

# Graffiti tags Shakespeare with local charm

Outdoor performances by Graffiti Theatre offered islanders the "nimble spirit of mirth" with a merry treatment of Shakespeare's grand comedy *A Midsummer Night's Dream* last week.

Presented as a dramatized reading, scripts almost dissolved from the stage due to engaging portrayals of romantic trials and tribulations under deft direction from Scott Hylands.

And despite strong performances from veteran local actors (such as Arvid Chalmers, Vaughn Fulford, Peter Marshall, Amanda Spottiswoode and Ann Stewart), it was rich theatrics from a less-familiar cast of dramatists in central roles that gave the show immediate energy and vibrancy.

Convincing acting by Katrina Bird (as a pragmatic Hermia), Jay Sturley (a churlish and possessive Demetrius), Adam Underwood (as the fickle yet eager suitor Lysander) and Tangle Caron (as the passionately melodramatic "spaniel" Helena) provided highlights of the show.

Themes of romantic rivalry, duplicitous desire and counterfeit love were emphasized through the Graffiti production and brought to full fruition in Act III when characters Demetrius, Lysander, Helena and Hermia met for a feverish battle of words where the audience hung on every exchanged insult with rapt attention.

"Never did mockers waste more idle breath," said Caron as a frustrated Helena.

But bawdy scenes in the subplot of a comedic band of common worker/thespians grabbed the heart of Graffiti's production with equal zeal.

The play within a play, *Pyramus and Thisbe*, was a "tedious and brief" gem unto itself when Fulford (as Bottom playing Pyramus), Joe Kerr (fey, fair and dainty Thisbe) and Allan Crane

(as Wall with his "sinister chink") had the audience howling over their ill-fated comic tragedy.

"Reason and love keep

little company together these days," said Fulford as the engaging, ass-headed par amour Nick Bottom.

young actress Pandora Morgan (clad in zebra skin, studded belt and pink-teased hair) gave Shakespeare's famous fairy Puck a punk twist with her otherworldly portrayal of the Cupid-like agent who wrings havoc with love potions among nobles, commoners and fairies alike.

"Lord, what fools these mortals be," said Morgan as Puck.

Indeed, the play almost seemed written for contemporary islanders since affections among characters

switched more rapidly than sleep cycles — in a manner similar to reports from local gossip circles.

But no one could take offense to such artistry, no matter how close the resemblance to their own romantic misadventures.

Cast in a gentle evening shadow amid living birdsong and a warm breeze on the ArtSpring patio or at Stowel Lake Farm, Graffiti players offered pleasant diversion for anyone willing to rest by a green hill for a short while.

## Jewish history film series begins July 7 at All Saints

A series of six films on the history of the Jewish people in the 20th century is being shown at All Saints By-the-Sea this summer.

Beginning July 7 with *Echoes that Remain* and running six successive Thursdays at 7:30 p.m., the films include two feature documentary Academy Award winners and well-known narrators.

*Echoes that Remain* is described in press material as "a poignant study of Jewish life before the Holocaust. Jews were generally confined to shtetls, the areas of cities

in which they were permitted to live."

On July 14, the 1981 Academy Award winner *Genocide* will be shown, while the July 21 film is *Liberation*, which covers the two fronts during World War II and the genocidal war against the Jews.

*The Long Way Home* (1997 Academy Award winner covering the post-World War II period) is shown on July 28, followed by *In Search of Peace 1948-1967* on August 4.

Unlikely Heroes ends the series on August 11. It documents unknown stories of

resistance during WWII.

Admission is free, but donations at the door will be appreciated.

Members of the Salt Spring Island Jewish Community have purchased the series in order to make it available on Salt Spring.

A small grant from the Jewish Federation of Victoria and Vancouver Island have helped to make it possible to show these films to the public at this time.

People are advised to come early as seating will be limited. Refreshments will be available.

## Pottery minis visit 'window gallery'

Mark's Work Wearhouse in Ganges will be changing its image for the month of July, as its windows display 150 miniature pottery pieces from Potters Guild of B.C. members.

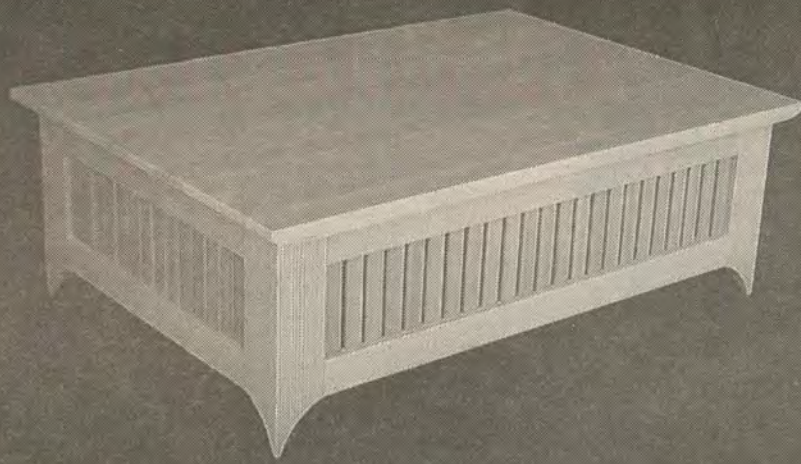

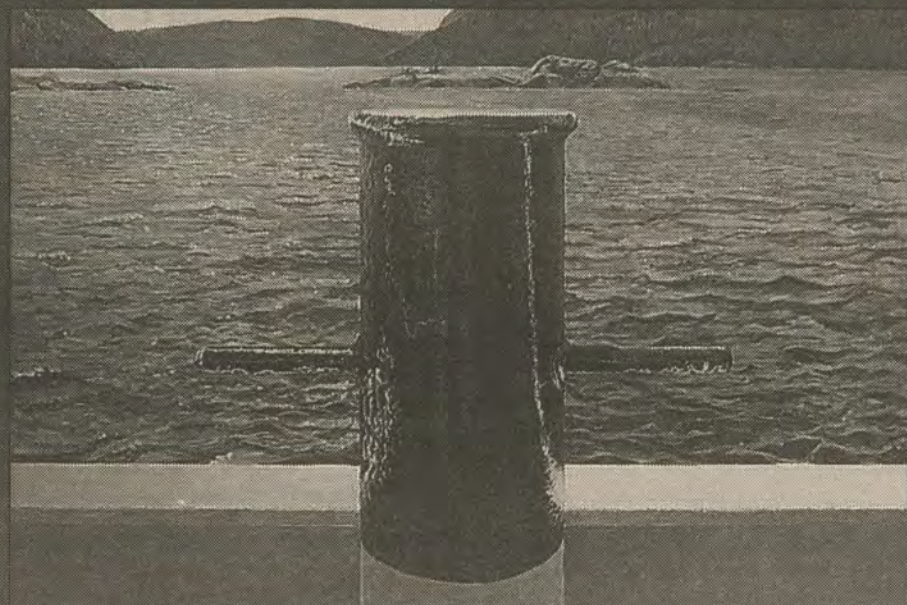

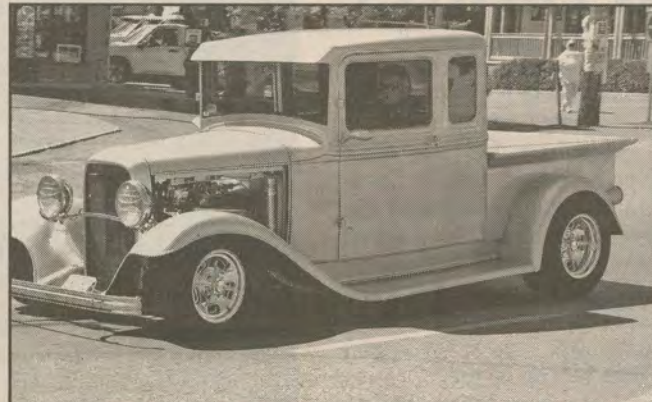

# Manx shares burning passion

A decidedly cool-mannered and swift-fingered Harry Manx left the crowd howling for more of his otherworldly blend of classical East Indian ragas and Mississippi Delta blues at a sold-out Fulford Community Hall concert on Friday night.

It marked the first time the Beaver Point resident had performed on the island in well over a year.

"When I'm on Salt Spring I feel like I can really recharge my batteries," said Manx in an interview before the concert. "The island has always attracted really inspiring people."

After a three-hour performance on a range of instruments as varied as Manx's own travels, it turned out Salt Spring's healthy servings of inspiration were largely due to people just like him.

For the uninitiated, Manx's sound may be difficult to get a handle on at first just because it's the kind of music people are not accustomed to hearing every day.

The music industry, it appears, thrives on endless categories, each appealing to specific groups within society.

This is where the "Manx touch" serves as a refreshing

wake-up call.

Manx said an increasing fusion of musical styles on the rise in Canada and worldwide reflects a changing society inclusive of various races and religions, all with their own distinctive style and musical traditions.

"The way things are today, the face of the country is really changing and a new music is also the result of that," he said, adding audiences across North America were open to the new sound.

"The public reaction has been good," he said. "North Americans in general really like their blues and have a

passion for all things Indian."

The appeal of this musical style becomes apparent almost immediately after he finished playing Make Way For the Living to open up the night. He is not afraid to experiment.

As with all experiments, sometimes things work and sometimes plans go awry. When things go well, the audience is captivated. When they produce unexpected results, Manx has the confidence and wherewithal to keep the audience engaged in the live show experience.

Manx explained a large

part of this creative spark was due to a life of travelling.

Born on the Isle of Man, Manx also travelled throughout Europe, Brazil, Japan and India.

Though each place offered its own influences, he said few places compared to the time he spent on the Asian subcontinent.

He'd been there many times and describes the lure of the subcontinent as irresistible. Eventually in the late 1980s, Manx, then 22, decided to follow his heart and remained in India for 12 years.

"In India I just couldn't help myself," he said. "It was a burning passion that I experienced and I just had to follow it."

During his stay in India, Manx spent a good deal of time under the tutelage of renowned musician Vishwa Mohan Bhatt, learning to play the Mohan Veena, a 20-string sitar/guitar which made itself noticed throughout the night.

Whether he is playing the Mohan Veena, the banjo or the Purgatory Hill Harp, Manx's signature sound has been the cornerstone of his live performances and recordings on Salt Spring's own Dog My Cat Records since his arrival on these shores nearly five years ago.

# K'naan calls for justice through music, poetry

Salt Spring Islanders who love "music with a message" won't want to miss an evening with K'naan, whose childhood in Somalia still infuses his hip-hop songs and spoken word poetry.

Now living in Toronto, K'naan just released his first full-length album called The Dusty Foot Philosopher at a Tuesday night event.

He performs at Beaver Point Hall on Wednesday, July 6 at an all-ages dance.

"With his unique voice but still truly authentic style, K'naan brings an enormous

dose of realness and urgency to the hip-hop world in a time when people are desperate for it," notes press material.

"K'naan creates urgent 'music with a message' because his whole existence depends on it."

He has two videos on Much Music and has even performed a spoken word piece at the 50th anniversary of the United Nations Commission for Refugees in 2001.

"In front of some of the biggest

suits in the world, K'naan brought the house down with his politically charged poem" which "called out the UN for its failed relief mission in Somalia."

"The audience was so moved by the piece that they gave K'naan a standing ovation and African superstar Youssou N'Dour who was also in attendance loved the performance so much that he invited K'naan to Senegal to record with him."

Tickets are \$15 at the door, or \$10 in advance at Stuff 'n' Nonsense in Fulford. Kids get in free.

Starting with a pancake breakfast at Meaden Hall (at 120 Blain Road) from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., islanders can celebrate their national birthday at a number of different venues over the course of the day. And they will likely find pipers at every turn.

Downtown, car buffs can catch the second annual Canada Day Car Show and Shine where well over 100 antique and classic cars will be found lining roadways near Centennial Park between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Live music at the car show features Valdy, YJP and Strait of Georgia.

The Salt Spring Concert Band will also perform Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture at Centennial Park between 11:30 and noon, when the Legion Pipe Band will march into the park with a national birthday cake. Various businesses will also be offering treats and gifts to celebrate Canada's 138<sup>th</sup> birthday, including Island Star Video.

Royal Canadian Legion Branch 92 will host opening ceremonies at 1 p.m. when pipers will march with the colours.

"Everyone gets a flag to wave," said past branch president Alan Wyatt.

His favourite memory from the Legion Canada Day event was when a six-year-old boy brought in his flag from the previous year to trade in for the latest model.

"It's mainly aimed at all the younger kids," Wyatt said.

Outside events include a children's midway held from 1-4 p.m., horseshoes (1-6 p.m.), disc golf (1-3



p.m.), face painting, popcorn, hot dogs and ice cream (1-3 p.m.)

"It's almost impossible to lose [at the midway] but don't tell them that," he laughed.

Entertainment at Branch 92 features the Salt Spring Concert Band from 1-2 p.m. and The Backyard Band will play in the Legion lounge from 1-4 p.m.

Meaden Hall will also host a cakewalk at 1:30 p.m. and bingo at 3 p.m. A meat draw in the Legion lounge will wrap up festivities between 4-6 p.m.

And if patriots haven't had enough music, ArtSpring will be hosting a free concert between 7:30 p.m. and 9 p.m. The variety show features local artists such as Danzkidz, Alvaro Sanchez, Synergy, Terry Warbey and the Legion Pipe Band, once again.

# Band plays Canada Day Tschaikovsky

all week on the device, which he promises will spew five to six feet of flame, smoke, and make a loud "whumph." Coulthard will be in period costume and will personally "detonate" the cannon.

The 1812 Overture performance will be followed immediately by a rousing rendition of Oh Canada, pipers and the official cake from Embe Bakery.

# In Here: theatric process

Fans of performance art and avant-garde theatre can participate in a play-building experience at ArtSpring tonight (Wednesday).

Salt Spring's Woodruff sisters (Kristen and Tessa) have already gained a reputation among local connoisseurs of alternative performance pieces with productions of *Electra* and *Safeguard Business* last fall.

Now, Kristen Woodruff presents *In Here*, a play by Ohio State University professor Thomas Taylor.

"The exciting thing about it is that [Taylor] is actually coming here on Wednesday for the performance," said Woodruff. "He's quite a respected performance-art theorist."

Taylor's play explores ideas about theatrical processes and interpersonal dynamics, she said.

"It's really a performance art event but it has this play as a subtext."

Woodruff has gathered performers and Taylor will direct the play from a script but that's where the play breaks from some standard theatrical traditions, she said.

"The actors won't have ever sat down to do it and he won't have met the actors until he arrives on Wednesday afternoon."

Taylor and Woodruff are striving for authenticity and reality, she said.

"If you can say what it's about then you don't really need to do it," Woodruff said. "You have to actually come to see what it's about. It's not about anything that you can say because there are a lot of non-verbal elements."

When people see a play, they normally see only the end product instead of witnessing the process as it unfolds, she said. Woodruff's production of *In Here* operates a little differently.

"It's kind of a celebration of the present. A finished play always ends up being a lie because there is no end to anything. It just keeps going."

The show opens at 8:30 p.m. and admission is by donation. Taylor will also give a lecture on performance art on Thursday. Information about the lecture will be provided at ArtSpring on Wednesday.

# Lavender festival offers a feast for the senses

For many, aromatic fields of lavender evoke the tranquility and peace offered by a tryst in southern France, but a day-long festival on Sunday offers a chance to immerse themselves in a fresh-scented escape without even leaving the island.

For three years now, the Salt Spring Lavender Festival has been a growing attraction.

This year's festival promises to be the largest ever and will give patrons the chance to receive a massage in the lavender fields, attend presentations on medicinal and

culinary uses of the plant, enjoy entertainment and, of course, stroll through the blooms of the island's three south-end lavender farms.

Participating this year is Salt Spring Lavender Company, at 2248 Fulford-Ganges Road; Everlasting Summer, at 194 McLennan Drive; and Sacred Mountain Lavender, at 401 Musgrave Road.

"The feedback we got last year is that people were so enchanted by the place," said Ben Sutton, owner of Sacred Mountain Lavender. "Just walking through the fields is a blissful thing to do."

Ben and his wife Jacque-

line planted their first field in 2001 and the couple now grows between 60 and 70 different species. Two other lavender farms have since opened in the neighbourhood.

The couple is among the few producers of distilled lavender oils in the country and their quaint farm boutique includes all kinds of lavender-themed salts, sugars and soaps.

"The first year it was only us and it's been getting a lot more popular," he said. "It's actually quite well-suited to the rocky soils and dry summers we have on the Gulf Islands and the deer don't eat it."

Sutton said he hopes the festival will teach visitors lavender is not only pretty to look at but is also a valuable addition to the spice rack, first aid kit or the shower.

"So many people think of lavender for its scent but they don't realize how versatile it really is," he said. "The most important thing is to have fun experimenting."

Sutton recommends adding a few sprigs of lavender and some lemon to a fresh salmon fillet for a fast and easy summer meal.

Sacred Mountain will offer a peaceful theme featuring lavender hors d'oeuvres, accompanied by tastings from Salt Spring Vineyards and chocolate gelato supplied by Harlan's.

The entire celebration will be set against a backdrop of

classical music and ocean views from the farm's scented gardens.

Sacred Mountain, the Salt Spring Lavender Company and Everlasting Summer will each host activities between 10 and 5 on Sunday, July 3.

Admission is \$3 per person and \$5 per family.

## Beyond Organic at Duck Creek Farm

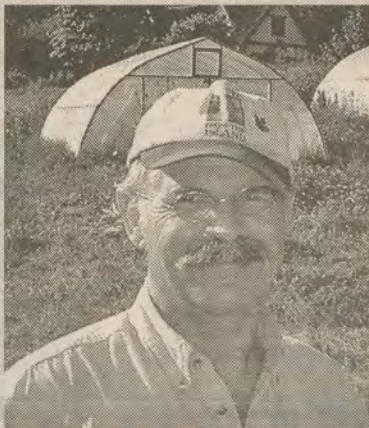
After earning his agricultural diploma in the 60's, John Wilcox, of Duck Creek Farm, became a founding member of CUSO and Canada's first agricultural peace volunteer where he worked with Gandhian village projects in India.

Today Duck Creek Farm, on Tripp Road, yields bountiful crops on 13 acres of the upper valley of Duck Creek. The farm is certified organic through the Biodynamic Agriculture Society of BC. In addition, many of the principles of Bio-dynamic agriculture are practiced here. Biodynamic growing is a non-chemical agricultural movement that seeks to utilize forces of nature and cosmos for optimum soil and plant vitality.

Duck Creek Farm has been recognized by The Land Conservancy of BC as a Conservation Partner for its work with Kathy Reimer of the Island Stream and Salmon Enhancement Society in fish and wildlife habitat restoration on the creek. Now Cutthroat trout and Coho salmon are able to live year-round in the ponds that John has helped create on his farm.

Sweet basil and cucumbers are John's specialty, and he has ample amounts of both growing in two greenhouses. Garlic, green beans, beets, carrots, squash, pumpkin and corn are some other of John's "bullet proof crops". He's also experimenting this year with some edible soybeans.

John is as passionate about community farming as he is about organic farming. "We need to



repopulate our farms, and find new ways to make local farming more affordable. The way things are going, we're going to become much more reliant on local food sources," adds John, who believes that within the next ten years escalating oil prices will lead to a massive shift away from industrial agriculture and towards local, organic farming methods. Let's hope so!

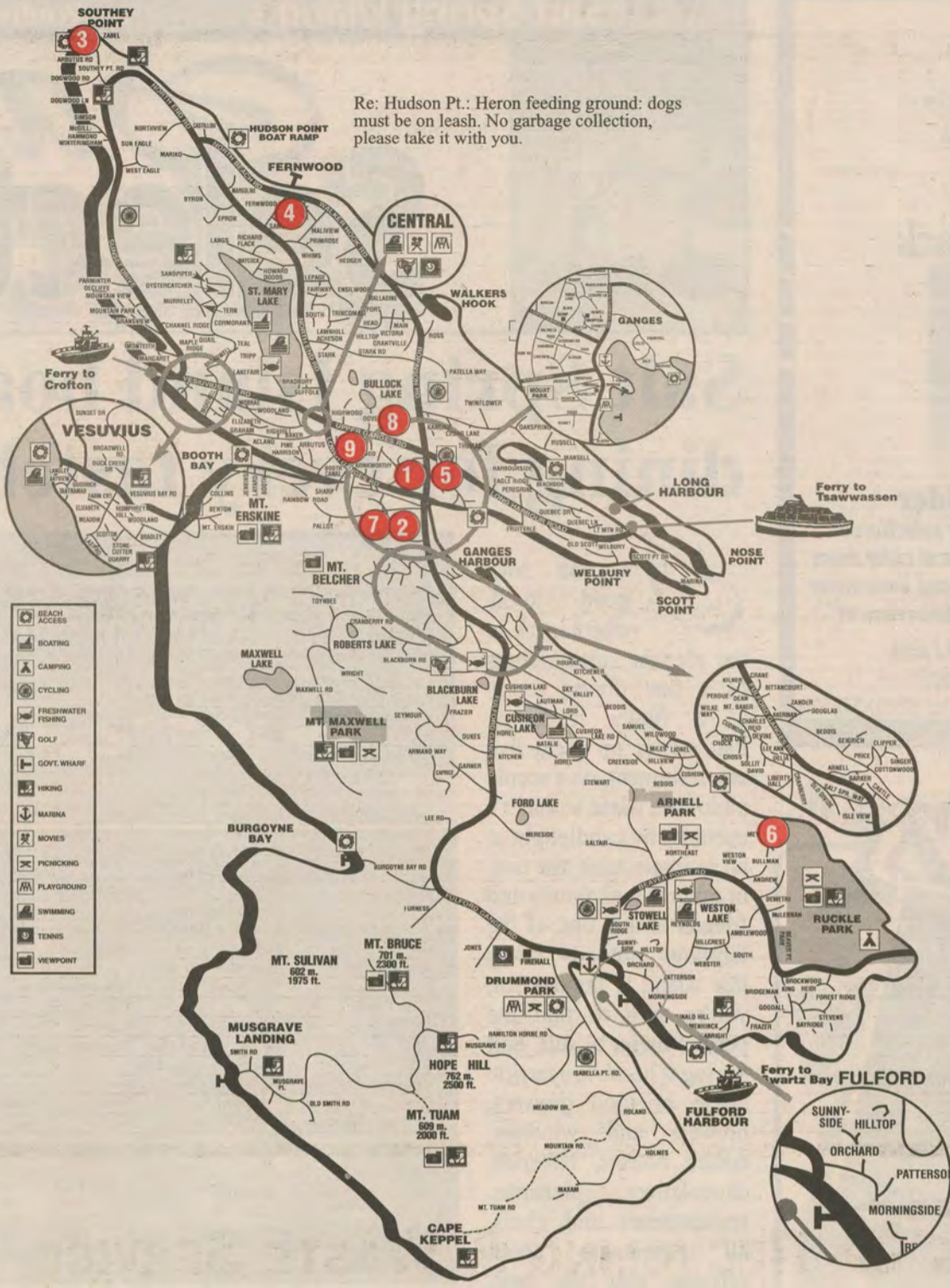

# Flick Pick

Analyzing The Jacket

Fitting into the "mindbending thriller" category best illustrated by Jacob's Ladder, Memento, and The Butterfly Effect, *The Jacket* has all the requisite parts but never quite comes together. Adrian Brody stars as a Gulf War veteran named Jack who is committed to a Vermont psychiatric hospital in 1993 after being possibly wrongly convicted for the murder of a state trooper. There, a morally challenged doctor (Kris Kristofferson) periodically puts him in a straitjacket and then tosses him in the body drawer of the downstairs morgue. It's a special plan that's supposed to cure Jack, but with each treatment he finds himself thrown forward into the year 2007. There, he falls in love with a depressed waitress (Kiera Knightley) and finds out his 1993 self is to die in four days. As Jack bumps back and forth from the two eras, things get deliciously complex. Or do they? The strange thing about *The Jacket* is just how matter-of-factly everything goes down. Oh, here's a weird hallucinatory sequence, here's surprising information about the future revealed, here's the time-travel paradox. But, from what I could tell, everything works out in the end just fine. That was, until I did some reading on the Internet, and found that there's a few dozen theories regarding the film. Huh? Did I miss something? There might have been more to *The Jacket*, but it sure wasn't jumping out from the screen to pique my attention. Perhaps this is the new type of anti-thriller, the one that doesn't beg for complex and thorough analysis. Maybe it's a joke: we're all looking for the "Scooby-doo" ending that changes the entire plot on its ear, but in the end everything's just how it looks. Then again, maybe I'm doing some over-analyzing myself. Maybe *The Jacket* just plain stinks.

# Lush, sensual paintings sum up home

Not surprisingly, Nicola Wheston, Diana Dean and Kathy Robertson all brought thermoses of tea while hanging their show at ArtSpring.

## ART BEAT ON THE ROCK

"We're all English and we all have similar artistic backgrounds," offered Wheston, explaining both the beverage and their show of Salt Spring landscapes running till July 10 with an opening reception on June 30 from 6 to 9 p.m.

All three trained at vari-

ous art schools in England and Canada around the same time and make a living off their art. They've all raised children and accommodated their art to the needs of little ones. They all landed in a beautiful spot that begs to be painted.

Two years ago they started sketching landscapes in the Salt Spring countryside, taking turns making destination suggestions. Splitting up and facing different vistas made coming back together at day's end very social for normally solitary artists.

It's not unusual for Kathy Robertson to paint in nature. Making her living as a weaver, but starting out as a painter and returning to it in her semi-retirement, she completes the painting on the spot.

The other two are chiefly figurative painters whose use of landscape serves different functions. They will sketch at the location but then go back to the studio to complete the work.

Wheston paints two genres: one figurative with a mythic and psychological bent and the other is straight-ahead landscape.

Dean uses the landscape in her usually large canvases to give depth to figures moving in and out of the story telling scenes. She cites masters Titian, Giotto, and Rembrandt as sources

of inspiration, an affiliation that is clear in the work.

All three are skilled artists so the product is truly gorgeous with a lushness and sensuality that sums up our island home. Not merely recordings of views that we love, they are interpreted with a practised eye, educated technique and passion for the outdoors.

There are challenges, however. Wasps, bees and mosquitoes all love the smell of turpentine and linseed oil, necessities of oil painting on canvas; the light changes every five minutes; the weather can change even more.

"We're purely playing with landscape," suggested Wheston. "Using composition, colour and finding oddities in nature. I cannot bear to be in the studio all the time."

At the Nicola Wheston Studio Gallery in Merchants Mews, Wheston's daughter Asha Robertson is presenting *The Show*. An installation of miniature TVs and figures, primarily made of porcelain with glass, wire and wood, *The Show* is a lighthearted exploration of Robertson's own addiction to TV and its effects on the quality of life.

Asha grew up on Salt Spring Island and graduated from the Alberta College of Art and Design in 2003. She currently lives in Kimberly, B.C. where she is very active in the artistic community.

Asha's work is now represented at the Secord Gallery in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

*The Show* runs July 2-9, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily with an opening reception on July 2 from 6 to 9 p.m.
