Sizzling Summer Nights ignite ArtSpring

As warm, sunny days ease into sultry and carefree evenings, visitors and islanders can find entertainment to suit all tastes and budgets at ArtSpring's Sizzling Summer Nights concert series, beginning July 8 with Ache Brasil.

Featuring spectacular acrobatics, whirring movement, powerful singing and percussive musical rhythms, Ache Brasil brings the rich cultural heritage of Brazil to ArtSpring.

Back of the Moon from Scotland plays July 12, giving listeners the chance to enjoy border pipes, fiddle, whistle, flute, guitar, piano and awesome three part vocal harmonies.

Next stop on the musical world tour is Denmark and the music of The Great Danes, a trio of Danish musical groups — Karen and Helen, Zar, and Haugaard and Hoirup. Set to perform July 14, this "triple bill of powerful talents . . . create gem-like settings of their traditional, original and contemporary music."

2006 marks the occasion of Mozart's 250th birthday, and Happy Birthday Amadeus! continues the sizzling celebration on Salt Spring. Chamber musicians Kai Gleusteen, David Visentin, Hiroko Kagawa, Catherine Ordronneau, and friends perform Mozart, Shostakovich and Chopin on July 17.

Concert goers can expect "rollicking chords, flamboyant solos and enticing rhythms" as Bienvenue, Les Batinses hits the stage on July 19. This adventurous, unpredictable sextet delivers "kick-ass traditional folk music" from Quebec.

The Creaking Tree String Quartet follows on July 21 with a show titled Kickin' Picken' and Bowin', an acoustic roots sound with musicians on violin, mandolin, guitar and bass picking out bluegrass, jazz, and chamber music.

July 26 brings Alpha Yaya Diallo, whose soulful singing and guitar playing is backed up by an amazing band performing music steeped in the rhythms of Guinea.

Neil Swainson and Friends perform July 28 followed by a two-night run of Stuart McLean and the Vinyl Cafe on August 2 and 3. Unfortunately, the McLean shows are sold out.

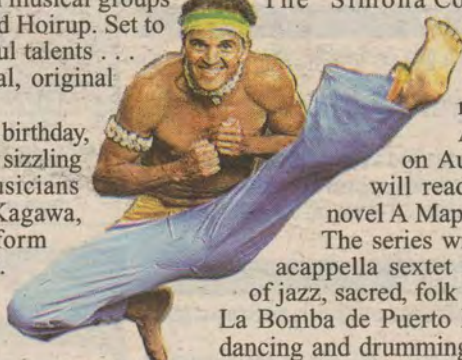
Billed as Cape Breton's latest musical success story, with a combination of incredible musicianship, amazing voices and wonderful dancing, The Cottars Return! on August 4 promises to be a lively and entertaining evening.

The Simona Colonna trio has its North American debut at ArtSpring August 5. Titled Italiano Cabaret, the trio performs a collection of the best of Italy's pop-music from the past three decades.

An evening with Jane Urquhart follows on August 9, where the celebrated author will read from her new critically acclaimed novel A Map of Glass and other writings.

The series wraps up with Boundless: Rajaton, an acappella sextet from Finland performing repertoire of jazz, sacred, folk and original music on August 11 and La Bomba de Puerto Rico, an evening of improvisational dancing and drumming with percussionist Sal Ferreras and a stellar cast of Vancouver's most respected drummers and dancers on August 16.

All concerts in the Sizzling Summer Nights series take place at ArtSpring and begin at 8 p.m. Tickets are available at the ArtSpring ticket office at 100 Jackson Ave. or phone 537-2102.

Graffiti sets stage in the meadow for outdoor theatre performance

Building on the huge success of last year's A Midsummer's Nights Dream, Graffiti Theatre is continuing an age-old outdoor theatre tradition with performances of Romeo and Juliet in the meadow at Mouat Park.

And although the show is still several weeks away, the meadow area was humming with construction activity last week as organizers worked on creating an outdoor theatre space.

Stage designer and theatre consultant Vaughn Fulford hopes this summer's outdoor performances will be the first in a series of theatrical events in the meadow.

"Personally, I have been fantasizing about this location for years," said Fulford. "I'm willing to put in the work to create the stage because of the potential for a long term legacy . . . with the possibility of annual outdoor events like music, folk concerts and lots of theatre."

Currently, the permit for the stage in the meadow will expire with the final performance of Romeo and Juliet in the second week of August, but organizers hope that the Park, Arts and Recreation Commission (PARC) will allow the stage to remain.

Set at the back of the meadow, the new stage sits under the overhanging branches of a huge maple tree, providing some shade and cover. Fulford and fellow volunteers Sam Tarasoff and Ted Olsen felled trees off Dukes Road to create a "forest" behind the platform.

The feel is natural and organic and merges seamlessly with the actual forest spreading out behind and beyond the stage.

Volunteer carpenters Richard Williams and John French were masterfully assembling the stage Friday morning. The set-up includes a large, main stage area, with smaller platforms on the side to accommodate entrances,

exits and the small group of musicians who will accompany the performance.

Curtains also provide some backstage cover and canvas banners and flags will add the finishing touches. Two staircases will lead to a "balcony" platform, considered a "must have" for any performance of Romeo and Juliet.

The simplicity of the Fulford-designed set might be deceptive.

"Sometimes the simplest things are the hardest to come up with," said Fulford, who also explained the attraction of outdoor theatre.

"When [director] Scott Hylands approached Graffiti with the idea of staging Romeo and Juliet in the meadow at Mouat Park, they jumped at the opportunity," he said.

"This performance is continuing and building on the legacy of live outdoor theatre that has been ongoing for thousands of years in

every culture.

"Nothing compares to the magic of live, outdoor theatre. It has to do with imagination — the audience becomes engaged both by the performance and the wonder of the natural surroundings. Both experiences together are transcendental."

Mouat Park is a near-perfect venue for outdoor events, he added. It is close to town and yet far enough away that the show will not be disturbed by noise or traffic. There is plenty of parking along the road leading into the park, or audience members can walk from town.

(The parking area at the meadow will be reserved for drop off only.)

The big field will provide plenty of seating — plans are to sell a maximum of 300 tickets a night, and the audience will be limited to that number.

Concert goers will be encouraged to bring blan-

kets and pillows for close-to-the-stage seating, with lawn chairs allowed further back for those uncomfortable sitting on the ground. Finally, the viewing area will be sealed with "hay bale" bleachers at the very back.

With the meadow sloping naturally towards the stage, spectators will be assured of a good view of the performance. Extra port-a potties will be provided as well.

"Bugs should be largely gone at this point in the summer, but bring bug spray if necessary," advised Fulford. "The show will go on in rain, unless torrential, but July and August on Salt Spring tend to be dry, which adds again to the suitability of outdoor events on the island."

He added: "The audience and cast for these types of events are tremendously adventurous."

The show runs for nine night (July 20 to August 5) and tickets are available at ArtSpring.

Benares sitar masters set to mesmerize island audience at Beaver Point Hall

India's acclaimed father-son sitar duo — The Mishras — return to Salt Spring as part of their 2006 North American summer tour.

From their home city of Benares, an ancient spiritual centre of traditional music and Hindu culture, they bring classical north Indian ragas and folk music to communities throughout B.C. and the Pacific Northwest.

Pandit Shivanth Mishra, a seventh-generation "Benares-style" musician, recording artist and head of the music department at Sanskrit University in Benares, has toured extensively bringing his masterful, mischievous, joyful presence and

playing style to the delight and amazement of audiences everywhere.

Deobrat Mishra received the Jewels of Sound award (the Indian "Grammy") in Mumbai, and recently also received his Masters degree in sitar while continuing to tour and record internationally with his father and others.

Like indigenous cultural arts all over the world, the traditional music of India faces unique challenges. With the ascendancy of Western and Eastern popular music, and the pervasive influence of "Bollywood" songs, sacred and traditional music is increasingly marginalized.

To keep the music tradition growing and alive, the Mishras began teaching music in their home. Early

this spring, near the banks of the Ganga River in Benares — one of the oldest and continually inhabited cities on earth — a hundred men climbed up and down scaffolding in the hot sun and poured, in one day, bucket by bucket, the concrete slab of the first-floor roof over the new Academy of Classical Indian Music.

Pandit Shivanth Mishra and his family have opened their new music academy to students and children of any caste or family circumstances who wish to learn their rich Benares "Gharana," or "ancestral tradition."

To support these efforts, Pandit Shivanth Mishra and Deobrat Mishra travel every summer and perform throughout North America.

- 16 spears asparagus, green and white
- 2 sprigs rosemary
- 6 slices pancetta
- 2 salmon fillets, 1 inch thick

Salt and fresh pepper
1/2 a lemon

Preheat the non-stick fry pan until thermo-spot turns solid red, snap woody ends off asparagus and divide tops into two bunches. Add a rosemary sprig and wrap each bunch with pancetta to

form a neat bundle. Season salmon with salt and pepper and drizzle with olive oil. Place into hot pan along with tomatoes, olives and asparagus bundles. Turn from time to time so the salmon and pancetta browns evenly. By the time the salmon is cooked, the pancetta should be lovely and crisp, the asparagus just cooked, and the cherry tomatoes softened and bursting with sweet sticky juices. Squeeze the lemon over all, and tuck in!

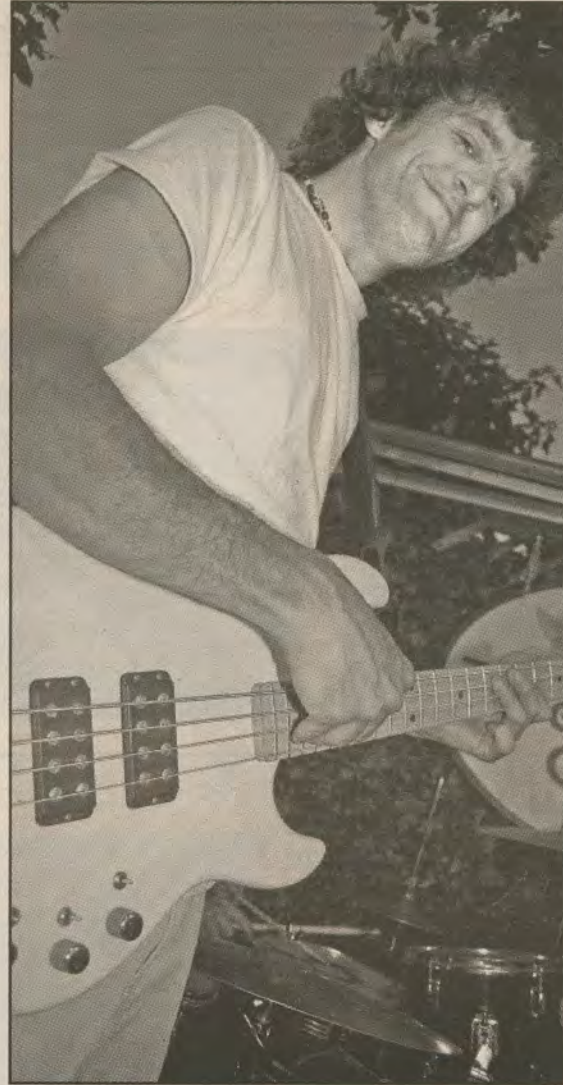

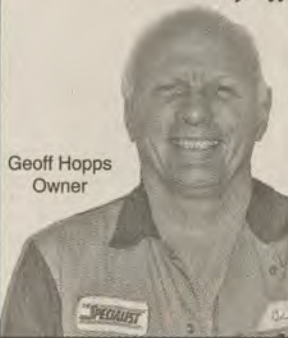

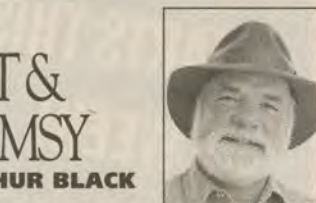
Three cheers for Philip the Loose-Lipped

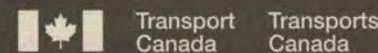

BREAKING THE LAW WILL COST BOATERS

Under the *Contraventions Act*, enforcement authorities can ticket offenders on the spot instead of requiring them to appear in court. In June 2004, the Governments of Canada and British Columbia signed an agreement to implement the *Contraventions Act* in British Columbia. The agreement came into force in the spring of 2006.

In the six Canadian provinces where the *Contraventions Act* has been implemented, there has been a substantial improvement overall in the level of compliance and consequently, boating safety.

Fines* for some boating offences:

- Operating a vessel in a careless manner \$250
- Speeding \$100
- Underage operation of a personal watercraft \$100
- Operating a power-driven pleasure vessel without the required operator competency card \$250
- Insufficient number of approved, appropriately sized flotation devices \$200 or more

Sperm donor seeks potential family

Islander Dwight Jones hopes to find children he has never known.

A Salt Spring resident since 1994, Jones (age 61) has two daughters who are currently in their 20s from a marriage of 25 years. But now he's searching for other children he might have helped conceive as a sperm donor over a 12-year period.

"I don't have any reservations about looking into the eyes of my own child," Jones said. "If not now, when?"

He did not previously think about children born from his donated sperm, but his perspective changed at age 40 when he learned that the man who raised him wasn't his biological father.

"No matter what people say, it makes a big difference."

He tried to find his biological father at that time, but he was unsuccessful.

"Now I have a 90-year-old mother and two daughters and that's my family," Jones mused.

"I used to think I had a big family."

Recently, he entered his name on a website for children of assisted human reproduction (www.donorsiblingregistry.com) after he noticed stories in the news.

Jones was a sperm donor between 1977 and 1988 at a fertility clinic run by Dr. Gerald Korn. Jones estimates that he could have assisted families produce anywhere between four and 30 offspring during that time.

"It was an anonymous process. There wasn't a hell of a lot involved in it."

The Donor Sibling Registry website lists some 7,300

members and has facilitated matches for some 2,300 offspring (of half siblings and/or donors). Jones found several children who were offspring of Dr. Korn's clinic and he participated in DNA tests to try to find a match.

But Jones hasn't found offspring yet and he's learned that fertility doctors he worked with are not particularly accommodating to current inquiries.

With a background as a software developer and a company that specializes in electronic medical records, Jones is now discussing a contract with Health Canada to help consolidate the medical records of 18 fertility

doctors in Canada.

"The new Assisted Human Reproduction (AHR) Act stipulates that offspring must have their genetic history."

Unfortunately, fertility clinics focussed on protecting the anonymity of donors prior to enactment of the AHR Act in 2004.

He believes that the rights of people to their family and genetic history should be paramount.

"They should have more rights there than anywhere."

Aid project needs islanders' bottles

The coordinator of Water for Aid hopes community members who previously supported the group through the Ganges Village Market save-a-tape program will now help in other ways.

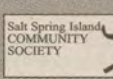

Island women prepare to chalk up the miles for breast cancer cure

Sixty kilometres in two days; it's a lot of walking, no matter what your fitness level.

But thousands of men and women will complete the journey during the third annual Weekend to End Breast Cancer from August 18 to 20 in Vancouver.

Local Salt Springers Dr. Talita Strumpfer and Melanie Fraude will participate in the walk, which raises funds for the BC Cancer Foundation.

Both have been touched by the disease and want to give hope to those diagnosed with cancer.

"I joined the Weekend to End Breast Cancer benefiting the BC Cancer Foundation because it is something concrete that I can do in the fight to end cancer," said Strumpfer.

"As a doctor I have had to tell many patients that they have cancer. They start the long road of fear, uncertainty, treatments and further tests, and I can only look on from the sidelines."

Fraude said she is walking in memory of the many family members she has lost to the disease.

"Loads of people in my family have died because of cancer," said Fraude, referring to three grandparents and an uncle who lost their fights with various types of cancer.

"I've got (cancer) in my blood, I guess," she said. "So while I'm able to do it, I thought, 'why not?'"

Strumpfer also has her family's future in mind.

"If this money that I raise can help someone in a lab somewhere to find a cure and allow my children to grow up in a world where cancer is as easily treated as an ear infection today, then I would gladly walk 6,000 km, let alone 60 km," said Strumpfer.

Fellow Salt Spring resident Simone Lamers completed the Weekend last year

on her and all those that participate.

"I recommend it for sure. It creates a lot of camaraderie amongst the women there."

Originally from Germany, Fraude has been traveling all over the world for the past five years. She said moving to Salt Spring has afforded her the chance to participate in something meaningful to her.

"It makes me feel great. I've never seen anything like this before and I've never participated in anything like this before," she says of the Weekend.

She said she is happy to support the cause here in Canada, even though she wasn't born in the country.

"I have a list of places I want to visit and live and Canada was always on it. Since I got here, I've just had a good feeling about Salt Spring Island."

Fraude, who moved to the island in October, has been training for the Weekend since she registered in late March.

She walks from her home in Fernwood to work in Ganges twice daily to prepare.

Participants must commit to raising at least \$2,000 in order to take part in the event.

Fraude has currently raised \$338 towards her goal of \$2,000.

Strumpfer's goal is \$4,000; she has raised \$2,375 to date.
