## Bite into 8th annual Salt Spring Apple Festival

**A**lthough the weather has begun to cool and warm days are less frequent, there is no doubt that summer has truly merged into fall when it is time for the annual Salt Spring Island Apple Festival.

Titled a Celebration of the Diversity of Apples, the 8th annual festival takes place on Sunday, October 1 from 9 a.m. till 5 p.m. and includes a display of over 260 varieties of organic apples, tours of apple orchards throughout the island and a chance to hear Johnny Appleseed present an apple monologue at Fulford Hall.

Fifteen apple-growing farms will be open to the public on the apple festival tour, including many not available to view at any other time. There are over 350 varieties of organic apples grown on Salt Spring and the Apple Luscious Organic Orchard will have over 100 apple varieties available for tasting at their farm.

Organizer Harry Burton suggests that festival go-ers begin their day with a stop at Fulford Hall to check out the astonishing apple display, including 23 kinds of red-fleshed apples.

"They [the red fleshed apple] are incredible to eat, great for your health due to the anthocyanins responsible for the red colour, irresistible to children and beautiful to look at," said Burton.

The public is encouraged to take a self-guided tour of the farms after getting tickets and maps at Fulford Hall or the Ganges Tourist Info Centre. The map shows locations and descriptions of all participating farms. Visitors are advised that it will be challenging to view every farm between the hours of 9 and 5.

At 10:30 a.m., the mysterious Johnny Appleseed makes an appearance at Fulford Hall, his second since his official death in 1845.

"He gave a fantastic talk at Apple Festival 2005 and he has promised to return in 2006," said Burton. "It is thought to be the magical power of all those organically grown apples which has drawn him back from the spirit world."

In addition, children can enjoy the antics of Captain Apple, a new south-end superhero who spreads the word about the benefits of eating organic fruits and vegetables.

Apples have been grown on Salt Spring since 1860 so the festival provides a glimpse of island history through the magnificent and historical display of apple varieties of all shapes, sizes and flavours.

"Our festival offers participants a chance to connect to incredible local produce and to connect with their farmer," said Burton. "People are loving all the diversity available and also tasting the heritage apple varieties. That is one way to travel back in time."

The Fulford Hall collection is being sold by auction to the highest bidder at the end of the day, with proceeds to the Organic Apple Growing Network of Salt Spring Island to purchase apple-processing equipment. Reserve bid is \$450 and the collection is currently available to view on eBay.

"Become a Salt Spring Island apple connoisseur," advises Burton. "It will change your idea of apples forever."

Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$5 for students and children under 12 are free. They can be purchased on Sunday, October 1 only at Fulford Hall or outside the Ganges Tourist Information Centre. For more information, visit [www.salt-springmarket.com/apples](http://www.salt-springmarket.com/apples).

## Pride weekend celebrates gay life

Gays and Lesbians of Salt Spring Island (GLOSSI) will hold its second annual pride festival this weekend, September 29-October 1.

A full range of events is planned, including the much-anticipated reading of *The Laramie Project*. The local production, directed by Jason Donaldson, brings together young and old, gay and straight, for a reading at ArtSpring on Saturday, beginning at 7 p.m. Advance tickets are on sale for \$10.

"The annual Pride celebration is a great way for the GLBT (Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transsexual) community to come together and celebrate our shared experience of living on Salt Spring Island," said GLOSSI president David Rumsey. "This year's theme — Way, Way, Out — emphasizes both the challenges and the opportunities of living in a relatively small, rural community. The *Laramie Project* is an excellent venue for addressing

those issues. I encourage everyone, straight or gay, to take advantage of this weekend's events."

Last year hundreds of islanders showed their support by attending a panel discussion at ArtSpring.

Wendy Judith Cutler is a professor of Women's Studies at the University of Victoria. She and her partner, Corrie Hope Furst, a certified body worker (and GLOSSI board member) have been visiting Salt Spring since the late '80s and now live here full time.

"We grew up in an era when it was not acceptable to be gay or lesbian. We came out in the '70s at the height of the women's, gay and lesbian movements, just after the Stonewall riots in 1969. Today we pay homage to the courage of those people, and we feel it's imperative to be out, and visible and celebrate our authentic selves. Pride celebrations aim to create a world free of homophobia and oppression."

"Way Way Out" kicks off on Friday with two films showing at The Fritz (formerly Cinema Central). *Fingersmith*, a mesmerizing lesbian mystery, gets underway at 6 p.m. and the cult hit *Sordid Lives* starts at 9:30 p.m.

On Saturday the Gaymazing Race takes participants on a treasure hunt of Salt Spring's gay and lesbian businesses to solve a puzzle and win prizes.

Saturday evening's Get Out and Dance is at Barb's Buns beginning at 9 p.m.

Dance tickets are on sale at Island Star Video for \$8 in advance or \$10 at the door.

And on Sunday, Out in

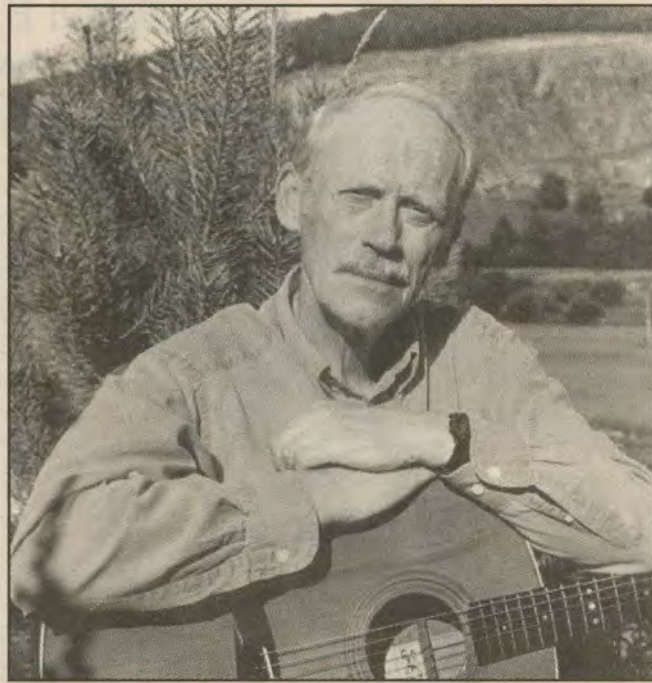
Salt Spring Folk Club fans can get back in their cozy Monday night seats with a giant of the international music scene set to entertain on October 2.

Scottish folk legend Archie Fisher is the first performer of the club's 10th season, and one the board has been hankering to nab for quite some time.

According to his website, Fisher emerged during "the Skiffle era of the late 1950s under the influences of performers such as Lonnie Donegan and Johnny Duncan. Later the recording of the Weavers at Carnegie Hall had a profound effect on his approach to music and his political outlook."

Fisher has recorded several albums since 1968, both solo and with other musicians, and he has been honoured by other high-profile artists covering his original songs.

"His return to the recording studio in the mid-1980s

was due to what he describes as his most creative song-writing period, which coincided with a series of North American tours in partnership with Garnet Rogers," explains the Foot Stompin' Celtic Music website. "Garnet produced the albums on his own Snowgoose label the last of which, Sunsets I've Galloped Into, was later leased and reissued by Red House Records."

"The Salt Spring club awards two scholarships each year to female graduates of the Gulf Islands Secondary School who have been accepted into a university or college for the following September. Every club in Canada offers similar incentives to higher education and at the national level CFUW provides a range of awards and fellowships through its charitable trust program to develop high quality scholarship."

Past fundraising events have included holding the Antiques Road Show on Salt Spring. Last spring a successful concert replenished the local scholarship fund.

In addition, in the past year, the Salt Spring club instituted the HOPE project to fund secondary education for girls in developing coun-

tries, in partnership with the Commonwealth Countries League. A Christmas lunch with a goods and services auction, a silent auction and a hostess table has raised sufficient money to sponsor four young women in Africa and one in Solomon Islands.

"However, CFUW is not all hard work," continues the release.

"For our own pleasure and enjoyment we provide innovative and stimulating programs that provide opportunities for life-long learning, friendship and shared interest groups."

Regular meetings on the last Saturday of each month include invited speakers, who have covered an incredible range of fascinating topics over the years.

New members are always welcome to join the club.

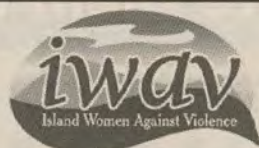

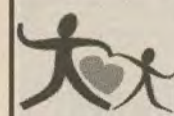

# Return to Duck Creek — future of farming is alive in the past

We are just sitting down to lunch under the canopy that extends out from the old bus that has become the farm office, workers' kitchen, first aid shack and general catch-all for all things farm-ish at Duck Creek Farm, on Tripp Road, just south of St. Mary lake.

In the dovecote not 20 feet away, 50-or-so rock doves flutter and coo. From the corner of my eye I see dragonflies glint in the afternoon sun while mud-wasps come and go along the shoreline of the beaver pond near where my car is parked. The sun pours down like honey on this golden Salt Spring afternoon; a tired old pooch named Tessie sighs and flops down in the shade next to our picnic table; life is as it should be.

I am here to talk to John Wilcox, owner of Duck Creek Farm since 1989, about what he thinks community-based agriculture should mean to us here on Salt Spring

Island. John's Duck Creek Farm produces garlic, basil, cucumbers, squash, potatoes, carrots, beets, apples, summer-and-winter squash, pumpkins and hay for garlic mulch.

The 375-acre farm where John grew up (which ironically also had a Duck Creek flowing through it) was in Ontario's corn belt, the southern-most county in the province. It produced hogs, sheep, soy beans, corn, field tomatoes, tobacco and dairy in earlier days. This was the era before chemicals and the industrialization of farming. In his grandfather's day, 18 draft horses provided the power that "Pa" used to do the bulk of the farm work. By 1938, John's father, Oliver (a

graduate of Guelph) introduced hybrid seed corn to Canada by founding the Wilcox Hybrid Seed Corn Company. His work was designed to fight crop disease. With his seed went instructions to farmers about how to grow their own hybrid corn seed.

After John completed high school and two years of agricultural school, he wanted to see the world. He joined the just-forming Canadian Overseas Volunteers (COV), now CUSO (Canadian University Services Overseas).

"My idea was to go into the world and help create peace and harmony through low-level agricultural work. I wanted to put into effect ideas like those written about by Dr. D. K. Faris in To Plough With Hope. 'I've got to go,' I felt," and "go" he did — to India.

"Ghandi had been dead for 12 years, but his philosophy of Swadeshi lived on," explained John. "Ghandi taught that the foundation of India's economy is based in its villages. He set up model projects that showed that a combination of cottage industry and farming are integral to healthy community life . . . People living at 'nature's pace,' as shown in Gene Logsdon's book of that title, show that home economics in its original sense is fundamental to community wealth . . . At this level, the movement taught, people hold their community first, they worked together, like they did in my grandfather's day."

"After an orientation in Delhi, I was sent out to a Ghandian farm project in West Bengal. My job was to observe village agriculture, my specific assignment was to introduce the Deep Litter method of raising poultry. After three months, I began to see that this was not working. It had little value to a village of 5,000 people with their fish ponds, paddy fields and palm trees. The project had departed Ghandi's principles and no longer extended out into the village. It was a nucleus unto itself. To be successful, a program must be an integral aspect of the mainstream economy of the community."

John ended up spending two months convalescing in Calcutta when struck by a water-borne illness.

"It was during this time that I became aware of what was wrong with imposing our agricultural systems

over the traditions of that ancient culture. Our system is the one that removes people from the land. Our own North American farmers have been displaced by policies that turn land and farming into a privately owned corporate model at the expense of community. I observed that there were six million agricultural refugees in Calcutta . . . Ghandi had said: 'The true India is to be found not in its few cities but in its 700,000 villages. If the villages perish, India will perish too.' Ghandi saw Swadeshi as a program for long-term survival."

Upon returning to Canada, John tried to convince people of the impossibility of exporting our centrist economic systems to Asia. He was dismissed as some kind of immature crank.

"I headed back home to our pioneer homestead and asked Pa if he wanted me to take over the farm. Grandfather John was a bit of a seer. He told me: 'John; if you stay on this farm you'll be nothing more than a cog in Dow Chemical's wheel for the rest of your life.'"

He told John to "get some white-faced cattle and become a real farmer again."

John moved west in search of this dream.

Since then his resume has grown to read like a Who's Who of modern-day farm reform, including participation in several organizations dedicated to preserving family and small farms in Canada and the world.

"Here on Salt Spring, we have a community based mainly on providing recreational (including tourism) and retirement settlement. This is displacing farmers — we need to find a way to provide equal status to sustain our ecology of farming and forestry in this community. Farmers have been put on a siding; we are so focussed on development and residential 'build out' that farming is taking the hit. The land, though called agricultural, is mainly fallow, and has become little more than a large block of real estate, a commodity beyond the reach of most farmers. Farming will not be preserved by pursuing only this suburban development model. Farming needs equal development status. If we don't make a determined and sustained effort to support farmers, they will not survive."

"When visitors come to our island, it's almost as if they can feel the wholesomeness and natural goodness of our island's rich agricultural history without even necessarily understanding why it's so attractive. We need to sustain what brings us that feeling."

As we sit in the sun enjoying our lunch, well-known Salt Spring Islander Gene Grooms arrives with a friend to pick up some fresh basil. He has just given John a BBQ for the crew. After he and John exchange goods for some veggies, Gene says, "I appreciate your generosity."

# Anglican Parish nourishes local history

With three buildings and the largest congregation on the island, the Anglican Parish is, by some measurements, also the oldest on Salt Spring. Services were held in settlers' homes as early as 1860, when the Bishop of Victoria, George Hills, came to visit.

The congregation presently numbers around 300, but the Reverend Canon Dr. Kim Murray points out that only half are active. Attendance at Sunday services averages 120 at the three points — St. Mark's at Central, All Saints By-the-Sea on Park Drive and at St. Mary's, Fulford.

The majority of the congregation is retired and membership has declined a little over the past eight years.

"It's kind of like being in charge of a bus stop," said Murray. "There are always newly retired people moving here, as well as people leaving. The slight decrease is certainly something we're trying to address, but I think it's fairly typical of the mainstream churches."

Murray was ordained in 1976 and was, for a time, the youngest priest in Canada.

He holds a PhD in history from the University of Durham and has spent the last 20 years in the Diocese of Victoria. He came to Salt Spring in 1998.

All Saints was built (as St. George's) on donated land in 1940.

In 1993 they physically separated the old parish hall from the sanctuary and moved the church across Park Drive; the hall is now the Galleons Lap photography gallery.

Then with the help of a vast army of volunteers, additions were made to the sanctuary.

Parishioner Alan Robertson said the expansion came about because "we needed more space. Basically, the women wanted renovations to the kitchen, and it just grew from there."

The vision was to build a community centre.

Murray explained that while it's Anglican tradition to be sacramentally focussed, there's also a strong commitment to outreach, both locally and globally.

And All Saints is so busy they've hired a hall use coordinator part-time to keep things running smoothly.

The parish leases its rectory to Community Services for \$1 a year for use as a youth residence, and helps Grandma's House and Bittancourt Manor (formerly Charlie Pyott House).

A popular weekly event is Soup's On, a free lunch prepared in rotation by three congregations, and enjoyed by up to 100 people, including lots of young mums and small children.

The parish supports as external mission projects the Primate's World Relief and Development Fund, a hospital for the blind in India and a training program for the ministry in northern Canada.

All Saints is important to the musical life of Salt Spring.

Music and Munch takes advantage of the excellent acoustics, offering a free concert followed by lunch

by the Anglican Caterers. Organist and choir director the Right Reverend Barry Valentine presides over a three manual pipe organ on which weekly recitals are given, and leads a loyal choir of 17.

Valentine is a retired bishop who came to All Saints on a temporary basis in 1989 and stayed for five and a half years as rector. In 1995 he took over musical responsibilities.

Taking care of two 19th-century buildings is a large responsibility. "St. Mark's (1892) and St. Mary's (1894) need regular attention, in the manner of the elderly buildings they are," said Murray.

St. Mark's needed a new foundation a few years ago and last year acquired a new digital Allen Organ.

Attendance at St. Mary's has dwindled in recent years.

"Of course we maintain it," said Murray, "but having historic buildings is a mixed blessing. They're a joy to have, but a major expense."

There is no advantage to having these buildings designated 'heritage.' "You lose control," said Murray.

"They want you to do things in a very specific way, but don't provide any funding. St. Mary's is a very dear building to some in the south end, and we can keep it up."

## Michael Stone yoga at Ganges studio

When Michael Stone teaches yoga, he doesn't talk about building a better body.

He goes deeper. Way deeper. Imagine Socrates, Plato or Marcus Aurelius teaching yoga, and you get the drift.

Stone, a Toronto-based psychotherapist and yoga teacher, is including Salt Spring in his world circuit, and he wants us to know, first and foremost, that yoga is about the mind, creating stillness, seeing reality as it is and becoming our true selves.

From September 29 to October 1, Salt Spring offers a dose of his yoga teachings at their purest.

"Yoga is not just about the flexibility in our hamstrings and shoulder joints," says Stone in an audio clip on his website, "but allowing the heart and the mind to be so flexible that we can hold simultaneous viewpoints or various viewpoints simultaneously" or for those with control issues or anxiety, "when you embrace 'not knowing,' then you arrive at the beginning of yoga."

(Also on the website this week is Stone in private conversation with the Dalai Lama on the relationship between yoga and Buddhism in practice and theory.)

Why did Ganges Yoga Studio invite Stone?

"The fact that he is a successful practising psychotherapist adds a western dimension to his explorations of the human psyche," said studio director Celeste Mallett, who discovered him at the annual yoga convention in Toronto this past May.

"His approach is one of synthesis. This is a unique aspect of his presentations. Many yoga and meditation teachers draw from a varied background, but Michael uses his disciplines to the fullest."

Stone's own background is varied: a masters degree in psychoanalysis and psychotherapy, ashtanga yoga studies with K. Pattabhi Jois, and Jungian psychology with James Hillman.

Workshop participants will benefit from not only his experience but also his research. He focusses on the integration of yoga psychology, Buddhism and contemporary psychoanalysis as they relate to the relationship between mind and body.

Stone is also known to relate the yoga sutras to our daily lives, and he makes his teachings accessible in a generous dose of audio clips, essays and interviews on his website: [www.mind-bodypsychotherapy.com](http://www.mind-bodypsychotherapy.com).

"His language is accessible, but would also appeal to those with a more academic background," said Mallett.

As for what he discussed with the Dalai Lama, we'll have to wait until the workshop to learn that.

## Say 'cheese' — but don't smell it

Somebody — obviously a devoted cheese-ophile — once described cheese as "milk's leap toward immortality." Personally, I wouldn't leap too high in defence of cheese. There are lots of different kinds out there and one man's cheddar is another man's gorgonzola. Cheese and I didn't get off to a very good start. The rest of my family favoured, for unfathomable reasons, a gooey, fluorescent orange confection called Velveeta.

They ate tubs of the stuff. As a kid I was a bottomless pit and a dedicated fridge raider. I would pluck out and Hoover back just about anything that wasn't lashed to the refrigerator shelves — but never the Velveeta. I would have gnawed the rubber gasket off the refrigerator door before I'd sink to that level. To me, Velveeta looked (and smelled) like a

used diaper.

There's an irony there, because as I discovered in later life, a lot of delicious cheese, well . . . stinks. The reek can range from cheese that smells like unwashed feet to a nostril-searing, pass-the-bucket stench redolent of Junior's unwashed football uniform mouldering in a high school gym locker with a hint of long-dead mouse thrown in.

It's a sadistic little game we play with our senses. We hoist a wedge of cheese to our face; our nose cries "Yuk!" But our taste buds croon "Yum!"

Nine times out of 10 the taste buds win. Gorgonzola reeks but we eat it anyway. Roquefort and Muenster cheeses are pretty whiffy. Camembert can make your eyes water and there's a French cheese called Vieux Boulogne that paramedics should use to revive heart attack victims.

And Blue Stilton! Why, Blue Stilton smells so bad we . . . dab it behind our ears?

Thought you'd heard of everything? Figured that the weirdness quotient had been used up in a world where people pay for bottled water, vote for George Bush and accord celebrity status to air-heads like Paris Hilton? Not quite.

Make room for Eau de Stilton.

It's a perfume being marketed by the Stilton Cheese Makers Association and yes friends, they are dead serious. A company spokesman explained (while maintaining a straight face): "Our perfumier was able to capture the key essence of the (Blue Stilton) scent and recreate it in an unusual but highly wearable perfume."

Where do we go from here? Cheddar roll-on deodorants? Brie cologne? Parmesan face powder? I hate to see the Stilton gang getting into the perfume business. It can only lead to nasty rivalries

as cheesemakers attempt to outskunk each other.

And that means, sooner or later, somebody's going to roll out the Casu marzu.

Casu marzu is the plutonium bomb of cheeses. It is native to Sardinia, and fortunately seldom gets very far from its roots. Casu marzu doesn't travel well. In fact, there's not an airline in the world that would let you bring it aboard.

It's kind of self-explanatory if you know Sardinian dialect. Casu marzu means "rotten cheese." Even if your nose is on strike you can always tell if you've got some Casu marzu on your plate.

It will be moving. That's because Casu marzu is riddled with dozens and dozens of living, wriggling maggots. They are fly larvae deliberately introduced in the fermentation process to give Casu marzu its trademark runny, stinky character. Removal of the maggots prior to ingestion is optional. Purists like to crunch them along with the cheese.

If you ever do summon up the nerve to try some Casu marzu you might want to bring along a pair of safety goggles. The maggots are highly active and can jump up to six inches when agitated. And how does Casu marzu taste? Awful, apparently. A food critic writing in The Wall Street Journal describes it as "a viscous, pungent goo that burns the tongue and can affect other parts of the body."

Indeed it can. Indulgents run the risk of intestinal lesions, nausea, vomiting, hallucinations and bloody diarrhea.

Cheese. I recently read a front-page story in a British newspaper that starts out: "A deranged cheese counter assistant has been convicted of terrorizing a leading Limehouse psychiatrist for more than a year."

Check the guy's passport. Sounds like a Casu marzu junkie to me.

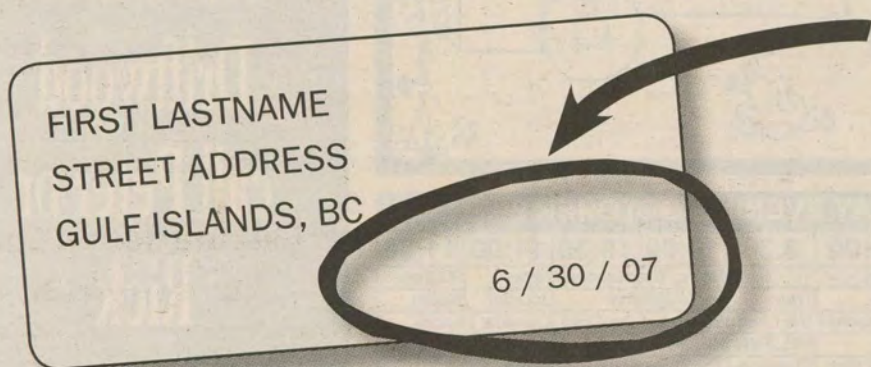
