

# 'Music has no borders' as Glass Onion opens stage

Islanders won't need to mourn a lack of live music venues any longer.

Following recent closures of night spots Moby's Marine Pub and Anise Restaurant, the Glass Onion is already providing live entertainment every week, along with existing spots like the Fulford Inn, The Local, Shipstones and both Tree House cafes.

"I think it's a great opportunity because obviously there has been a void and music is always something we have been interested in," said Glass Onion owner Teija Heikkila.

"We did a little bit of music when Anise and Moby's were still there but we realized there was already established venues for that."

But Heikkila and her partner Peggy Barron received many compliments about their restaurant and numerous people approached them to play there, she said.

"When the Moby's thing happened, we thought, 'Okay, let's take it on.' Businesses evolve and there's a need and we want to fill that."

And the restaurateurs are excited about the changes brought on by initiatives from local musicians Gene Grooms, Terry Warbey and Lisa Maxx.

"Things typically happen

for a reason. How all this is coming together and kind of making us go in that direction is pretty exciting."

They will be hosting open stage nights on Wednesdays, comedy and theatre events on Thursdays and live music on weekends, she said.

"Understanding that people who just want to listen to music might not want a full dinner, our chefs are developing a late night menu," she said.

Their philosophy for organic, locally supplied ingredients will still extend

into traditional pub fare items like chicken wings, nachos and pizza.

She is also looking into expanding their selection of Gulf Islands Brewery beers on tap.

"It's all about broadening the base."

The Amazing Sundogs kicked off entertainment at the music venue last week and Lisa Maxx and her Younger Man Band will perform on Saturday.

"It's the YJP rhythm section," Maxx said. "I thought I would get to learn a whole

bunch of jazz standards but the boys just want to rock," she laughed.

They plan to offer tunes by the Police, Bob Marley, Van Morrison, the Beatles and tons of other stuff, she said.

Maxx is also set to coordinate live entertainment for the rest of the summer and beyond.

She's already arranged for Swamperella, a Cajun band from Toronto, to play on July 29.

"We are going to charge a cover because they are coming from Toronto. But gener-

ally we will try not to charge a cover," she said.

"We will fill the month of August with local bands to show the tourists some of our island talent. And then moving in to September and the fall, we will bring in some off-island bands, so the locals can have a variety of music."

Theme nights are also planned - starting with a Mardi Gras theme for Swamperella on July 29.

"I'm encouraging people to come in costume."

**M&M reaps annual Flower Festival**

**Harmer strikes common chord**

Sara Harmer may make her home on the shores of Lake Ontario, but a riveting performance delivered to a crowded Beaver Point Hall Thursday night proved her music speaks to the imaginations of listeners across the country.

As evening turned to night, Harmer wooed concert-goers with songs of lost lovers, drafty basement apartments and tales from the Canadian landscape.

Judging from the crowd's reaction, water, trees and jilted lovers are as much a part of island life as they are on the fringes of the Canadian Shield.

So entranced was the audience, it was not until Harmer forbade people from sitting down during a 30-minute encore that the youthful crowd began to swing their hips on the dance floor.

On numerous occasions between Chad Van Gaalen's opening guitar riffs and an improvised version of Michael Jackson's *Billy Jean*, it seemed unlikely the

rustic south-end venue could withstand the pressures from the three-hour-long folk-rock extravaganza.

Harmer seemed to relish the opportunity to play at Beaver Point Hall, recalling the many times she had driven by the site while living on the island one summer in the early 1990s.

As the show proceeded, Harmer recalled numerous Salt Spring memories from that summer long ago.

Overall, Harmer's music may not span the musical spectrum but each song contains intricately crafted lyrics that set them apart and helped her latest album, *All of Our Names*, receive a Juno Award earlier this year.

Many numbers performed at Thursday's show have been in Harmer's repertoire for more than a decade and though she may not be the most prolific songwriter, her attention to detail and continual polishing reveals a strong commitment to her craft.

The visit to Salt Spring and a previous night's show in Tofino marked the beginning of an extensive Western Canadian tour on the summer folk concert circuit.

The current tour follows a spring Harmer spent walking and playing shows along southern Ontario's Bruce Trail to raise awareness of Niagara Escarpment development concerns.

"I figured that as well as going to meetings, hiring experts, learning about the application process, and meeting with countless planners and politicians, I could also round up some musical friends and set off to walk the Bruce Trail along the escarpment and play shows along the way," she writes on her website.

That Harmer can still find the time to visit smaller communities and use music as a tool for change rather than as an end in itself confirms a long-lasting loyalty to the land and people that contributes so much to her inspiration and success.

"Stare. It is the way to educate your eye, and more. Stare, pry, listen, evesdrop. Die knowing something. You are not here long."

# Irish heritage soars through Rosheen

From jigs and reels to authentic-sounding original works, Rosheen's spirited and vivid performances transport listeners to the fairy realm of Irish soul.

Rosheen performs as part of the Sizzling Summer Nights festival at ArtSpring on Friday, July 22 at 8 p.m.

The seven-member group may come from Quebec, but their music seems to come straight from the Emerald Isle — it's that authentic.

Moving from flute-haunted ballad to the dancing reel style and back again, Rosheen is described as "ethereal and lovely, from its lilting female vocalist to its violin and harp. Celtic groups come and go, but Rosheen stands out for its exceptional ability to move between lament and dance style with equally deft precision."

Well known in Canada and gaining a following among Celtic music aficionados in the United States, the septet was founded in 1997 by singer-songwriter Lynn Vallieres, a self-taught singer

whose Irish heritage helped inspire a lifelong love for Celtic music.

In addition to the crystal voice of Vallieres (recorder and bodhran), six seasoned and versatile musicians make up the band; Michel Henault (guitar, arranger-composer and writer), multi-instrumentalist Gregoire Painchaud (keyboard, piano, violin, mandolin and arranger-composer), Kattialine Painchaud (violin and harp), François Matte (wooden flute, tin whistle), François Guilbault (double bass and bass) and Christian Pare (percussion and drums).

Rosheen is the third performance in ArtSpring's summer line-up of 11 concerts featuring international talent. Highlights include Canada's famed women's choir, Elektra, Divas of Diversity, showcasing Armenian and Arabic music, and Deep Cove Jazz, comprised of four of Canada's best-known jazz musicians.

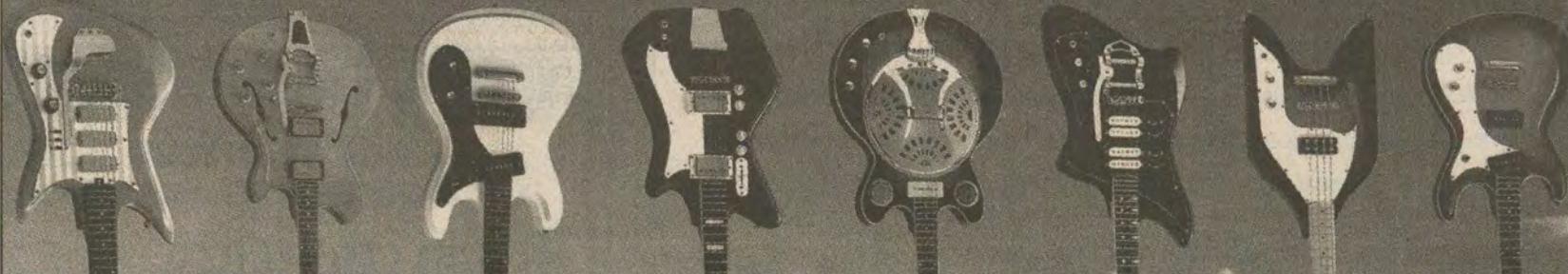

## Cherneff show celebrates 30 years

Gary, Beth and Lisa Cherneff celebrate 30 years of artistic achievement on Salt Spring by inviting the public to their workshops, galleries and gardens to view and purchase current work this weekend.

The event is on July 23-24 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at their 520 Long Harbour Road property.

Gary and Beth Cherneff came to Salt Spring 30 years ago and immediately set to work establishing pottery and weaving studios, while working towards building and occupying a cottage on their property. Two years later their daughter Lisa was born.

Although Gary and Beth still live at their property, the cottage is now a pottery studio and gallery and Beth long ago transformed her art practice from weaver to floral designer. Lisa, who maintained through her teens that she would never become an artist, has returned to Salt Spring Island with her Bachelor of Fine Arts and is now an artist/craftsperson, making extraordinary jewellery from her flame-worked glass beads.

Artistic highlights of the last 30 years for Gary include the coordination of a workshop tour by Japanese potter Ichizo Yamashita, in conjunction with the Shad-

bolt centre in Burnaby and local Salt Spring groups. In addition, he was a coordinator of the Exhibition of West Coast Contemporary Ceramics at ArtSpring and at the forefront of planning for an arts exchange between Salt Spring Island and Yamana-ka, Japan.

Beth's reputation as a floral designer continues to grow. Her arts background has given her the tools to mold the colour and form of flowers into exceptional compositions. She occasionally collaborates with Vancouver designers and regularly attends floral events there as well. Beth recently returned from three days in

Seattle, where she attended the yearly National Symposium for the American Institute of Floral Designers.

Lisa's post-art-school interest in glass was kindled through her experience working at the New-Small Sterling Glass Gallery on Granville Island. She has now set up her studio on Salt Spring and her work has already reached consumers as far away as New York.

In addition to the Cherneffs' weekend show and sale from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., a special opening takes place on July 22 from 6-9 p.m., featuring the jazzy grooves of Alvaro Sanchez and his group "Sweetwater."

## Flick Pick

Visual treats and good, silly fun combine in Constantine



Constantine stars Keanu Reeves as the titular hero, a grizzled and grumpy demon-buster who hopes his good deeds will get him into Heaven. He's got cancer, and needs to move fast.

He gets his opportunity when spunky detective Angela (Rachel Weisz) seeks him out looking for help with the apparent suicide of her twin sister. It doesn't take long before the two discover the wicked plot of Satan's own son to break down the walls between Hell and Earth.

Constantine's cosmology is fascinating. God and Satan have been using Earth as a sort of toy as one character remarks, God sees our world as an "ant farm." Somehow, this isn't as depressing as it sounds, and wondering whether Constantine himself will find the faith necessary for salvation provides the suspense.

Let's not push the film as some kind of intellectual treatise, though. It's really more of a comic book (and of course, that's what it's based on), and is more about excitement and flash than any serious thought.

At this level, Constantine is good, silly fun. First-time director Francis Lawrence, a graduate of pop music videos, shows he can make a good looking and thrilling action film without resorting to seizure-inducing editing or frenzied pacing.

He's obviously skilled visually. We're treated to some frighteningly beautiful sequences, most tellingly Constantine's thoroughly unpleasant quick jaunt to visit Hell. It looks just like L.A. today, except there is a furious burning wind and the sky is, well, flaming orange.

And, as always, I'm going to come to Keanu Reeves' aid. This guy takes way too much flack. Here,

just like he was in *The Matrix* and *Speed*, he's the ideal charismatic action hero. There's just something about the clumsy way he delivers a comic line, always so deadpan, yet you never get the feeling he's not taking everything deadly serious.

He also knows how to play the role blandly enough so that the more colourful surrounding characters have room to breathe. Here, we've got not only the gorgeous Rachel Weisz as the heroine but two great meaty roles for the mysterious Tilda Swinton (as the androgynous Archangel Gabriel) and the creepy Peter Stormare (as a slimy lounge-lizard-ish Satan).

The four of them combine for a climax that is both thought-provoking and twisty, plot-wise. I had no idea how things would turn out, which is always a pleasant experience when we're talking about the big-budget blockbuster.

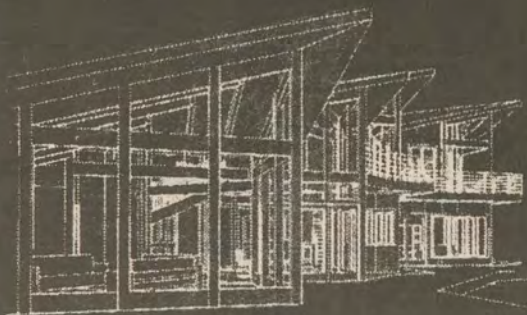

1 lb. fresh asparagus, 2-inch pieces

Stir together ricotta, cream, parmesan and seasonings. Cook pasta in boiling salted water until not quite done. Add asparagus and cook for three minutes. Drain. Reserve two tbsp. of cooking water. Return pasta and asparagus to pan, add reserved water to ricotta mixture, pour over hot pasta and toss together. Serve topped with almonds and parsley.

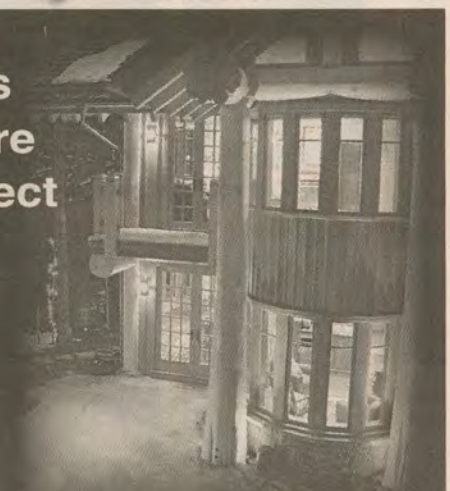

## Fibre Festival splashes island weekend with wearable colour

Big, bold and guaranteed to bemuse — the Fibre Festival Fashion Show will hit the ArtSpring stage on Saturday, July 23, with entries from local artists, student designers and internationally known fibre and textile craftspeople from across Canada.

The Fashion Show is one of several events comprising the fourth annual Natural Fibre Festival from July 20-26, with public events Friday through Sunday.

People are urged to drop by the Farmers Institute on Saturday and Sunday for demonstrations and displays of some of the fibre techniques used in the garments; some of the animals that provide the materials for them; a sheep-shearing demonstration showing how the fleece that provides the fibre is harvested; and wonderful vendors of fibre, fabric and finished goods — some of whom will be showing their work in the Fashion Show.

Organizers say this year's submissions seem to have sorted themselves into four themes: earthy, futuristic, theatrical, and elegant — an indication of the scope of the show.

As always, the Fashion Show will highlight work done largely in natural fibres, but this year there will be a special sub-group of garments constructed in "weird and wonderful" fabrics: the fibre of pineapple plants; a sweater made from dog-hair; and items made from hemp and some "man-made" natural fibres like Soy Silk.

Also for the first time will be live on-stage music provided by Addi Perkins and Friends.

The show will be "choreographed" by Jill Smith, and Jane Stafford will be her inimitable self as the MC. And once again, there will be a Meet the Designers tea during intermission, with treats from Jana of Jana's Bake Shop.

Tickets are available at the ArtSpring box office (537-2102).

This year some designers will display their entries on Sunday, July 24 at the Farmers Institute.

In addition to displays and demos for a \$5 admission, basketry and knitting workshops are available for children — basketry only on Saturday with both offered Sunday. Just register for the \$20 workshops at the festival.

A free shuttle bus will run to the Farmers Institute grounds on Rainbow Road from the Tourist Info Centre.

Food and refreshments are also available on site.

Creativity is served at a Friday night keynote dinner with Shirlee Lewis, Barb McCaffrey and Diana Sanderson at Stowel Lake Farm on Reynolds Road. If any tickets are available, they may be acquired by calling 537-9533.

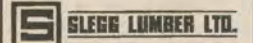

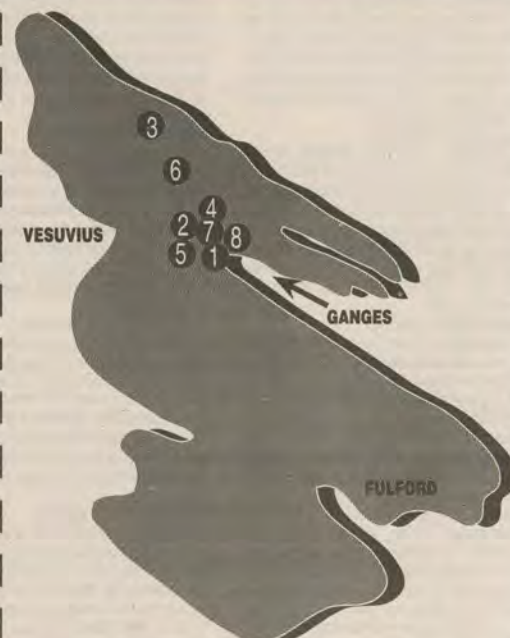
