

Photo Synthesis illuminates photo art

From the sublime to the merely excellent, the Photo Synthesis photography group show at ArtSpring running till August 14, features 25 artists, including a selection of images from the annual Day in the Life special edition of the Driftwood newspaper.

I loved Eric Klemm's new Backstreet Series.

Backstreet #303 shows a back alley with a blue and yellow mural of trees on the left side with the same daylight colours infused throughout. A car is in the distance but facing the viewer, headlights beaming. A red dumpster is placed just off centre, and on closer examination there's a small girl child dressed in a furry dog suit sitting, with her legs dangling, on the dumpster. Stunning!

A few artists morphed their photos into the painting realm, either through composition, medium or imagination.

Birgit Freybe Bateman's Demoiselle Cranes on Sand Dunes (Keechan, India), produced on canvas by Tarris Imaging, suggests a painting with its two-tone background and sparsely placed objects.

Demoiselle Crane Triptych confirms that it's not just the surface that makes one look closer, but also the composition. Hundreds of elegant birds look personally placed by Freybe Bateman as the repetitive patterning of identical objects offers dynamic juxtaposition against a wing ready to take off.

Alan Bibby's Bark Mountain and Rock Forms uses that same patterning to create images that look like something different than

what they are.

Michael Levy's work indicates he is moving in a somewhat different direction. His small, beautifully framed black and whites use the age-old tradition of the nude. Surprisingly, they are not human but are created from run-off in the sand.

Stephen Friedman's work of two rocks seemingly floating in mid air about a pool of water confused and confounded me. Was Clouds and Rocks digitally manoeuvred or was it that nature and the photographer saw an

opportunity to create art? Check the title tab beside the photo.

Many of the photographers used their travels for their inspiration.

Diana Hayes pulled together a gorgeous series from her travels to Paris, Greece, Ireland and Mexico. Buy them all, I say, to get the full effect.

Though Ken Ketchum's photos of tall ships were actually taken in Victoria — he was one of a few photographers invited to chronicle the international tall ship festival, they have a definite foreign edge that suggest travel. Cunning composition


elevates these to art.

Mexico, as Alane Lalonde sees it, is colourful, hot and vibrant.

Any Salt Spring photography show should include nature shots with David Borrowman's flowers, Kim Kornbacher's depth-filled reflections, and Tamar Griggs' waning and waxing moons fitting the bill.


A pleasure to see human form, Eric Onasick's black and white Rehearsal Break features a slumped woman sitting at a grand piano. Her posture says it all, as does Shari Macdonald's Baby, which clearly celebrates a new life.

Organizers are to be applauded, as is Nicola Wheston, who hung the show.

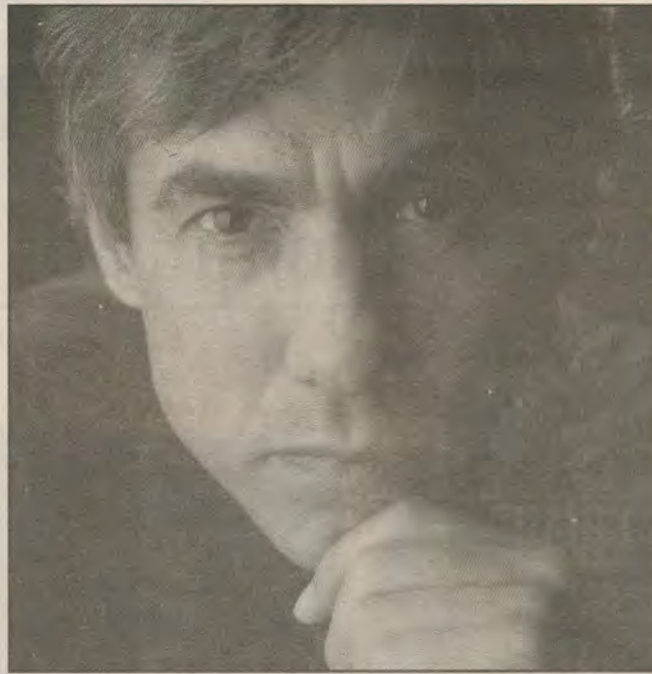

Galleons displays Zimbel photos

Galleons Lap Gallery will be exhibiting over two dozen photographs by George S. Zimbel, beginning July 29.

According to Galleons Lap owner Seth Berkowitz, this is a rare opportunity for those living on the West Coast to view and purchase these original photographic art images.

A professional photographer in the U.S.A. and Canada for more than 60 years, Zimbel pioneered the photo essay style during the era when large-format, glossy magazines emphasized photography as a medium for presenting narratives.

"His trademark way of working was 'non-interventionist,'" says Berkowitz, "which allowed him to capture his subjects without injecting himself into the composition."

Images being shown at Galleons Lap range from a series of iconic portraits of Marilyn Monroe and a ground-breaking series of images from the Nixon-Kennedy TV debates, to a whimsical portrait of three children on a beach.

"My work begins with recording an image, but it's not done until I have made a fine print," states Zimbel.

Collectors can be assured that the images are both created and quality controlled by the photographer himself, who now lives and works in Montreal.

This show of 30 original photographic art images is being loaned to Galleons Lap Gallery by the Stephen Bulger Gallery in Toronto and is running in conjunction with the annual Salt Spring group photography show at ArtSpring.

The George Zimbel show runs for three weeks at the Park Drive gallery in Ganges. An opening reception takes place Friday, August 5 from 5 to 8 p.m.

Music and Munch features YJP in farewell concert

On Wednesday, August 3, Music and Munch presents the "Young Jazz Players" (YJP) in their sixth and perhaps final performance in the lunchtime recital series.

The popular ensemble of six local jazz musicians have all graduated from Gulf Islands Secondary School and will be travelling their separate ways in the fall.

The YJP are familiar to residents and tourists alike, having performed everywhere from the Saturday Market to the Fibre Festival Fashion show last weekend.

The rhythm section of the group also performs with singer Lisa Maxx under the name Lisa Maxx and her Younger Man Band.

Original band members include Addi Perkins on alto sax, Ed Perkins on guitar, Garrett Macdonnell on

tenor sax, Simon Millerd on trumpet, Ben Sanchez on bass, and Devon Banman on drums.

Banman, unfortunately absent for this performance, will be ably replaced by Luke Geifing, a Grade 10 student at GISS.

The future looks bright for the young musicians and plans for the fall include Millerd studying jazz trumpet at Humber College in Toronto, Sanchez attending Langara University College to study photography, and Addi and Ed Perkins and MacDonnell all heading to U.B.C.

Banman will remain on Salt Spring for a year to work and save funds for his "grand adventure."

This free performance of jazz standards begins at 12:10 p.m. at All Saints by the Sea, followed by an optional lunch for \$5.50.

Flick Pick

Bloom throws it all out there, with questionable results

Bloom is the film adaptation of James Joyce's famous novel Ulysses. Stephen Rea plays the title character Leopold Bloom, a Jewish advertising salesman living in Dublin in 1904.

The story takes place over one day in Bloom's, shall we say, mediocre life. He leaves his wife Molly at home, knowing full well she is meeting another man that afternoon, and goes on a minor odyssey of errands and trifles around Dublin.

Along the way he becomes somewhat of a father figure to burgeoning artist Stephen Dedalus, argues with an anti-Semite, ogles young ladies and has a series of humorous hallucinations.

Joyce's novel is commonly seen as one of the most important works of English literature, and maybe the most difficult as well. It is over 600 pages of varying styles: first person, third person, stream of consciousness, stage play, scientific journal, and so on. It doesn't help that the text has some sort of allusion every sixth word (the annotations need a whole separate book).

All of this makes for a pretty impossible adaptation. Novel and the film are completely different mediums, especially when you're talking about style.

Story is one thing — that's why a bad book (presumably one with no discernable style) can make a good movie. But a good book is one that uses words and sentences to maximum effect. Ulysses is all about the text: the shape of it, the way it flows, the way it at once teaches and lies to the reader. How can Bloom possibly recreate any of this in pictures?

It doesn't, preferring instead to focus on the novel's vulgarity and absurdity, and to maximize the quirkiness factor. Everything, from the semi-period piece aesthetic, to the cloying oh-so-Irish music, to Stephen Rea's annoyingly hammy performance, screams "We don't know what we want, so we'll just throw it all in there."

In fact, I get the impression that Bloom is more about making the novel accessible to a more mainstream (Irish) audience, a bit of nationalistic mythmaking if you will. A hint: the closing sequence after the credits has Bloom himself stepping into a modern-day Dublin, linking Ulysses (and all of its renown) with Ireland today, for no apparent reason.

I'm not saying that it's wrong to play on peoples' patriotism by re-exposing them to their cultural history, but a complex and iconoclastic work like Ulysses isn't exactly the best vehicle.

World's best youth orchestra lands on island Saturday

If proof is needed to confirm that the future of Canada's orchestral music is in good hands, audiences need simply to listen to the National Youth Orchestra of Canada (NYOC).

Known for performances that often surpass the pros, The NYOC performs outdoors at Gulf Islands Secondary on Saturday, July 30.

Quite possibly the largest group of musicians to perform on Salt Spring Island, the orchestra brings a spectacular program of orchestral music, including Prokofiev's explosive, vibrant Symphony No. 5.

Following the NYOC's 1996 Tokyo performance, delegates of the World Youth Orchestra Conference Festival declared the NYOC as being "the best youth orchestra in the world." In 2002, the NYOC returned to Asia to perform at the same festival as well as tour parts of Japan and China.

Since opening its doors

as an innovative training program 45 years ago, the National Youth Orchestra has been one of this country's great artistic success stories, nurturing the talents of aspiring young musicians from coast to coast.

Fine weather has been reserved for the Saturday, July 30 performance, which begins at 7 p.m., so people should bring their picnic suppers, blankets and lawn chairs to the Gulf Islands Secondary School soccer field.

The National Youth Orchestra of Canada performance is part of ArtSpring's Sizzling Summer Nights Festival, which is sponsored by Pegasus Gallery of Canadian Art.

A cappella divas serve up vocal feast

Sue Johnson is relaxing with her morning coffee in Melbourne, Australia when she takes a Driftwood call on Friday afternoon.

But her mind easily leaps ahead to the debut Canadian tour of her acclaimed a cappella group — Coco's Lunch — which hits ArtSpring on Tuesday, August 2.

"We got the invitation from Festival Vancouver, and once that came through we just built a tour around it. That was the springboard, the gig it is all centering on."

Coco's Lunch may be a novel musical meal for Canadians, but they're a cherished national favourite in Australia and roused serious appetites in Europe last year.

"When we went to Europe it was amazing the response we got," says Johnson. "We got a standing ovation at the first concert, so we hope that happens in Canada."

The five-member, all-female group merges high energy with heartfelt lyrics and a range of compositional styles.

"It's all very sophisticated, musically. We like complex rhythms, we all play percussion and drums, and love experimenting with harmony."

The five band members, who have been together for eight years, all contribute original songs to their repertoire. Singers/composers are Nicola Eveleigh, Lisa Young, Gabrielle MacGregor, Jacqueline Gawler and Johnson.

"Everyone has something they bring to the music that is their own sort of voice," observes Johnson.

The group has earned a buffet full of awards from Australian performing arts organizations, and won Best Folk/World Song from the American-based Contemporary A Cappella Recording Awards, and a runner-up nod for Best Folk/World Album of the Year in 2003.

"It's a lovely affirmation for your work when you get something like that. It affirms that you're on the right track."

Coco's Lunch is also known for its children's songs and tarted-up adult versions of classics, such as Miss Muffet "live at the Tuffetts' Jazz Club."

Tuesday's concert begins at 8 p.m. Tickets are available through the ticket centre at 537-2102, by dropping in to the arts centre, or via tickets@artspring.ca.

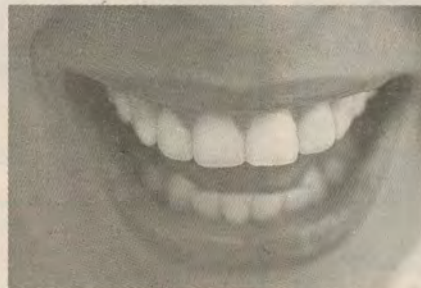

Cutting-edge metal bands set to educate islanders

Evan Hardy wants to bring some hard-core culture to Salt Spring with a benefit dance set for Friday, August 5.

Hardy, who grew up on the island but now lives in Vancouver, has invited four hard-core/metal bands to perform at Meaden Hall, beginning at 7 p.m.

Golden Phoenix, A Textbook Tragedy, Starless Nights and April are set to tour in the fall both inside Canada and beyond, but have put Salt Spring on the summer performance roster.

With a solid Lower Mainland following, Starless Nights opened for My Chemical Romance and The Used during the Taste of Chaos Tour in Vancouver this year and recently released their first EP, called This Perpetual Heartbeat.

"No show is ever boring and no show-goer ever forgets Starless Nights," asserts the band's website.

A Textbook Tragedy has

played on the 2004 Vans Warped Tour and their music is praised by AbsolutePunk.net.

"Aggressive instrumentals and powerful vocals combine for a sound that can't really be classified as anything but 'crazy.' Taking influence from bands like The Dillinger Escape Plan, Botch and Refused, the band uses elements of metal and hardcore, as well as jazz and ambient rock in their songs.

"All of these sounds combined often conflict in wonderful ways, forming an original and furious sound that will take the listener on a different journey with each song."

Hardy is interested in trying his hand at promoting music and wanted to help the Core Inn Youth Project at the same time.

"I want to open people's eyes to something different and I didn't want any money for it."

Admission for the dance is \$7 at the door.

Ojibway artist visits Thunderbird Gallery

Cowichan Valley artist Ice Bear holds his first Salt Spring exhibit when Thunderbird Gallery hosts his work from July 29 through August 13.

Ice Bear (also known as Chris Johnson) will be at the gallery over the opening weekend, working on a large

yellow cedar bas relief.

Salt Spring Eco-home owners set to open doors for tour

How many homes are on the first Salt Spring Eco-Home Tour?

That depends on whether you count the work-in-progress in the total: if you do, it's 13, if not, it's 12. But if you're in charge of organizing the event sponsored by the Salt Spring Island Conservancy and the One-Tonne Challenge, then you might be inclined to make a joke and say "12 and a half."

In any event, says tour coordinator Karen Hudson, it won't be physically possible to visit all 13 sites, whose owners were thrilled to participate in the inaugural event on Sunday, July 31.

Homes include those constructed using straw bales, cob and rammed earth, and some with alternative energy sources or water systems.

One of the first homes without a well to acquire a building permit — seven years ago — is also included.

All properties have a variety of fascinating features — which may make it tricky to pick which ones to pursue.

"If you plan it right and go to the homes that are close together, you might be able to see six tours and squeeze in a few others," said Hudson.

She estimates that cyclists can even see and travel between four available homes and should ask for



advice about that option.

Cycling and carpooling is highly encouraged, and rides will be coordinated from Gulf Islands Secondary School (GISS), where the tour maps and information are picked up from 9:30 a.m. onwards.

Most home owners have chosen to set tour times rather than have an open house all day, and that has in part made it possible to offer so many properties for view, with potential crowding alleviated by use of scheduled times.

Each person who takes the tour will also receive a certificate for a \$25 discount on an Energuide home evaluation.

Tickets cost \$25 (or two for \$45) and are available in advance through Salt Spring Books (537-2812), Morningside Organic Bakery in Fulford, and the Salt Spring Island Conservancy office. Tickets will also be sold at the Saturday market from 9 a.m. to noon, and from GISS (at 112 Rainbow Road) on the tour day.

All proceeds benefit the Salt Spring Island Conservancy. The tour is also preceded by a Sustainable Housing Forum with a panel of expert speakers set for Meaden Hall the night before at 7 p.m.

The Greenwoods Eldercare Society, the operational arm of Greenwoods, continues to provide and to expand its important services to seniors living in the community while being committed to supporting the needs of residents requiring Complex Care (residential care for people living with challenging and concomitant physical and cognitive health problems).

Greenwoods is a team of sympathetic and enthusiastic people. Professional staff, volunteers, families and friends make the Greenwoods residence a safe, secure and comfortable home for residents and are committed to providing experiences and services which enhance the quality of life of seniors living in their own homes in the community. Through a professional assessment program, seniors living in the community at large are able to join in programs within the internal community of Greenwoods. The therapeutic benefit of recreation, socialisation and creative opportunity has been extensively proven through many research studies on aging and health. The breadth of activities at Greenwoods is impressive: from theatre trips, Bingo, Bridge & Scrabble, Seniors Olympics, Teas, barbecues, Music & Munch trips, to weaving or a trip to the Fall Fair.

Community Adult Day Program

Greenwoods provides the opportunity to seniors living in the community to participate in a variety of social and creative activities. The life-enhancing Adult Day Program runs three days a week at the Greenwoods Facility and allows elders living with physical or cognitive challenges a chance to maintain physical, cognitive and functional skills as well as providing the caregiver a respite from what can be a challenging role. In a structured setting, clients can participate in activities and meet friends—old and new. A typical day at the program might include social interaction, an island drive, arts and crafts, music therapy, scrabble and bingo, exercise and a hearty home-cooked lunch.

The buses have allowed an expansion of the recreational programs to include regular trips around the island and can be seen daily on the roads of Salt Spring Island transporting seniors to Greenwoods Day Programs or to a community event and are easily recognizable with our hallmark

Respite Care

When caregivers need a break due to illness, personal health circumstances or simply because they need a vacation from what can often be a challenging role, Greenwoods Eldercare Society can offer respite care.

Respite Care has been effective in both delaying the need for residential care placement and in acclimatizing individuals to the residential care environment making permanent placement in a residential care facility more a natural transition and less a jarring event.

Islanders at Heart

The Greenwoods facility is at the heart of the islands and is able to provide excellent care for the residents and for seniors who participate in its programs due to the dedication of staff, friends, volunteers and a generous and caring community.

Sea Eagle: Story of a double-ender with no end in sight

A boat pulls gently away from the Salt Spring Marina slip E-37 and swings her nose into the light breeze that favours Ganges Harbour on this perfect spring morning. There are two men on board. One is at the wheel, intent, focussed on the course ahead . . . the other is standing in the cockpit, one hand gripping the combing and gazing at the trail of the boat's wake streaming astern.

This is the story of the pocket cruiser Sea Eagle: where she came from, where she's been and where she's going. This is the story of a double ender with no end in sight.

In the early 1940s the Gunderson Shipyard in Portland, Oregon is turning out lifeboats for the U.S. Navy at a feverish clip. All in all, 3,500 22-foot clones are manufactured, by this company alone, for the war effort.

The boats are built to be tough and unsinkable — to survive and be tested to the point where half a ton of sandbags stacked on one side still leaves four inches of life saving freeboard. There is no beauty to behold in the process. The double diagonal planked hulls, extra heavy frames, stems, sternposts and prop shields are strictly utilitarian — qualities that would attract a drowning sailor for sure, but few others.

All we know about our story-boat's war years is that it survives, is stored in a massive collection of redundant war gear and doesn't surface again until 1970 when Robert Plummer of Tacoma, Washington walks into a navy equipment sale

and buys it.

We don't know this man Plummer, but we can still thank him. He puts a covered deck and cabin on his purchase, names it Dixie Chicken, heads north for Skagway, Alaska and sails directly into our story.

Plummer and his boat are enroute to Alaska when an overheated engine brings them to a full stop in Christie Passage just north of Port Hardy, B.C. The lighthouse keepers at Scarlett Point, newlyweds John 'Bo' Curtis and Cathy Young, watch as the drama unfolds and the boat is towed into the shelter of the port. The next day

they are down at the Hardy dock. There is something about that boat they like, despite the breakdown in the channel.

"We wanted something that could handle a sea that we couldn't," Cathy explains years later. "So we bought her."

Over the next 19 years the "Chicken" becomes an integral part of the Curtis family as they move from the lighthouse in Port Hardy to a similar post at Lawyers Island in Prince Rupert to the Chatham Point Light off Campbell River to Victoria and then to Salt Spring

Island. With her new owners she proves herself, lives up to her pedigree, especially in the turbulent and unforgiving waters off Prince Rupert where every element of the boat from her rudder to her engine and hull is tested once again.

"She was our car basically," Bo says. "The Chicken was our only connection with the world at times. She was our life line."

During the high-spirited sea adventures of the Bo and Cathy years, the Chicken is rebuilt and improved.

By the time the family makes landfall on Salt Spring Island in 1989, the

old gas engine has been replaced with a Bukh diesel, mysterious hunks of what look like train track rail have been removed from her bottom, and the cabin, deck and cockpit have been rebuilt. If there is anything lacking at all in the boat it's the room needed to accommodate a growing family and the Curtis family begins thinking a little bigger.

Salt Spring artist Bert Small is already quite familiar with the converted lifeboat when he and a friend see her in a sail past during a visit to the Victoria Classic Boat Festival in 1996. (In fact, over the last two years he has made a point of slowing down in his runabout to have a closer look at the gem moored off the Third Sister in Ganges Harbour and every pass has strengthened a resolve to someday own the boat.)

If there were any doubts at all in Small's mind, they were erased at the boat show with his friend's enthusiastic help.

"We were standing on shore watching her approach when Norman suddenly calls out 'Hey! Is your boat for sale?'" Small recalls. "And at the very moment the words are out of his mouth the Dixie Chicken turns her bow and heads straight for me."

One year later and after "proper" ceremony, the renamed Sea Eagle reawakens in the Bert Small world, a place where no detail of the boat's maintenance or cosmetics is overlooked.

"I touched every square inch of her, inside and out, stem to stern and bilge to mast head," he says.

The artist is devoted to the boat — it becomes a palette for his creative energy — and for eight years he continues the restoration begun by Robert Plummer and Bo Curtis. Small and Sea Eagle also travel extensively throughout the Gulf Islands where Bert paints from his "studio" boat and Sea Eagle develops a following in every port.

But it's not all play. Sea Eagle is also put to work regularly at the Victoria Boat Show where she is bestowed with the Best Pocket Cruiser award in 2000 and 2004. She is also featured in Pacific Yachting under a *Love Struck* headline and continues to garner interest from a world of boaters interested in classic restoration.

It is indeed a perfect spring morning as the two men head for Sea Eagle's new home in Long Harbour. It is also the perfect time to break the third link in the veteran lifeboat's chain of command and forge a new one.

For Small it is time to move on; there is another project boat waiting in the wings, and for longtime Sea Eagle admirers Brian Carroll and Susan de Stein of Long Harbour, there is a world of adventure and gunkholing now waiting at their dock.

"It is my belief that we never really own a boat; but that we caretake it for the next owner". . . Bert Small, Salt Spring Island

History created one step at a time with pilgrim trek

It wasn't long before the more than 100 young pilgrims taking part in a four-day trek through the forests and over the mountains of the island's south end realized this would be no average walk in the woods.

"A mother lost her baby this morning and we also came across a camp that was looted by bandits," said 12-year-old Cassie Bascom.

All this and it wasn't even three o'clock yet.

The trek, undertaken by the 106 youth and 30 adults between July 20 and 23, commemorated the great westward trek across the plains by members of the Mormon faith in 1847.

Though the 30-kilometre journey was considerably less demanding than the 4,000 kilometres walked by the real pioneers, organizers like Salt Spring's Per Svendsen tried to make events along the way seem as authentic as possible.

"The more realistic it is, the more valuable the experience it will be," he said.

Before setting off from the end of Chilton Road in Mount Tuam Estates, participants, many who had never met before, were divided into 13 different family groups.

A family's nationality and social status were decided and the new siblings were

given money with which to purchase some basic supplies for the journey.

While some were able to buy steaks, others were left with only a few vegetables.

Svendsen said the Irish, Scottish, English and Scandinavian immigrants on the real journey represented a vast cross section of society and he wanted to show their ancestors' cultural and social heritage.

With little help from adults watching from a distance, the families began building their wooden carts and loading up supplies.

"This is more than a spiritual experience," he said. "It is about learning important lessons about teamwork, confidence and sharing."

Just before the first car in the wagon train rounded a corner high up on Mount Tuam during the second day, sounds of creaking carts and singing pilgrims could be heard in the distance.

With the hot sun beating down on the dusty road, pioneers dressed in homemade period costumes appeared in a clearing, forging ahead, barefoot and prepared to tackle any obstacles in their way.

Liz Linville, 14, said she would most likely be spending her summer watching television, tubing, swimming or hanging out with friends if she was not busy scaling the side of a mountain.

During a well-deserved rest from pulling carts said to

weigh between 300 and 400 pounds, participants at the head of the convoy explained their day's trials.

"Two hours ago, all the men had gone off to war and we had to continue our westward journey without them," explained 19-year-old Megan Arnott.

During the original trek, many Mormon men were called off to fight with the Mormon Vanguard Brigade in the Mexican War.

While the young women and girls were left pulling their possessions, the young soldiers underwent rigorous training exercises in the woods nearby.

At another point, the path was so steep and cluttered with debris, families had to

unload their wagons in order to pass.

Early on in the day, pioneers did not know what to believe when they came across a trading post whose patrons lay on the ground in agony and covered in ketchup after a bandit raid.

Not all the authentic touches were so trying and later that evening it was rumoured a trader would stop by with enough buffalo meat for everyone in camp, news that came to the delight of pilgrims now that the previous night's steaks, vegetables and bannock were but distant memories.

At many points along the journey, it was hard to distinguish the past from the present and participants like Nicole Wright said that is why she believed the lessons

were so valuable.

"We are part of an incredible heritage and this event just gives us so much more respect for it," she said. "You can watch movies and read books all you like, but this is just like being there."

At the end of the day's seven-kilometre trek, Lowell Rockliffe, one of four Salt Spring Island youth on the trip, said he enjoyed the opportunity to share such a great experience with his peers.

Looking out over a meadow from his family's campsite, he said he would not likely forget it any time soon.

"It's not often you realize how easy life really is," he said. "This has created a strong connection to our past."

Jewish film fest could spur life changes

History buffs, documentary film aficionados and anyone with a social conscience should catch the last three films of the Jewish Film Festival at All Saints Church.

Starting at 7:30 p.m., the films are free but donations are gratefully accepted.

The first three, especially *Genocide*, the story of man's inhumanity to man narrated by Elizabeth Taylor and Orson Wells and winner of the 1981 Academy Award® for best feature documentary, was an excellent example of the best of what a documentary can be and do.

The subject matter was horrific but, because it was dealt with directly without overt manipulation, the

information was disseminated with compassion. With seamless editing and logical chronicling of events with personal histories included, the film was devastating but inspiring.

I learnt things I never knew and I saw things that spurred me on to effect change in my own life.

The next one — *The Long Way Home* — which runs July 28 examines the critical post-World War II period and the struggle of the displaced Jewish refugees to find dignity and renewal in the aftermath of the Nazi Holocaust. Narrated by Morgan Freeman, this winner of the 1997 Academy Award® for best feature documentary will be excellent.

On August 4, *In Search of Peace: 1948-1967*, narrated

by Michael Douglas, chronicles Israel's first two decades, offering new insights on the origins of the Middle East conflict.

Unlikely Heroes documents unknown stories of resistance during WWII. Narrated by Sir Ben Kingsley, it is the last film in the series and runs August 11.

Moriah Films, a division of the Simon Wiesenthal Centre for Holocaust Studies, and the Museum of Tolerance, produced these six documentary films on the history of the Jewish people in the 20th century.

Salt Springer Judy Levine,

an expert on World War II and the ethnic cleansing of over six million Jews and other groups deemed inferior by Hitler and the Nazi regime, bought the films with the intention of public education.

We have not learnt our lessons as ethnic cleansing continues in the 21st century.

Why?

Watching these superb films can perhaps answer that question.

At the very least they will encourage more questions, an activity that can begin the termination of our cruelty to each other.

Healing hollyhocks follow the sun

Hollyhocks (*althaea rosa*), with their lovely pastel spikes of flowers, are a subspecies of the marshmallow, *Althaea officinalis* and they have many of the same healing properties.

Althaea is from the Greek verb *althane*, which means "to heal." Both plants are from the Malvaceae family, which again comes from the Greek word for soft or soothing: *malakos*.

There is a bit of a story behind the name Hollyhock, which originated in England where the leaves were used to treat the swollen heels of horses; because of this practice it became known as hock-leaf. For some reason the English people believed the flower came from the Holy lands, and so it was soon called Hollyhock, which developed into hollyhock.

The flowers actually originated in China where they are a symbol of fruitfulness; they were imported into England in the 16th century. In Victorian England and the language of flowers, the Hollyhock was ruled by Venus and seen as a symbol of female ambition. Although this was not a popular view at the time, because of the flowers' beauty and their ability to grow in almost any soil, hollyhocks started to show up in almost every English garden.

Hollyhocks grow in almost any soil and need only a modicum of water, though they will be showier if you give them a bit of care and regular watering. They like the sunshine and tolerate shade. The tall spikes of flowers attract bees and other important pollinators

and they are wonderful flora to grow at the back of flowerbeds or in front of a fence.

Mallow flowers are interesting as well as pretty and have a habit of following the sun. This trait so impressed the ancient Pythagorean philosophers they considered the plant holy. To them the flower was seen as a symbol of moderation and represented the control of human passions; both of which were considered necessary achievements in order to attain wisdom and health. Funnily enough, the symbol for sweetness and mildness was also mallow because of its sugary flavor and smooth texture.

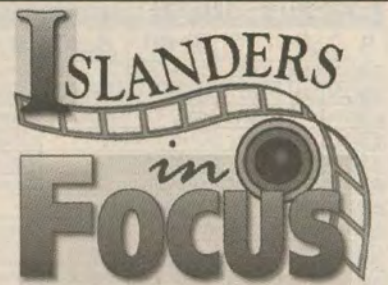
