fair weekend will see the third annual After Fair Affaire at the Garden Faire on Rainbow Road.

Evenings at the gallery and nursery/campground will feature 10 local bands, and a beer and wine garden benefit for the Gulf Islands AIDS Society (GIAS) following the daytime events of the fall fair.

"It's become an HIV/

AIDS benefit," said event organizer Shirley Taylor of Garden Faire nursery.

"We're pleased to be able to do that with Stephen Lewis at the AIDS conference on Salt Spring this weekend as well."

Following last year's success, the GIAS will once again operate the beer and wine gardens with all proceeds directed to people living in the Gulf Islands

who are suffering with HIV/AIDS to help alleviate financial stress caused by the condition.

People living with HIV/AIDS must often travel off-island for medical reasons, and incur the extra expenses of vitamins, supplements and special dietary needs.

The financial impact often comes at a time when income is lowered with dis-

ability and sick leave.

"We're still looking for sponsors," she said.


"There is no cover charge and the only revenue is from the beer gardens going to the AIDS society."

The all-ages event will feature the musical talents of Valdy, Planet Music, Simone and the Soul Intentions, Samba du Soleil, The Swells, Tarris, Gene Grooms, Atomic Blues Band and Step-

hanie Rhodes with Rebecca Nygaard.

Camping is available in the forest behind the venue with music running all evening Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

PARADISE 4 SALE runs at Lions Hall on Saturday, September 18 at 8 p.m.

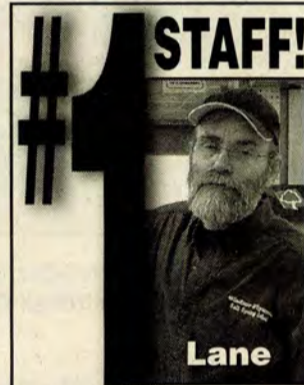

# Unbeatable folk club line-up set to be unleashed

Autumn rains have returned, but that isn't bad news for folk music fans.

Cooler weather means the eighth Salt Spring Folk Club season is just around the corner, with season tickets going on sale this weekend at the fall fair.

This year the club hosts one of Canada's most biting musical satirists, a "have-to-have-him" folk singer from Teesside, England, an East Coast legendary sensation, the U.S.A.'s answer to Connie Kaldor and a fantastic bluegrass duo with island connections.

And since a club year wouldn't be complete without the Gumboot Gala in March, there'll be one of those as well.

Guaranteed seating and earlier entry to Fulford Hall for all six concerts goes with season's ticket-holding territory, along with a slightly cheaper price (\$85 for six tickets as opposed to \$90 for six singles.) Season tickets are also transferable, so buyers don't have to attend every event.

Folk club board member Kathleen Horsdal said everyone on the board is excited about this year's line-up.

"We're really happy to be able to continue our record of offering good entertainment," she said. "It's well-balanced with different kinds of performers and genres of music."

Performers and Monday dates, matched with the above descriptions, are: Todd Butler with opening act Ross and Fauro on October 4; Vin Garbutt (Nor Folk Connection) October 25; JP Cormier (Phil Vernon) on November 22; Christine Lavin (Alan Miceli) on February 7; and The Laws (new talent showcase to open) on February 28.

The Gumboot Gala, with Bill Henderson, Valdy and guests, runs on March 21.

Folk club evenings will also feature supper, wonderful desserts and all kinds of

refreshments. This year Salt Spring wine could also be on the menu.

For the Butler show, the folk club is pleased to partner with the Salt Spring Island Conservancy in presenting a benefit for the local group, whose focus this year is species at risk.

Conservancy executive director Karen Hudson said she had hoped to book Butler for the conservancy's 10th anniversary celebration earlier this year, so was thrilled when the folk club offered co-sponsorship of an October 4 date.

"His political satire is so cutting edge and he follows the issues of the day," said Hudson, who saw Butler perform at a species at risk conference. She was impressed with the research he had done about the main topic in creating a song for the event.

"He gets to the heart of the issues," she said.

Presenting a benefit isn't new for the folk club, which has also raised funds for AIDS groups, the food bank, skatepark society and the conservancy's Mount Maxwell watershed purchase campaign.

Folk club season's tickets can be purchased with cash or a cheque at the fall fair on Saturday and Sunday, and may be reserved by calling Horsdal at 653-4689.

Individual concert tickets will go on sale two weeks before the event at Stuff 'n' Nonsense, Salt Spring Books and Acoustic Planet.

Horsdal notes that ticket prices can be kept low because of all the hours volunteer board members and others put into the effort. Board members are Kathleen Horsdal, Karen Dakin, Bill Henderson, Valdy Horsdal, Patricia and John Flanagan, Don Tarris, Harry Burton, Gary McNutt, and Harry Warner.

## Deceased poet 'Fudge' honoured

This Saturday evening at StarBooks, a gathering of local poets will honour Steve Gillespie, who passed away from a heart attack one month ago.

According to a press release from Ken Rouleau of StarBooks, Gillespie (aka Eat Lard Fudge) began his poetry career 10 years ago following his first heart attack and after the death of his mother.

"He acquired a new lease on life and went on to publish two books of poetry (Yomp and SeaBreeze) and became a popular performer, combining social justice with personal challenges, articulated in a meter best described as "Beat" and exploratory," said Rouleau.

Aside from his gift of poetry, Gillespie was universally liked and known as one of the greatest canvassers in Greenpeace history. People are invited to share their poetry and to enjoy teas, talks and some recorded video footage of Fudge in action.

The event begins at 7 p.m.

**Sale of new Tim Lawson Band CDs benefit Stephen Lewis Foundation**

The newly released Tim Lawson Band CD has hit check-out counters at several Salt Spring retail locations with a fundraising campaign for the Stephen Lewis Foundation.

Each CD sold sees five dollars donated to the Stephen Lewis Foundation and its efforts to provide care and assistance for AIDS-affected

men, women and children of Africa.

So Many Stories is Lawson's fifth CD and follows previous efforts aimed at social causes: The Quiet Canadian, Lest We Forget and Lest We Forget II.

According to Lawson, the inspiration for this form of fundraising and activism with his music was there right from the beginning with his first CD, the Quiet Canadian.

Inspired by Sir William Stephenson, who was the subject of the best-selling book *A Man Called Intrepid*, and a personal mentor of Lawson's in Bermuda in the 1980s, the CD came of Lawson's desire to do something to aid Stephenson's causes.

"I get to tell his legacy," said Lawson in an interview with the Driftwood last week. "Men should not make war on other men, but on poverty, disease and ignorance."

Amplifying the voices of other people is central to

Lawson's inspiration with *So Many Stories*, a testament to his ability to articulate his empathy and emotional response to the tragic human cost of HIV/AIDS in Africa.

"There are millions of people out there who have something to say who don't have a microphone," explained Lawson.

Why Me, the final track on the new CD, was inspired by the hour-long documentary profile of Stephen Lewis, the special UN envoy on HIV/AIDS in Africa, that was created by Salt Spring film-maker Judy Jackson and aired on *The Nature of*

Things with David Suzuki. Profoundly disturbed by the education he received from the program, he turned to his music.

"I went and grabbed a guitar and found some chords and I felt like I was being guided," said Lawson. "There were literally tears streaming down my face as I tried to find a way to dare to touch it, try to find a voice for it. It all come through in about three hours and is virtually unchanged since then."

"Anything I can do to help raise awareness of him and the problems that still exist in Africa, I will do," he said. "I think about what I didn't know before I saw the program. It ripped my heart out; the amount of suffering that was going on."

*So Many Stories* strays easily between the personal and global views of life with love songs such as *Looking Up and Could Life be Fair* blending easily with messages of universal hope in *Just Reflecting* and *You Might Not Have Noticed*.

Hope is, in fact, a singular message that Lawson sees as the background for the work as a whole.

"There's more hope every day," said Lawson.

Acting through optimism, Lawson sees his music as a tool to make a difference. With over \$75,000 donated thus far to the Royal Canadian Legion Poppy Fund through sales of earlier CDs, his musical activism has proven its potential to do just that.

Stephen Lewis will be on Salt Spring providing the keynote address at the Community to Community conference organized by Salt Spring Organization for Life Improvement and Development (SOLID) on September 19.

Lawson will perform for conference delegates.

**REFERENDUM BYLAW PASSED**

As a result, on September 8, 2004, the Board of the Capital Regional District (CRD) passed an amendment to the referendum bylaw that authorizes a referendum scheduled for November 20, 2004. If successful, the referendum vote would authorize long term borrowing of \$4,212,000 to build an indoor swimming facility and result in a tax increase of \$23.03 per \$100 000 of value for every residential property on Salt Spring. For the average value home of \$313,920, the tax increase is \$72.29.

**PLEASE HELP!**

The required tax increase can be reduced by \$11.57/ per \$100 000 value with the success of the \$2-million infrastructure grant, resulting in \$36.34 for the average value home.

The sought after infrastructure grant, however, has not yet been approved and we have no indication at present of whether or when the grant application will receive a response. We are asking our federal and provincial government representatives to expedite the granting of the \$2 Million joint federal/provincial infrastructure grant on our behalf, in order to have a clear picture of tax funds required for the project.

Please help us by voicing your concerns to our government representatives and asking them to facilitate the timely processing of our grant application in the best interests of our community.

Visitors have arrived just in time for the island's biggest event of the year — the Salt Spring Fall Fair. This year's theme is Agriculture — Our Island Tradition.

From livestock, garden and craft displays to non-stop music, demos and amazing food and beverage choices, the Farmers Institute grounds on Rainbow Road will be packed and humming with activity.

Shuttle buses run continuously from in front of the Tourist Info Centre in downtown Ganges to the fair both days.

One exciting new event sees Farmers Institute couples vie for the ultimate title of King and Queen of the Farm in a six-event contest in the livestock show-ring on Sunday from 1 to 2 p.m.

The Farmers Institute grounds on Rainbow Road will be packed and humming with activity.

The demonstration tent will be a busy place both days, with the following schedule in place.

On Saturday, from 10 a.m. to noon, Salt Spring Island Weavers Guild members will let people try their hand at weaving.

At 1 p.m., the Sweetest Apple Competition begins. Harry Burton will demonstrate and explain "the sweetest apple measurement," and spectators are encouraged to bring any produce — from corn to tomatoes and grapes — to have its sweetness tested.

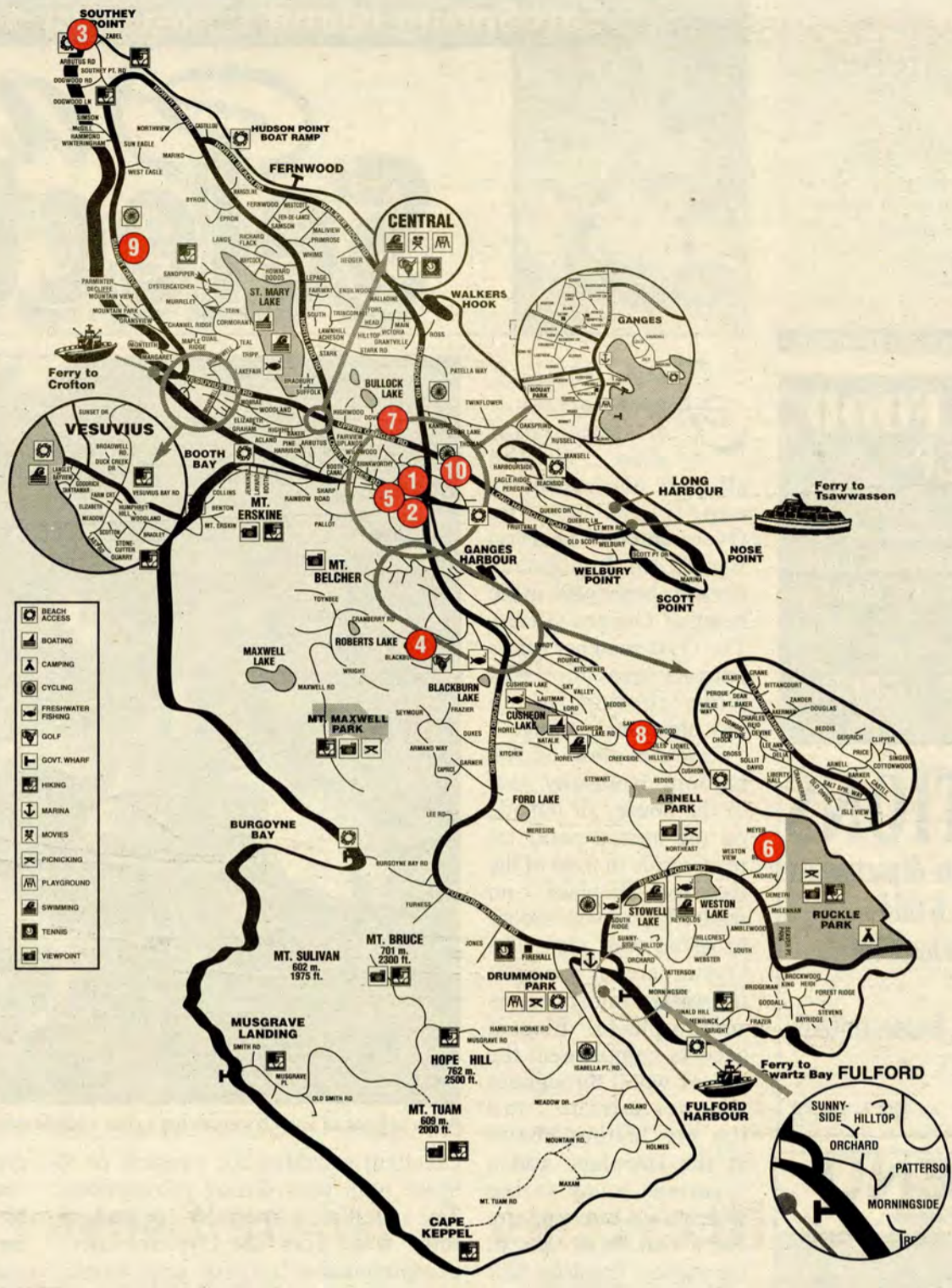

# Love of horses plus trail concerns forges bond among riders group

About 15 local equine enthusiasts have banded together to form Salt Spring Trail Riders, a group concerned about access to riding trails on the island.

"We are a very diverse group of people united by a passion for horses and a concern for the trail situation on the island. Everyone feels very strongly about the need to maintain trail access, in part to maintain the rural ambiance of the island," said Patricia Lockie, a competitive show rider.

"Development has certainly encroached on a number of trails and reduced the amount of land available for recreational riding at a time when the horse population is growing."

The group hopes to see existing trails maintained and expanded for recreational riders, said Lockie, who has been riding for 20 years.

"Many private landowners do offer access to trail riders. Even large land owners have been kind enough to allow riders to come through. We don't go out in huge hordes. The groups are very small, usually just one or two riders at a time," said Lockie, who noted that Salt Spring Trail Riders are insurance-carrying members of the Horse Council of B.C.

"Trail riders are mature, responsible individuals who believe it is a privilege, not a right, to have access to trails."

The group hopes that planning committees will consider developing multi-use trails in their manage-

ment plans, like Beaver Lake Park and Galloping Goose Trail on Vancouver Island, she said.

"The newly created Burgoyne Bay Provincial Park has a history of equestrian usage on logging trails and at Camp Narnia. Wouldn't this be a wonderful permanent home for Salt Spring's Pony Club and for the Therapeutic Riding Association?"

"The bottom line is that there is now a critical mass of horses and riders pursuing a wide diversity of equestri-

an activities, both on and off the island, but with limited opportunities for trail riding here, and with no fixed equestrian facility," said Lockie, adding that trail riders can act as environmental stewards for areas that hikers can't access.

Kim Mowatt, a registered psychiatric nurse who has been riding since she was a child, agrees that the Salt Spring Trail Riders is a respectful group that endeavors to keep trails clean.

"There might be a mis-

conception about riders on trails and about where horses should be. We're not galloping through in disregard for people's property. We're respectful and ask permission. We just want it to be something that's accepted.

"Of course, we'd be willing to offer any property owners a chance to ride if they wanted the experience," said Mowatt, who teaches therapeutic benefits of horseback riding through her business Healing Horses.

Through twice-weekly lessons she took from Mowatt last year, Salt Spring resident Andrea Collins developed a passion for trail riding.

"The experience of riding in a natural environment is exhilarating, peaceful and fun. Something magical happens when we open ourselves up to the healing energies of the horse," said Collins, who noticed physical, emotional and psychological changes in herself after she started riding.

"On a less positive note, many of our trails are being lost to logging and development. [Salt Spring Trail Riders] was formed to help map trails and protect them. We can also act as wardens, especially in areas like Burgoyne Bay," she said.

"Our group is planning to affiliate with the Back Country Horsemen of B.C. We're hoping this will help us connect with many of the lone riders on Salt Spring Island and bring more awareness of the value of trail riding to the larger community."

was born and educated in Canada but worked for British Intelligence during World War II.

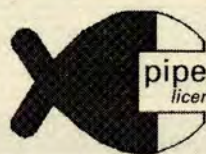
A seeker into the meaning of life, she eventually met fellow seekers Peter and Eileen Caddy in the 1940s.

Any remaining seating will be open to the public at 7:30 p.m. for \$5.



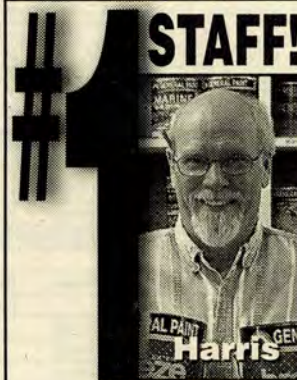

# Houses, black holes and GHG

This weekend you can visit the Earth Festival Society booth at the Fall Fair to sign up for the One Tonne Challenge. This article is one of a series looking at island solutions to greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) and climate change. The One Tonne Challenge, part of the island's Community Energy Strategy, invites everyone to participate in identifying and reducing their individual contributions to GHG.

Winter is coming, fuel prices are rising and BC Hydro rates are now over seven cents per kwh — up from just under six cents.

Now is a good time to winterize your home and fix those "black holes" of energy loss.

Saving electricity not only saves dollars, it also reduces GHG. Although 90 per cent of B.C.'s electricity is currently generated from hydropower and produces few GHG emissions, when a light bulb is turned off on Salt Spring, less fossil fuel is needed to generate electricity somewhere else on our interconnected North American grid system.

Home heating accounts for much of our annual home energy use. Firewood is a readily available and renewable fuel. One of the advantages of using firewood is that it is locally grown and supplied — heating dollars are kept on-island. However, firewood is responsible for much of the local air pollution, producing large quantities of carbon monoxide, methane (which is a potent GHG), volatile organic compounds and particulate matter.

To reduce pollutants, ensure your wood is dry — it should be seasoned under cover for at least one full year — and that you are using an EPA-rated, low-emission, high-efficiency wood stove.

Other options for efficient, clean burns include pellet stoves, which can reduce

air pollution by up to 90 per cent, and contra flow masonry heaters, which burn hot, clean and fast and then slowly radiate the stored heat.

What is the best way to save dollars and energy, and cut GHG emissions? An EnerGuide for Houses energy assessment is a good way to answer these questions. The ideal time for an assessment is before any major planned change, such as renovations, window upgrades, or heating system replacement. The program provides subsidized home assessments and identifies ways to improve your home's efficiency. Grants are available to homeowners who use the EnerGuide program to improve the energy performance of their homes.

When choosing a major appliance, look for an Energy Star-rated model. Today's energy-efficient refrigerators use 70 per cent less energy than models made 20 years ago, while today's dishwashers are 60 per cent more energy efficient than those bought in 1984. Low-flow showerheads save as much as 60 per cent of the water used by conventional fixtures.

Below are three stories from Salt Springers who have had an EnerGuide for Houses assessment, to show what sort of changes people are making to their homes.

## The Rainbow House

It was built in the late 60s, when single-paned windows were the norm, not a lot of insulation was used and people didn't worry about drafts. The house was being renovated, which provided the opportunity to improve energy efficiency at the same time. The main motivation for making improvements was to reduce fuel bills. The peak bill in the winter of 2003 was \$500 for a four to six-week period.

The Rainbow House received a "really poor" energy-efficiency rating, partly because of the large expanse of north-facing single glazing. During the "blower door" test, the owner was "staggered by where the air was coming from — corners and cracks you wouldn't

even think of as drafty."

The assessment shaped a few of the renovations: gaps were filled and caulked, and insulation in the attic will be tripled. The interior finish in the living room was being replaced, so more insulation was added behind the new drywall. All of the windows will be upgraded to energy efficient, low-E sealed units with some argon-filled.

Some openable windows were replaced by fixed glass to reduce air leakage, and window areas were reduced.

Special heat-saving blinds will be purchased for the larger windows. The old oil furnace will be replaced with a more efficient unit.

## The Sunset House

The owners built the Sunset House in 1979. The house has good solar exposure, a metal roof and stucco exterior. Windows are sealed double units.

Six-inch thick walls provide good insulation. The home is heated primarily with firewood, with electric baseboards for extra comfort.

Fireplaces are found in the living room, bedroom and each of the downstairs rooms. A wood cookstove in the kitchen also provides space heating. The owners are now in their 70s, and don't want to rely on hauling and chopping wood.

The Sunset House was rated "a bit above average" for its energy performance. To reduce heating costs and eliminate the need to burn firewood, the owners decided to install a heat pump. Upgrading their heating system will also improve the resale value of the house. Their new air-source heat pump is about three times more efficient than baseboard heating. The owners also upgraded the insulation and drywall in the basement.

## The Cottage

Owner-built in the 1950s, this two-level, stick-frame house had single-glazed aluminium windows, an oil furnace and an open fireplace.

Attic and walls had minimal insulation. The owner had plans to do a "gut" reno-

vation on the home. He was motivated to have an EnerGuide assessment to recuperate some of the money invested in the renovation. The owner wanted to learn which options would keep operating costs to a minimum stating, "Why pay more energy costs than necessary?"

The old oil furnace was removed, as were all oil heat sources, single-paned windows, insulation, wiring and old plumbing. New energy efficient vinyl windows were installed.

Additional inches of insulation were added by attaching new horizontal strapping to bring the insulation rating to R20. The roof will be insulated to a minimum of R28.

Inefficient forced-air heating was replaced with radiant heating. A propane fireplace will provide additional heating and the wood-burning fireplace will be closed off to prevent heat loss.

Individual needs and circumstances determine the investments that we make in energy efficiency. You may not be able to afford to switch to wind power, solar power, or radiant heating systems, but simple lifestyle choices, such as switching off lights and turning down thermostats, go a long way.

To save energy at home, think like your grandparents! Switch off lights as you leave the room, and turn down the thermostat at night.

Electronic appliances such as TVs, sound systems, and computers consume power in standby mode. Plug them into power bars and switch off at the power bar when not in use to eliminate these phantom loads.

Winterize the house in fall: add storm windows to single-glazed windows — heat-shrink plastic works well as a temporary solution; seal up unneeded windows and doors; and caulk obvious drafty cracks.
