# Record of unabashed man in exhibit

Primitive cultures believe that the picture taker takes your soul when a photograph is shot.

There is an intimacy between the photographer and his/her subject matter, whether in the Kalahari or in Toronto, that is undeniable.

This notion leaps to the fore when observing the recent show at Galleons Lap entitled Photographs by David Kalef, which runs till November 3.

Without knowing the background, which is as compelling as the work, the photographs, developed with traditional techniques, are portraits that tell a story, drawing you in with curiosity.

Each piece is a photograph of an elderly man standing or sitting in his home environment. He is dressed in women's clothes yet does not try to be female.

His thick fingers, not unused to hard physical labour, hold a cigarette or a cigar, his feet are planted far apart, knees splayed, not even trying to look demure. A variety of wigs festoon his balding scalp, but there is no makeup.

The photographs, taken between 1991 and 1995, do not reflect a style of that period but rather something my grandmother might have worn in the '70s or '80s. The clothes are very large and built of luxurious fabrics: satins and organzas with big floppy bows. Ropes of fake pearls and button earrings frame a face filled

with pouches and lines. The subject's eyes always look straight at you, unabashed and unafraid. He is what he is and this is a record of it.

His home, which I later learned was a one-room cabin he built himself, is filled with the minutiae of life describing the man. Books of esoteric poetry and Ovid about movies like Tootsie and Mrs. Doubtfire. Lush plants spill off a rough homemade shelf.

The subject, whose first name only is used in promotional material — Ward — and Kalef use each other to fulfill their own private agendas: Ward to "out" himself in a way that challenges the viewer not to judge, and Kalef to build a series of work that initiated a resurgence in his career.

Ward was the father of an ex-girlfriend. (He died in 1999.) Even though the relationship with the daugh-

ter ended, Ward and Kalef spent long hours together discussing philosophy, politics, art, poetry, religions and the media, all the stuff that friendships are made of.

Divorce had separated the ex-girlfriend and her father for 11 years, even though fond memories prevailed. On the first visit after this hiatus, Ward told them of his fetish. Eventually Kalef approached him about taking his photograph and this series was born.

Kalef's story is as interesting. A Ryerson alumni, from '83 to '89, he received a degree in Photographic Stills and one in Media Studies coming out with the idealistic passion of a man wanting to change the world with his art. Disillusionment ensued when this didn't happen and photography went on the back burner as other artistic endeavors followed, including formation of a rock band called the Belle Jars in Toronto.

A few exhibitions in the early '90s fizzled, but the work with Ward inspired him to continue. This exhibition at Galleons Lap on Salt Spring Island is his first show since recently returning to the darkroom.

The next Galleons Laps show runs from November 10-27. Called Chasing Light Stranger, it features the work of Russ Kwan and Wendy Kwan with an opening reception on November 10 from 5 to 8 p.m. and a book signing on November 11 from 1-4 p.m.

# Musical tribute on Remembrance Day

The Salt Spring Concert Band (SSCB) under the direction of Dawn Hage presents a two-evening musical tribute to Canadian veterans and current hopes for peace in a concert titled Tunes of Glory — a Remembrance Day tribute.

Taking place at ArtSpring, the show features familiar marches, songs and contemporary music dealing with the subjects of war, peace and remembrance.

In addition, vocalist Sylvia Louwman will lead the audience in a sing-along of popular music from the war years.

"We wanted to offer something to the community to add to the traditional celebrations in place on Remembrance Day," said SSCB manager Sheila Spence.

"This concert will appeal to veterans,

families, and the whole community. The music is both upbeat and moving and much of it will be familiar to listeners of all ages."

Musical selections include such favourites as Scotland the Brave, Amazing Grace, The British Grenadiers, Royal Air Force March Past and Holst's First Suite for Military Band.

The contemporary Pacem by composer Robert Spittal is a musical plea for peace and Fields of Honour by Canadian composer W.A. Mighton is a composition inspired by the "possibility of a new kind of army, an army that would bring peace to the world rather than war."

The medley Themes Like Old Times includes Melancholy Baby, Ain't We Got Fun, Moonlight Bay and After You've Gone, all written between 1912 and 1921.

The war years produced some of the greatest songs ever written and audiences will have a chance to warm up their own pipes and sing along with Louwman.

"We brought Sylvia in to sing some of those great songs from the war years that really bring a tear and a smile, no matter what age you are," said Spence.

Songs featuring Louwman will include The White Cliffs of Dover and I'll be Seeing You, and songsheets will be provided to encourage audience participation.

Tunes of Glory takes place on November 10 and 11 at ArtSpring. Both concerts begin at 8 p.m. and tickets are \$15 for adults and \$10 for students with the GVM Youth Pass in effect. Tickets are available at the ArtSpring box office, 537-2102, or through tickets@artspring.ca.

## Musician and poet bridge genres in Nov. 5 fundraiser

Local songwriter and musician Phil Vernon has teamed up with poet Murray Reiss to put together an eclectic, entertaining and thought-provoking afternoon of music.

Titled *Midnight Bridge* — songs and poems for a crooked time, the November 5 concert will be an interplay of the two artists' work, with a balance of solo and combined presentations.

"The interplay will be throughout, with about a third of the material directly worked together," said Vernon.

The concert will address concerns of living in today's world, with a somewhat hopeful and optimistic slant on how we may survive our present predicament with environment, war and health issues.

"The title, 'songs and poems for a crooked time', leads into what we are about, which is songs and poems that touch into our experience in our lives," said Vernon.

"What is our experience? Do we know what is going on? How do we find our way? We do that through songs and poems. We reach into ourselves and hope that others will be touched as well and perhaps we can find our way together."

"The 'Midnight Bridge' has the same kind of imagery," added Reiss. "In the magazine *Atomic Scientist*, there is always a picture of a clock, indicating so many minutes left until midnight, or the end of the world. There's always a gap, and we are looking for a way to find a bridge that goes over midnight entirely and ushers in the new dawn."

Despite the serious topics, the pair insists that the concert is anything but gloomy. They address these rather heavy issues with a mixture of optimism, hope and humour.

"There's lots of funny material," assures Vernon. "We have fun."

Some of the material that audiences can look forward to hearing on Sunday will

include Vernon's *Gamburu*, *Reef Net Song* and *Housing Blues*, a tongue-in-cheek look at Salt Spring's affordable housing debates.

Reiss will read poems such as *Catfood Cop*, which involves *Viagra* and a cream coloured kitten, *Wild Strawberries*, a gardening dilemma, and *Cemetery Compost*, with *compost*, a leather-backed turtle and death as its subject matter.

All proceeds after costs from the concert will go to support two western Kenya-based initiatives, a medical clinic and women's bee-keeping project.

"At the medical clinic, they are perpetually short of drugs and funds will go directly to buy more," said Vernon. "The bee-keeping project gives local women an opportunity to earn a guaranteed wage and create fair trade honey within a local market."

The concert takes place Sunday, November 5 at the Lions Hall. Time is 3 p.m. and admission is \$10, with tickets available at the door.

## Drop Radio hosts Hallowe'en bash

Local independent recording artists Drop Radio will officially release their debut self-titled CD on Friday, October 27 at Beaver Point Community Hall.

"Drop Radio has been a local phenomenon for the last three and a half years, bringing a wide variety of musical genres to their dynamic performances," explains a press release. "From their roots reggae ska to their world rhythm funk, Drop Radio guarantees to make you move."

Special appearances by Aaronius Ablemonk, Oriana and the Gypsy Island Dance Troupe, and DJ Shai-k-yerbooty fill

out the bill.

"Drop Radio has expanded its roster to include Tom Jensen on drums, Galen Mongeau on percussion and you never know who might drop on stage to sweeten the radio's sound."



## Keelaghan ready to win over folk club crowd

Canadian singer songwriter James Keelaghan brings his silky baritone voice and passion for history to the Salt Spring Folk Club stage on November 6.

Featuring a silky baritone voice that "soothes, seduces and packs a punch," Keelaghan has a "compelling ability to tell the stories of himself and his land," says his website.

The concert takes place at Fulford Hall, with Ed Peekeekoot as opening act.

In addition to melody and lyrics, Keelaghan has a strong interest in history and spent time studying that

subject at the University of Calgary before deciding to devote himself full time to music.

That passion inspired such famous songs as Jenny Bryce, Cold Missouri Waters, and Red River Risin', a song set during the Riel rebellion of 1870.

Keelaghan has built a following all over Canada, the U.S., Europe and Australia. In addition, he has performed in Denmark, and was the first Canadian to play the Hong Kong Festival in 1995.

Keelaghan credits family members and a legion of

songwriters for his inspirations.

"My father was a great influence as a story teller, my mother for a sense of humour," states Keelaghan on his website.

"I listened to a lot of Irish traditional stuff when I grew up, tempered with Jethro Tull, Neil Young, Bruce Cockburn, Joni Mitchell and Captain Beefheart.

"Liam Clancy for voice and guitar style, the poetry of Yeats. I loved Harry Belafonte — the world's greatest stage performer; and Pete Seeger — a fine balladeer. But influences never stop.

I am influenced by David Francey, Oliver Schroer, Hugh McMillan and a host of others now."

"I love touching people as a performer," he says. "Putting a song across so that people get inside the story. I love the immediacy of it, the feedback."

The November 6 concert takes place at Fulford Hall and doors open at 6:30 p.m. for season ticket holders and 6:45 for general admission. Music begins at 7:30 p.m.

## All Saints Day sings at namesake church

For over 10 years, All Saints church has opened its doors to musicians and music lovers in the recital series popularly known as Music and Munch.

# Wright's short history re-released with illustrations

# Making love like there's no tomorrow

## — If you're a rare-breed turkey, there just might not be!

According to Laura Philips in her Nature of Animals newsletter, the gene pool of rare poultry varieties is diminishing. "Each year the hatch rate declines and there aren't as many strong poults among those that do hatch. Such is the nature of breeding very rare types of poultry," she writes.

Watching Gordo, one of the tom turkeys at Margaret and Alan Thomson's Windrush Farm on Salt Spring's North Beach Road, it's as if he has read this very same newsletter.

With chest puffed out and tail fanned in regal display, he gobbles and struts, making love with any willing hen as if there is no tomorrow.

"Just trying to do my part," I can almost hear him chuckle.

Gordo is a Slate (also known as Blue Slate) turkey tom, a heritage-breed, so rare the very survival of these beautiful turkeys is at risk.

"The Blue Slates, and the Bourbon Red turkeys that we raise here are rare," says Margaret. "The Blue Slates especially so. That's how we got involved in raising them. They desperately need our help."

The Slate variety of turkey is named for its colour, which is ash-blue over the entire body with a few black flecks. It is also called the Blue turkey.

The standard weight of a young Slate tom is 23 pounds, 14 pounds for a young hen. Blue Slate was one of the breeds produced to help farmers distinguish their flocks. Different feather patterns helped farmers identify their birds, especially when walked to market in large and sometimes mixed "turkey trots."

The Slate was accepted by the American Poultry Association in 1874.

Along with their flock of Blue Slates, Margaret and Alan also raise Bourbon Red turkeys, another very rare breed.

The Bourbon Red (named for Bourbon county, Kentucky) was developed by J. F. Barbee in the late 1800s from crosses between Buff, Bronze and White Holland turkeys.

Settlers heading west took the breed to Kentucky. Final development was centred in Kentucky and southern Ohio where they were called Kentucky Reds and/or Bourbon Butternuts.

The American Poultry Association accepted the Bourbon Red in 1909. It is a handsome bird, brownish to dark-red in plumage with white wing and tail feathers. The feathers have soft red bars; body feathers in the toms are edged in black. Neck and breast

never seemed to mind. In fact, we were told that a flock of turkeys arriving on the lawn amidst a flurry of feathers and loud gobbles is a very special part of the 'Salt Spring experience' many guests come here looking for. Of course we could fence them in entirely, or house them so they can't fly, but we like it that they have a varied diet of grass, fruit, seeds, berries and insects.

"We raise truly 'free range organic' turkeys, and it shows in their overall health, the flavour of their meat and the quality of their oil."

Heritage breed turkeys, including the Blue Slate and the Bourbon do not grow as fast as industrial broad-breasted varieties.

"We don't have a finished meat bird in 16 weeks like the commercial growers," says Margaret.

"It takes six months to raise a bird and we miss the Thanksgiving market because, in October, our oldest young-of-the-year are four months old; the youngest two months old. What we aim for is the Christmas market. By selling some birds, we cover our costs. We are not doing this to support ourselves. Our purpose is to help preserve these endangered heritage breeds, and we encourage, and will assist, others on Salt Spring to get involved. It's not difficult, and it is very rewarding knowing we are helping keep an important heritage bird from becoming extinct."

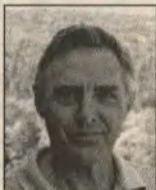
Margaret and Alan do not have a farming background. For 30 years Margaret was a nurse; Alan was in the freight-forwarding business in Vancouver and Winnipeg. In 1998, they moved to Salt Spring.

Margaret and Alan welcome enquiries about all aspects of heritage turkeys, including orders for Christmas. Visitors to the farm are welcome with a phone call; kids especially are always welcome.

feathers are chestnut-mahogany. Average toms weigh 33 pounds, hens weigh 18.

"Very often the success of raising rare-breed poultry comes down to just one hen," Margaret tells me. "Our best-laying Blue Slate, Soledad (meaning Solitude in Spanish), was the only one of 17 eggs to hatch."

Even trying to locate a source of fertile eggs can be tricky.

"We got our first eggs from Bill Braden, in Ontario. He has an excellent reputation and many of his birds have been winners at Toronto's Royal Winter Fair. We ordered 48 turkey eggs from him two years ago. Only 11 hatched, which was quite a disappointment. We only ended up with two adult hens, and only one went broody. Luckily, we hatched out 30 birds that first year, providing the foundation of our flock. It was a matter of learning that turkey eggs don't travel well. As soon as we developed our own production

in an incubator less than five miles away, we got a 90 per cent hatch rate. With six birds laying on a 28-day incubation schedule, we can put in two-and-a-half dozen eggs per week into our incubator and hatch out 200 birds in a season, March until May."

If all this sounds like an awful lot of responsibility and hard work, raising any kind of poultry is not without its lighter moments. Turkeys, even the heavy, mature toms are excellent flyers. In the wild, turkeys roost in trees.

"We kept a ladder handy for a long time," says Alan, "so we could climb up on the roof of the house and shoo the birds back onto the ground."

Windrush Farm is right next door to Salt Spring Spa Resort and more than once the turkeys decided that the grass looked greener on the spa's side of the fence.

"For us this meant no end of embarrassment," says Alan, "but the guests and the owners of the resort

# Kids can make movies thanks to Community Ed partnership

Salt Spring's Community Education program offers children a rare chance to participate this fall with Let's Make a Movie.

The course, taught by Cindy Jacobsen beginning this Friday, leads kids through the entire movie-making process from script-writing to filming to editing, and all on consumer cameras and free software.

Jacobsen conceived of the course after attending a community education meeting last year and finding herself "by far the youngest person there." She was aware that creating classes for young people would both fill a gap and provide more numbers for the program in general.

Jacobsen has had former careers in the United States as a web designer and a community college media studies teacher.

She also worked on three different film crews in Seattle before deciding that the amount of stress involved

was not worth the end product.

Making films with children unites her skills and interests with her latest career of "being a mom"; she wanted to do something which her son Noah could also be involved in.

"There's so many things a community needs and it's really a matter of finding out what would be useful to the community at large, and trying to fill that need," said Jacobsen.

"That's the exciting thing about being somewhere that's small enough that people can really make a difference by doing some-

thing that isn't being done already. So that's spurring my creativity a little, trying to come up with something that would be useful."

Expanding the program to include children is a welcome idea, says Community Education director Judi Francis, although she points out that the program already tries to offer one or two courses for children each season, including an Easter Bread Basket-making course with Heather the Bread Lady last spring and a mask-making class last fall.

Future development of kid-oriented programs depends both on getting feedback on what types of classes parents and kids would like to see, and finding instructors to teach them.

One thing that Jacobsen has noted is that in her former community similar programs offered classes for adults and kids concurrently, so that parents and children could attend courses at the same time.

Francis agrees that this

is a great idea, but for now the focus will be on finding more courses to run on Fridays when most kids are off school.

A good step in that direction, says Francis, is an ongoing dialogue between Community Education and the Salt Spring Island Coalition of Family Services.

After meeting last June, the two groups have agreed to find suggestions for courses and to collaborate on implementing them.

There has also been some talk of offering arts and music courses in collaboration with Acoustic Planet.

For now, kids have an excellent opportunity to learn something really fun with Jacobsen's Let's Make a Movie.

"If you think about the price for daycare, it's really quite a good deal," Francis says of the \$120, four-session course.

The course, which is directed at ages "10-12-plus," begins October 27 and goes from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

"A lot of people really liked it. It was unique to Salt Spring. It kind of depicted the nature around [the island]," said Benwell.



# Return to Vietnam shared Sunday

In 1971, when Bruce Logan completed his second one-year tour of duty as an American army officer participating in an ugly war in Vietnam, he vowed that he would never look at another grain of rice and that he would never set foot onto the Southeast Asian land mass again.

It took less than a year for him to abandon the first pledge. Three and a half decades later the Fulford Harbour resident reneged on the second vow and, along with his partner Elaine Head, returned to Vietnam on a trip of reconciliation and healing.

The two-week junket through a now unified Vietnam was "moving and emotional beyond description," said Logan. "I feel like I connected with the Vietnamese people and their vibrant culture in a way that would have been impossible during my combat tours there in the '60s and '70s."

Head adds, "We found the Vietnamese people so welcoming and warm, yet despite the strength of the new Vietnamese economy, many are living well below the poverty level. These juxtapositions and contradictions are everywhere."

The couple travelled with a group called Tours of Peace (TOP), a not-for-profit organization dedicated to helping veterans come to closure about having par-

ticipated in the conflict. Part of the prescription for healing was humanitarian work throughout the former South Vietnam. TOP distributes food, medicine, medical supplies and school supplies to orphanages, clinics and schools.

"We also went laden with donated goods from family, friends and fellow islanders. Everywhere that we served, whether it was a leprosy vil-

lage or a home for victims of Agent Orange, the people were very appreciative. We now realize that there is so much more that we can do," they said.

On Sunday, October 29 at 10:30 a.m., Head and Logan will share their experience through slides and discussion at the Unitarian Fellowship at the OAP room at Fulford Hall.

**Cheddar Cheese Pretzels**

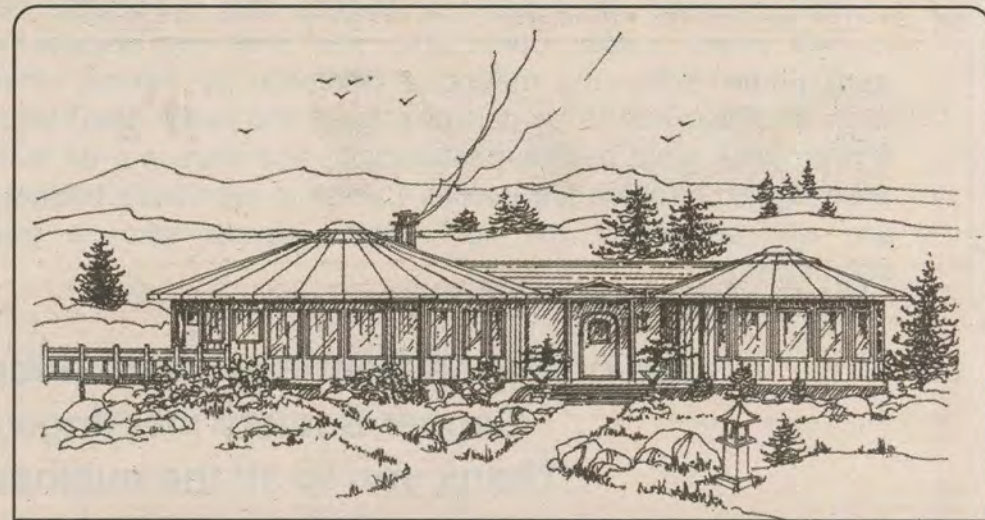
- 3 c. flour

- 1 c. butter, cut in
- 1 c. whipping cream

- 1 tsp. salt
  - 1 tsp. baking powder
  - 2 tsp. dried herbs (you choose)
  - 1 egg yolk
- Mix together. Roll dough to 1/4 inch. Flour both sides. Cut shapes with pretzel cut-

ter. Place on cookie sheet and sprinkle with poppy seeds, sesame seeds or caraway, or coarse salt. It helps if you spray lightly with oil, then sprinkle.

Bake at 350 degrees for 15-20 minutes.

# October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

## Stepping Forward to Fight Breast Cancer

Breast cancer affects many Canadians, whether it's a personal struggle to beat the disease, or to support a family member or friend as they receive treatment. There are many ways to get involved in the fight against breast cancer, and Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October offers a chance for everyone to learn how.

Speaking up about cancer is a good place to start; support for funding, for research, for diagnostic equipment, will only happen as more people become aware of the need. And the need is great. In 2006, it's expected that about 22,300 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer, and 5,300 will die of it. Even men are not immune.

Generous donations from individuals and businesses have led to improvements in diagnostic tools for early detection, screening programs, and research, and reduced the death rate of the disease since 1994. Currently, genetic research has been identified as an important step to learn more about this disease, since it's well-known that heredity plays a role in developing this type of cancer.

Therapies used to fight the disease have also expanded to include not only the latest drugs available for trials, but also cancer prevention efforts and supportive care to improve the quality of life for people fighting cancer. This has contributed to improved ten-year survival rates for women with breast cancer.

Getting involved on a personal level is also a concrete way to fight breast cancer. Contributing your skills and experience, gaining new skills, and making a difference by helping others is an enriching way to be part of a team and make new friends, and provides great personal satisfaction. And there are as many ways to help as there are people. Cancer is everyone's business, and with awareness, the fight against cancer takes a giant step forward.

## Cancer facts:

Breast cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in Canadian women. It starts in the breast tissue, in the area between the armpit and the breastbone.

All women are at risk of developing breast cancer, but some women are at higher risk because of their age, family history or reproductive history. Many women are alive and well today because their breast cancer was found and treated early. Breast health is one area in your life where you can take control.

## What to watch for:

- Any place in your breast that feels lumpy like a pea or that is thicker or harder than the rest.
- Puckering, dimpling or swelling of the skin on your breast or around nipples.
- Orange-peel skin - patches of skin where the pores stand out, which may or may not be discoloured.
- Bleeding or discharge from your nipples, or crusting on your nipples.
- Tenderness, redness or pain in your breasts.

## What is breast cancer?

Breast cancer is an uncontrolled growth of breast cells that may form a mass of extra tissue called a tumour. Tumours can be benign (non-cancerous) or malignant (cancerous).

The most common type of breast cancer begins in the lining of the ducts - the tube-like part of the breast that milk passes through to reach the nipple - called ductal carcinoma. When it spreads outside the ducts, it is called invasive breast cancer - most breast cancers are invasive. Metastatic breast cancer is cancer that has spread from the site of the initial cancer to other parts of the body.

## Local cancer support groups

"We also have an informal support group that isn't affiliated with anyone," explains Roz Woolley. "That is for all women's cancers, not just breast cancers, although most are breast cancer survivors."

They meet for coffee at the 19th Hole Restaurant at the golf course on the first Wednesday of each month at 10 a.m. On the third Wednesday of each month they get together at the Croftonbrook lounge at the same time.

"Sometimes new people choose to come (to the Croftonbrook session) because it's a more private environment."

# Virtues Project gets presidential kudos

A Salt Spring resident addressed a conference on school safety in Washington, D.C. last week, and impressed President George W. Bush with his presentation on The Virtues Project.

John Kavelin, a co-founder of The Virtues Project, was asked by White House staff to address the assembled guests, President Bush and First Lady Laura Bush about the character-building programs and materials of The Virtues Project, which is used in more than 85 countries.

Kavelin mentioned that "values"-based education often has a particular cultural or faith-based agenda, whereas

virtues such as courage, caring and integrity are universal to all cultures and creeds. He described The Virtues Project strategies for inspiring a culture of character in families, schools and communities, particularly its successes in violence prevention and remediation.

Kavelin said President Bush congratulated him on the grassroots initiative, indicating that it is home-grown efforts such as these that have the capability of making a real difference in our schools.

Hearing Kavelin speak of his decision to leave a 16-year career at Walt

Disney Imagineering to commit full time to this work, the president joked, "You don't look a day over . . . 60."

An audience of 350 school administrators, police officers and child advocates heard the Bushes speak "on the need to apply 'best practices' to prevent and respond to school violence across America," said Kavelin.

The Virtues Project is a global initiative for character education honoured by the United Nations as a "model program for all cultures." It was founded on Salt Spring in 1990 by Kavelin along with Linda Kavelin Popov and Dr. Dan Popov.

## Island kids master challenges of trick-or-treating

When you live on a rural island with farms, acreages and long, dark driveways, trick or treat challenges can be rather daunting for a kid.

However, Salt Spring youngsters are nothing if not resourceful and have found solutions to getting the most loot for their effort on All Hallows Eve.

A popular north-end solution is to visit areas that are more densely populated, including Maliview, Mobrae, Bayview Avenue in Vesuvius and Wildwood Crescent off Lower Ganges.

Kate Hosie resides on Sunset Drive, and quickly discovered that it was a dead-end option when it came to trick or treating.

"It has to be the worst place," said Hosie. "The driveways are long and steep. It's awful. I don't trick or treat there."

Hosie, now 14, discovered the Vesuvius area when she first started trick or treating with friends years ago and it quickly became a tradition.

Maliview Drive has become such a sought-after destination over the years that past resident Lianne Fidler sought help from the community through donations of candy and funds. Hundreds of children visit the houses on Hallowe'en, many travelling from residences far away.

Luke Hylands prefers Kingfisher Cove to the dark and infrequent houses on his rural road.

Tightly spaced together, Kingfisher residences provide a perfect 'city street' type of experience for the costume clad set.

"Every year I go with my friends to Kingfisher. I would only get about a quarter of a bag if I just went on my road," said Hylands.

Children living in the south end of Salt Spring have their own traditions when it comes to the annual Hallowe'en experience.

Margaret O'Hara and kids Emma and Sam enjoy staying home and trick or treating in their own neighbourhood near the Fulford village.

"We have always stayed home and the kids have gone house to house in the village," said O'Hara.

"It takes a couple of hours and their haul is substantial enough for their liking.

"For the past few years, we have lit a small bonfire at the end of our driveway. This lures the kids up our hilly street, and often parents have a seat at the fire while their kids venture further up the hill.

"We always have a lot of people from the 'deep south' (i.e., down Beaver Point Road), so I think coming to Fulford Village is a popular option.

"It is one of my favourite nights, not for the candy overload, but for the community feeling of a lot of people being outside at night," said O'Hara. "And all the orange — what a great colour!"
